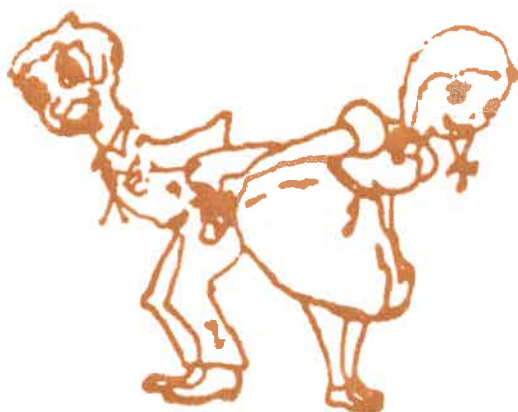

My dad was born in Ogden, Utah on March 04, 1956 and passed away on August 07, 2005 at the age of 49. He was swept away suddenly early in the morning of Sunday, August 7, 2005. A day that will never be forgotten.

My Father was not only a terrific and wonderful Dad, he was also a loving and caring husband, extremely talented musician, the best Volkswagon mechanic in town, and he sang like a song bird. Bill touched so many people across the world with his heavenly voice and beautiful music.

Bill lived life to its fullest. He started square dancing when he was 8 years old, then began calling when he was 12 years old. Square dancing was his ultimate passion and carried it with him until the day he died. My Dad had many passions including his love for the outdoors. In his prime, he loved to climb and successfully "summitted" Mt. Hood, Mt. Rainer, and Mt. Shasta. He also enjoyed rock climbing and mountaineering, and was part of a mountaineering team that had many expeditions up Mt. Hood. Camping and hiking was almost an



every weekend ritual when I was a little girl. Our favorite place to camp was Lost Lake on Mt. Hood; he would even let me help him build the best camp fire. When my dad wasn't calling or enjoying the outdoors, he loved to study astronomy and look at the stars. I swear I have seen more shooting stars since the death of my Father; I think it's his way of saying goodbye.

In 1952, Jim & Dottie Hilton attended square dance classes in the Oakland, California area and promptly fell in love with the activity. After a couple of years of dancing, Jim decided he would like to learn to call and attended several institutes for callers. In the process, he found there was very little sound equipment which would do a good job for square dance callers.

Having acquired a substantial amount of electronic training in the service, Jim designed a sound system for callers and, subsequently, received three patents on the systems. He started his own business in the basement of his home and, as the business grew, moved into a commercial area.

The company was incorporated in 1966 with Jim Hilton as president, Jim Mork as Vice President and Dottie Hilton as Secretary/Treasurer. As the company continued to grow, it was moved to Concord in 1969. still specializes in sales of premium

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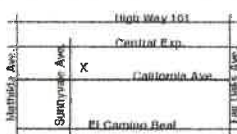
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Your Rovin' Corners

Jim and Betsy have traveled across the US and around the world, dancing and promoting dancing. Each month we share with you our experiences and thoughts. This month we are looking at the 50th Anniversary of the EAASDC, dancing at the IAGSDC, and recruiting and training dancers.

We just love to participate in large gatherings of square dancers! The National Square Dance Convention celebrated 50 years in 2001 in Anaheim, and this year's convention in Portland, Oregon was the 54th.

In 2002 there was a big celebration in England – 50 years of the BAASDC (British Association of American Square Dance Clubs). The 54th Square Dance Convention in Portland was a great success.. Over 8,000 dancers from all over the USA and around the world gathered to dance, shop, learn, and share their love of the activity with one another.

This year the EAASDC (European Association of American Square Dance Clubs) will have their 50th celebration in Germany. Each year the EAASDC holds two large "Jamborees" so that the dancers get to enjoy dancing with some of the best callers in Europe. Often, special callers from the USA will join them. This year, our friend Ingeborg Keuber-Leucker, a caller from Bergheim, near Cologne is head of the organizing committee for the EAASDC. They decided to give it special emphasis.

