On Summer Institutes

So you went to Fresno and you had a wonderful time, just as I said you would, and of course you are going to the 'Golden State Roundup', right here in our backyard. But summer is coming, and you've heard a lot about these Summer Institutes, and people at Fresno were talking about meeting there, and you want to know more about them. Are they really fun? Are they just like a Roundup only more so? And how do you stand the pace for a whole week?

The main difference between Conventions or Roundups and Institutes is that the weekend affair is a sort of two-day party, with a combination of big-name callers, out-of-town guests, and local callers and dancers. At least half of any weekend meeting is made up of the people who live near enough to come to most of the events without making any special effort, even if they cannot attend them all. They are the same sort of dancers we see every week at our own clubs, only more of them. But when you go to a week-long Institute somewhere, on your vacation, the same group gathers at the beginning and stays through the whole week, and the number of local people is very small, as they are not allowed to drop in for separate events, but must sign up for the whole course. This means that the group is made up of leaders from all over -- people who care enough about it to come a long way, make reservations a long time in advance and spend a whole week on it. A lot of them are Callers and teachers, many are organizers and Club officers, and others are in recreation work. There are also a few just plain dancers, but not many. Even those few will usually be planning on taking back a lot of ideas for their whole area.

The result of this high concentration of leadership is that every minute is interesting, even when you are not dancing. Everyone has something to contribute, and some experiences to share. Meal times are especially valuable, and the bull sessions after dances. And you have time, in five or six days, to make permanent friendships, just as you would on shipboard. In fact, there is a lot of the same quality about a Summer Institute that there is about an ocean voyage--the same sense of being cut off from ordinary life, being thrown together with a new group of people, sudden friendships, unexpected group fads and activities, and a warm, relaxed receptiveness toward everything and everybody.

There are Institutes all over the country, now, and they come in all price categories and all degrees of comfort, with or without children, with one leader or with many. As an example, let's take Asilomar -- not only because we know it best, but also because it seems to us the best one to start with, for California dancers.

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At Asilomar you take your children with you, sign them in, and forget them. There is a separate program planned for them, there is all the beach and woods and swimming pool they want, and there are separate tables for them where they are served first. They even seem to put themselves to bed at night without supervision. Maybe the Asilomar breed of children is just superior. Anyhow, they come from six on up, and they all love it.

Of course, the location of the Asilomar Institute gives it a lot of advantages. It is always cool for dancing, even in August, and the pine trees and sea air make you feel wonderful. It is nowhere near a highway, but you can drive into Monterey in a few minutes. The quarters are simple but not primitive, the beds are good, there is enough hot water, and the food is superb.--(I like to camp, all right, but when I am dancing I like lots of hot showers, and plenty of room to hang clothes.)

If you did nothing but stay a week and dance, in between eating and sleeping, you'd have a wonderful time and be glad you'd come. But at the risk of sounding too serious, I am going to stick my neck out and add something else we always feel about Asilomar, as well as some other Institutes we have attended. We come away feeling re-dedicated to the cause of spreading Square Dancing, so that as many people as possible can share the good we have found in it. There is something about being in the company of people who are so convinced of the real values of the movement that they are making a career of furthering it, that can't help but be inspirational. These are people who have never lost their first enthusiasm for Square Dancing -- who have never put the financial profits above the benefits shared, and who are still concerned first and foremost with making Square Dancing a better thing than it already is, and are just hoping to be able to make a living

while doing it. For those of us for whom it is a hobby only, Asilomar is liable to send us home thinking about what we can do for Square Dancing, rather than what Square Dancing can do for us.

Now -- if you are still going, after all that -- here is a little practical advice. Sign up early -- most Institutes are full long before Summer. Don't plan to see anybody who lives near the Institute, while it is going on -- you won't have time. Take all the clothes you have -- you won't want to bother with laundry. Take all your shoes, and change them often. At Asilomar, you can buy shirts and shoes, and petti coats right there, in case you run short -- most places, no. And after you get there, don't stick to your own crowd. Try to identify everybody, and remember them. Don't wait for the other couple to make advances -- step right up and be friendly with them. Some of our best Square-Dancing friends we see only once a year -- at Summer Institutes.

He feels too that a Callers wife is a very important part of the team, and without her interest and enthusiasm, a Caller cannot develop as fully. "Much of the credit belongs to my wife, Betty, who besides teaching all the Rounds, adds much with her gracious friendliness and charm."

What started out to be just a hobby has been keeping Bill and Betty much too busy, but when so many dancers tell them how much Square Dancing has contributed to their lives emotionally as well as physically and socially, both are grateful to have had a part in that.

At least one bid (SACRAMENTO) was ready to be presented. One groups representative however, questioned whether the California Square Dancers wanted Calif. State Square Dance Conventions continued, or established. Few highlights of your 2nd Annual California Square Dance Convention held in Fresno February 19-20, 1955.

1300 plus registered -- All sections of California represented -- Grand March started on time, led by Convention guest of honor HARRIETT BLOHM, of Los Angeles and Fresno's Mayor GORDON DUNN. Floor was taped with 6 inch crosses (center of each square) for 154 squares. All squares filled at peak of crowd. 9 foot squares were used. \$2700 Plus taken in \$2700 plus expended. All bills paid except some \$50 or \$60 and \$49 left, with which to meet those obligations. (Boy was that a sharp pencil!)

JOY RIDE

Record: "Joy Ride" - Dot No. 15247

St. Position: Facing, both hands joined, M's back to center.

Footwork: Opposite throughout. Directions given are for the M;
W does counterpart.

