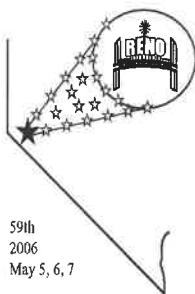

Your Rovin' Corners

Thank your local caller! Of course, all callers are local callers, when they are calling for their own "local" club. Some callers may travel from time to time, or even often. We have danced with many "National" and even International callers. Dancing with the likes of *Tony Oxendine*, *Jerry Story*, *Jon Jones*, *Nasser Shukyar*, *Dee Dee and Randy Dougherty*—oh, the list goes on and on—is great fun. These callers, and many more, bring us fun and good times when they come to town at a "special" or state and national event. These are our stars and have every right to be recognized as such. Each of these callers also calls for one or more local clubs, calling one to several nights a week, teaching, bringing square dancing to newer dancers, and building their calling strength for the other events.

It is the "little" club caller I am thinking about right now, though. The guy or gal who works at a regular job, often 40 or more hours a week and calls square dancing like we dance square dancing. Often one night a week, sometime more. Some weekends, occasionally events away from home. These callers call square dancing because they love it. Many spend untold hours studying and practicing at home.

Let me sing the praises of several callers who have helped me on my journey through square dancing. I am sure that each of you could echo me with other special callers in your life.

My first caller was *Jay Klassen*. He affected the name of "Daddy White Boots," did a comb-over to cover his balding head and was then calling for the Flares and Squares of San Jose. Alas, Flares and Squares are no more, but Jay went on to call for many and various clubs over the years. He left square dancing for a time, moved down to the California Central Coast, and made his way back into square dancing. He was truly a talented caller, patient and passionate about square dancing.

I danced a year with *Johnny Robertson* and the Golden Eagles, also now defunct. Johnny's dancers will remember him for one of his favorite phrases, "follow your nose and follow your toes." Never did really understand what he meant by that. After he retired he ran a fishing camp but he also built a square dance pavilion to continue his calling.

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Gary Carnes was calling with Sunnyvale Singles then. He was my idea of a "great" caller for a long time. I often joke that he was the third caller to "try" to teach me to square dance. Sunnyvale Singles was the biggest singles club in the county then, maybe the biggest club in the country. Certainly one of the most enthusiastic, full of fun people. Sunnyvale Singles has had a number of callers since then, and still is going strong. Gary tells me he will retire from calling in April. It will be a loss to square dancing.

Betsy and I became full time RV travelers about 7-8 years ago, roaming the country and the world and loving the local callers wherever we went. We worked over a year for the 2001 National Square Dance Convention, promoting the 50th National Square Dance Convention. We danced with local callers across the width and breadth of this great country. We met many wonderful callers whose names have faded with the passage of time. This last year we have worked for the 2005 National Convention promoting the Portland convention internationally.

We have made several trips to England and Europe, meeting and dancing with clubs and callers at every stop. Many of these callers are stuck in our memory banks. It was in Vienna where we first learned to "shVing through" (swing through), but *Jake Shimada* from Japan froze the floor when he said "be careful now — ZOAAM!" You could smell the burning brain cells of the dancers before they realized he meant "Zoom" and everyone performed it perfectly.

One caller whose name I have forgotten is the epitome of the local caller. When we called his club contact, the first thing they said was "he is a wonderful caller, we just love him—but he doesn't sing very well." He confirmed it that night, both verbally and in practice. He called on guest callers to do singing calls, or even club members who memorized just one record. His dancers knew that he was a truly great caller because he was passionate about square dancing. He transmitted his passion to everyone who met him.

Our current local callers, *John Aden* and *Mike Burnham* are great too. They both just love what they are doing. John is retired, Mike works a full time job. Both, like so many local callers, pour their heart and soul into our club. We could not pay enough to get someone to do what these guys do for Livingston Texas' Boots and Babes. For very modest pay, they maintain the finest sound equipment, buy music to bring something fresh to the club, help find and promote newer dancers, participate in every aspect of the life of the club.

I could go on and on, but so could you! There is no way we can recognize or praise these local warriors of square dance enough. They give so much, bring so much to our lives.

