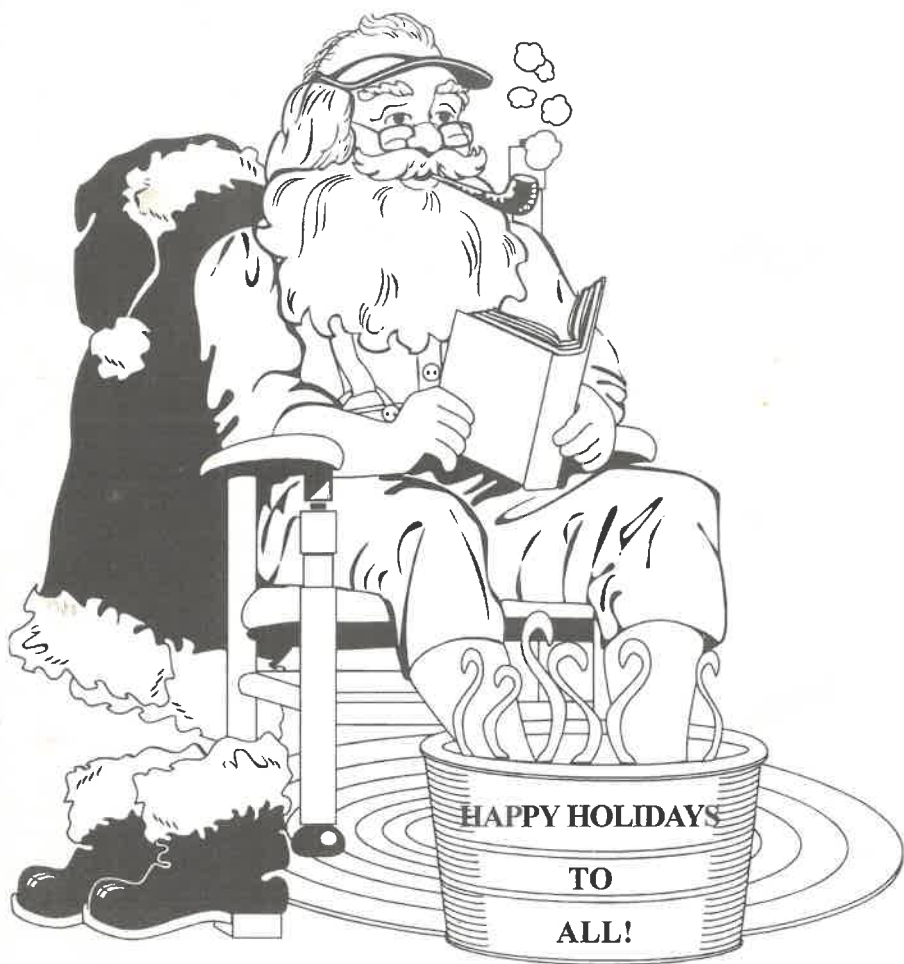

SANTA CLAUS

Clad in red, full-bodied, white bearded & lavish bell ringer is this jolly old gentleman we all know from countless street corners at Christmas for quite some time, but who is this man? How did he come to America? The nature of his thorough involvement with the American Christmas scene has turned this mythical creation into a living Christmas icon. At the same time it has almost forced us to imagine him landing with a group of Dutch & English settlers who are attributed to be the initiators of this tradition in America. Santa Claus is the sum total of several trends, customs & beliefs that only became unified about a century and a half ago. His story is told through an examination of the 3 names given to him in America – St. Nicholas, Kris Kringle, & Santa Claus.

Much of the present form of the Santa story is due to the works of Clement Clark Moore & the cartoons of Thomas Nast. In 1822, Dr. Moore from New York wrote a Christmas poem, "A visit from St. Nicholas" to read to his children on Christmas Eve. The following year Ms. Harriet Butler read the poem & sent it, without Dr. Moore's consent, to the Troy New York Sentinel for publication & became popular. In 1938 Dr. Moore revealed that St. Nicholas was his creation & since then it has appeared countless times.

The 19th century American cartoonist Nast who had lived on the same West 23rd Street as Dr. Moore, did a series of Christmas drawings for Harper's Weekly. It was where the today's much familiar fat & rosy cheeked Santa with white beard & ringing bell made his debut after being modified from the fat, little, elf-like creature depicted in Dr. Moore's poem.

And perhaps what made Santa more realistic is the classic reply of the editor of the New York Sun in response to the 8-year old Virginia O'Hanlon's query whether there really was a Santa Claus - "Yes, Virginia, there is a Santa Claus", and made Santa living forever to the children.

LIGHT A CANDLE AROUND THE WORLD !

This seemed to be the theme of the Texas Star Promenade held near Geneva on the first weekend in November 2002. The Texas Star Square Dance Club of Geneva, Switzerland organized this wonderful weekend for dancers. They incorporated a graduation dance on Friday night when six newer dancers celebrated their completion of the Mainstream Square Dance Course and were welcomed to the greater square dance community. This dance was held in the community room of a large apartment complex in Onyx, a suburb of Geneva, Switzerland. We rode down from Paris with Roy Mann, a transplanted Englishman, living in France full time, who organized Paris Calling some years ago and is the mainstay of square dancing in Paris today.

