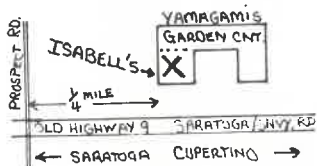

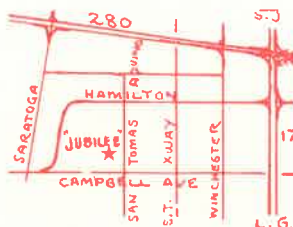

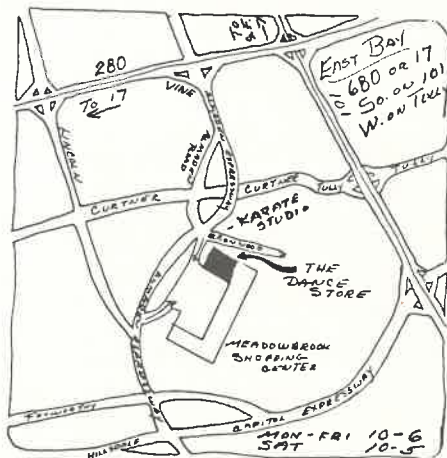

CALLERLAB is pleased to announce another step forward in its continuing efforts to include more callers in its international family. This new category of affiliation is the SUBSCRIBER. The CALLERLAB office has received many letters from callers who say they subscribe to and support the CALLERLAB programs and code of ethics but, for very good reasons, cannot attend the Annual Convention. Others write to inquire about subscribing to CALLERLAB publications even though they cannot become members. Thus, the name SUBSCRIBER seemed to be a double-edged natural. A SUBSCRIBER must meet all of the qualifications for full membership except attendance at a Convention. He/She will receive all CALLERLAB publications which full members receive but will not be eligible to participate in CALLERLAB business by vote or committee assignment and will not be covered by the CALLERLAB group insurance. Dues for the SUBSCRIBER will be the same as those for a full member, currently \$40.00. When a SUBSCRIBER attends a CALLERLAB Convention, he/she automatically becomes a full member, having met all other requirements. When a member is unable to retain full membership by attending one Convention every three years the member may revert to SUBSCRIBER status rather than being dropped. Those interested in becoming a SUBSCRIBER should obtain a recommendation from a CALLERLAB member and send it with their request and dues to CALLERLAB, BOX 679, POCONO PINES, PENNSYLVANIA 18350.

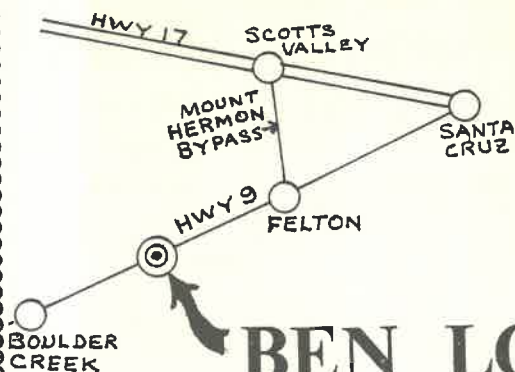

DROP-OUTS DANGER SIGNALS FOR SQUARE DANCING

Over the years, our hobby has had many problems, covering everything from beginners to underarm deodorant. Time and effort by those who put the perputation of our hobby ahead of self interest seems to keep things on course. It's easy to look back and say, Oh!...the good old days when this or that was the thing, gosh, why don't they do things the same way. well, who are "they"? They are you and me, the dancers.

If there are problems in square dancing today, we the dancers are responsible, no one else. I repeat, we the dancers are responsible for our own problems, no one else.

The good old days are still here, and will be here as long as we want them, as long as we have guts enough to be masters of our square dance well being and future.

Some of you may be thinking by now, what is this article all about, get to the point about drop-outs and danger signals. Before getting to the drop-outs and danger signals, let's stir your thoughts with these comments. Have YOU given back to square dancing as much as you have received? Have you carried your share of responsibility for the perputation of square dancing? Have you been a taker and not a giver? Do you help those who make mistakes in your square or your club? So you only complain and hope they go elsewhere or have you dropped out of club and only dance where you know everyone is perfect and will not make any mistakes? Do you make statements like, "It's the callers and teachers who are causing all of the problems, they flood us with so much new materials we can't keep up, why can't they do this or that? Why doesn't Callerlab do something?"

Well do you fit in here some place or are you, as a dancer, doing everything you can to help? Have you ever gone up to a caller after a dance and said, "Thank you for such a good time"? I'm sure you have. However, have you ever gone up to a caller after a dance and said, "I hope the next time you call to all the floor and not just a few as I know you want to do a good job for all since all of us pay the same at the door"? If you have not done this, you are not doing your part as a dancer.

Callers and teachers are guided by praise and complaints and respond to both, and if they can't they will drop-out. You as a dancer, have taken a step to be something a little different than your neighbor, and that step has given you pleasure put you in a roll of being a VIP (very important person) who must depend on eight others to fulfill your pleasure. Think of that a minute. It takes eight others to give you the pleasure of square dancing the other seven in your square and the caller. Without you, they can't function either, so who is responsible for your square dancing future, you are. You are a leader, you are needed. We need your help.

