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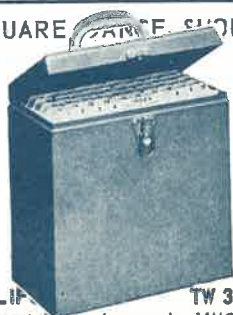
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SQUARE DANCE ~ WHERE?

WILL IT WELD FAMILIES CLOSER TOGETHER? HELP RETARD THE JUVENILE DELINQUENCY PROBLEM? IS IT THE BEGINNING OF A WAY OF LIFE TO BE WOVEN INTO A PATTERN OF PERPETUITY?

WE SHOULD RECOGNIZE AND BE AWARE OF THIS TENDENCY, ENCOURAGE IT WHENEVER POSSIBLE. CARE MIGHT ALSO BE EXERCISED IN NOT OVER-FORCING THE ISSUE. On setting up squares

by MADELINE ALLEN

Let me say right at the beginning, I'm agin' it. Anyone who has followed my commentaries this far knows that I consider the democratic quality of square dancing one of its greatest charms, and that I dislike any form of picking and choosing the people with whom one will consent to dance. And no matter what the advocates of setting up squares say, all squares are not set up for the sole purpose of dancing with friends--plenty of them are set up for the purpose of not dancing with anyone who might prove unworthy of associating with experts. If you can only enjoy yourself at a square dance when the others in the square are at least as good as you are, you have my sympathy, because you are missing the point.

However, I must admit that 'setting up' seems to be done a lot more in other areas than here, and also seems to be on the increase. Perhaps there are open dances in some areas where a good case might be made for it--there may even be places where the high level of friendliness and congeniality that we have always found among square dancers does not prevail, and where you might, for instance, have to beware of drinkers or roughnecks. I will go so far as to concede that there might even be places where you could be allowed to take your own square, and dance together all evening.

At our own affairs, however, whether it be Club Dances, Hoedowns, or Round-Ups, I have never seen any excuse for a formally 'set-up' square. There are too many opportunities for unkindness, no matter how unintentional. Just the sight of six people standing around, either waiting for some special couple to join them, or waiting to spot a couple they consider suitable, has a snubbing effect on the other couples looking for a square. If enough squares on the floor are set up ahead of the 'sets in order' call, it would seem as if there were no place to dance at all, and sensitive couples may be discouraged entirely. On a very crowded floor, as at the GOLDEN STATE ROUND-UP, it is hard enough to move around the floor at all, without having to pass half-filled squares who obviously do not want you to fill in. And if, in an unguarded moment, you agree to join a 'set-up' square, and then stand there, trying to choose between explaining to passing friends that that extra place is not available to them and ruining the hosts' plans by letting them in--well, to me that is just as embarrassing as being turned away. I just don't like any part of it.

If I am wrong about you, and all you really wanted to do was to be sure and dance with a few friends you don't see very often, let me recommend the 'half-set-up' square. Find a couple you particularly want to dance with, walk out on the floor together, and raise your hands for two more. No matter who you get, you and your friends can enjoy a good dance together, or laugh later over a tough one, but for two short squares you should be able to stand anything. You might be lucky and get old friends, or you might be even luckier and make new friends, but at least you won't run the risk of hurting anyone without meaning to.

After all, it all boils down to that old-fashioned virtue, COURTESY. The right to the 'Pursuit of Happiness' guaranteed to us by law, goes only so far--we may pursue happiness for ourselves only up to the point where we hurt others. If you can unobtrusively dance with the people you want to dance with, well and good. But don't let me see you stepping on anyone else's face to do it. And don't start asking for rules to protect the 'set-ups' from crude people wanting a place to dance, as one letter in a recent magazine suggests. It ought to be taken for granted that in square dancing everyone wants to dance with everyone else, just as it is taken for granted in civilized countries that everyone wants to be fair and honest. These are pleasant conventions we would like to think apply to everyone, and our advice is, if you are the exception, for goodness' sakes don't admit it.

PAWS 'N TAWS

The Valley PAWS 'N TAWS of Danville under the capable leadership of HOMER BLINCOW, Caller and his charming taw LOIS, were organized in 1950 with two squares of charter members. Still dancing regularly with the group are charter members ROY and HELEN ANDERSON, BOB and REINE GREEN, JOHN and ADELE PROCTOR and NEWEL and FREDIA STEPHENS.

The club conducts one beginners class a year, commencing in the Fall and running for fourteen weeks. Those beginners who have by this time demonstrated outstanding proficiency in the art are graduated into full membership. (Editor's note: They haven't had a failure yet)

Annual feature events for the club include the BIG PARTY and pot luck dinner at Christmas time and summer picnics to sustain interest through the warmer weather.

