Why Go To Square Dance Conventions?

First, have you ever been to a big Square Dance gathering? Have you ever spent a week-end with hundreds or thousands of other enthusiasts, dancing, talking about dancing, watching dancing and being watched while dancing? If you have, you can stop right here. You don't need any encouragement from me to go again.

If you have never actually taken the big jump, however, this is the time to start. Right this month, in Fresno, is the ideal Convention for first timers. Far enough away to be a 'trip', near enough not to require time off, big enough to give you that 'lift' I am going to talk about -- the Fresno Convention is tailor-made for Bay Area dancers to start on and I really mean 'start', because once you begin going to big Dance gatherings, each one you manage to make is twice as much fun as the last one, because you know that many more people.

Making friends -- that is the secret. We don't go to conventions any more to learn new dances -- anything good gets spread around too quickly these days. We certainly don't go to get 'high level' dancing -- the level in any big group is never as good as in our own Clubs. We don't even go to hear top Callers any more, because we have plenty of them right here in the Bay Area, besides the ones who call for us on their travels around the country.

But there are two things about a Convention you can't get any other way -- the thrill of meeting new people from all over the country and making permanent friends of them, so that at later Conventions they will be Old Pals and the special sort of lift that comes with any enthusiastic crowd activity -- the feeling of being part of something tremendous and exciting.

To me, there are two high moments at a Square Dance Convention, each based on one of these thrills. There is the moment when you first walk in the door of the Convention Hall, where Pals from across the country that you haven't seen since Tucson or San Diego. We're off! From then on, the excitement builds up until the other big moment at the end of the Grand March, when the entire mass of dancers is on the floor and you can really see what a big thing you are a part of -- only an incurable sour-puss could fail to feel that lift.

Of course, it is perfectly possible to attend Conventions and never meet anyone. You can go with your own square, dance only with people you already know, stay out of the Grand March because your square might be split up and go home and complain about the crowded floor and low level. If that's the way you want it, all right for you. But if you'd rather try it my way, here are a few suggestions.

Go in a bunch if you want to and stay in a Motel together, but the moment you enter the Hall, separate. Agree never to

join a square with more than one couple you know in it. Introduce yourselves and find out where everyone else comes from. If one couple messes up a Cross Trail Thru, you'll feel a lot more sympathetic if you know that they are from some remote outpost in Alaska, where they dance only to Jonesy's earlier albums. Maybe you can be a real help to them and send them back home with records and books and a determination to take up Calling themselves. Maybe the guy who pushed you thru a new figure isn't just a loud-mouth -- if you only knew it, maybe he wrote the darn' thing. Did you read his name-tag? (That actually happened to me -- ask me about it.)

After you dance with a couple, take a second look. Will you know them again? Try it later in the day. See how many you can really place, with some special thing about each. One couple travels in a trailer, from Convention to Convention. One teaches Square Dancing to blind people. One has just come back from Japan, where he danced with the Emperor's brother. One couple is just moving into your area, from across the country. Tell them about your dances and especially about 'Square Dance Where?' (Plug)

Here's another suggestion. Listen carefully to all the new Callers you will hear and if you like anyone especially, make a point of finding him and telling him so. This applies not so much to the visiting Big Shots, although they like to be complimented too, but especially to the local Callers who may never have called to so many people before and who have been shaking in their boots for months just thinking about it. Give them a little encouragement, even if you have to stretch a point -- who knows, maybe next year that same nervous guy will be the big Star and will be glad to see you! This is just another way of collecting friends.

I have mentioned the fact that you can't expect to learn many new squares at a Convention, but you can learn other things. There is usually a new hit Round Dance you can learn and introduce at home. Callers can pick up little gimmicks to surprise their Clubs with and their wives can get ideas for new dresses. Dancers always seem to come home with new quirks of styling, some good and some bad, but all entertaining. After all, dancing is pretty much alike all over the country now, but there are still a few differences.

If you are with me so far, keep right on. If you enjoy Fresno, why not try Phoenix in February? Then in April there is the National Convention in Oklahoma City, the biggest of all -- pretty far away, but worth it. Of course, wherever you go you will keep reminding people of our own Golden State Roundup, so that when it rolls around in May you can qualify for the double enjoyment of welcoming a lot of Old Pals you have met in different places and being hosts to them on your own home grounds. -- By that time, you should be really bitten by the Convention bug and ready for the Summer Institute season. Lastly he should shy away from the stigma of Professionalism, consider calling a hobby. Irregardless of all the above I sincerely believe most of us enjoy being Callers."

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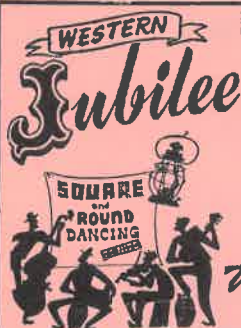