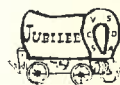

The drop-out problem has always been with us, and until recently was occurring after three to five years of dancing. That situation has now changed very dramatically. The drop-outs are now occurring in the worst possible point of a dancers live, and that is the beginner classes and immediately after. Our compiled reports show over 50% drop-out during class, and of the 50% who finish class, over 60% do not last six months. These facts are real danger signals that must be taken seriously and corrective measures started, otherwise, in a few years our supply of new dancers will be less than those who drop-out through natural attrition.

ARE YOU WILLING TO HELP? WE NEED YOU. Your hobby needs you, will you help us? We believe corrective measures are possible however, we must first analyze the problem. We want you to go back to class, we want you to be a monitor and go through a beginner class again. Only in this way can we fully determine why the drop-outs are so high and from that information we will be able to establish the cause and hopefully, offer good sound corrective measures.

□ ■ □ REPORT ON MIAMI, FLORIDA CONVENTION □ ■ □

From time to time, we watch as our club callers travel on the annual trek to the CALLERLAB Convention in some distant city. Do you ever wonder what goes on at a CALLERLAB Convention? Do you ever wonder what sacrifices your caller is making to provide more enjoyment for you as dancers when returning from the Convention?

There are a host of topics which are scheduled each year at the Annual CALLERLAB Convention ranging from topics on Choreography to routine Committee meetings. There is no such word as free time during the three days of the Convention, however. Most callers pay their own way to the Convention and we try to schedule as much into the available time as possible.

The Convention starts on Monday morning at 10:30 AM and has an opening session followed by five or six concurrent sessions with committees and an orientation session for first timers and those who wish to get updated on recent CALLERLAB actions.

Then on Monday afternoon, we scheduled two 1½ hour sessions on many topics. Six topics at 1:30 and six more at 3:30 with a coffee/tea/coke and Tab break in between. These include some additional committee meetings as well as topics of prime interest to each member of CALLERLAB dealing with the technical aspects of calling and creating choreography.

Then some special interest group meetings at 5:00 and other opportunities for state callers to get together to discuss mutual concerns. Dinner is a slightly more formal affair with presentations for those callers who complete their 25th year of calling as well as awards to those callers attending from a foreign country.

Tuesday dawned bright and sunny but later turned into a real downpour so swimming was curtailed and most had already decided to take advantage of the many outstanding leaders in attendance and scheduled for presentations including most members of the Board of Governors. The first activity scheduled was breakfast at 7:30 AM and then our meetings began at 9:00 AM. Again, we saw six sessions concurrently scheduled for 1½ hours, a coffee break during the morning and then another 1½ hour session to round out the morning.

The afternoon saw two sessions for the caller's partner as well as six additional concurrent sessions. Taxes and record keeping was also a sell out crowd again this year.

The Tuesday night Banquet is the highlight of the Convention because this is when our Chairman of the Board gives his short talk and the presentations of the prestigious Milestone Awards are made. This year saw us make presentations to five outstanding caller leaders through the years. The first was to Benjamin Lovett who was the dance master for Henry Ford during the 20's and 30's. The second Award was to Ralph Page of New Hampshire followed by Charlie Baldwin of Massachusetts

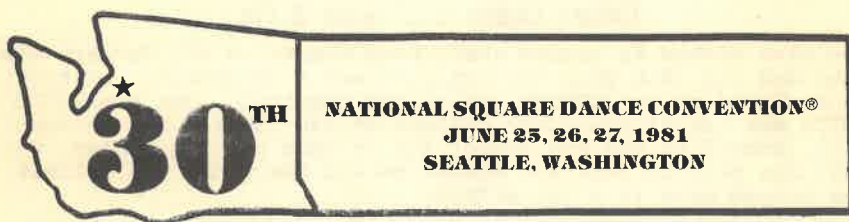

and the New England Caller Magazine. Don Armstrong followed with the final presentations to Jack Lasry both of Florida.

Activities again ceased formally at 11:00 PM and breakfast was again scheduled for 7:30 AM. The final business meeting was begun promptly at 9:00 AM and the meeting included 21 resolutions being passed and three being defeated.

What does it all cost a caller to make this pilgrimage? Airfare of about \$250.00, Hotel costs of about \$240.00, Convention costs of \$95.00, miscellaneous meals, cab fare, tips etc. about \$50.00 and lost booking revenues of about \$350.00 to \$400.00 or a total investment in the future of Square Dancing of almost \$1,000.00 per caller. Are your callers dedicated to improving themselves? YOU BET. Now you know what they sacrifice for you.

The pinnacle of square dancing was reached by the Square and Folk Dance Federation of Washington at Atlantic City in 1977 when the National Executive Committee announced the 30th National Square Dance Convention would come to Seattle on June 25, 26, and 27, 1981.

This announcement climaxed a year and a half of preparation in order to present the bid to host the convention and commenced four years of planning and preparation to present dancers an outstanding event in June of 1981.

Square dance leaders in Washington could not possibly have imagined the magnitude and grandeur of an event such as a National Convention when they banded together in the spring of 1947 with the mutual idea of forming a State Federation of Square and Round Dance Clubs. Since that time the Washington Federation has grown from its initial membership of seven clubs to the present 240 clubs. It is these 240 clubs who will host the 30th National convention using the facilities of the Seattle Center.

Plan on attending and dance where the Square Dance has been designated the official dance of the State.
