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"CALLERS ARE HUMAN"

In order to perform any function successfully, immense concentration is required. A tennis player loses his concentration by a movement of a spectator in the stand, a golfer requires absolute silence while putting and even a weight lifter needs to concentrate.

Callers are no different, and a lack of concentration for just a second or two can throw the dancers into turmoil. The Caller's concentration must be retained throughout the entire evening. When he loses that concentration, it results in something less than a well called dance. If it is a local Caller, most dancers will brand him as N.G. and avoid attending his dances. If it is a traveling Caller it is written off as a bad night.

What effect concentration? It can be a hard day at solving problems at work, a traffic jam on the way home, a flat tire, problems at home and most of all a confrontation with his spouse before the dance.

Traveling Callers and some local Callers earn their living at calling, but most Callers have a regular job to attend to and moonlight at calling. This means that they are exposed to all the daily frustrations that go with work, commuting & possible problems at home. If this leaves them with a severe headache, come evening, the show must still go on. All of these affect concentration & have a direct affect on their calling.

Too many dancers are unforgiving and maintain a low tolerance level. Good show or bad, Callers do try harder, and we need to show empathy.

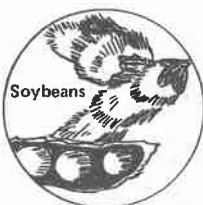

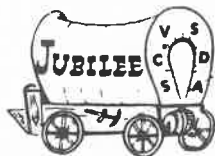

Quarterly Experimental Selection Committee

For the third quarter of 1977, the CALLERLAB Quarterly Selection Committee has selected: FOLLOW YOUR NEIGHBOR and its companion call FOLLOW YOUR NEIGHBOR AND SPREAD. These calls are requested to be workshopped at Mainstream Club level Dances during the months of July, August and September. Please do not use them in your Mainstream Programs until after July 1, 1977. Thanks.

FOLLOW YOUR NEIGHBOR (Deuce Williams 1968)

Follow Your Neighbor starts from Right or Left Hand Parallel ocean waves. On the call, the dancers facing IN step straight ahead to join adjacent hands and Cast 3/4. At the same time, the dancers facing OUT "follow" into their neighbor's position with a 3/4 looping turn (270 degrees) to rejoin the same neighbor with the other hand. Right Hand Waves change into Left Hand Waves and Vice Versa.

It is easy to get into sloppy habits when executing this figure since some callers incorrectly teach the dancers facing out to Run or Fold into the adjacent slot. In the original concept of this call the author was quite emphatic in describing the action - we quote from the source:

"Be sure you realize the correct routine is for the dancers facing OUT to walk in a circular path, actually coming around 3/4 of a full circle and should arrive at the 'finish line' just as the Centers are completing their Cast 3/4. The dancer can time the loop so as not to arrive too soon or too late. Oftentimes we've seen dancers making a little spot turn almost right in place, then having to stand there and wait for the Centers to come around on the Cast 3/4. That is NOT the proper way to Follow Your Neighbor. The 'Loop' method of dancing the call is the way it was designed."

The author also noted that the dancers facing IN should step directly forward to join "inside hands" exactly as we now do in Scootback. This can be either a Right or Left, hands depending upon the starting set-up. From a Right Hand Ocean Wave, all action is Right Handed - dancers facing IN meet with the Right Hand and Dancers facing OUT loop to their Right. From Left Hand Waves all action is Left Handed.

PRACTICE ROUTINES FOR FOLLOW YOUR NEIGHBOR

Start from Squarred-Up Set
Heads Square Thru 4 Hands
Curlique (or Touch 1/4)
FOLLOW YOUR NEIGHBOR
Left Allemande

Start from Squarred-Up Set
Heads Square Thru 4 Hands
Step to a Wave (or Touch)
FOLLOW YOUR NEIGHBOR
Boys Run -- Box Gnat -- Slide Thru -- Allemande L

FOLLOW YOUR NEIGHBOR AND SPREAD. This is a natural extension of the Follow Your Neighbor call. It starts from an Ocean Wave and is executed exactly like FOLLOW YOUR NEIGHBOR BUT, when the "SPREAD" is called for, the dancers who have done the Cast 3/4 will spread apart by sliding sideways to become ends of a new Ocean Wave. Those who have done the loop will move into the center position and become the centers of the Wave.

