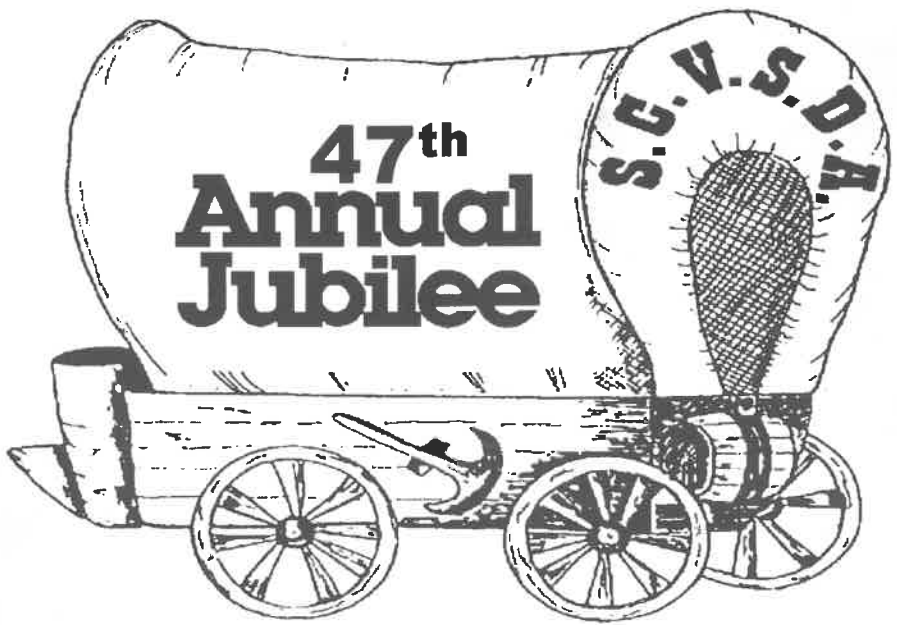


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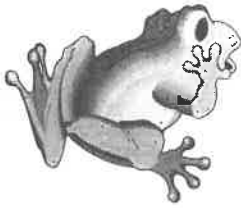

Of course the youth are also invited to participate in all dance programs throughout Jubilee. 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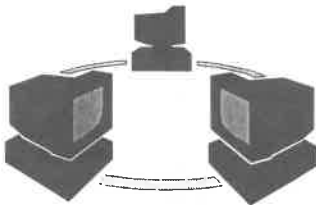
HOW TO STAY YOUNG & HAPPY!

Remember: Life is not measured by the number of breaths we take, but by the moments that take our breath away!

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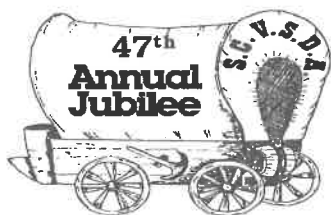

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YOUR ROVING CORNERS

Hello Angels!

We are sure that each of you is working hard as angels in the new classes in your clubs. After all, newer dancers are the life-blood of Square Dancing and if we do not do all we can to attract and support them, Square Dancing will surely shrink and eventually die. I once asked Steve Koppman, famous square dance caller who was making a rare appearance on the West Coast, about the future of Square Dancing. He thought a moment, then responded, "Well, it is too much fun to die, but it will change!"

If we want to see Square Dancing grow and bloom, not shrivel away, we must give it our wholehearted support. We must recruit, host newer dancers, and be angels in the class. Do you remember the fun and excitement when you were learning to dance? It is just that much fun to help others to learn!

We recently learned that one of dancing's most active traveling callers, Bob Baier, has accepted a full time job outside of Square Dancing, which will see to his personal future. He says that he realizes that, as much as he loves calling and Square Dancing, it is not going to take care of him in his old age. He has been forced to drastically reduce his calling schedule and will only come to the West Coast about twice a year.

With the decline in numbers of dancers, he can no longer draw enough dancers to pay him to remain a full time traveling caller. And he is one of the most exciting and fun callers we know.

If we want to see Square Dancing continue, and even grow, it is critical that we attract newer dancers. Each of us must make a new resolution to boost the activity we love.

Now we all know the proven formula for attracting prospective dancers. Everywhere you go, invite people to learn to dance. Personally, we are bringing about 6-8 new prospects to the Fall class of our club. Where did we find them? The grocery store, the doctor's office, a neighbor, a clerk! Wherever we go, we often ask the people we interact with the critical question, "What club do you dance with?" When we get the expected answer, "None" we assure them that all is not lost! We ask them which is their left hand and when they show us, we explain that if you can walk, and tell your left from your right, you can learn to dance! By that time we have seen them walk and know they have all of the minimum requisites to learn Square Dancing.

Keep it light, keep them smiling, and get their name and telephone number. About a week



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or so before class starts, call to remind them. Two days before class begins, call again, offer to pick them up. Pick them up and bring them to club! Dance with them and serve as an angel in the class. Spend as much time with them as you can. The more you can do to bond with them, the better dancer they will become, and you will have a new friend - who knows, maybe a friend for life!

54th National Convention - June 22, 23, 24, 25, 2005

We were very excited to get an email from Australia the other day. Australia has often sent dancers to the National Convention and had a large contingent in Portland in 1994. We expect to see quite a number of them in Portland in 2005 to meet with you. We expect dancers from England, Germany, Sweden, Japan, and even from Beijing, China.