On Saturday, the dancing continued in a community hall in the village of Bossey, another suburb of Geneva. Cows grazed in the pasture and orchard outside the hall while inside some 50 or more dancers danced with the principal calling of Alan Covacic of Buckinghamshire, England (email: mail@smcovacic.fastnet.co.uk) who had made the trip especially to call for the weekend. The dancing was fast and furious, rotating between mainstream and plus. Everyone was enjoying himself or herself when we gradually began to realize how diverse we were as square dancers.

Soon we realized that we had dancers and callers there who were from England, France, Switzerland, Germany, Italy, Australia and the U.S. One dancer and his wife were from Paraguay, although they now live full time in Switzerland! (The National and International Square Dance Directory

lists NO square dance clubs in Paraguay, so why go there?) When Alan did a singing call to "Light a Candle Around the World" (Aussie Tempos A1012) it was obvious that these dancers, representing many countries were fervent in their desire to come together in peace and for the shared pleasure of Square Dancing. This song is becoming a sort of Square Dance Anthem for Peace.

We (Jim Pead and Betsy Waite) are currently living in Paris and dancing with Paris Calling while we are representing the 54th U.S. National Square Dance Convention. The 54th will be held in June 22, 23, 24, and 25, 2005 in Portland, Oregon. We found a great deal of interest among the dancers for coming to Portland, where the National Convention was last held in 1994. They then hosted the largest number of International Square Dancers at any National Convention in many years. The Portland National Committee is intent on holding the best convention in many years, and attracting dancers from every corner of the U.S. and the largest number of dancers from around the world ever!

While in Geneva the predominant language spoken among the dancers was French, many, even most, were conversant in English, which has become the international language of recent times. The members of the "Crazy Crocodiles" from Germany were all fluent in English, and communication flowed around the hall with ease. Besides the "Crazy Crocodiles" and us, representing the 54th, and the Texas Stars, other clubs represented were the Swiss Smiley Dancers, the Geneva Wheelers, the

Wheelers and Dealers from the UK, and the Square Drivers from Switzerland. The Swiss representative of the EAASDS attended and greatly livened up the party!

The Texas Star dance hosts were Christophe Fuerer and Angelika Alger, and we were personally hosted by Mary France Muller. We felt truly cared for and wonderfully accommodated.

Betsy and I have had the privilege of dancing with other European square dancers, both in clubs and at specials. We always find them extremely courteous and welcoming, exemplifying what is wonderful about Square Dancing everywhere. The focus of Square Dancing is the unity of people coming together for fun and joy. In America, the motto of square dancing is "Square Dancing is Friendship Set to Music." In the European Association it is "Friendship

is Square Dancing's Greatest Reward." Everywhere we have danced, it is clear that when eight people come together for a common purpose, they are always interdependent and enjoy the camaraderie best in a spirit of helpfulness and cooperation - the thing that makes Square Dancing truly great.

If we could all light the flame of peace in our hearts, as in the song "Light a Candle Around the World" and share the peace, friendship and caring we see in Square Dancing, that flame could spread and bring a world of peace. Before you go to sleep tonight, think or say a word of thanks for the joy and friendship Square Dancing has brought you. Betsy and Jim do, every day!



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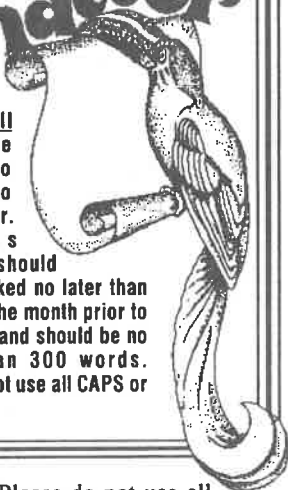

CLUB CALLER RESPONSIBILITIES

This information was developed by the Education Committee of the UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA, INC. and will provide a general description of the typical responsibilities of a Club Caller.

INTRODUCTION

Most clubs are organized in a basic club format with officers or leaders performing their duties in a very specific manner. Clubs may use different titles for their leaders, but the duties and responsibilities are basically the same. The Club Caller is also a leader of the Club and has certain responsibilities in the performance of his duties. The following is a list of typical responsibilities for a Club Caller that may meet the needs of most clubs but may require some variation or tailoring depending upon the type and organization of the club.

CLUB CALLER

Maintain Club dancing proficiency at the level designated by the Board of Directors of the club. Conduct the club dances as scheduled by the Board of Directors. Provide all sound equipment and records. Latest records will be utilized as deemed desirable by the Caller. Conduct Club Classes in Western Style Square Dancing as scheduled by the Club Board of Directors. Obtain approval of the Club President of a substitute caller in event of absence. Attend Club Board of Directors meetings in an advisory capacity. Report on activities of Local and State Caller Associations, CALLERLAB, etc.. Make recommendations for improvement of Club operations. Promote proper square dance styling, dress, promptness, enthusiasm and attendance at Club, Area and State functions. Adhere to the CALLERLAB "Code of Ethics" to the maximum extent possible. Prepare and offer a variety of programs to avoid boredom and stereotyped dance nights. Periodically develop gimmicks or special events to create an atmosphere of fun and excitement. Don't let interest wane.

Present a professional appearance and attitude at all club functions. Western style attire is required at all Club dances and square dance activities. Participate in all Club functions. Mingle with the Club members to obtain the feelings of the Club dancers. Assist in other Club activities as deemed necessary. Set an example for Club officers and members to follow to include; dress, badge, promptness, enthusiasm, knowledge of the square dance community, activities, etc.
