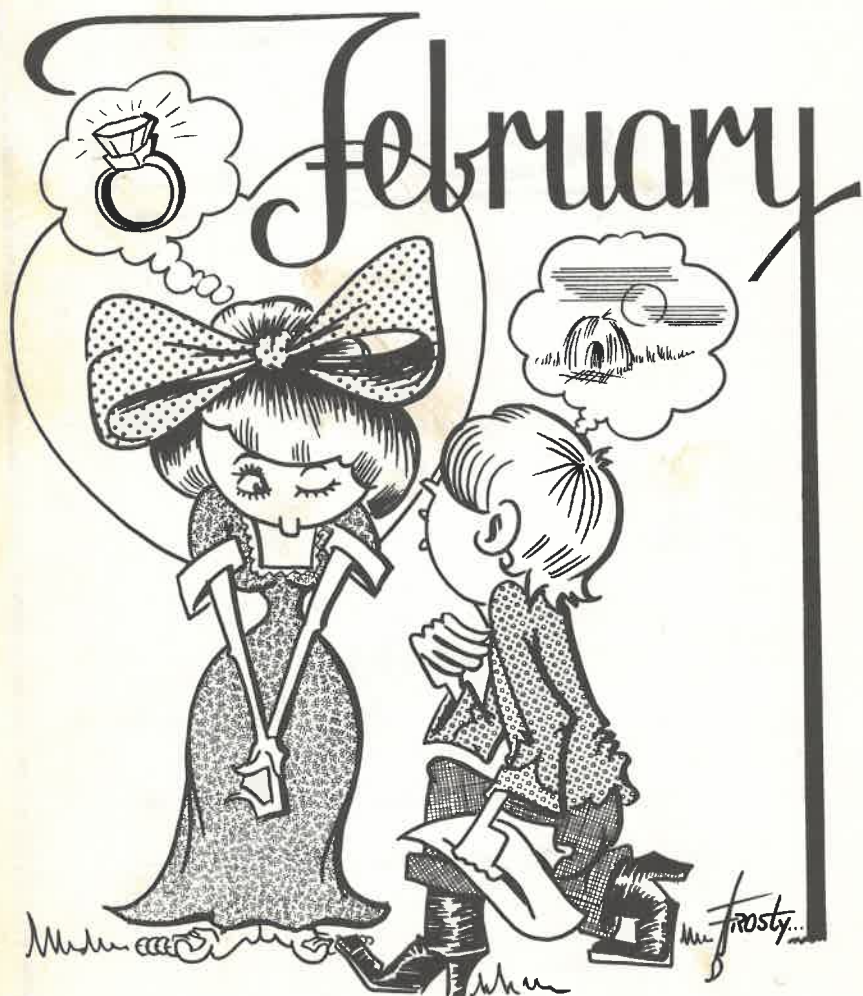

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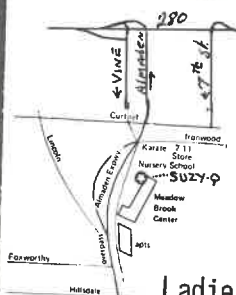

These letters tell me what so many Square Dancers have told me in person as to the way they feel about my articles & Square Dancing today. I want to extend a Thank You to these people for their permission to use their letters and also for writing them in the first place.

Dear Jeanne:

Three cheers to you!!! You are right, we are going in a breakneck speed progress in Square Dancing. We have stopped going to Hoedowns because to often it becomes a workshop instead of a funshop.

Keep up the good work Jeanne. Keep the fun in Square Dancing.

Jeanne:

Your letters of October & November are like a fresh breath of air in a smoky bar-room. Our open dances, the Hoedowns, are rapidly deteriorating into rat-races. It is time for dancers to demand better returns for their money. We are tired of the mixups, the rat-race calling, the frustrations which we get at these supposedly open dances. If the caller wishes to sing, use personal Western slang, Hawaiian accent, or other idiosyncrasy, let him use them at his home club dance, where the members can kick high, spin twice, or three times around, or dance a jig if they desire. After all that is their club and they can do what they wish to do. But when you invite ALL dancers to a Hoedown, use good solid english and do not try to see how many calls you can jam into twenty seconds.

If the squares on the floor, any number of them, are being frustrated, and mixed up, they are not to blame, YOU are. Straighten them out, slow down to 55 miles an hour, give them a chance to enjoy themselves, ALL of them, not only that special square near your callers station, which generally comes from your own club. Do not spring way-out calls on them, such as Relay the Deucy or Flip the Diamond. We paying visitors are with you to have fun and we can have it if you limit your self to reasonable speed, and to the limits of calls generally set for the advertised Hoedown, or other type of dance.

