Really Learning To Square Dance

In the olden times, as we have been told far too often by people who don't like our modern square dancing, nobody had to learn to square dance. You just started going to dances, and pretty soon you were dancing. They didn't have any of this complicated modern stuff, we are told -- just a few simple figures anyone could do. (Like the Quadruple Ox-Bow Loop?) Anyhow, they didn't have classes, they were all on one level, and they did everything in eight counts, and never cut corners the way we do. And they all had fun.

Well, maybe they did. So what? Times have changed. People have changed. Square Dancing is no longer a mild social diversion for a few unsophisticated country people -- it is now an organization sport for millions of people all over the country, and like any other team sport, it has rules that have to be learned and skills that have to be developed, before you are a welcome participant in the game. Everything moves faster these days, and the quickest way to learn anything is to take regular lessons in it. Hence the modern custom of square dance classes.

That business of 'Fun', that word is rapidly gathering a secondary meaning never intended by the ones who use it, because of the fact that a lot of people say they square dance 'for Fun', when what they mean is that they are too lazy to learn to do it right, so they want it understood that they don't intend to try. There was once a cartoon in the New Yorker of a couple sitting on their porch watching a bulldozer at work on the next hillside, and the woman is saying "Oh Dear! I do hope that isn't going to be an improvement!" Her feeling about the word 'improvement' is about what I feel about the word 'Fun'. In its real meaning, I am all for it - no one has more real fun than people who can really square dance. But when 'dancing for Fun' is used to mean 'dancing without learning how', then I am against it. Square Dancing is worth the effort it takes to learn to do it right.

I have a word of encouragement for beginners, however (and I mean 'temporary beginners' and not 'perpetual beginners'), when it seems as if there were no end to what has to be learned. Square dancing is not like Folk dancing, where you have to learn new dances all the time, for ever and ever. Square dancing is much more like riding a bicycle - suddenly there comes a time when you have learned how, and from then on you are a Square Dancer - you can coast. Once you have really learned the trick, even if you stop for a while, you will never entirely forget, and anything new they think up will come easily to you. The big thing is to keep at it until you reach that point where you can dance without stopping to consider every movement. Then you're set for life.

ROUND OF THE MONTH

SANDMAN

By Helen & Bill Burner, La Mesa, Calif.

Record: "Mister Sandman" by Chet Atkins, RCA Victor - 20-5956
Position: Open, facing LOD. Start M's LEFT; W does counterpart throughout.

Measures

INTRODUCTION

- 1-2 TWIRL, TWO, THREE, FOUR; STEP, SWING, BACK, TOUCH;
Man walks fwd LOD L-R-L-R-L and swings R fwd, steps back on R and touches L by R, while W does one R-face twirl (R-L), steps fwd R-L-R and swings L fwd, steps bkwd on L and touches R by L.
- 3-4 Repeat meas. 1-2.

PART "A"

- 1-2 TWO-STEP, TWO-STEP, TWO-STEP, TWO-STEP;
Four two-steps in open pos. LOD.
- 3-4 STEP, SWING, STEP, SWING; SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE, SWING;
Step L slightly away from partner, swing R across L, step R slightly twd partner & swing L across R. drop hands, Moving away from partner, step L to side, step R behind L, step L to side, swing R across L.
- 5-6 STEP, SWING, STEP, SWING; SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE, TOUCH;
Step R to side swing L across R, step L to side swing R across L. Moving twd partner step R to side, step L behind R, step R to side, touch L by R. Take closed dance position.
- 7-8 TWO-STEP, TWO-STEP; TWO-STEP, TWO-STEP;
Four R-face turning two-steps. End OPEN position.

PART "B"

- 9-10 WALK, TWO, THREE, SWING; BACK UP, TWO, THREE, TOUCH;
Walk fwd LOD L-R-L & swing R fwd. Walk bkwd RLOD, R-L-R and touch L by R.
- 11-12 WALK, TWO, WRAP UP; STEP, SWING, BACK, TOUCH;
Man walks fwd LOD. L-R-L-R-L and swings R fwd. Step bkwd on R, touch L by R, as W walks fwd R-L then wraps up with R-L, step R and swing L fwd. Step bkwd on L and touch R by L.
- 13-14 UN-WRAP, WALK, TWO; STEP, SWING, BACK, TOUCH;
Man walk fwd L-R-L-R-L and swing R fwd, then step bkwd on R and touch L by R, as W unwraps on R-L and then walks fwd R-L-R and swing L fwd. Step back L and touch R by L. Take closed position.
- 15-16 TWO-STEP, TWO-STEP; TWO-STEP, TWO-STEP;
Four R-face turning two-steps. End OPEN position.

BRIDGE

- 1-4 Repeat INTRODUCTION for bridge.
- Sequence: INTRO., A, B, BRIDGE, A, B, BRIDGE, A, B, TAG.
- Tag: TWIRL, TWIRL; BOW
Man walks fwd four steps L-R-L-R as W twirls twice (R-L-R-L) under M's L arm. Both bow.

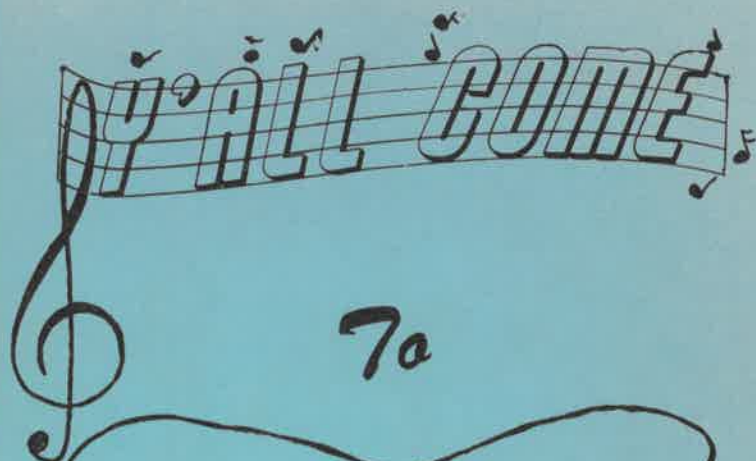

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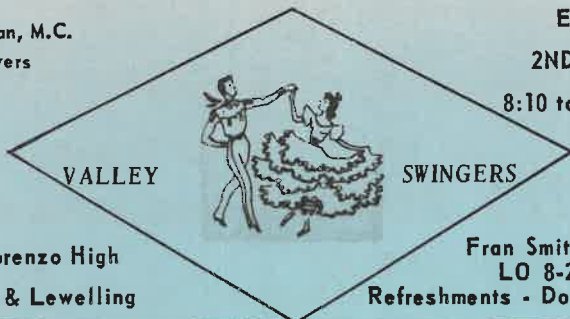

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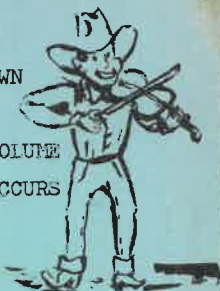
