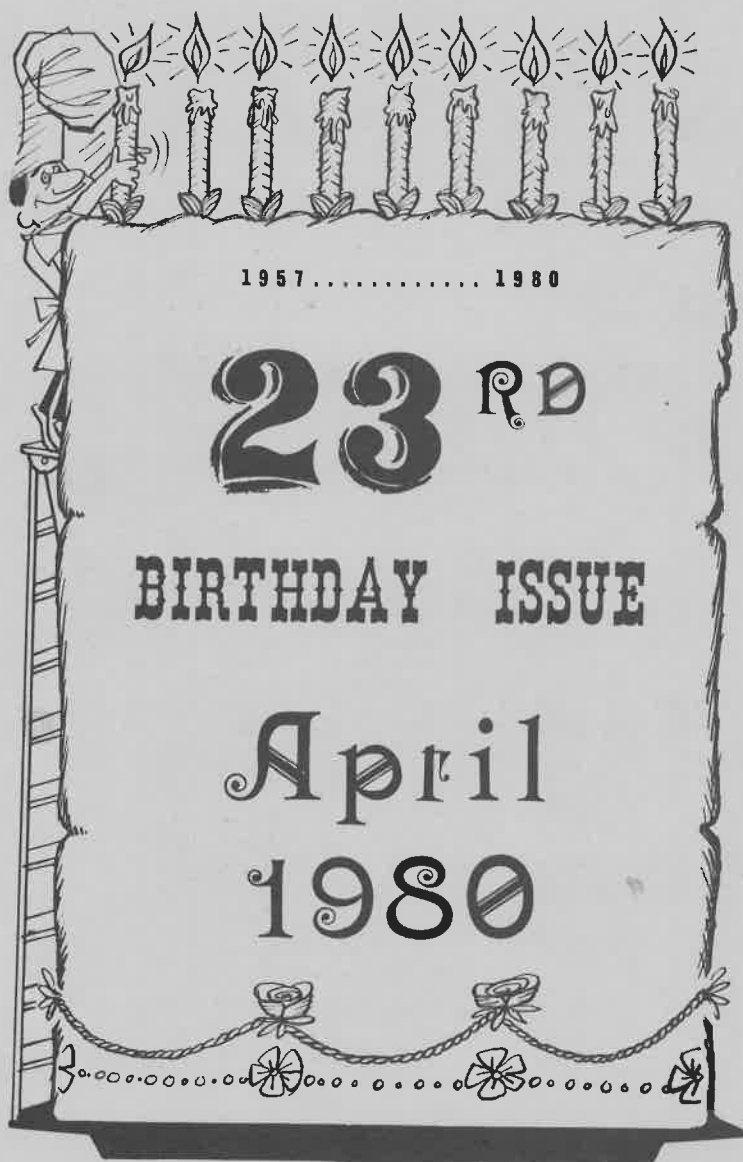


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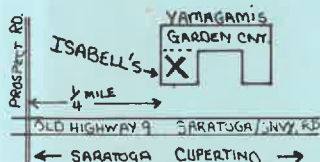

Hi Everybody! As I watch you dance, it gets harder and harder to distinguish the new dancers from club members! At this point in your square dance life, I can only offer you a little guidance. So here are some do's and don'ts I hope will help you.

Do get out to Hoedowns. There aren't too many for your level - so get out to the ones offered. Dancing to different callers is great practice. You'll find that each caller has something a little different to offer. It's the best experience you can get.

One of the nicest things about square dancing is courtesy. I'm sure you've been told most of our "unwritten rules" by now. But some bear repeating.....Never leave a square that's being formed -- even when you see friends forming a square across the floor. Don't talk and prevent others from hearing the call. Be gentle -- with any hand or arm movements. Don't grasp or yank. At the end of the dance remember to thank the caller(s) for the evening of dancing. Remember, it's a team effort, so do your part.

Square dance attire not only looks good, it feels good also. Ladies need those full skirts and fluffy petticoats to make those 'Ladies Chain' and Courtesy Turn' movements look good, and gents need those smart looking western style duds to help them look handsome and hold the ladies gently! When you need a gift for a friend or special person, what better than something for square dancing -- belt buckle, earrings, subscription to Square Dance News, tie, shirt, petticoat, etc.