If you do this, you will find your halls more completely filled, and the membership of your clubs will take an upward turn. Reach out and bring back into square dancing those



promising younger dancers, as well as the oldsters. Lets have good fun, smooth dancing, happy dancers. Lets stay away from the rat racing, the faked accents, the out of line calls. Lets enjoy our dancing.

I have been a square dancer for only three years, starting when I was 76 years of age. Mrs. Lawder is my junior by nine months now, we are far from being even club dancers, but we do enjoy our dancing and generally keep up with the youngsters if the timing is right.

Use this note of mine as you wish. Reword it as needed. But it is the way We think, and hundreds undoubtedly think the same. It is exceptional to see oldsters past 55 in clubs, Why?

Keep up your good work something will surely come from it, to the good.

If you want to do plus 1 or plus 2 dancing, you should be willing to put in more than one night a week dancing. It's very similar to playing golf or any other sport. If you want to be good at it you have to practice.

SOAP BOX .. If all clubs that advertise their dances would put in the level of their Hoedowns and the Callers would stick to calling that level and not introducing new movements at open Hoedowns, we would soon find that there would be dances at all levels. The dances would have smoother dancers, with more poise and grace as all the dancers on the floor would be capable of doing the calls used at the dance. It's fun to try advanced dancing, but the place to try it is at a workshop, not a Saturday night Mainstream dance.

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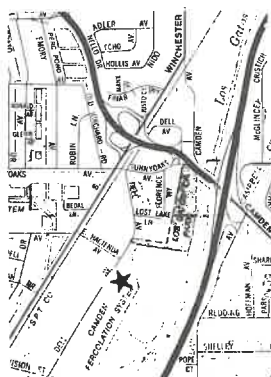

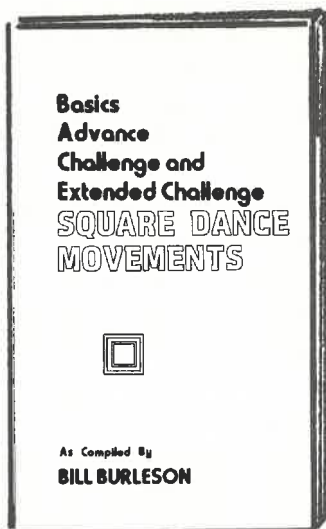

TO DETERMINE WHERE YOU WILL DANCE IN MAXIMUM COMFORT, THOUGHTFULLY AND CAREFULLY GRADE YOURSELF ON A SCALE OF 1 TO 7. YOU, AND YOU ALONE, ARE QUALIFIED TO MAKE THIS DETERMINATION SO BE HONEST WITH YOURSELF! AN AVERAGE OF FIVE OR MORE WILL INDICATE THAT YOU WOULD ENJOY THAT PARTICULAR LEVEL OF DANCING, THREE OR LESS ON ANY OF THE CALLS LISTED WOULD INDICATE THAT YOU NEED MORE DANCING EXPOSURE TO IT AND SHOULD NOT CHANCE GOOFING A SQUARE AT A DANCE LABELED IN THAT CATEGORY.

1. NEVER HEARD OF THE CALL, OR HAVE FORGOTTEN IT.
2. HAVE HEARD OF THE CALL, BUT WOULD NEED A WALK-THRU AT LEAST.
3. COULD DANCE IT WITH THREE STRONG COUPLES TO GUIDE ON.
4. IF IT WERE CALLED DIRECTIONALLY I COULD HANDLE IT.
5. I CAN DANCE IT AS LONG AS THE OTHERS IN MY SQUARE DO NOT GO ASTRAY.
6. YOU CALL IT ... I'LL DANCE IT!
7. I KNOW THE CALL THOROUGHLY, CAN EXPLAIN IT AND/OR HELP OTHERS IF THEY FALTER.

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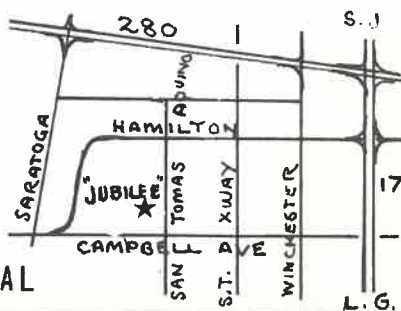

CALLER-TEACHER .. DO YOUR DANCES GET SMILES OR FROWNS? by Jack Murtha

A caller need not be a genius to observe that people learning to square dance vary greatly in the ease with which they learn to respond to his calls. The caller does need to be a genius to figure out how to deal with these great variations among beginners in his classes!

Public schooling has been faced with these problems for years, and many of the profession's finest minds have applied themselves to the task of learning how to help teachers. The results of their research identify many causes of the problems and provoke fascinating discussions about ways to use the facts that are known to help teachers and students interact in classes.

Teaching square dance classes bears an amazing resemblance to teaching a physical education class...or a language class...or a music class...or almost any other class in which students learn their skills from a specially trained teacher.