I guess the most we can do is to thank them, regularly and from the heart.

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For What It's Worth...

On the morning of December 14, 2004, a legend left us: Bill Peters. Although he suffered from Parkinson's disease towards the end of his life, you really never heard him complain. I can still hear that distinct voice of his, clear across the room, a bari-



tone filled with passion and humor.

He was the original "Jazz Man" pioneering styles of music that sometimes even the angels feared to try. Yet, in his opinion, "a caller should never attempt music or a singing call that you don't like – you can't sell it and it's a waste of time."

I have so many memories of him from my childhood: dancing to him at local benefit dances, to

asking him advice about being nervous calling just prior to a national caller. I remember watching him in awe as he whipped out his harmonicas and jammed with the Ghostriders and Dick Ledger at the "Once in a Lifetime" benefit event in Yuba City. Just last year, I was extremely proud to be able to introduce him to a few of my new caller-students at

CALLERLAB. He was a great influence to so many people.

Bill would attend and call at a local benefit dance for the Choo Choo Squares, held in Richmond, California. This group was made up of children suffering from Down's syndrome and various other childhood debilitating diseases. Every year since 1966 I would attend as a dancer. In 1972 while attending Bill's Callers College there was a conflict with his class and the dance. His solution was to hold the class there at the school in another room so that he could attend and call. For Bill a commitment was a commitment and you didn't bail just because it was difficult to schedule.

I believe it was 1976 at Golden State Roundup in San Francisco. I



had just found out that I was the caller prior to Lee Kopman in the C-1 hall. While on the stage, I had looked up and seen Lee standing in the back. I was so nervous, and I was shaking so much that I had to plant my little finger on the needle pad so that I could put the needle on the record (another Bill Peters lesson.) When I conveyed this to him, he simply said that it was natural and that some

callers get nervous even when he walked into the room.

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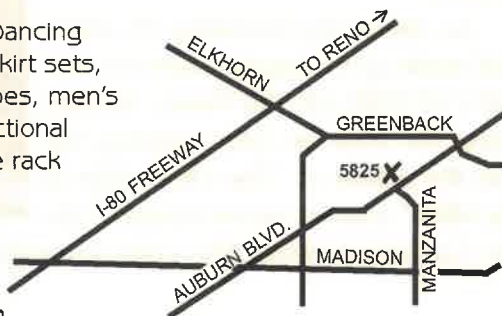
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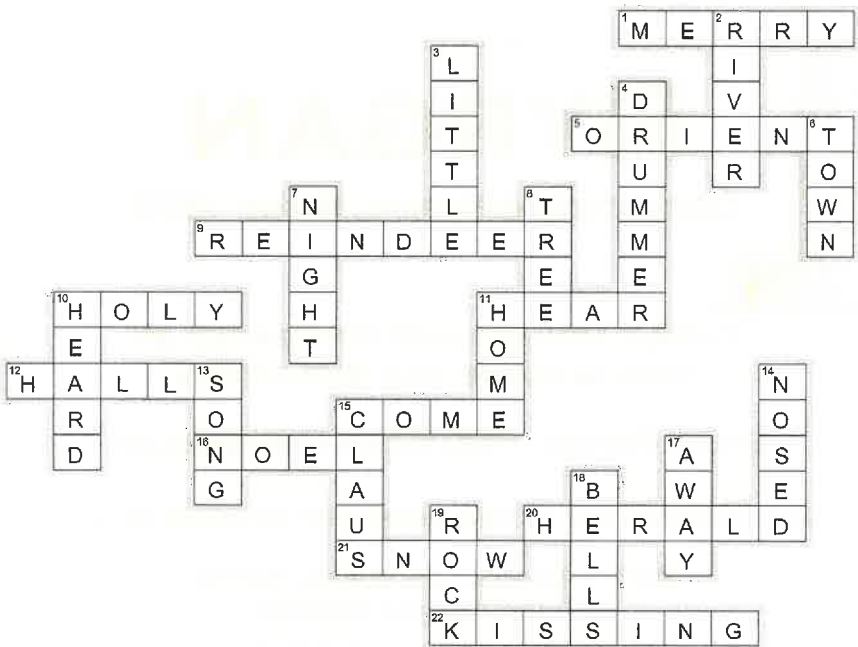

Bill had an opinion on everything and you loved him for it. In my mind I see him in his classic thought process just before he was about to convey his particular bit of wisdom – hands clasped together, finger tips pointing to the ceiling at his mouth, like he was in prayer. He was always on stage, even at home.

