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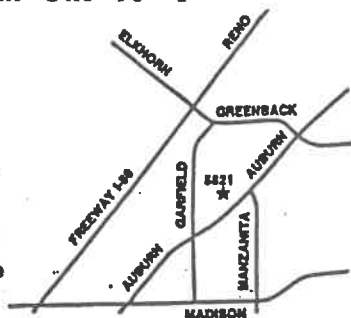
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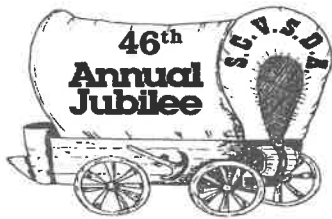

We have been on the road again! Unfortunately, the Pink Lady had to stay home while we were away. We went off and enjoyed the 51st National Square Dance Convention in St. Paul, Minnesota! When we were in China, dancing with our two Chinese Square Dance Clubs, we did not believe we would be able to go to St. Paul. As many of you know, our stay in Beijing was cut short because Jim developed a rapid heartbeat and required hospitalization. While the medical care was excellent, it was quite expensive, so we decided to come back to the USA where Jim could be covered by Medicare! (He has gotten a clean bill of health since our return.) As long as we were here in the U.S. we decided to attend the 51st. We were able to stay with a friend in Minneapolis, and really had a great time.

First, let me make a couple of comments about the "Twin Cities" of Minneapolis and St. Paul. The area is lush and green this time of year due to frequent showers. These cities are really lovely with many parks and lakes. The people enjoy an active lifestyle including a good deal of outdoor activities.

Jay & Gail Richards, who were the leaders of the 51st, put together a great convention. It was held in St. Paul at the River Center Convention Center. It was well organized with dancing from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. followed by after parties. The 9,000 registered dancers were busy and fun. We logged a good deal of time in the Overseas Hospitality Room where we met dancers from Germany, Sweden, Japan, Taiwan, England, and, of course, Jim and Betsy registered from Beijing! We wore our Chinese folk dance costumes on several occasions.

Every year, the organizers try to come up with a special event that is fun and catchy. Last year in Anaheim, we joined thousands of dancers dancing through Disneyland. This

year, about 4,000 square dancers danced on the Wabasha Bridge. The Wabasha Bridge crosses the Mississippi River in St. Paul. Somehow, Jay & Gail persuaded the city fathers to close the bridge for several hours so the dancers could get to the bridge, square up, and dance to the singing of Tony Oxendine and DeeDee Dougherty. The record number of 4,000 square dancers on a bridge will be submitted to the Guinness Book of World Records. We danced with dancers from Alabama, alongside dancers from England and Japan! To seal the event, all dancers linked up in a gigantic group hug, setting a record for the largest "Group Hug" ever in the history of the world. And who better to set such a record than square dancers, whose motto is already "Square Dancing is Friendship Set to Music."

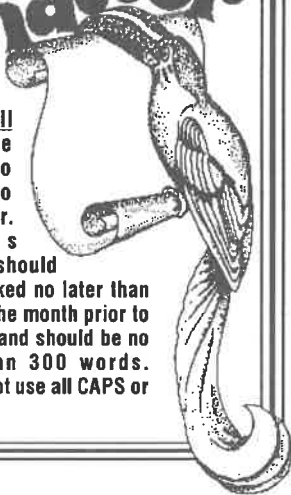

We saw many old friends, and made a number of new ones. Texas will host the convention in 2006, following Portland in 2005, Denver in 2004, and Oklahoma City in 2003!

Now is the time to start planning to come to Portland and enjoy the next West Coast National Convention! We hope you will all join us there! Of course, you will hear a lot more about this from us in the next few years.

We are glad to be home. We really enjoyed the St. Paul Convention. Since we have been home we have danced in Lodi and San Jose. We leave later in August for Southern California, then on to Albuquerque and to South Texas for the winter. Look for us next month! Happy dancing!