One concept which has recently arrived on the school scene is called Mastery Learning. Developed as a result of research by several noted educators, the idea has intriguing possible applications to square dance classes. In order to understand the bases of the concept, pretend you are a public school teacher and have been asked: "What percentage of your students are able to earn "A" grades in your classes?" Most teachers will answer that between 5% and 15% of those enrolled in their classes are "A" students.

How about a teacher who says 95% of his students are able to legitimately earn "A" grades in his classes!

Dr. Benjamin Bloom of University of Chicago says that up to 95% of the students taught by Mastery Learning techniques can earn "A" grades. The main difference is in how long and how much quality instruction the teacher provides the student earning the grade. In many school classes, the teacher presents the same lessons to everyone and each is allowed the same amount of time to learn the tasks. At the end of ten weeks, the class ends and everyone is graded. Sure enough there are some "A" and "B" grades, some "C" and "D" and some "F" grades.

What makes the difference between "A" grades and "F" grades? These educators say a major factor is learning rate. some people simply learn given skills faster than others. NOT BETTER--JUST FASTER. Classes are often set up so those who learn most rapidly earn "A" grades and those who learn more slowly earn lesser grades.

.....>>

A principle rule in Mastery Learning is that every pupil have adequate time to earn the "A", or said another way, master the tasks.

Do you recognize the square dance class? We give 30 weeks of lessons, and those who are rapid learners receive smiles while our slower friends get frowns. If what these educators say is true only five out of every 100 class members are really not able to master mainstream square dancing. Bloom would say most class members could earn smiles if we allowed each of them the time needed to earn the top grade.

Mastery Learning involves some fairly simple ideas:

The new dancer must feel he or she can & wants to learn.
The new dancer must have the opportunity to learn which means:

- enough time to learn
- good quality of instruction
- the ability to learn

Unfortunately, there are many problems both in public schools and in square dancing that prevent us from holding Mastery Learning classes. The idea is so logical and simple, but the realization is very complex and difficult. These factors are involved:

Learning rate varies by a ratio of 6 to 1. This means it takes up to six times as long for the slower student to learn a skill to the same level as his most able classmate. If the best dancer in class can master Transfer The Column after 20 correct tries, another dancer in the same class may Quality of instruction is much more a problem for the slower student then for the faster one. The most able learner will learn regardless of whether the quality of instruction is good or poor. The class member who takes longer to learn hasn't a chance if the quality of instruction is poor. Quality in this sense refers to:

- The teacher's ability to properly sequence the order of presentation.
- The teacher's ability to require that each stage be mastered before the next stage is added.
- The teacher's ability to diagnose students difficulties.
- The teacher's mastery of the subject matter.
- The teacher's ability to motivate practice time.

Prior learning and experience. The training and knowledge a new dancer brings with him when he joins the class makes a difference. Perseverance will often outweigh many other factors in determining who masters the skills and who doesn't. Self-fulfilling prophecies influence success. Both teachers and students work hard to make their early predictions come true.

All above are factors verified by research as affecting the student's ability to master a task, skill or subject. The despair of many educational leaders is that even though we know what must be done to allow our students to learn to mastery, not many classes are organized to allow such learning to happen. The same is true in Square Dancing.>>

● **ARE YOU MOVING? SEND US YOUR NEW ADDRESS!** ●
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How well do your class and club members know the mainstream basics? As in school, there must be a system to evaluate how well your students have learned what was taught. There are many possible evaluation techniques, but let me suggest two you might want to try:

Evaluation Idea #1

Step 1 - Dig out the enrollment lists for all the square dance classes you taught or the club sponsored three years ago.

Step 2 - Identify every person who graduated.

Step 3 - Contact each of them to determine if they are still dancing at least twice a month. It doesn't matter where or who with.

Step 4 - Determine the percentage of the class members who are still dancing.

Square dance leaders often quote the statistic that the average dancer drops out after three years. This means that 50% of your class members can be expected to have dropped out. Is your percentage higher or lower?

Evaluation Idea #2

Step 1 - Take the 1976 mainstream premium record put out by Square Dancing Magazine to one (or more) club nights and have the club members dance the bands on the record. Note three of the eight bands that the whole club is able to dance without a breakdown or walk through.

Step 2 - Just prior to graduation, play the same three bands for your new dancer class. Note whether or not they can dance all three bands on the first try without a breakdown or walk through. If so, the class has achieved Mastery Learning.

Step 3 - If not, follow the same process using the extended (75) basic record and/or the basic (50) record from the 1976 series. Determine the level the class has mastered. If the class cannot dance three bands of either record on the first try without a breakdown or walk through, they have not mastered any level of square dancing and may expect some problems at mainstream party dances.

