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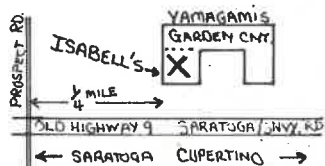

So if you don't have the time you will be much better off staying with the Mainstream, Quarterly Selection, Callerlab program. Many dancers say this is boring! It will only be boring if the Callers do not do their homework and plan a program that has some variety in it. Many plus 1 & 2 figures and some Advanced figures can be called directionally with out giving them a code name ie; Acey Ducey: Ends circulate, centers trade.

Square dancing now is very reminscent of the Folk Dance program in the late forties. Folk dancing was the "In" dance and classes and clubs were overflowing with dancers. Slowly

Would you believe that Folk dancing is growing again in fact some classes are as large or larger than the square dance classes. Is history repeating itself?? Need we say more!!

Hi Everybody! We've had the good fortune to meet many of you at our New Dancers Hoedowns, and all we can say is, "You've come a long way, Baby!" Your Callers are doing a terrific job, and you too! We've never seen better dancers.

Now that we all feel so comfortable walking to the beat of the music, maybe it's time to remind ourselves to use more of a sliding step. You learned that at one of your first classes -- but we all need to remind ourselves from time to time. And remember--smaller steps and tighter squares make for smoother, more flowing and easier dancing.

Another thing we notice is that many Club dancers are going with Class members to Hoedowns. And that's great! They are very helpful -- as well as fun.

You will notice Club dancers doing some little fancy extras that are unfamiliar to you. Many times you pick up styling points just by watching others. Most of these are great -- and do try them. However, if it's something that changes a movement in any way, you would do well to ask your Caller what he thinks about it.

Now let's take the time to get better acquainted with that lovely lady with the smiling face who greets you each Class night. She's the 'Chief Cook and Bottle Washer', your Teacher's good right hand, the Caller's Wife. Generally, she takes registration, brings the coffee, worries about you when you're not there, checks the sound to make sure everyone can hear, helps make everyone feel welcome and comfortable, sets a good example by wearing proper square dance attire, and makes sure the hall is left clean. She's an information service when you forget where you can find square dance clothing, or should you buy long or short sissy pants, or is it more comfortable to dance in boots. Have you ever had to give a breath mint to someone you don't know very well? She has. If you have a question and don't get a chance to ask your Caller, ask her. Chances are she knows what he would tell you. If she doesn't, she won't guess at the answer, she'll find out for you. You think your teacher is great? She knows he is. She's his Chief Fan -- and critic. If she sees something that could stand improvement, she'll remember to tell him later. Your teacher knows how important his wife is to the success of the Class or Club. Now that you've had a chance to think about it, you'll want to thank her for all her efforts too.

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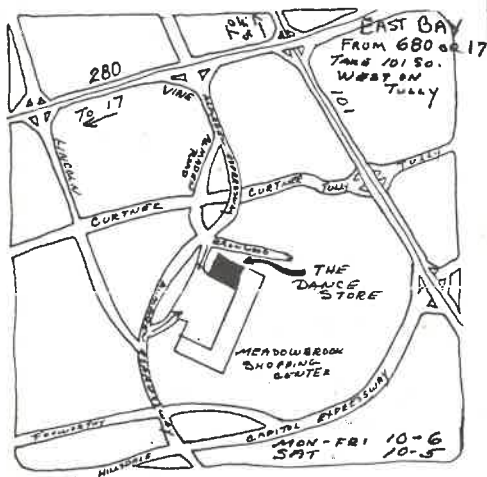