Measures Part "A"

- 1-4 STEP/BACK, STEP; STEP/BACK, STEP; TURN AWAY, 2; 3, TOUCH;
keeping weight centered over L, step in place L, step R
in back of L, step in place L (back pas-de-basque).
Repeat, starting R.
Turn away from partner with 3 steps (L,R,L); end facing
partner with both hands joined; touch R ft beside L on
4th count.
- 5-8 Repeat meas. 1-4, starting M's R. - (RLOD)
- 9-12 SIDE, BEHIND; SIDE, TOUCH; STEP, DRAW; STEP, BRUSH;
Release M's R and W's L hands. Step to side on L in LOD;
step R behind L, step to side on L, touch R beside L
(grapevine). Step to side on R, travelling in RLOD, draw
L back to R (toe out), taking weight on L; step again on
R and brush L ft fwd.
- 13-16 Repeat meas. 9-12; end in Varsouvian position, facing
LOD.
- 17-20 TWO-STEP; TWO-STEP; HALF WHEEL, 2; 3, 4;
In Vars. position, starting M's L, W's R, do 2 two-steps
progressing in LOD. Then, in 4 steps (LRLR), wheel (L-
face) half around to face RLOD.
- 21-24 Repeat meas. 17-20 progressing in RLOD. End facing LOD.
- 25-28 TWO-STEP; TWO-STEP; TWIRL, 2; 3, 4;
Still in Vars. position, progress in LOD with 2 two-steps.
Then releasing L hands, M walks fwd 4 steps (LRLR) while
W makes 1 slow complete R-face turn in four steps (RLRL)
under her own and M's R arm.
- 29-32 Repeat meas. 25-28; end in escort position.

Interlude

- 1-4 WALK; 2; CROSS, BACK; STEP, BRUSH;
In escort position, walk fwd slowly 2 steps (LR). Then,
step L across in front of R, step back on R, step L be-
side R, brush R fwd.
- 5-8 Repeat meas. 1-4, starting M's R.
- 9-16 Repeat meas. 1-8.
- 17-20 STEP, TAP; STEP, TAP; SIDE, BEHIND; STEP, BRUSH;
Step on L to side, tap R beside L; step on R to side, tap
L beside R; release handholds and do a grapevine step
moving away from partner. Brush R ft fwd on 4th count.
- 21-24 Repeat meas. 17-20, starting on M's R and do the grapevine
moving twd partner. End in facing position ready to re-
peat dance from the beginning.

Dance is done twice through plus ending.

ENDING: Repeat meas. 17-32 of Part "A." End with twirl and bow.

SEQUENCE OF DANCE: PART A, INTERLUDE, PART A, INTERLUDE, ENDING.

A short three years ago Marin County Square Dancers had two places to go, to dance--CHARLEY BASSETTS' Beginners class at MARIN JUNIOR COLLEGE or the two dances a month at the TAM VALLEY HALL. There were a couple of other clubs in the area but the membership was small and their meetings closed. Today one can go Square Dancing every night of the week--except Sunday--and most nights one has a choice of several places. Three years ago we were looking for dancers to fill our halls; today we are looking for halls big enough to take care of the dancers. And we have only just begun!

Altho it won't be a year old officially until June, much has already been accomplished by the Marin County Square Dancer's Association. Besides sponsoring beginning and intermediate classes, they have held two big Rose Bowl dances and a MARCH OF DIMES BENEFIT dance. This Association grew out of the meetings of a few members of the then few Clubs and the few Callers living in this area, who wanted to stage an open dance at the Beautiful ROSE BOWL in LARKSPUR. It was the consensus of opinion in this group that more local dancers were needed if we were to keep Square Dancing interesting in Marin County; and that the best way to do this was by organizing. Under the leadership of BILL OWEN and with the proceeds from the ROSE BOWL dance in June, the Association began sponsoring classes. Beginners classes, under the direction of CHARLEY BASSETT, run for ten weeks, at the end of which the members are "promoted" into a ten-weeks Intermediate Class under some other Caller. Upon completion of the Intermediate Class, the members are given a "graduation" party, complete with diplomas class pictures, etc. by a CLUB MEMBER of the Association. The fourth series of ten-week classes is now in progress. A new Beginners Class will start on Tuesday, May 3rd at ISABEL COOK SCHOOL in SAN ANSELMO. A new Intermediate Class begins on Wednesday, May 4th. Enrollment in these classes is closed after the first two weeks.

A Beginner's Hoedown is also being sponsored by the MARIN COUNTY SQUARE DANCERS ASSOCIATION. March 26th was the date of the first such dance, and they will be held on the 4th Saturday of each month at the NEIL CUMMINGS SCHOOL in CORTE MADERA. These dances should be an outing for those who have been "exposed" to Square Dancing in the past, but haven't followed thru, as well as late beginners and advanced dancers who like an occasional "easy" evening.

CHARM 'N FARMERS, a recently organized club having LARRY TWIST as Caller, held their first party on February 19, and a charming time was reported by the many who attended.

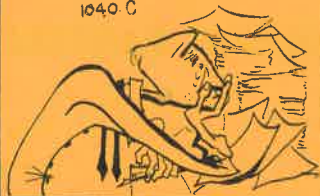

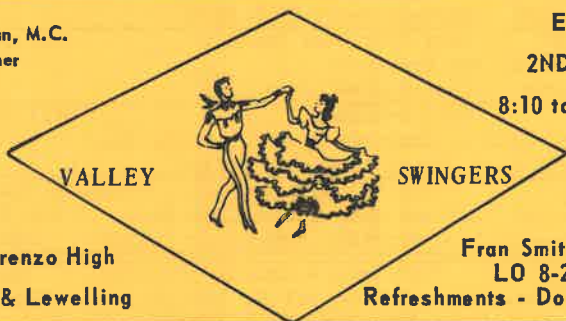