Do try to dance with as many people as possible. You'll be surprised at how interesting that couple in the next square is, or how good you feel after helping a couple in that last square. Square dancing is friendship set to music. A great part of your enjoyment is the fun of good fellowship.

The movements you're learning now are getting more complicated. Don't worry too much about that. Just come regularly, and with review and repetition they will be as easy as 'Right and Left Thru'. Just remember you are square dancing for fun!

Until we square-up together again--keep smiling!

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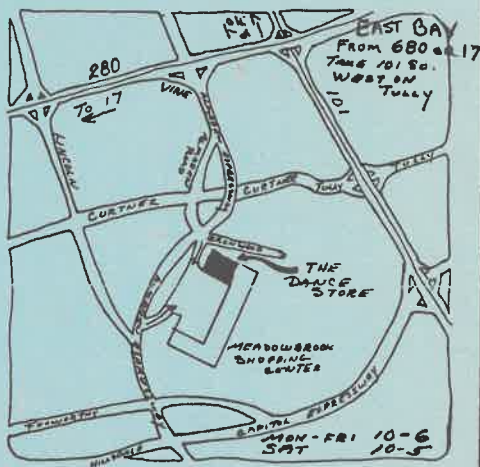

There was a strong feeling of togetherness and purpose as leaders with diversified backgrounds and experience gathered together for the betterment of the entire profession.

A recommended cue sheet format was adopted for a one year trial period. Phases One and Two of Round Dancing were readied for presentation to the CALLERLAB Convention in March. An Educational Committee was established.

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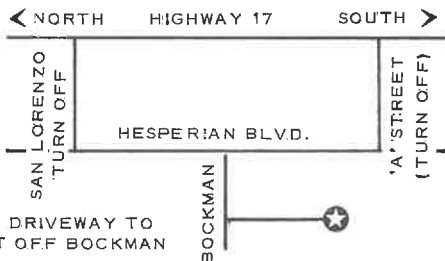
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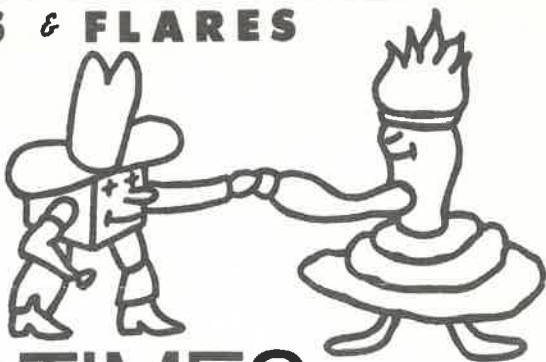

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President's Message

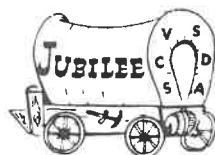
It has been a long time since the dancers of the Association have seen a President's message. Our predecessors mercifully relieved us of yet another monthly deadline by discontinuing this previously regular communication. We have no intention of reinstituting this practice and will instead depend on the good services of newly appointed publicity chairmen Ted and Sherry Erickson.

It has come to the attention of the board of the Association that since the advent of Proposition 13 nearly all of our member clubs have had some sort of difficulty in obtaining the use of a school. The board of the Association, recognizing these problems, has authorized a contact with all the school districts in our area explaining square dancing's case and defining the benefits to a school which the presence of a square dance club offers. There is also a move underway in California State Square Dance Council to engage legal counsel to advise us in our dealings with the many school entities in California.

It is with some concern that your president has received reports in the last few months that some dancers are disregarding the time-honored rule against drinking alcoholic beverages **before and during** square dancing functions. We would hope that those who engage in this practice would consider its effect on everybody's enjoyment before continuing to the detriment of our favorite pastime.

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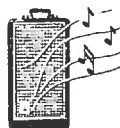

CALLERLAB Quarterly Selections (QS)

WORKSHOP

"Linear Cycle"



For the quarter beginning on April 1, 1980, the CALLERLAB Quarterly Selections Committee has selected one new figure for use during workshops at Mainstream Dances for groups who enjoy trying the Quarterly Selections. The figure has seen quite a bit of action and use since its release and is quite easily handled by Mainstream dancers. The figure was Co-Author'd by Lee Kopman and Dave Hodson and is called LINEAR CYCLE. The definition has been reworded to conform to Mainstream terminology and has been reviewed and approved by one of the Co-Authors. While the definition appears and is described for right handed waves, it can be adapted to left handed waves and for some groups, it can also be used in other variations. For most Mainstream clubs, however, we encourage the right hand wave version

LINEAR CYCLE: In any Right Handed Ocean Wave(s) - Ends and Adjacent Centers Single HINGE, Dancers facing out FOLD, all DOUBLE PASS THRU, AND PEEL RIGHT. Results in facing lines standing at right angles to the starting wave. If done from Left Hand waves, the pass is a left shoulder pass and the peel is to the left.

