Dancers, generally speaking, love Callers. They are the Big Shots of the Square Dance world, we couldn't dance without them, and in spite of what we say, we really know that we could not possibly do as well ourselves. In general, that is. But now and then, out there on the floor, we find ourselves wondering how anyone could be so stupid.

'Does everybody know 'Whosit's Whatsis?' he asks. There is a confused murmur from the floor -- did he mean for us to answer if we do or if we don't? 'Well,' he says, 'Maybe we'd better walk it. A ll right -- first and third balance and swing, down the center and split the ring, lady go gee, gent go haw, home you go and swing your Taw, now first and third swing Sally Goodin, swing Grandma, then your corner -- no, no! -- not the ladies, just the gents -- what's that? - Sally Goodin is your right-hand lady -- all right, let's go home and try it again -- now first and third balance and swing, down the center and split the ring --' and so on. Next time around he will have to explain Grandma, so he will go back to the beginning again, for a third time. Does he think people will get over a tough spot easier if he gives them a running start? Or hasn't he ever sat down and figured out what spots may cause trouble? Or doesn't he know how?

This painful scene brings up another gripe -- one reason the dancers can't tell whether or not they know 'Whosit's Whatsis' is because most Callers no longer mention the name of the call they are about to use. Of course, very few Callers use the calls as written any more, either, but usually, buried in the middle of a lot of hash and breaks, there will still be found the bare bones of some call that has a name of its own, and being able to recognize it when it comes is one of the pleasures of being an experienced dancer. There is also the point that in some dances -- 'Riptide' is a classic example -- a moment to collect your thoughts may make just the difference between being able to do the figure, and help the rest of the square thru, and saying afterwards, 'Why, that was Riptide -- we ought to have been able to do that!'

Let's go back to the walk-thru for a moment. A few years ago, at any Open Dance, nearly every square was walked thru from beginning to end, including all the breaks. The reaction to this boring procedure was an attempt to outlaw walk-thrus entirely, with the natural result that no one dared call anything that was not either old and standard or entirely made up of familiar breaks. Gradually a few more recent innovations have crept into this 'safe' area -- new fundamentals like 'throw in the clutch,' and simple figures like 'ends turn in' -- and can now be called almost anywhere. But we have also noticed that the smarter callers have developed a technique of 'Talk Thru,' for unobtrusively giving the dancers a

slight lift over a given spot of difficulty, and this system, which does not take up enough time to be boring, does open up a lot of dances that are fun to do but that do need a little explanation the first time. I am all for directional calling, but a whole evening of squares that can be done from scratch by anyone with eight weeks of square dancing and a fast reaction time, can get pretty repetitious. -- Of course, the Caller does have to know the dancers, and the call, to spot the bad corners in advance.

We talk a lot about 'judgment' when we are discussing Callers, and to me 'judgment' means simply being able to tell what a given bunch of people can do, or can attempt to do with pleasure. (I won't mention the word 'fun,' because that has come to be a synonym for laziness in dancing.) It also means the good sense, if you are a Guest Caller, to resist the temptation to show the regular Caller how fancy you can get, at the expense of the dancers. And it involves knowing your own limitations as a caller, and staying within them.

Here are a few more small suggestions. Have your liaison officer on the floor, and then look at her occasionally, for guidance. Not only that -- when she signals you, believe her. The purpose of having her there is so that you can tell how you and the music sound from the floor. If you think you can tell better from behind the mike, you had better fire her.

Don't race us thru a dance at 150, and then say afterwards, 'I knew it was too fast, but I didn't want to stop and try to adjust a strange set.' Believe me, we'd rather take time for a second start than simply waste the whole call.

If you get mixed up and throw the dancers, break down and admit it -- all the best callers do. None of this 'I guess we'd better walk that part,' implying that the dancers need the help. You may fool the poor beginners, who think everything is their fault anyhow, but us old hands know what you did. A simple 'I goofed!' makes everybody happy.

One last request -- don't get confidential and start crooning into the mike, as if we could read your mind. Webster says, 'To Call -- to talk loudly, to shout, to announce.' Remember, if we can't hear what you are saying, you'd have better stood in bed.

A Grand Welcome to the Superior California Square Dancers Association. Their name is derived from their section known and referred to as Superior California, and is not in any way intended by them as a superlative. They have 13 Clubs in the Association which included Stockton, Lodi, Sacramento, Placerville, Rocklin, and Applegate, and new members registering consistently.

Their first dance (See Adv. Page 28) in Sacramento should be supported by every Square Dancer everywhere to show them their Association is a worthwhile step towards the encouragement and strengthening of Square Dancing.

CALLER OF THE MONTH



Dan Allen

To vote an emissary of Goodwill towards California Square Dancing, Dan would be our man. Travels to institutes, festivals, sessions in every part of our nation. Dan confesses it is at these workshops that Madeline (that renowned columnist) scrounges up the gimmicks for the unusual, basically new squares they write.

Born and brought up in Andover, Mass., then honor-graduated from Yale in 1926, Dan's trek to the West came as a result of the Shrine Football classic, as a member of the East team. In 1930 Dan and Madeline sashayed up to the altar for what has been a happy, fruitful union.

Started dancing in '43 and calling in '49. Dan feels his calling is subsidiary to his dancing and the attempt to promote new dancers. Dan, besides handling Sets In Order news for Northern California, instructs a fine 'teen-aged group in Marin County.

