Square Dancing Away From Home

Did you ever spend the evening in your Motel room in a strange town, wishing you knew where there was a Square Dance? Travelling golfers have no trouble finding golf courses, amusement sections of newspapers list theaters, Ball games, horse races, and all sorts of other forms of recreation, but how many of them list Square Dances? Not many!

Someday in the future, when you enter a strange town anywhere along the highway, you'll be able to read, along with the Lions' Club and Rotary signs, one that says 'Square Dancing Tuesdays & Saturdays, Call Main 2456 for Information! Even if the day happens to be Wednesday, you can stop and call the number, and be told how much farther you'll have to drive to find a Wednesday dance. Until that happy day, however, you will have a problem finding a place to dance, if you are in unknown territory. If it is daytime, you can always try the Chamber of Commerce, the Recreation Dept., or the School system. After dark, those places will be closed, but there is the YMCA, and the Police or Fire Dep'ts may know something. After eight, in a very small town, some people have been known to shut off the engine and listen. (Half Moon Bay, for instance!) But if you know you are going to travel, and where, you can save yourself a lot of trouble by some advance preparation.

For instance, there's a publication called the 'National Directory of Square and Folk Dance Callers, Teachers, and Leaders', which lists names and addresses of dancers and callers all over the country. Of course, it is not anywhere near complete, and the town you are in may not even be listed but maybe there is a dancer within phoning distance anyway, who can direct you. Or, if you know where you are going, you can write 'Sets in Order', and get names and addresses of subscribers in that area, and then you are all set. Or you can call us--we take magazines like this one from almost all parts of the country, and we can probably find you a name or two to start out with. Once you have contacted one dancer, you are in.

Dancers sometimes feel hesitant about going to dances away from home, for fear things will be too different, and they will be lost. Don't worry--square dancing is more nearly alike all over the country than you would think. Calif. dancers can dance anywhere, because we have been trained to listen to the caller, and not to expect any set pattern, so that it is very hard to disconcert us. The only thing that can throw good Western dancers is an old, non-directional call, which the local people have always done--like the Cowboy Loop, for instance. On the other hand, styling is a constant surprise to us. Pigeon-wing allemandes, grand right and left with the thumbs up, Varsouvienne promenades, right

and left through with no hands, and especially 'all around your left hand lady 'passing left shoulders'-ouch!-do baffle us for the moment. But the fun of dancing away from home is partly in novelty, and it is up to the visitor to adapt to the styling of the area, and learn something new. (I will make one exception-I personally refuse to twirl between every two men on a grand right and left, no matter where I am.) Generally speaking, however, changing your habits in small things is just another challenge, which makes for gayer dancing.

There is one good reason for trying to find dances away from home, aside from just wanting to dance, that you may not have considered. No matter how insignificant a member of your own Club you may be, the farther away from home you get the more important you become. If you want to see why, just remember the last time your caller announced that you had visitors present, from Cleveland, or New Orleans, or some other distant place. Weren't you thrilled? And wasn't it fun to dance with them, and notice any little differences in the way they twirled, and get their impressions of your Club? It will be the same with you-if you come from a distance, you will find yourself an honored guest, and a Celebrity. Fun, for a change!

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ROUND OF THE MONTH

PRETTY BABY

Original by Jim and Ginny Brooks, Everett, Washington

Music: "Pretty Baby" - Rainbow #118. Two-Step Rhythm

Starting Position: OPEN, facing LOD. Directions for M; W is OPPOSITE throughout.

Meas.

- 1-4 TWO-STEP(L); TWO-STEP(R); STEP(L), BRUSH(R); STEP(R), BRUSH(L);
Starting on outside ft, take two two-steps fwd in LOD. On the cue "brush", glide or slide inside ft fwd in a slow brush with a shh-ing sound while slightly bending (dipping) the supporting knee just before taking weight on inside ft for next step. Repeat STEP-BRUSH opposite foot.
- 5-8 STEP(L), BRUSH(R); TURN(R), 2(L)/3(R); STEP(L), BRUSH(R); TURN(R), 2(L)/3(R);
Step fwd L, brush-swing R fwd LOD; step bwd on R turning twd partner and with two quick steps LR complete turn to face RLOD changing hand hold to new inside hands. Repeat same in RLOD turning twd partner and LOD to OPEN position as in measure 1.
- 9-16 Repeat meas. 1-8 ending in FACING pos, both hands joined; M facing Wall.
- 17-20 LEFT/BACK(R), LEFT; RIGHT/BACK(L), RIGHT; TURNAWAY(L), 2; 3, TOUCH(R);
Pas de Basque rhythm step. Step sideward on L in LOD swaying slightly in that direction, step briefly on R ft behind L heel and quickly step on L for full ct. Repeat to opp side with opp ft. Turn away from partner in three steps LRL progressing slightly LOD; re-join both hands and touch free ft (R) close to heel of supporting foot.
- 21-24 RIGHT/BACK(L), RIGHT; LEFT/BACK(R), LEFT; TURNAWAY(R), 2; 3, TOUCH(L);
Same "Pas de Basque" action in opp direction and on opp ft turning away and progress RLOD and ending in OPEN pos facing LOD.
- 25-28 TWO-STEP FACING(L); BACK-TO-BACK(R); FACE-TO-FACE; BACK-TO-BACK;
In OPEN pos do four two-steps in LOD swinging inside hands with body.
- 29-32 AROUND(L), 2; 3, 4; 5, 6; 7, 8;
"Mountain Style DOGIDO." Keeping inside hands joined, M leads W across in front of him to his L side and on around behind him to starting position in eight steps (M in place) as he continues to face LOD. If desired, W may make one complete L-face twirl as she rolls behind the M -- if so, this should start as L shoulders are adjacent. We prefer the walk-around.

COMPLETE DANCE IS DONE FOUR TIMES PLUS TAG: Repeat meas 25-32; BOW AND CURTSY with M back to center touching M R and W L hands.

Here is the Gal that sits on the sidelines sweats out all his good and all his bad calls and always has a word of encouragement for him when things look blue. She is the one that spots mistakes that often escape the eye of the caller, or comes up with a timely suggestion that perhaps it might be time to take a break. She is the good will ambassador between the Callers and the Dancers."