If this movement is done correctly, there should be no standing around or waiting for any dancers. By adding the "SPREAD" ending to FOLLOW YOUR NEIGHBOR, Right Hand Waves end in Right Hand Waves and Left Hand Waves end in Left Hand Waves.

• **Afraid Of The Big Bad Wolf?** Are you afraid of the cold? The heat? The dark? If so, science has a word for you. According to the Health Insurance Institute, many people have phobias without even realizing it—or being able to spell it. Fear of the cold, for example, would be *cheimophobia*; fear of heat, *thermophobia*; of darkness, *achluophobia*. Other phobias are: *agoraphobia*, fear of open spaces; *arachnophobia*, of spiders; *ochlophobia*, of crowds; and *gamophobia*, of marriage.

What About Callers?

There's another subject that needs defining. This has to do with the various categories into which callers seem to fit. Not that it really matters, because a *caller* is basically one who calls, who has the ability to project his voice to a floor of dancers in such a way that they can follow his directions, both singing and patter, and so that they can learn from his teaching. However, here are some of the types of callers that have emerged over the years. How do your definitions compare with these?

A name caller: One who has established himself; a caller whose name will be recognized more than 100 miles from his home; (popularity-wise) one whose name will attract dancers.

A traveling caller: A fulltime or part-time caller who derives a portion or all of his living from calling and travels at least a portion of the time to cities around the country and around the world in order to call for pay.

A professional caller: (Note that there is very little difference in our book between a professional caller and an amateur. The word "amateur" refers to *one who loves* what he is doing. The term "professional" refers to the respect and attention he devotes to the art of calling.) One who calls either for pay or who donates his services so that others may dance.

A challenge caller: One who is able to and who enjoys calling "challenge" dances; one who specializes in challenge calling and/or teaching challenge movements.

A hash caller: One who excels at improvising or specializes in "hash" type of calling.

A recording caller: One who has been featured on flip side singing call or patter call records with some degree of regularity; one who is part of a lineup of a recording company and appears frequently on their records and in their advertising material.

A home-club caller: One whose primary expression of calling talent is in club dances. One with whom calling is an avocation and who performs infrequently for clubs other than those with which he has an agreement to call regularly.

A class teacher/caller: One who has the ability, patience and intelligence to convert a non-dancer into an accomplished, enthusiastic supporter of the activity.

A one-night-stand caller: A skilled individual who can take a group of non-dancers and entertain them with uncomplicated square dance calling for a period of from two to three hours with the eventual result that many, if not all, want more.

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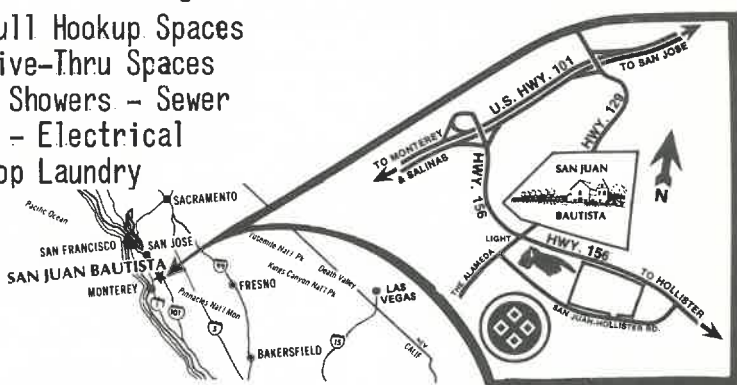