We met Ingeborg in 2002 on our last big trip to Europe. After we danced at her club, the Bergheim Happy Hoppers, we connected with her again in England at the 50th Anniversary there and invited her to come to Portland. She came to promote the special dance in Bergheim. It will be on the first weekend of September. I hope you get this in time to join us there!

From Bergheim, we will go to Hamburg, one of the hotbeds of square dancing in Germany, to dance with various clubs for several days. Then on to Berlin to meet with friends and dance some more! Then on to Stuttgart to dance with several clubs there.

When we were in Europe in 2002 we enjoyed dancing in Nurnberg and thought we would go there again this year. When we wrote our hosts there, Karin and Earnst Schott of the Kuni Hill Runners, they said they will be away. They are going to St. Petersburg, Russia as part of the "Russian-German Square Dance Friends Club" to work with the first square dance club

in St. Petersburg. They plan to do tourist stuff during the day and dance every night and graduate the new dancers on the last night there. They invited us to join them—how could we not go! We will report our adventures there to you next month.

After the convention we worked our way down to San Jose, California where we formerly lived and where we knew that the IAGSDC was having their annual convention. (For those who don't know, IAGSDC stands for International Association of Gay Square Dance Clubs.) The gay community has adopted square dancing in a big way and our experience is that they are often quite good, high-energy dancers. This year they sponsored a free dance on Friday night with Bronc Wise, Mike Jacobs, and Andy Shore and invited all dancers to join them. Their hall was filled to capacity. It was a great dance and we felt welcomed and well accepted. The IAGSDC website indicates that they dance the Callerlab-specified levels of Modern Western Square Dancing. They also point out that their square dancing is often high energy dancing because many dancers dance both the men's and women's parts, and tend to be strong dancers with an excellent sense of position and set orientation. Their club membership is open to all square dancers and we know a number of non-gay dancers who really enjoy dancing with gay clubs because of the excellent quality of the dancing.

Our experience in San Jose bore this out entirely. The dance rotated between mainstream, plus, advanced and challenge dancing and certainly welcomed all comers. We felt particularly gratified to see so many of our old friends from San Jose who came to the free dance. With callers like this, who would not? One of our friends said he felt uncomfortable with same-sex dancing, but he quickly adapted and had a lot of fun.

Of course, that is what square dancing is all about—having fun and friendship. Our motto is "Square Dancing is Friendship Set to Music," and the Europeans motto is "Friendship is Square Dancing's Greatest Reward."

This is September, National Square Dance month. This is when we traditionally welcome non-dancers to our clubs and introduce them to the fun and friendship of square dancing. If your club has not done enough advanced planning, please look through the back issues of American Square Dance and learn about the many square dance clubs that are being successful, attracting new dancers, and helping our wonderful activity grow.

Square Dancing has seen a decline in numbers for ten years or more, but the numbers seem to be stabilizing and the warm, welcoming, energetic clubs that are actively getting out and recruiting are growing. Your club can as well. Here in East Texas our clubs all plan strong efforts to grow and retain dancers. So can you!

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For What It's Worth...

Picture yourself at a party – you're out there, dancing and having a good time, when all of a sudden the host and a crew start putting chairs and decorations away. The music is still playing and others are still dancing as well. You glance at the clock on the wall and notice that the party was not scheduled to end for another five or ten minutes. What is your impression? Does this put a damper on the end of the dance? I believe that it does. I believe that this sends a message to the remaining guests that you can't wait until they are gone.

This happens with many clubs, throughout the United States. It is not restricted to just club dances. I have seen it done at major festivals. Those of you who do not see this as a big thing need to understand that everything that you do or say reflects on the dance and the club as a whole. If you have a rude treasurer that grabs money out of the hands of your guest, that can put a on damper right at the beginning. In the same instance, the end of the dance is just as important as the beginning. It will be the last thing your guests will remember.