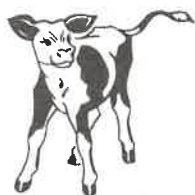

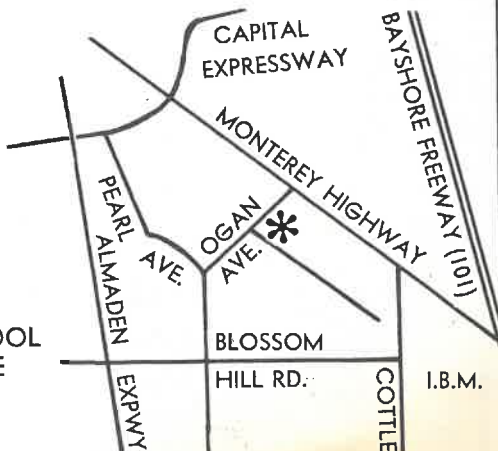

In the 1930's, Square Dancing almost died in our country. Henry Ford preserved some of the old dance forms in his Grand Balls at Deerfield Village. However, the searching out, preserving, and revitalizing of the form of dance known as Square Dancing was a project carried out by LLOYD SHAW, a school superintendent from Colorado Springs, Colorado. His interest resulted in two books, *Cowboy Dances* and *The Round Dance Book*, teenage exhibition groups that toured the country and took it by storm, and the summer classes for prospective square dance callers and teachers. For many years, most of the nationally recognized callers had studied with "Pappy" Shaw.

After his death in 1959, a non-profit Foundation was set up to preserve and promote Lloyd Shaw's approach to square dancing. This national organization annually supplies callers, cuers, prompters, and panelists for the National Square Dance Convention. Its major work, however, consists of producing kits of records for school and recreational use (Special Education, Elementary, Secondary Recreational, and prospective callers how to teach dance. In recent years, the Foundation has also added Summer and Winter Dance Weeks for recreational dancing fun in the beautiful Colorado Rockies.

Membership in the Foundation is open to all, an active membership costs \$15 and brings a quarterly newsletter, a free record certificate, and other benefits. This summer, workshops for graduate credit will be held in Chatham, Ontario, in June, at Bowling Green State University in July, and at the University of Wisconsin in Oshkosh in August. The summer Dance Week will be held July 20-25 at Steamboat Springs, Colorado, and the Winter Dance Week will be held the last week in December at Peace Valley, Colorado.

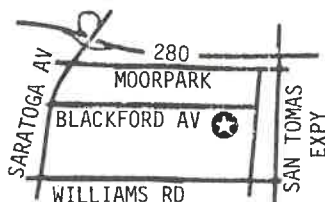

CRINOLINE CARE Nita Smith

Today's accepted square and round dance attire includes bouffant petticoats. Therefore, some general knowledge is needed to help in the care of these garments.

WASHING AND DRYING:

Use Cold Water Soap in Cold water for best results. Washing machines vary, and it is necessary to experiment for best results. Washing time, 5 minutes. DO NOT spin dry! After rinse cycle, remove dripping slip, smooth out all wrinkles in the tiers and lay out in a circle on a sheet to dry. May also place over an open umbrella, or slip may be placed in a dryer on FLUFF DRY ... NO HEAT ... long enough to dry the nylon remove and lay out to dry the cotton top. Fluff drying actually puts bouffancy into the slip.

STORING:

Cotton bags or pasteboard boxes are best for storing slips. Use a gore pattern such as is used in a gored skirt, sew up 4-6 gores, put a heading at the top and bottom, run a string or elastic through ... here is a petticoat tote bag!

NEVER HANG a petticoat between wearings. WEARING And HANGING have the same effect -- the weight of the many yards of fabric pull down and cause the slip to lose its fluff.

AFTER EACH WEARING --- place slip in dryer on fluff dry and leave it long enough to dry out moisture it has gathered from body and atmosphere, and also to fluff out the dust it has collected from the air.

DISCOLORATION AND DYEING:

White nylon may discolor with age. Try WHITE PIT to remove slight discoloration. If white is badly discolored, it is best to tint slip with a color. Liquid dyes work well. Follow instructions for synthetics on the label.

ELASTIC:

Elastic should be replaced often. Weak elastic allows a slip to sag in spots causing it to hang unevenly. It will also make the slip lengthen as much as an inch.

STARCHING:

No way is known to restiffen a slip and keep it stiff. Starch is still the cheapest way and can be satisfactory if experimented with. Try 1 cup Linit starch mixed thoroughly with 1 cup cold water. Pour this into 16 cups Hot water, stirring as you do so. Cover to prevent scum from forming. Wash and damp dry slip. Pour starch solution into washing machine. Swish slip by hand in the starch until it is thoroughly saturated -- 10 to 15 minutes -- remove from the machine, smooth out all wrinkles and dry either in a dryer or by laying out in a circle.
