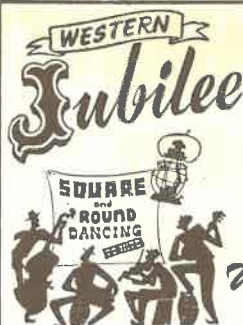

NOTES ON PROGRAMMING

by MADELINE ALLEN

I don't want to alarm anyone, but have you noticed that a lot of us Square Dancers are getting older? Not only that, but so are our husbands. Where once we galloped through a four-hour program with twenty callers and no intermissions, now we rebel. Either we sit out the Rounds, or we skip a few Squares and hide when they call for "one more couple"! Or else we revise our programs.

The present trend seems to be toward two Squares, a rest, and then a Round. At Asilomar, they tried a very short rest and two Rounds, one old or easy, one new or difficult. That gave everyone lots of choice, and no one had to skip any Squares. The Rounds were listed, too, so that you could budget your strength, and try that new one you almost knew, by skipping the old favorite before it.

One thing about us "mature" dancers, though -- our knees may be weak, but our heads aren't. We want smooth floors (no more grass!) and smooth calling and time to breathe, but we still want to be challenged and to have to think. Somebody has said that a High-Level dancer is one who knows more non-directional calls than anybody, and it is certainly true that you can tell who has been dancing more than five years when someone calls "First couple thread the needle". Nowadays, the Callers' Workshop would turn thumbs down on anyone who tried to put over a call like that. In modern dancing, there has to be some sense in what the Caller says, but sometimes you have to do a pretty quick job of analysis, right there on the floor, before you get it. And that quick reaction is what every dancer is building up to, and what he hopes to attain.

When all of us are about ten years older, and want to skip even a few of the Squares, I'm going to propose another change in the program. I want two patter calls together, and two singing calls. Then I can sit out the singing calls that I know, and dance the patter calls, where I have to think.

LET'S GO ON A SQUARE DANCING VACATION

Dear Phil:

We had a swell trip to the Yakima Festival (and back). From Fresno to Wyandotte where we danced in the foothills under the oaks and stars to Tommy Henderson and Phil Hostetler --next day early and beautiful drive up the Feather River Highway past Lake Almanor to Lassen Park (just opened that day) into controlled traffic between 18 foot snow drifts. (Beautiful sight) Past Burney Falls (be sure to stop -- falls coming out of Lava beds. Color gorgeous!)--past Mt. Shasta and Weed and into Klamath Falls. No dance scheduled but don't worry call the B. M. Antles and in 3 hours a "special made to order" dance will be in progress. (Those northern "Eager

Beavers" specialize in making visiting dancers satisfied and happy.)

Continued into Portland -- choice of dances and we chose "Hayloft" one night with the Glen Blackstones being our perfect hosts and "The Barn" next night with Ken Dellinger calling and Helga greeting the guests. They make a swell pair. (Ken is quite interested in how the California Square Dance Associations function.)

Into Yakima for the Washington State Festival Friday and Saturday. Arriving Thursday we scouted the dance locations, as they were scattered over the city in various schools and grange halls plus a street dance. The Yakima group danced in the street and the Seattle group danced in the Washington Jr. High. The other council groups danced in other halls.

We had corresponded with Harriet Hartinger, Secy. of the Wash. Federation (Seattle), Kay Elvert, who prints the State directory around Seattle and the Bloomfields of Vancouver, B. C. We went into the first squares being formed in the street dance and who should we find ourselves with but the HARTINGERS, ELVERTS and BLOOMFIELDS!! (Where is Ripley?) From the street dance we went to the Wash. School -- then Carpenters hall (hosted by No. Central group -- acoustics terrible! So back to Wash. School). We were so adopted by the Seattle group that we stayed right there.

Chuck Jones was his usual funny self during next days work shops and Saturday night the gala affair was held outside in the stadium -- on grass - (Don't let anyone tell you you can dance on grass). However, it was a colorful affair and we enjoyed it very much. Chuck was M. C. and good. Harriet Blohm was "special" guest of honor. The show was stolen completely by the caller of a teen age exhibition group from Vancouver, B. C. She went by the name of Rose -- Her calling is simply unbelievable -- Chuck Jones almost cried he was so completely astonished.

We have now danced from Fresno to Canada and what is our most outstanding impression? Answer: Not since leaving have we seen the couples of a single square rotate, and yet we were taught that is a MUST!

The second noticeable thing was that callers seem to call to and the dancers dance to a set pattern. In many cases if the caller changes the wording of his call or changes a break the dancers stop. Instead of following the caller they say he made a mistake and wait for him to call the pattern as they learned it. (In other words they couldn't dance a hash call.)

At Seattle Doc "Bill" Price took us under his wing and 1st night was Aqua Barn (Joe Hall calling). 2nd night to Bremerton (Bob Wright and Doc calling). 3rd night to Hayloft (Jim and Jinny Brooks) high level right here and we had swell time. 4th night was July 4th and friends put on impromptu dance and chicken dinner (thanks to Slim and Ruth Larsen) so we wouldn't travel on the 4th.