As one of the founding 18 callers that made up the organization we now call CALLERLAB, Bill Peters, literally wrote the book on caller training. He was the author of “The Other Side of the Mike” and the seven-volume Callers’ Guidebook Series. He wrote numerous articles for Sets In Order

magazine and served as the editor of the Sets in Order Callers' Text Book. In addition Bill wrote, edited and published a celebrated note service for callers called "Choreo Breakdown" for well over fifteen years. He trained and influenced more callers throughout the world than anyone can count. He was a great performer and an even better teacher; instructing at least one full-time callers' school every year and worked as a faculty member of the Superschool College both East and West.

He was a member of the Board of Governors of CALLERLAB for at least twelve years that I am aware of and served as the first chairman of the Accreditation Committee as well as the Caller Training Committee. In 1986, Bill Peters received the highest award anyone can achieve in CALLERLAB, the "Milestone Award."

Bill leaves behind his gracious and beautiful wife Betty, two children, Linda and Robert, three grandchildren, Katie, Robin and Morgan. He also leaves behind thousands of square dance family members who love him and will miss him. Where Dr. Jack Murtha inspired me to teach, Bill Peters inspired me to Teach the Teacher – for what it's worth, thank you for everything Bill...

RV Camping



RV Campers at the 54th National Square Dance Convention® will have the enjoyment of staying at the Hillsboro Stadium, located 17 miles west of the Convention Center. The stadium is located in an area of fine homes and high-tech business, yet the area is considered “The Countryside” of Portland.

Since the Stadium is located near Hwy 26, there is easy access to this main highway leading into Portland, making it convenient for those who wish to drive into town. Due to traffic and in-town parking, a bus pass is strongly recommended. Bus passes are available on your Registration Form for \$40; after April 30, 2005 they increase to \$50.

Fred Meyers Super Store, Starbuck’s, Baskin-Robbin’s, Wendy’s and Les Schwab Tire Store are all right next door so campers will have access to all their needs within easy walking distance. There is a lovely walking path for walking your dog, as long as you remember to clean up after them. There are a lot of things to see and do in the immediate area if you have someone with you who cannot dance every day or you choose to come a little early and sightsee. The Stadium is available to campers from 6:00 p.m. on Sunday, June 18, 2005, through 10:00 a.m. Saturday, July 2, 2005. The 54th NSDC will be moving out on Sunday, June 26, 2005, so you will need to make arrangements with the Stadium if staying past that date. Those going on the Alaska Cruise following the Convention will have a safe place for their rigs at a different location to be determined by the Director of the Alaska Cruise.

The charge for camping during the Convention is \$20 a day, with a four-day minimum stay. Showers are available during the day from 6:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. daily. This will be *dry camping only!* We are planning to contract for water and dump service on a pay-for-use basis.

Portland’s MAX

MAX is owned and operated by Tri-Met, which also operates the bus system. MAX is a 15-mile light-rail system that runs east from downtown past Memorial Coliseum, the Oregon Convention Center and Lloyd Center to the city of Gresham. It runs west from downtown to the city of Hillsboro. It runs north from downtown to the Portland International Airport. Tri-Met’s service area is divided into three fare

Instructions for Registration

- Print *legibly* all names, your address, city, state, zip code, nation, and ages of youth to ensure correct registration.
- Correctly enter all amounts in Subtotal column, including Registration fee for each dancer and quantity and amounts for all other materials.
- Important!** Daily schedules are only available with the purchase of a Program Book. They will not be available separately at the convention. **Most delegates will want to purchase the Program Book.**
- Correctly calculate TOTAL and include credit card information (with signature), check, or money order payable in U.S. funds to the 54th National Square Dance Convention® with the Registration form. Do NOT send cash.
- A \$5.00 fee *per delegate* will be assessed for cancellation or changes.