General Comments: The description allows for the figure to be done from a variety of starting positions including a $\frac{1}{4}$ TAG formation. The timing for the figure should dance comfortably in 10-12 beats although as you gain familiarity with the move, you can do it in less time. This is a comfortable move you can do it in less time. This is a comfortable move if not rushed and the PEEL RIGHT does not seem to bother the dancers. It is the same action as a normal PEEL OFF for the dancers on the right hand side of the DOUBLE PASS THRU. □

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RULES TO PLAY GOLF BY!



RULE 1: A ball rolling or lying near a bunker or sand trap may be played if the player feels he is in need of practice. If a player elects to practice, no strokes other than the first one made in the bunker shall be counted against said player. Should the ball fail to emerge after the making of the first stroke, the faulty design of the bunker is deemed amply demonstrated and the skill of the player should not be penalized for a defect in construction over which he has no control!

RULE 2: A ball striking a tree while in flight shall be deemed not to have struck a tree unless the player making the stroke declares that it was deliberately aimed for. In this case, play shall cease momentarily while his partners congratulate him on his marksmanship. But if the player attests in good faith that it was in no sense his intention to strike the tree, then it is obviously a piece of bad luck that has no place in a scientific game. No penalty shall accrue to the player, who is therefore permitted to estimate the distance his ball would have traveled and to play the ball from that position.

RULE 3: There is no such thing as a lost ball. The ball is somewhere on the course and will be picked up eventually and pocketed by someone other than the rightful owner, thus becoming not a lost ball but a stolen ball. A player suffering a stolen ball shall be entitled to cries of sympathy from his fellow players who shall crowd around him, importuning him not to compound the felony by charging himself with the loss of a stroke. Upon returning to the clubhouse the player shall apply to the professional for restitution of the stolen article since that worthy official always has a large supply of golf balls on hand.

RULE 4: In arriving at the judgment whether or not ground is under repair, for the purpose of lifting a ball unpleasantly situated without penalty, the player shall toss a coin. If it falls, the ground may be deemed under repair.

RULE 5: A putt that rims the cup and stays out shall be deemed to have dropped, since the occurrence shall be contrary to the laws of gravitation which supersede the laws of golf. The same rule shall be in force for balls that pass over the hole and stay out, since it is a well known fact that any object attempting to maintain its position in the atmosphere without something to support it, must drop!

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

Dear Ken:

Your March editorial claimed that advanced dancing is not for the "majority" of dancers because it is too time consuming & expensive. I disagree!

The advanced level is no more difficult to learn than mainstream was. (Some dancers even find it easier as they can draw from their mainstream background.) Classes, or Workshops are readily available, requiring only one night per week of the dancer's time. The workshops, similar to the beginner's class, teach advanced calls and familiarize dancers with the "all position" concept. Typically one to three new calls per week are taught, which does not overburden dancers.

Once the level has been learned, opportunities to dance it abound. Several advanced clubs meet weekly. In addition, advanced hoedowns are sponsored on a regular basis.

The average mainstream "half-life" is three years. Then dancers drop out because they become tired of not learning, bored, or lose their enthusiasm. The advanced movement is prolonging the half-life, and making dancers enthusiastic again. This is an asset to the Square Dance movement, and not a detriment.

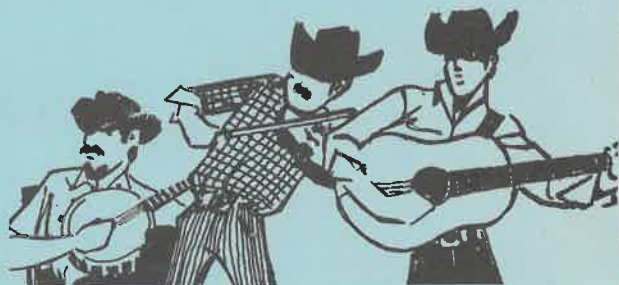