I've written about problems, research and evaluation. If any callers or dancers who read this are interested in suggesting solutions, write to me. I's like to hear from anyone who is retaining over 50% of their graduates for more than three years and from those whose new dancer class can dance three mainstream bands before graduation. We need to gather information from successful classes and share ideas with callers and clubs having problems. If any good ideas come in, I'll write another article to report solutions.

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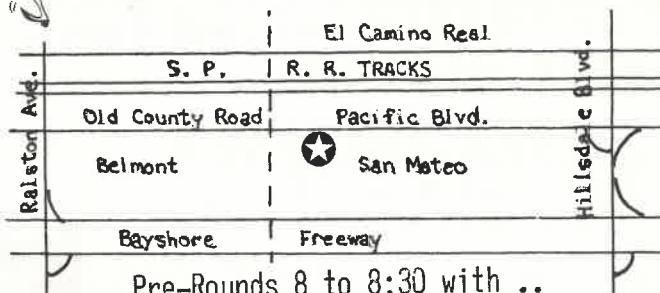

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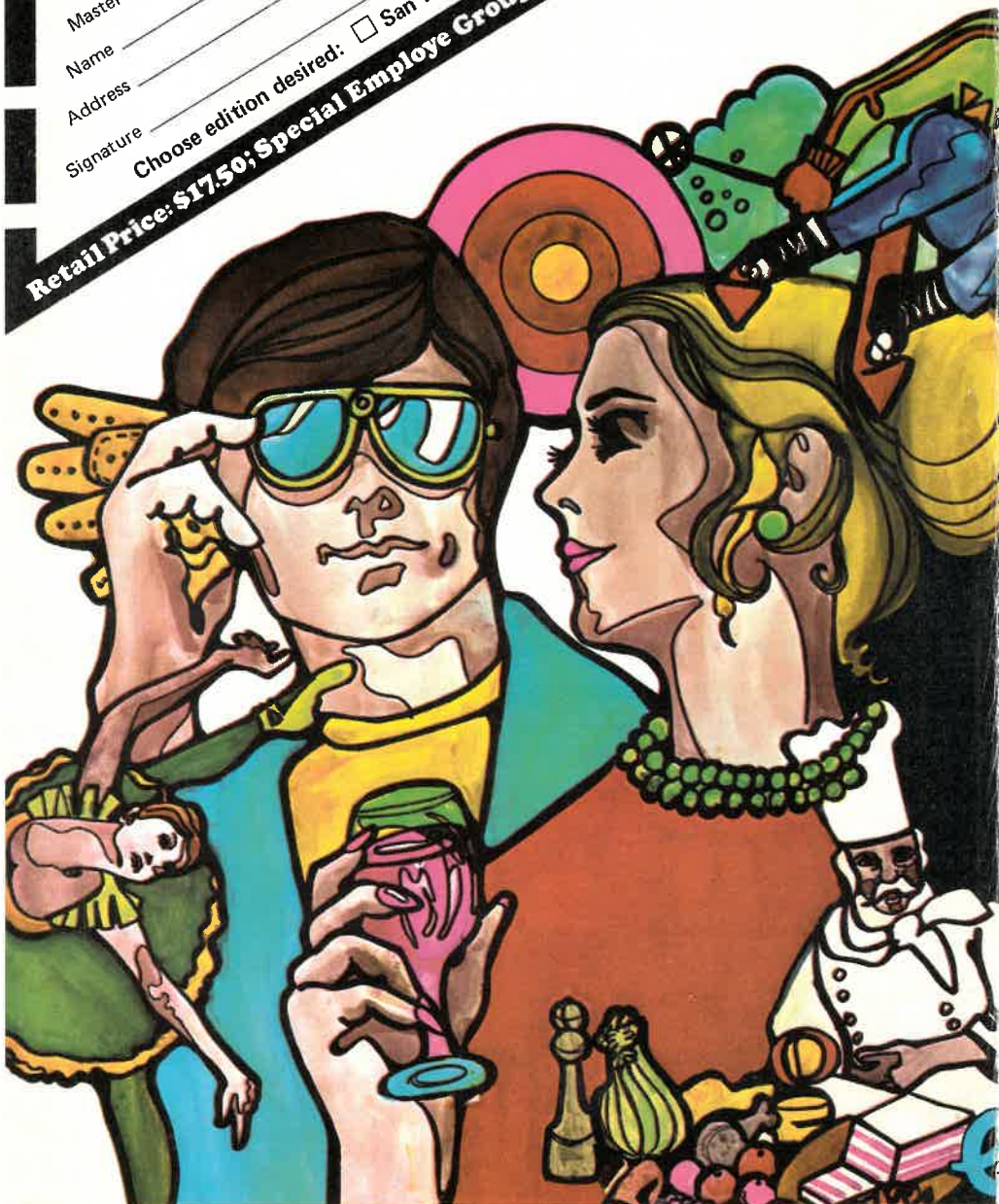