Instructions for Housing

- Check the "No" box on the Hotel/Motel Housing required if you are staying in the RV Campground or providing your own housing.
- Check date boxes for each night a room is required.
- Room sharing: The Housing committees does not find or assign roommates. To avoid double booking, only one couple/individual should request the room.
- Those wishing "Same hotel as" *must* send Registration together in same envelope.
- Enclose completed Registration Forms for all persons in a group if the group wishes rooms in the same hotel/motel, and forward not later than Sept. 15, 2004. Include name and telephone number of group leader.
- Indicate 4 choices of housing preference, in order, by specifying hotel code letter. Be sure to indicate smoking and room type preferences. Hotels will be assigned on a first come, first served basis, according to availability.
- Fill out credit card information for hotel/motel deposit and sign. No checks or cash accepted for room deposit.
- Room Deposit and Confirmation** are being handled by the Passkey System, licensed by the Portland Oregon Visitors Association, which allows the Housing Committee to manage room blocks in participating hotels. Passkey requires one night's deposit via credit card. Credit card information will be held by Passkey. Room confirmation will be provided by Passkey.
- Housing Changes:** Any requests for housing changes must be made through the Registration Housing Committee. Hotels do **not** have the ability to honor change requests.

RV Camping

RV camping will be available at the Hillsboro Stadium, about 17 miles west of the Oregon Convention Center. RV camping is **DRY CAMPING ONLY**; there are no hookups. Bus passes are strongly recommended for RV campers.

zones. Fares, which range from 65 cents to \$1.65, are the same for the bus and MAX, and are transferable. For \$1.65, MAX will transport you from the Portland International Airport to downtown Portland, or from downtown Portland to the Portland International Airport. Some of the hotels will reimburse for the \$1.65 MAX ride if you are staying at their hotel.

In the downtown area, there is a 340 square-block area called "Fareless Square". Passengers can ride the buses or MAX free within this "Fareless Square" at any time on any day. The "Fareless Square" boundaries are Interstate 405 to the west and south, N.W. Hoyt on the north and the Willamette River on the east.

The Registration Form for the 54th National Square Dance Convention® indicates hotels located near the MAX line. They are the Doubletree Lloyd Center, Embassy Suites Downtown, Hilton Tower Downtown, Marriott City Center and The Governor Hotel. For dancers staying at those hotels, you will find a sheet of directions located at the hotel showing you the route to the MAX stop. MAX operates from 6:00 am until 1:00 am, every 15 minutes.

These hotels are within walking distance of a MAX stop ("within walking distance" meaning a maximum of three blocks for this purpose.) Convention bus routes WILL NOT service these hotels. 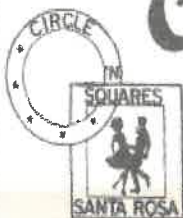
We are looking forward to another good year of square dancing with our friends and new dancers. We will have a Spring Dance in April. Please watch for advertisements and flyers for that dance.

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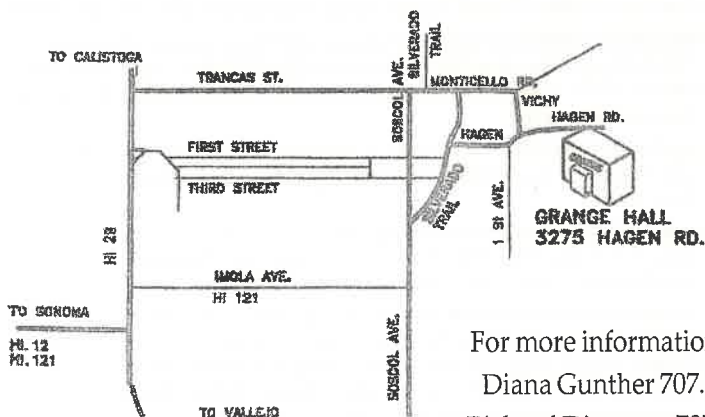
