2ND ANNUAL YOUTH COMPETITION A HUGE SUCCESS!

The 2nd Annual Youth Square Dance Competition sponsored by the California Square Dance Council, Inc.'s Youth Advisory Committee, was held on Saturday, April 26th at the Queen Mary Hotel in Long Beach, CA, in conjunction with the 44th Annual California State Square Dance Convention.

Three squares of youth dancers from all across the state participated in this year's event, which was held during the dinner hour to attract a larger audience. The competition itself culminated a day of preparation as dancers got to know each other and practiced in the convention's Youth Hall with the help of callers Mike Kellogg and Scot Byars. Participants ranged in age from 9 to 18 years old, and came from as far away as Utah.

The actual competition consisted of a 15-minute, timed event. Caller, Andy Shore, challenged the dancers with the first 60 calls on the basic list. Each square had a caller who served as "Judge and Coach", plus 3 timers. As long as the square was able to keep dancing their time continued. If the square broke down timers for that square stopped their watches until the square was reset in "lines" ready to begin again. Once the square was reset, the stopwatches were started again. Special thanks go to Andy and the three "Judge/Coaches" - Tim Pepper, Pat Camathan and Scot Byars. The winning team kept dancing for 14 minutes, 44 seconds of the total 15 minutes, and were "coached" by a very enthusiastic Tim Pepper. The team consisted of Chelsea Owens (12), Vivianne Figures (15) and Preston Silveira (14), all from the Cactus Corners of Livermore, CA; Emma Jellesed (16), River City Rugratz/Overalls, Sacramento, CA; Marc Cavalier (17) Inglewood Guys & Dolls of Buena Park, CA; Apriyl Ameeti (18), Valley Trailers of

Salt Lake City, UT, and Shane Garside (13) of La Crescenta, CA. Dan Silveira filled in for Thomas Figures (12) who was injured earlier in the day. Both are from the Cactus Corners. The winning square received commemorative T-shirts donated by Ben & Lori Goldberg of BLG Designs and passes to the Queen Mary's "Ghosts & Legends" Tour, donated by the hotel.

Other participants in the 2003 competition included Lanette Sweany (14) and Jordan Raynor (13) from the Lads n' Lassies Club in Mission Hills, CA; Mike Beriter (13) and Joseph Bereiter (11) from the Funsters in Walnut, CA; Elisabeth Carpenter (11) from the Sundowners of El Cajon, CA; Heather Figuers (14) from the Cactus Corners in Livermore, CA; Jenny Moffitt (11), Jackie Moffitt (9), Elizabeth Blais (16) and Jessica Blais (12) from the Ramblin Rouges of Mission Viejo, CA; Jordyn Merrill (10), Ruffles & Beaus of El Cajon, CA; Heidi Jellesed (13), River City Rugratz/Overalls, Sacramento, CA; Ashley Parker (13), Manteca Trailblazers, Manteca, CA; and Amanda May (10) from Lakewood, CA. In addition to the judges, several other individuals assisted with the competition, including Jim & Nancy Dillon, Erin Byars, Gregg Duke, Mario & Aileen Farinha, Edie Spiers, Ken Ott, Ben & Teri Jellesed, Bruce Gantenbein, Conrad Pearce, Reid Fähring, and MC/Youth Advisory Committee Chair Bonnie Abramson. Plans are well underway for the 3rd Annual Competition, set to be held in conjunction with the 45th California State Square Dance Convention scheduled April 24, 2004 at Cal Expo in Sacramento. Ultimately, the Youth Advisory Committee hopes to expand the competition to include different dance levels and possibly youth caller competitions. 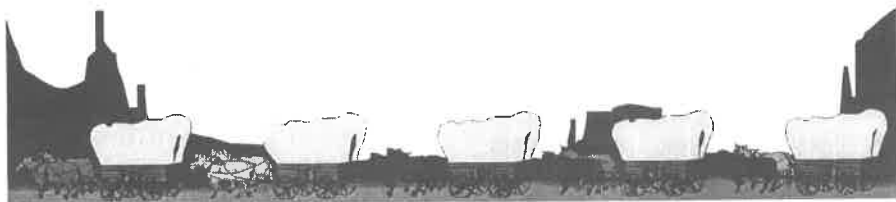

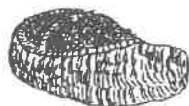

YOUR ROVING CORNERS-IN OKLAHOMA!

Jim and Betsy are roving ambassadors for Square Dance! They recently returned from six months in Europe. Previously they spent nearly a year in China-all Square Dancing! When in the U.S. they live in their motorhome and travel to dance! They have just returned from the 52nd National Square Dance Convention in Oklahoma City on June 25, 26, 27 and 28!

"Welcome to the Heartland!" was Oklahoma's motto for this 52nd NSDC. We were welcomed grandly by the dancers of Oklahoma and enjoyed the convention as much as any we have ever attended, except perhaps the 50th in Anaheim, but that was really special!