I understand that you want to get out of the hall as quickly as possible. You may even need to be out at a certain time because of money constraints. There are other ways to accomplish a timely exodus without leaving a bad impression.

End the dance fifteen minutes early. There is nothing wrong with this if you announce it in advance. This gives your caller the ability to end the dance on a musical high note and everyone goes home wanting more.

Ask the dancers to help. Erin and I have many times, explained the situation to the dancers, and have asked for their assistance, and they have cheerfully carried a chair or two. If it is announced correctly, no one has ever told us that they minded or seemed upset about it.

Have an adequate clean-up crew planned first. Sometimes in the course of putting together an event we forget the clean-up at the end. It is the last thing anyone thinks about. If you plan the clean-up crew first, it won't be forgotten. I have always believed that more is definitely better than not enough. What happens if you have too many people to clean up? Send some off to the afterparty as hosts.

If our Adobe Squares, Hoedowners or Boots and Belles are in attendance

at the end of your dance or festival, be assured, every single teenager and most of the adults will be there pitching in to help you move tables and chairs, sweep the floor, walk single ladies to their car or whatever is needed. We try to stress to our teenagers that there is more to square dancing than just having a good time. There is responsibility, and we take our responsibilities seriously, for what it's worth...

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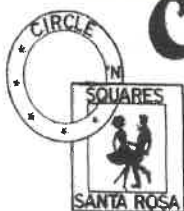

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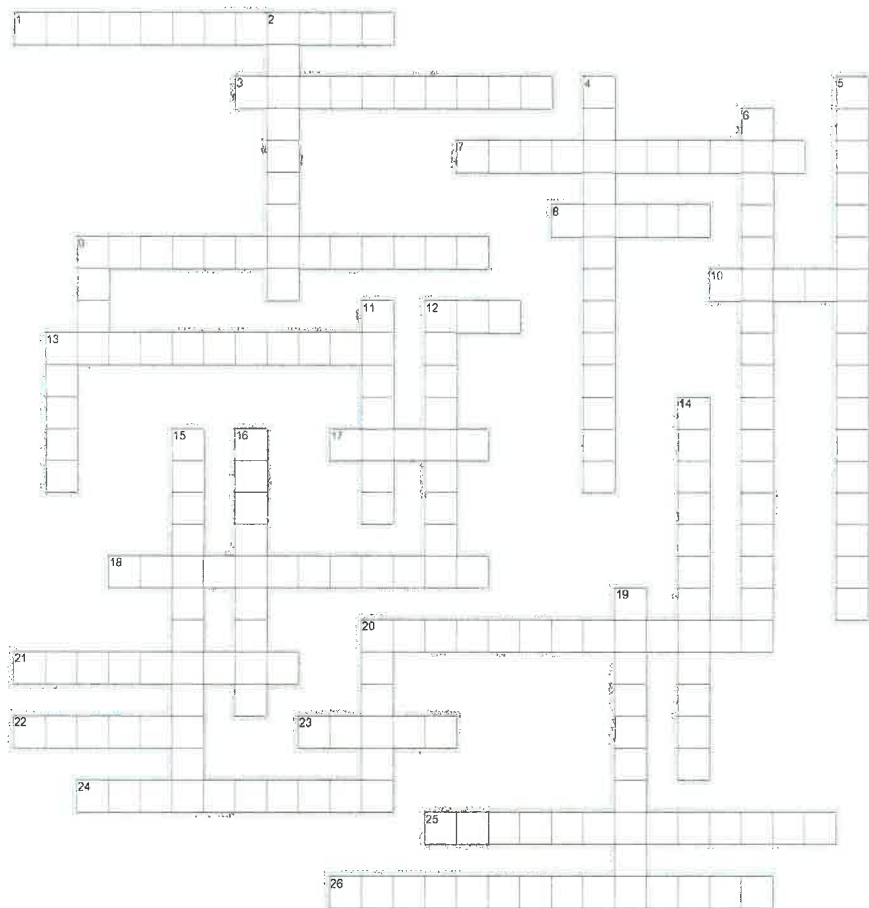

