On Smooth Dancing

by Madeline Allen

Square dancing is always fun, but it is more fun when the other people in the square are what I consider Smooth Dancers. By that I don't mean just 'not rough.' I mean that they do a lot of little things that make the whole square flow more smoothly.

Smooth dancers never stop dancing. If they are not active, they are always moving a little, forward and back, or just swaying, watching the others, listening all the time ready to move the moment they are called. Incidentally, they know when they are called, because they know which number they are in the set.

A smooth dancer always knows who is corner is - not only what color she is wearing, but who she is - and greets her with enthusiasm in an Allemande Left, or when they meet again after a Star figure. Next to his own partner, she is his closest friend in the square, and he lets her know it.

Smooth dancers keep time to the music, both in simple-walk-ing steps and in swings. They swing with vigor, but they know when to stop, and never keep the others waiting for the next figure.

A smooth dancer is decisive in all he does. He leans away in a forearm swing, making it a real swing, not a walk-around. He gives his partner a little start on a Wagon-Wheel Spin, he circles halfway around or once around exactly, he promenades to his original home, and really 'squares' the set. He knows which way to turn to find a new corner, no matter from what angle he is approaching. And if he makes a mistake, he does that decisively too, and then accepts the derision of the others, and does not try to blame anyone else. He is not embarrassed about it -- he figures that's one on him, and next time it will be on someone else.

A smooth dancer may privately know that he doesn't need a walk-thru on a given dance, but he doesn't show it. If the Caller has decided the floor as a whole needs one, he goes along -- after all, someone else in the square may need it. And he keeps quiet during a Talk-thru, for the same reason. In fact, he believes in letting the Caller have the floor.

A smooth dancer ends each square with a flourish, applauds the Caller (or the Square, if they have had an especially tough time), and then thanks the people he has been dancing with as if he meant it. (And here is a word for the Callers--when you tell us to 'pass on thru and keep going' or to 'prom-enade to the wall,' we don't have a chance to thank our Square, and we miss it.)

Of course, really Smooth dancers know the dances, too. Or rather, they know their basics so well that they can follow any reasonable call, and guess at any unreasonable one. They enjoy a dance well done, and they simply love a real stinker honestly loused up by other equally Smooth Dancers. And whatever happens, they go right on having fun, and letting the world know they are enjoying themselves.

HERE'S ED MALKEMUS

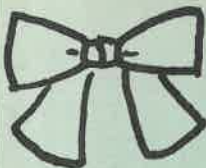
Here comes the Deacon of Square Dancin' hisself. Genuine in spirit, always ready with a joke, beloved to his fellow callers and dancers, Ed is a real asset to Square Dancing.

Born in 1898 in the town of Paloma, Calaveras Co., Calif., loaded with Gold! He saw his first square dancing in the town's rustic barns. It wasn't until 1946 that the bug for dancing struck him in San Francisco at the YMCA. Two years later, he met Ann, a truly, truly sweet gal. The nuptial knot was swiftly tied, and from here on we quote Ed:

"We both felt that the most fun for least effort could be had Square Dancing. So we bought books, records and equipment. After much research and study a course was developed in six lessons composed of 1, basic steps, 2, fundamental movements and 3, positions. I taught squares, Ann taught rounds and our first class developed into the NAPA BUZZ STEPPERS. We alternately directed and M.C.'d that group for almost 5 years. I am as proud of Ann's calling as I am of my teaching. To this day I still use my method of teaching, but we now have retired to the fun of dancing, guest-calling and teaching private classes."

There it is - a vignette of Napa's leading citizen, a swell guy, good caller. Make it a must to go up and see him in the near future.

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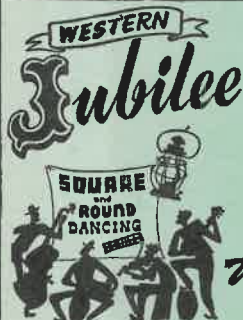
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Sacramento Valley & North News

WALTZ ROMANCE

By Terry and Del Greyell of Seattle, Washington
Record; "Waltz Romance" Aqua Record No. 202
Position; Closed, Traveling CCW around the floor
Gent's footwork given, Lady does opposite.

Measures;

PART 1

- 1 - 4 WALTZ, 2, 3, STEP-TOUCH: WALTZ, 2, 3, STEP-TOUCH
Pursuit waltz (L,R,L,) Step (R) touch (L), gent
now steps back on L to start one measure turning
waltz (R face) to RLOD, step (R) touch (L) hold,
(ct. 3)
- 5 - 8 REPEAT MEASURES 1 - 4, end facing LOD, assuming
open position on last step-touch.

PART 2

- 9 - 12 WALTZ OUT, FACE-TOUCH: BOX THE GNAT, FACE TOUCH
Waltz out (L,R,L) Step (R) at same time pivot 1/2
R to face partner, touch (L) hold (ct. 3). Box
the gnat (stepping L,R,L) face partner. Step (R)
touch (L) Gent controls partner's position on the
floor by holding hands at shoulder height. Dan-
cers now face RLOD.
- 13 - 16 REPEAT MEASURES 9 - 12, end facing partner's
left side to LOD. Join both hands.

PART 3

- 17 - 20 GRAPEVINE LEFT, FLARE: GRAPEVINE RIGHT, TOUCH:
Gent steps L to side, R across in back, L to
side, R across in front, flare by swinging L
foot out and around (on ct. 5 & 6). Now travel
to RLOD by stepping L in back, R to side, L
across in front, R to side and touch L, hold
(ct. 6).
- 21 - 24 BALANCE BACK, WALTZ, WALTZ, TWIRL YOUR GIRL
Gents balance back on L, 2 turning waltz steps,
then take one waltz step in place as girl twirls
stepping L, R, L. Join both hands,
- 25 - 32 REPEAT MEASURES 17 - 24, and assume closed posi-
tion to repeat dance.

NOTE: Record repeats dance three times. To end dance,
gent twirls lady to edge of floor and with his
back to center of floor - dancers bow.

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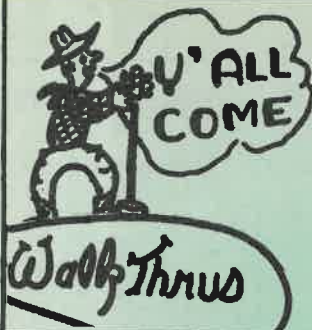