Many dancers like to go to weekend "Festivals" or "Specials," and nearly everyone enjoys the occasional Saturday night dance. As true square dance "junkies" Betsy and I can't get enough of these dances. Let me explain.

Square Dancing is fun all the time. We enjoy dancing with newer dancers at their very first class; we enjoy being angels in square dance classes as newer dancers learn; we enjoy club dances with our friends (and with friends-to-be); but, we really brighten up and smile when we go to a "Special". In some places, the regular club night is

dubbed "workshop" and club dancing has that aspect. We always enjoy honing and polishing our dancing skills, but come the weekend we like to dress ourselves up and go kick up our heels!

The very first "National Square Dance Convention" was held in Riverside, California in 1951. Over the years it grew in stature and numbers, hitting the high point in Seattle in 1976, in our bicentennial year. That year, dancers filled a football stadium. Since then, the numbers have gone down, but other dances have gone up. Currently, the NSDC is running 8-10,000 dancers each year.

The National Convention is moved around the country on a "bid" system. The aim is to have a National Convention within comfortable distance of each dancer from time to time, so everyone gets to enjoy a really big, splashy event. Each year a different city comes to the convention with a delegation (committee) and offers to hold a future convention. This year, the city of Charlotte, North Carolina, won the right to stage the convention in 2007! Meantime, the NSDC will be in Denver in 2004, Portland in 2005, and San Antonio in 2006. Several other cities declared intent to bid for 2008 and 2009.

The National Convention is a really big dance. In Oklahoma, nearly 8,000 dancers enjoyed themselves at the Convention Center. There was Square Dancing at every level from mainstream to challenge, every phase of round dance, contra, clogging, and country-western. There were halls for youth, singles, couples, and lots and lots of exhibition groups. In addition to the dancing, there are opportunities for states and organizations to display their successes in the "Showcase of Ideas" and there they also can share their publications. There were dozens and dozens of vendors with everything from records to square dance clothes, to videos, handbags, petticoats, badges, and even arch supports! Each morning there were several "education" meetings dealing with various topics. Despite a limited number of international dancers, there was a room devoted to "International Hospitality." There is always a special entertainment on Wednesday night. Oklahoma was able to get the Bellamy Brothers who entertained at a two-hour show. Of course, the best square dance callers in the world were there. Each evening we were treated to calling by Tony Oxendine, Jerry Story, Larry

Letson, Jerry Junck, Mark Clausing, Tim Mariner, Dee Dee Daugherty, Tim Crawford, Bob Baier, Jon Jones, Deborah Carroll-Jones, and on and on and on! In the Arena, we danced with the Ghost Riders Square Dance Band with caller after caller coming to the mike, calling to a floor jam-packed with happy and enthusiastic dancers. By Saturday night, excitement reached the peak when Grand Square Inc. sponsored the big After-Party, giving popsicles, hackey-sacks, and other door prizes while the callers were singing and calling their hearts out!

Since we normally reside on the West Coast of the United States, we are deeply involved in promoting the 54th National Square Dance Convention in Portland, Oregon in 2005. Officially we are responsible for International Publicity, but invite everyone we meet to come. We believe the Portland convention will be the biggest, best convention in many, many years. After attending all but two National Conventions since 1988, we are ready for more!

Recipe for a Square Dance Club Supreme

To 3 cups of music, 2 cups of callers and 2 cups of cuers, add 4 teaspoons of interest and 2 teaspoons of enthusiasm.

Sift together thoroughly, then stir in an equal amount of activity and relaxation. Add 3 teaspoons of courtesy.

Season to taste with learning, then fold in a generous amount of concentration. Place in a pan well greased with thoughtfulness and lined with respect for personalities. Sprinkle lightly with a sense of humor.

Allow to set in an atmosphere of democratic planning and mutual responsibilities. Bake in a moderate cool oven.

When well done, remove and top with a thick coating of good grooming, served on a platter of friendliness garnished with smiles.

Result: One complete club that will serve any size community.

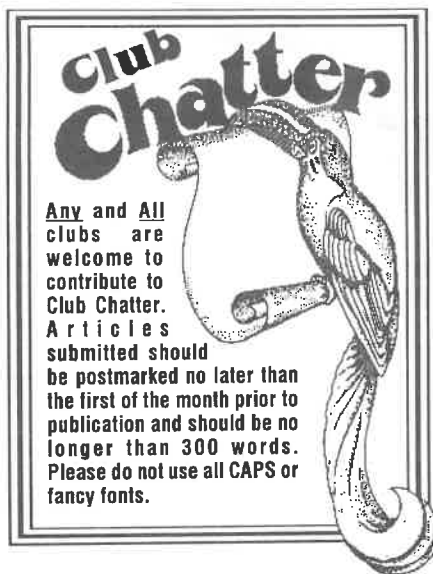