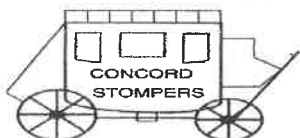

Instructions for Registration (left side)

1. Print *legibly* all names, address, city, state, zip code, nation, and ages (the projected age on June 21, 2006) of youth (under eighteen) to ensure correct registration.
2. Correctly enter all amounts in the Subtotals including registration fee for each dancer plus quantity and amounts for all other materials. If tours are selected, complete and return the Tour Registration Form and payment with this registration.
3. **Important!** Daily schedules are only available with the purchase of a Program Book. Program Books will be sold separately at the Convention. Most delegates will want to purchase the Program Book.
4. Correctly calculate Total and include credit card information (with signature) check or money order payable in U.S. funds to the 55th National Square Dances Convention® and return it with the Registration Form. **Do not send cash.**
5. **ARRV, Camping is Full Hook Up.** Indicate RV Camping on your Registration Form, and enclose the required fees (four-night minimum) to cover the nights that you intend to stay. Please check appropriate boxes. RV camp sites will be assigned on a first come, first serve basis. If you plan to camp together, you must arrive on the same hotel, and forward not later than September 15, 2005.
6. A \$5.00 fee per registrant will be assessed for cancellation or changes.

Instructions for Housing (right side)

7. Check the **No box on the Housing Required** block if providing your own housing, or if staying in an RV area.
8. Check the date boxes for each night a room is required. If you request housing in the same hotel, you must specify the hotel. Do not check the **Other** box.
9. **Room Sharing.** The 55th NSDC Housing Bureau does not find or assign roommates. To avoid double booking, only ONE couple or individual should request the room.
10. Those wishing "Same Hotel as" must submit their Registration Form together in same envelope.
11. Enclose completed Registration Forms for all persons in a group if the group wishes rooms in the same hotel, and forward not later than September 15, 2005. Include name and telephone number of group leader.
12. Indicate four (4) choices of housing preference, in order, by specifying hotel code letters. Be sure to indicate the first choice and the second choice. Hotels will be assigned on a first come, first served basis according to availability.
13. **Room Guarantee:** The 55th NSDC Housing Bureau requires one night's guarantee via credit card. Fill out credit card information and sign. Credit card information will be held by the 55th NSDC Housing Bureau. To take advantage of the special 55th NSDC rates, please book your reservation by May 22, 2006. After that date, the 55th NSDC blocks will be released and the 55th NSDC Housing Bureau will be unable to guarantee your room.
14. **Cancellation:** If an E-mail address is provided on the Registration Form, the 55th NSDC Housing Bureau will provide an acknowledgment via E-mail within 72 hours of reservation being processed. Fax and mailed acknowledgements will be sent within 10-14 days. If you do not receive your acknowledgment in this time frame, please contact the 55th NSDC Housing Bureau via E-mail: housing@sanantoniovali.com. You will not receive a confirmation slip from the hotel.
15. **Housing Changes:** Any requests for changes/cancellations must be made through the 55th NSDC Housing Bureau by: (a) E-mail: housing@sanantoniovali.com; (b) Fax: 210-207-6702; (c) Mail: 55th NSDC Housing Bureau, 203 S. St. Mary's, San Antonio, TX 78205 through June 1, 2006. After this date you may contact your confirmed hotel directly for changes.
16. **Housing Guarantee:** The 55th NSDC Housing Bureau will receive all cancellations on or before May 20, 2006. After May 20, 2006, cancellations received after May 1, 2006 will be assessed a \$25.00 cancellation fee. A one night room/tax charge will be assessed by your confirmed hotel for cancellations received less than 72 hours prior to arrival.
