Whenever people have been nice enough to tell me that they liked my articles in this magazine, I have been asking them what other subjects of importance to Square Dancers they would like to have discussed. In answer to an overwhelming majority, the subject this month is Short Sleeves on Men.

I have not had nerve enough to take a poll among the worst offenders as to why they persist in wearing short sleeves, when most men do not, but from remarks overheard I have deduced three attitudes. One is that all special dressing for square dancing is for the birds, and other men can try to look like cowboys if they want, but not me. Secondly, there is the excuse that short sleeves are cooler, and if women can wear them, why not men? And lastly, there is the attitude- 'What's it to you?'

Answering number three first, let me speak for all the women I have ever talked to on the subject (and that means plenty of women)-I hate to touch a man's sweaty bare arm. Since square dancing requires arm swings with every man in the square, and since good manners requires being willing to dance with any square in the hall, I can't avoid a bare-armed man all evening, and am forced to suffer and look cheerful. That, I don't like.

Let me say, at once, that not all men have repulsive arms. Some male forearms are nice and smooth and dry, like a bologna sausage. But you can't tell, 'til the pace gets hot, just what is going to develop. Some get wet but not hot, like a raw oyster. Some get slippery and bristly, like a greased pig at a Fair. Some are really fur-bearing, and when they get both hot and wet, the effect is like groping thru the tropical jungles. Naturally some of this slime comes off on your hands, and the next hand grip you take gives your opposite a nasty surprise. As I said, all the bare arms aren't that bad, but when you have met a few, you get so that you hate to take a chance. If you can do it without being actively rude, you dodge a man with short sleeves.

As to being cooler -- well, that is a matter of opinion. Some men prefer to have sweat absorbed, rather than just to let it run. This brings up the question of undershirts for men, which are always worn by the men I know well enough to ask. A thoroughly soaked shirt back is not much more pleasant to touch than a bare arm, and an undershirt does help -- or so I am told.

As to 'Why not women too?' -- the plain truth is that women do not sweat so much, and have nice smooth arms. Again on hearsay evidence, I might add that men seem to like the feel of women's arms. Or are they only being polite?

I hope I have put my case strongly enough to suit those who asked me to write about it. At least, no man who reads this (or has it read to him) can maintain any longer that long sleeves for men are only a question of style, and purely his own business.

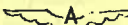

WALTZ TOGETHER

By Eva and Al Lampert, Long Beach, California

Record: "Together"--Columbia 39352

Position: Open, facing LOD.

Footwork: Counterpart throughout.

Measures

Introduction

1-4 Wait 2 Meas. Bal. apart to face partner; together to face LOD

PART 1

1-4 Waltz Out, 2, 3; Wind, 2, 3; Bal Fwd; Bal Back;
Both waltz out diag fwd L, R, L; M takes 3 more steps fwd in LOD R, L, R, and W takes full left face turn (yo-yo) L, R, L retaining same handhold on windup and joining free hands after windup; (cuddle up) both balance (rock) fwd on outside foot; rock back on inside foot; (both facing LOD).

5-8 Unwind, 2, 3; Cross, Side, Cross; Balance Left; Balance Right; Retain hold of W left and M right hands as M steps fwd L, R, L pivoting on L to face RLOD. Rejoin hands with arms extended out to side, as W unwinds one full R face turn out, R, L, R; M steps back on R with slight dip, face partner, step to side on L, cross R over L in front. (W steps fwd L with slight dip, face partner, step to side on R, back on L); both step to side in LOD, M L touch R to L; step R to side in RLOD, touch L to R; W counterpart.

(W also crosses in front); M crosses R over L, touch L to R (pivoting 1/8 R face turn; take closed dance position on cross touch.

13-16 Waltz, 2, 3; Waltz, 2, 3; Waltz 2, 3; Twirl, 2, 3;
3 turning CW waltzes. W twirls R face under M's L arm to open position.

PART 11

17-20 Waltz Out, 2, 3; Cross Under, 2, 3; Balance Forward; Balance Back;

Waltz out diag fwd; change side by W turning L face under her L, M's R arm (Calif. Whirl) 1 full turn into banjo pos. (arms extended out to side) M is now facing RLOD on outside. W facing LOD on inside. M bal fwd on L (W back on R) M bal back on R pivoting 1/4 R face to face partner (W fwd on L).

21-24 Waltz Out 2, 3; Cross Back, 2, 3; Balance Fwd; Balance Back; Open and repeat 17-20 in RLOD. Finish facing partner, M back to center in loose closed dance position.

25-28 Side, Back, Side Cross, Side, Back; Walk Around, 2, 3; 4, 5, 6.
6 step grapevine-Side L, back R, side L, cross R in front of left, side L, back R; walk around in 6 steps in banjo pos making 1 1/4 turn to end M facing RLOD. (Maneuver to closed pos on 5, 6).

29-32 Waltz, 2, 3; Waltz, 2, 3; Waltz 2, 3; Twirl to Open;
3 turning CW waltzes starting first waltz back on L. Twirl to open.

TAG

1-4 Waltz Out, 2, 3 Wind, 2, 3; Balance Forward; Balance Back;

5-8 Unwind, 2, 3; Cross, Side, Cross Twirl, 2, 3 Bow.

Repeat meas 1-6 of Part 1-twirl and bow on meas 7-8.

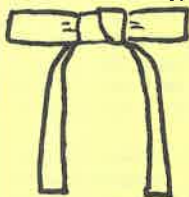