We spent nearly a year dancing with the Chinese in Beijing. We invited them to come. We exchanged emails when we returned. We were beginning to despair because the caller we loved from the Long Marchers

wrote that he had decided not to come. Then we got a message from a member of the club that he and his partner were planning to come. Recently, he wrote to say that he expects between 15-20 other dancers to join him! We believe that the 54th Convention will sport the largest number of dancers from outside the USA in many years. We certainly hope so!

Have you signed up for the 54th yet? The National Convention is annually the biggest party in Square Dancing, and easily the most fun! Oregon will have every level of round, and square dancing, plus western, clogging, contra, and a large number of educational opportunities. There will be an optional cruise to Alaska following the convention, and a "Lewis and Clark Trail RV Caravan" before the convention.

ROUND DANCERS

This is for you!

Dancers should let their leaders know what dances are being done at clubs they attend. Dancers should make a list of dances they would like to learn. Dancers should learn to give and take for the benefit of the group or majority of the club. Dancers should let leaders know if they like or dislike a dance. Don't suffer in silence if a dance is disliked or timeworn - make your feelings known. Advise dancers that the best shoes for dancing should have leather soles and soft rubber low heels. Leather soles offer less friction of the feet on a dance floor and permit easy adjustments and turns. The rubber heels provide a measure of safety on slick floors.

Floor Fright - is a common occurrence with new dancers. The best way to overcome floor fright is by exposure. Get up first, walk around the floor, talk to your partner. Don't stand still or tension will build.

Foot Watching - This adds a confusion factor to the dancers thinking and coordination. Dancers do not have time to stop and think through each step or foot action. Each step must be danced in time with the music and forgotten so that they will be ready to respond to the next action. Foot watchers will observe the status of each foot. The brain translates the desired action into a mental image. Each step is also more complex because of the typical foot watcher posture, imbalance and bounce. Dancers must step in time with the music, responding to their first thoughts. Foot watchers do not watch their feet in any other daily activities.

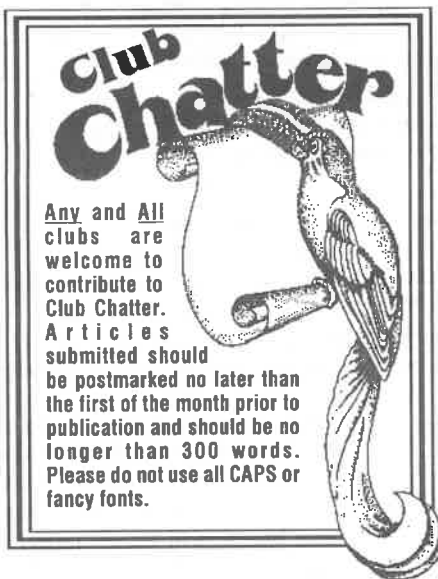
Improvement - Dancers must first accept the fact they may be doing something in a substandard manner and that there may be a better way. Once accepted the dancer is ready to

improve. It is natural to resist change from something that is familiar. A single trial is a poor means of evaluation. A style should be tried until perfected before it is compared with a more familiar material. Avoid hasty decisions in adopting or rejecting new material. Allow adequate time and trials for a thorough evaluation.

Mistakes - Every dancer makes mistakes. Dancers must learn to fake it. New dancers sometimes stop in their tracks when they realize they have made a mistake. This action destroys any change of quick recovery. Once a mistake is made, it is too late to correct; the music goes on; it doesn't wait. Dancers should erase each mistake from their mind so they can concentrate on the next step or pattern. Expect to make mistakes and enjoy your dancing. It's more fun when you don't take your mistakes too seriously. The most important step in any dance or figure is the next step. There is nothing you can do to change the step you just took.

Style - Dancers who wish to improve the appearance of their dancing should give consideration to style. Small steps contribute to good style in all types of dances. Balance and good posture are easier to maintain when steps are small. Mistakes will be smaller and fewer as well. Dancers do not rush as much if they take small steps. Use relaxed body movements in a comfortable manner. Develop your own individual style and enjoy it. Styling should be used to increase pleasure, not to show off.

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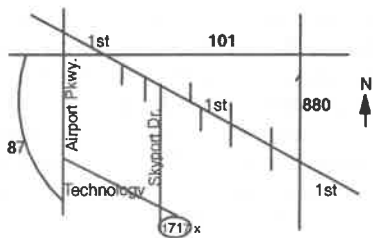

TAM TWIRLERS Of Larkspur

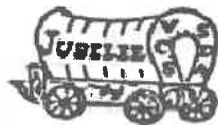

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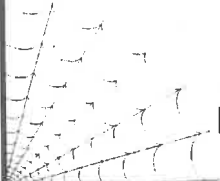

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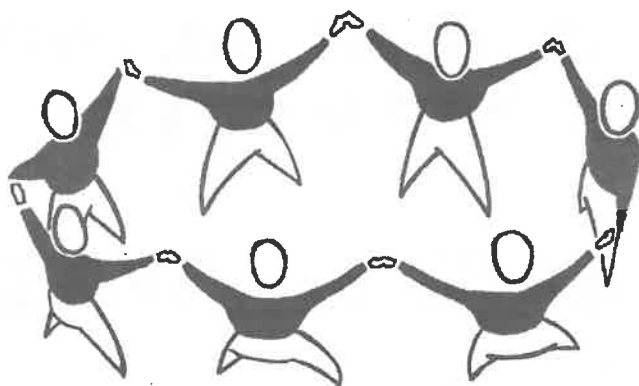
