How High Is Up?

What? Levels again? This time, though the news is good. The Bay Area is finally progressing to the point where a dancer has a choice of several different 'levels' on any given Saturday night and there are enough dancers to go around, so that all levels can continue to operate. All that remains is to perfect the system of suiting the dancers to the dance, so that everybody will be happy.

If there were any way of rating dancers on a sliding scale (which Heaven forbid!), it would be apparent that the normal curve obtains as usual -- the greatest number of dancers would be in the middle, with a few extremes at each end. At the bottom would be the beginners, who are still in classes or have just graduated and also those who are just naturally slow to learn or may not really care to bother. In the middle would be the great mass of dancers, who all know about the same amount, but maybe not the same things -- they may make mistakes, but not all the time, or always the same ones. And at the top you would have a smaller group of dancers who, either because they have danced longer or are faster learners have reached the point where they think themselves so good that they dare the Caller to stop them. The ideal programming would separate these groups, for their own dancing pleasure, because they don't want the same things.

Obviously, the beginners want encouragement. They are feeling their way and they want to be led by the hand, walked through everything and then allowed to dance with confidence what they have learned. They don't want to be surprised -- practically everything about square dancing is still a surprise to them. They are crazy about the music and the rhythm and are ready to be entertained by the simplest things. All they want is to be allowed to go on dancing -- they are the ones who want a third tip and who will dance all night. A Caller who understands what this group requires can really make a hit for himself.

The middle group are the real Square Dancers and they want some of everything. Variety is important and the newest calls and just enough surprises to keep them listening. This is the level where most people stay and for that reason it should probably not be called 'intermediate'. That word implies that it is a stage through which dancers are supposed to pass. Call it 'Middle Level' or 'Fun Level' or just plain 'Hoedown Level' -- most of the open dances in any area should and do cater to this group.

There have been so many cracks taken, this past year, from all over the country, at 'High Level Dancers', that it is very hard to be impartial about them. In the absence of 'Elimination Contests' such as they have in Australia, where a single mistake forces a whole square off the floor and survivors are awarded A's, there is no way anyone can become officially a 'High Level Dancer', but a dancer may classify himself as such by issuing a general challenge to the Caller to throw him if he can. (Nothing pleases a High Level Dancer more than the spectacle of the Caller trying so hard that he throws himself instead -- as happened to all the Callers at a well-known Hoedown last month.) Some whole clubs are organized for this special purpose -- Callers are invited and are asked to do their best, or worst, let the chips fall where they may. Occasionally an open dance has been attempted at this level, but seldom successfully -- dancers who do not feel this way just can't believe that anyone really wants to spend the evening struggling, so that they come anyhow and either they are unhappy or the Caller has to change his approach for them and the others are unhappy. Just being an excellent dancer does not make you a High Level Dancer -- you have to be spoiling for a good fight, too.

The point of all this is that all these types of dancers will have a better time if the level of the whole floor is fairly even. It is very encouraging to see how many new Hoedowns are appearing, advertised as 'Beginners' or 'Walk-Thru-Level'. Anyone reading 'Square Dance Where?' (and why not?) can easily pick out a dance in that category that would be a safe bet for him. But when you get to the next stage, the picture is less clear. It may be that, so far, there are really no 'High Level' dances being advertised -- that all regular Hoedowns fall into the middle class, near the bottom or the top, but that no group has quite made up its mind to come right out and say 'Unless you are willing to trade punches with the Caller all evening and Devil take the hindmost, don't come.' As long as there was no choice of dances on a given night, this was probably just as well--the Caller waited to see who turned up and called accordingly. This meant that the same dance would be very fast one month and very slow the next and there was no way of telling ahead of time. This was not too important -- it was the 'only game in town', so if you wanted to dance you had to go.

Now, however, when there is a choice, maybe it would pay for the clubs sponsoring Hoedowns to try to be more specific as to the sort of dance they really want to have and then advertise it that way. If the Caller, or Callers, knew what they were expected to do, and then did it, regardless of the number of dancers present who would rather dance faster or slower, each Hoedown would gradually build up a reputation that would attract the very dancers who would enjoy that level the most. That way, everybody would be happy.

- 1-4 STEP-SWING; STEP; CROSS: DIP:
Step L, swing R fwd; step fwd on R: pivoting R on R cross L in front and step on L; with M's back to center of circle, dip back on R (W dips fwd on L) into closed dance position.
- 5-8 WALTZ LEFT; 2; 3; 4;
4 CCW (L face) box waltzes making one complete revolution to end in open dance position facing LOD.
- 9-16 Repeat Measures 1-8
- 17-20 STEP-SWING: BACK-TO-BACK, TOUCH, --, STEP-DRAW: STEP-DRAW.
Step L, swing R fwd; step fwd on R, turning back-to-back and touch L instep to R heel; step back in RLOD on L, draw R back to L taking weight on R; step back again on L, draw R back again to L but keep weight on L. M's R and W's L hands remain joined during this and pointed fwd and up.
- 21-24 STEP-SWING; FACE-TO-FACE, TOUCH, --; STEP-DRAW: STEP-DRAW.
Step R in LOD, swing L fwd and turn face-to-face; step L in LOD, touch R instep to L heel. Take closed position, M's back to center. Step back on R in RLOD, draw L back to R taking weight on L; step back again on R, draw L back again to R but keep weight on R.
- 25-28 BAL. BACK; TURN A HALF; BAL. BACK; TURN A QUARTER.
One hesitation balance back (M steps back on L touch R by L); one waltz turning $\frac{1}{2}$ CW (right face) so M's back is twd wall; A hesitation balance back (step-touch): one waltz, but turning only $\frac{1}{4}$ CW so M faces LOD.
- 29-32 BALANCE BACK; WALTZ; 2; 3:
One hesitation bal, back (step-touch); with M starting fwd on R. 2 CW waltzes making 1 full turn and moving slightly fwd in LOD and opening out to starting pos.

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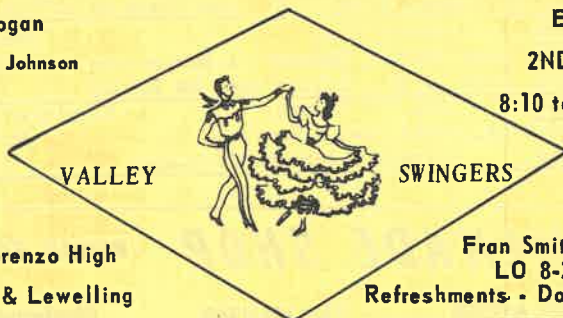