Last night to dance was at Frenches Camp out of Garberville. I mention this because it was a real barn and the

program was handled by Edith Thompson of San Bruno. She is camp recreational director and she dances 3 year olds to 80 year olds. Keeps everybody going -- everybody happy and it is a real treat to those on the side line. Every so often comes "advanced squares only" and she can call real well.

We are now within striking distance of home so we make the dash the next A.M. (But don't be foolish and pass up the spots on your map that are marked "SPOTS OF INTEREST". They usually are just that.)

How long for the trip? 3 weeks to the day. How much dancing? If you read carefully you noticed it was almost every night. How can you stand it? Start at daylight, travel until 3:30 or 4:00 maximum (choice of motels at that hour)--shower at once and sleep until 7:00. You are then fresh. Light salad and to dance. Eat with gang afterward and right to bed.

How do you know where dances are? Read "Square Dance - Where? -- Oregons dance calendar - same with Washington and ask your caller friends where and who to contact ahead. If stuck in a new town go right to police dept. Some of them are square dancers or will find one soon.

We got home just in time for the monthly Association dance. Danced Sunday (2nd Sunday of each month) on the park slab. 3 callers, Earl Johnson, Dos Palos, Cleo Harden, Coalinga, Rod Harris, Fresno - formerly Colorado. 35 squares!

Music: "Mexicali Rose", Windsor No. 7621.

Position: Varsouvianna dance position, both facing in LOD. Identical footwork throughout the dance for M and W.

Measures

- 1-2 BALANCE FORWARD, TOUCH, -; BALANCE BACK, TOUCH, -;
Balance fwd in LOD on L ft, touch R toe beside L ft;
bal back on R ft, touch L toe beside R ft.
- 3-4 STEP, -, CLOSE; BALANCE APART, TOUCH, -;
Part. release both hands after M gives W an initial lead on her L face turn at the start of Meas. 3. In canter rhythm, M steps fwd in LOD on L ft, holds 1 ct, closes R ft to L taking weight on R and turning slightly twd center, while W steps fwd on L and starts a $\frac{1}{2}$ L face turn, holds 1 ct and closes R ft to L taking weight on R and completing $\frac{1}{2}$ L face turn to face in RLOD. Meas 3 ends with part. facing, M facing in LOD, R hands joined. Part. then bal bwd, away from each other, on L ft and at arm's length, and touch R toe beside L ft.
- 5-6 BALANCE TOGETHER, TOUCH, -; BALANCE PART, TOUCH, -;
Both step fwd twd part. on R, touch L toe beside R ft;
both step bwd away from part. on L ft, touch R toe beside L ft.
- 7-8 STEP, -, CLOSE; BALANCE BACK, TOUCH, -;
Again in canter rhythm and releasing R hands after M gives W an initial lead for her R face turn, M steps fwd in LOD on R ft, holds 1 ct and closes L ft to R taking weight on L, as the W steps fwd in RLOD on R ft and starts a $\frac{1}{2}$ R face turn, holds 1 ct, closes L ft to R taking weight on L ft and completes a $\frac{1}{2}$ R face turn as part. take Varsouvianna dance pos. Both then bal bwd in RLOD on R ft and touch L toe beside R ft.

OF THE MONTH

- 9-16 Repeat action of Meas. 1-8.
- 17-20 STEP, SWING, -; RUN, 2, 3; SIDE, BEHIND, STEP; STEP, DRAW, -;
Step fwd in LOD on L ft, swing R ft fwd; start R ft and run 3 quick steps fwd in LOD, R-L-R, pivoting $\frac{1}{2}$ R face on last step on R ft to face wall; as in a "back pas de basque", step to L side in LOD on L ft, step on R ft across in back of L, step in place on L ft. Then step to R side in RLOD on R ft and draw L ft to R while turning $\frac{1}{2}$ L face on R ft to face in LOD.
- 21-24 Repeat action of Meas. 17-20.
- 25-28 RUN, 2, 3; 4, 5, 6; WHEEL, 2, 3; 4, 5, 6;
Start L ft and take 6 quick running steps fwd in LOD, L-R-L-R-L-R. As M moves bwd in a spot CCW turn with 6 quick steps, L-R-L-R-L-R, W moves fwd in a CCW wheeling turn with same footwork, to end with both facing LOD.
- 29-32 WHEEL APART; STAR, 2, 3; 4, 5, 6; STEP, TOUCH, -;
Part. release R hands, W moves CCW around M with 1 running waltz step, L-R-L, as M steps diag. bwd and to R on L ft, steps slightly bwd on R ft and closes L ft to R, to end Meas. 29 with part. in LH star pos, M facing wall. In this LH star pos and starting R ft, part. move CCW with 2 running waltz steps, both facing in LOD. Step fwd in LOD on R ft, touch L toe beside R ft.

REPEAT ENTIRE DANCE FOR A TOTAL OF THREE TIMES

TAG ENDING:

- 1-4 Repeat action of Meas. 1-4 to end with part. facing, R hands joined at arm's length, and bowing to each other.