We asked Dan for his thoughts and feelings towards the movement:

"I have agreed with Pappy Shaw that International Folk Dancing and "modern" Square Dancing should be separated as movements, and have tried to promote that idea without hurting either movement.

Square dancing will make you more friends in a shorter length of time than any other hobby I know of, and is an open door to the swellest bunch of people all over the country, as I have found out in several trips. You can go into any group and be accepted as a friend from the start. It is also the only activity I know of in which husband and wife are exact equals."

ROUND OF THE MONTH

THE VELVET GLOVE -- Originated by "Doc" and Irene Heimback, Blue Island, Illinois.

Record: RCA Victor 20-5405 -"The Velvet Glove."

Position: Partners side by side, facing L O D, inside hands joined shoulder high. Steps described for man, lady counterpart. Note: On last beat of introduction, brush left foot forward.

Measure 1: Count 1, step forward on left, Count 2 close right behind left, Count 3 step fwd. on L, count 4, swing R fwd. with slight brush.
Measure 2: Count 1, step fwd. on R, Count 2, close L behind R, Count 3, step fwd. on R, count 4, swing L fwd. with slight brush.
Measures 3-4: Repeat measures 1-2, but instead of brush on last count both hold.

Measure 5: Partners release joined hands, moving away from each other, count 1, step sideways to L on L, count 2, step on R across in back of L, Count 3, step sideways to L on L, count 4, Swing R across in front of L with slight brush.

Measure 6: Moving toward partner, repeat measure 5 and take closed pos.
Measures 7-8: In closed pos. take 4 quick two-steps turning clockwise and moving LOD. At end of meas. 8, open to side-by-side pos., facing LOD, Gent R, lady L hands joined shoulder high.
Measures 9-16: Repeat meas. 1-8. At end of meas. 16, partners face each other with gent's back to center of circle. Gent's R, lady's L hands joined shoulder high.

Measure 17: Count 1, step sideways to L on L, Count 2, step right across in back of L with slight dip (limp step). Counts 3-4, repeat cts. 1-2.
Measure 18: Count 1, step sideways to L on L, Count 2, swing R across in front of L with slight brush, (swing joined hands fwd. and turn to back-to-back pos., gents turns L, lady R), Count 3, (Release joined hands and continue to turn to side-by-side pos. facing RLOD), step sideways to R on R, Count 4, draw L to R, (do not take weight on L, join inside hands shoulder high facing RLOD).

Measures 19-20: Starting L take 4 quick two-steps fwd (RLOD). At end of meas. 20, keeping same hands joined, partners turn to back-to-back pos., gent turns R, lady L.

Measure 21: Partners in back-to-back pos., gent's L, lady's R hands joined. Count 1, step sideways to L on L, count 2, step R across in back of L with slight dip. Counts 3-4, repeat counts 1-2.

Measure 22: Count 1, step sideways to L on L, count 2, swing R across in front of L with slight brush, swing joined hands backwards and turn to face-to-face pos., gent turns L, lady R. Count 3, (Release joined hands and continue to turn to side-by-side pos. facing LOD), step sideways to R on R, count 3, draw L to R, (do not take weight on L, join inside hands shoulder high facing LOD).

Measures 23-24: Starting L take 4 quick two-steps fwd LOD, at end of meas. 24 keeping hands joined, partners turn to face-to-face position.
Measures 25-32: Repeat measures 17-24, but instead of hold on the last count of meas. 32, brush left foot fwd.

Repeat entire dance, and then repeat meas. 1-16. To end the dance lady does two twirls under gent's left arm, four quick two-steps in closed pos., then lady twirls once more, gent bows and lady curtsy.

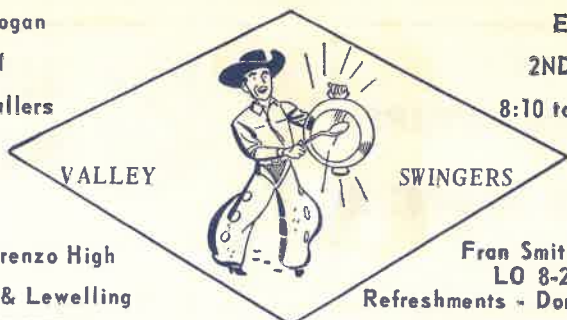

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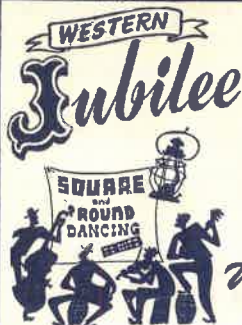

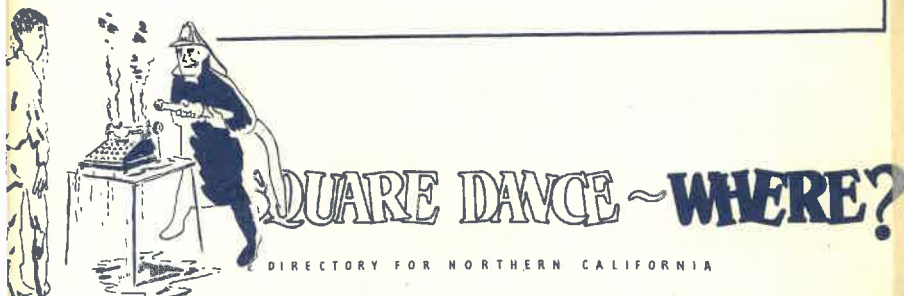