The PAWS 'N TAWS entered a live float in the Walnut Festival parade in Walnut Creek last year. HOMER called to one square with guitar music furnished by JIM HOSICK of the HILLCREST PROMENADERS. The dancers reported minor complications on the curves but nobody fell off the truck and a great deal of enthusiastic comment was generated. Activities of this nature create interest in square dancing and might be considered by other clubs. Get a float in the big P.-rade in YOUR community.

Among the largest of the Bay Area clubs and until recently the only club in the Mount Diablo area, the PAWS 'N TAWS regularly dance nine to twelve squares. They meet Fridays at 8:30 p.m. at Green Valley School. Party Night is the last Friday of each month.

ROUND OF THE MONTH

IT'S BEEN A LONG, LONG TIME
by Bill Lee, San Gabriel, California

Music: "It's Been a Long, Long Time" - Windsor 7630
Position: "Skaters" dance position, both facing LOD
Footwork: Identical footwork for both M and W throughout the dance

Meas.

- 1-2 WALK, 2, 3, "DIP"; BACK, TURN, TURN, STEP;
Start L ft and walk fwd in LOD 3 steps, LRL, then "dip" by flexing R knee to lift R ft about 6 inches straight up off floor keeping legs close together, and at the same time dip quickly on L leg by flexing L knee; step bwd on R foot starting a $\frac{1}{2}$ L turn, step fwd on L ft continuing L turn, step fwd 2 more steps, RL, to complete $\frac{1}{2}$ L turn to end facing in RLOD, W on M's R side, both having weight on L ft.
- 3-4 BRUSH, STEP, BRUSH, STEP; TAP, SIDE BEHIND, SIDE;
Brush R ft fwd in RLOD, step on R ft, brush L ft fwd, step on L ft; tap R toe sharply to floor across in back of L ft, step to R side twd COH on R ft, step on L ft across in back of R, step again to R side twd COH on R ft.
- 5-8 Repeat action of Meas. 1-4 starting in RLOD and ending facing LOD.
- 9-12 LADY TURNS IN; GENT FOLLOWS; SWAGGER, -, 2, -; 3, 4, -;
Partners release R hands as M does 2 quick two-steps almost in place starting L ft, while W does 2 quick two-steps turning $\frac{1}{2}$ L across in front of M over to his L side and end facing RLOD; M does 2 quick two-steps almost in place but making a full L turn to end facing LOD as W does 2 quick two-steps to make a $\frac{1}{2}$ L turn to end with partners resuming skaters position as at start of dance, both facing in LOD, partners then start L ft and take four "swaggering" steps fwd in slow time by stepping on L ft across in front of R, stepping on R ft across in front of L, and repeating L and R.
- 13-14 BALANCE FORWARD, -, BALANCE BACK, -; FORWARD, 2, 3, TOUCH;
Bal fwd in LOD on L ft, hold 1 ct, bal bwd in RLOD on R ft, hold 1 ct; start L ft and walk fwd in LOD 3 quick steps, LRL, touch R toe to floor behind L ft.

15-16 BALANCE BACK, -, BALANCE FORWARD, -; BACK, 2, 3, TO-UCH;

Bal bwd on RLOD on R ft, hold 1 ct, bal fwd in LOD on L ft, hold 1 ct; start R ft and walk bwd in RL-OD 3 quick steps, RLR, touch L toe to floor be-side R ft.

ENTIRE DANCE IS DONE FOUR TIMES

Ending:

1-2 BALANCE FORWARD, -; BALANCE BACK, -; LADY TURNS OUT, AND BOW;

On musical "tag" following fourth and last time through the dance, bal fwd on L ft, hold 1 ct, bal bwd on R ft, hold 1 ct; partners release L hands and W makes a $3/4$ turn (not a twirl) in 3 steps, LRL, while M makes a $1/4$ R turn in place with same footwork, ending with partners acknow- ledging.

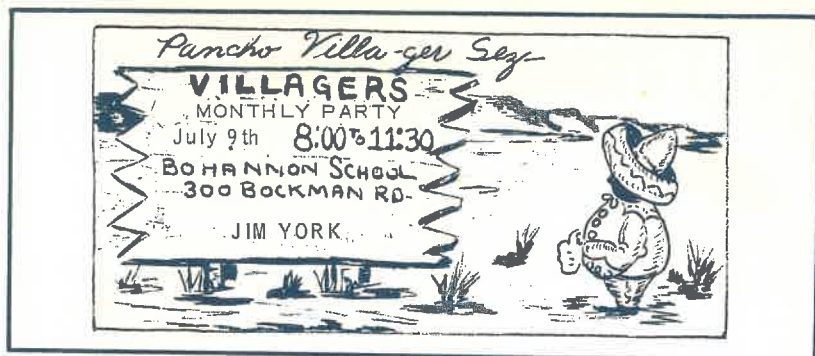

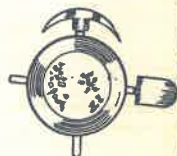
