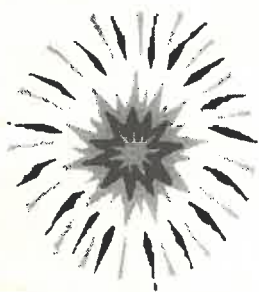

We in the United States have all heard the haunting song, "Taps." It's the song that gives us that lump in our throats and usually tears in our eyes. But, do you know the story behind the song? If not, I think you will be interested to find out about its humble beginnings.

Reportedly, it all began in 1862 during the Civil War, when Union Army Captain Robert Ellicombe was with his men near Harrison's Landing in Virginia. The Confederate Army was on the other side of the narrow strip of land. During the night, Captain Ellicombe heard the moans of a soldier who lay severely wounded on the field. Not knowing if it was a Union or Confederate soldier, the Captain decided to risk his life and bring the stricken man back for medical attention. Crawling on his stomach through the gunfire, the Captain reached the stricken soldier and began pulling him toward his encampment. When the Captain finally reached his own lines, he discovered it was actually a Confederate soldier, but the soldier was dead. The Captain lit a lantern and suddenly caught his breath and went numb with shock. In the dim light, he saw the face of the soldier. It was his own son. The boy had been studying music in the South when the war broke out. Without telling his father, the boy enlisted in the Confederate Army. The following morning, heartbroken, the father asked permission of his superiors to give his son a full military burial, despite his enemy status. His request was only partially granted. The Captain had asked if he could have a group of Army band members play a funeral dirge for his son at the funeral. The request was turned down since the soldier was a Confederate. But, out of respect for the father, they did say they could give him only one musician. The Captain chose a bugler. He asked the bugler to play a series of musical notes he had found on a piece of paper in the pocket of the dead youth's uniform. This wish was granted. The haunting melody was now known as "Taps"...used at military funerals was born. The words are...

"Day is done...Gone the sun...From the lakes...From the hills...From the sky...All is well... Safely rest...God is nigh..."

Fading light...Dims the sight...And a star...Gems the sky...Gleaming bright...From afar...Drawing nigh...Falls the night..."

Thanks and praise...For our days...Neath the sun...Neath the stars...Neath the sky...As we go...This we know...God is nigh..."

The United Square Dancers of America's Annual Meeting will be held on Wednesday, June 25, 2003 beginning at 1 p.m. in the Century Ballroom, Westin Hotel, next to the Convention Center, 1 North Broadway, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. Registration will start at 12:30 p.m. and the meeting should end before 4:00 p.m. This meeting is the official annual meeting of the USDA Board of Directors that provides the guidance and direction for the world's largest national square dance organization. The Board of Directors consists of delegates from all USDA Affiliate Organizations. Visitors are welcome but may not vote on items brought before the Board. Voting is reserved for the designated Directors of the Affiliate Members.

This is a great opportunity to meet the national leaders, the USDA Executive Committee Members, the USDA Board of Directors, and representatives from other national and international organizations. You will observe the USDA Executive Committee Members reporting on their activities during the last 12 months and future plans.

The purpose of USDA is to promote and perpetuate the total square dance movement, which includes square, round, contra, clogging, line and heritage dancing; establish a line of communication from the individual dancer to a recognized unified body to make decisions at the national level; provide for education to further the growth and enjoyment of Square Dancing; encourage cooperation between member clubs, state associations, councils, federations, national, international organizations; provide a forum for implementing the benefits of membership and to represent Square Dancing to the general public as a wholesome, enjoyable family type organization. YOUR ROVING CORNERS

Well, we got home from Europe just after April 1st and promptly began dancing in the Santa Clara Valley. We were long time members of the Rafter Rockers and quickly joined them again. We have been having a great time dancing with local callers - we can even understand them! We have danced with Gary Carnes, Ken Carroll, Roger Smith, and Nasser Shukyar so far and hope to get out and dance at your club soon. Of course, we took pictures at the Golden State Round-up this year because Ron and Joann Swanson, who took over the picture taking duties from us when we went on the road, had to be gone.

As we reflect back on our dancing in France, Belgium, Germany (Germany, Germany, Germany) Austria, and England, we are struck by how frequently we danced while on the trip. Of course, we were making the trip for a purpose - to dance with as many clubs as possible, and promote the 54th National Square Dance Convention. It will be held in Portland, Oregon on June 22, 23, 24, and 25 in 2005.

When we campaigned for Portland to accept us as volunteers, they put us on the "publicity" committee, and gave us the title of "Directors of International Publicity." While we were in England, a dancer looked at our titles and said, "If you take the first letter of each word it makes an interesting acronym - DIP! We are the official DIPs for the 54th National Square Dance Convention. Of course, if you haven't yet signed up, we are trying to get registration forms to all the clubs. Don't be late!

In the United States the motto of Square Dancing is "Square Dancing is Friendship Set To Music." We were a little surprised to see a different motto in Europe. They say

"Friendship Is Square Dancing's Greatest Reward." We like both mottos and both are entirely accurate and right. The dancers in Europe were friendly, open, and welcoming.

At many of the clubs we visited, few dancers left before the evening was over - the Germans especially are great after-party goers, but they close the evening by forming a "Friendship Ring." They stand shoulder to shoulder, their arms crossed before them, right over left, grasping the hand of the person next to them. As they sway to the tune (a little reminiscent of "Cruising Down the River") they sing:

The Friendship Song

Let's all join hands in friendship
For every one to see
Remember that a stranger
Is just a friend to be

Hold fast your hands in friendship
For many years to come
This friendship ring will always bring
Good fun for everyone

Reicht Euch die Hand in Freundschaft
Ein jeder sieht es dann
dass auch für Dich ein Fremder
der beste Freund sein kann

Halt fest die Hand in Freundschaft
für lange lange Zeit
dass dieser Ring Euch immer bring
viel Spass and auch viel Freud

Each dancer then turns to his or her right, uncrossing arms, and shouts "Afterparty, afterparty, afterparty!" Great way to end an evening. We will look for you at an afterparty soon!

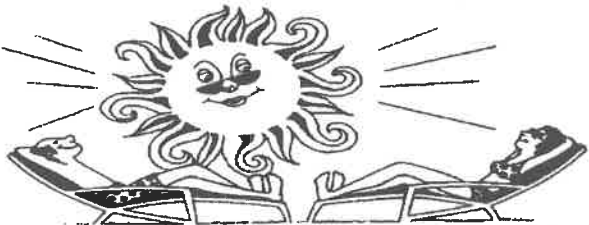
