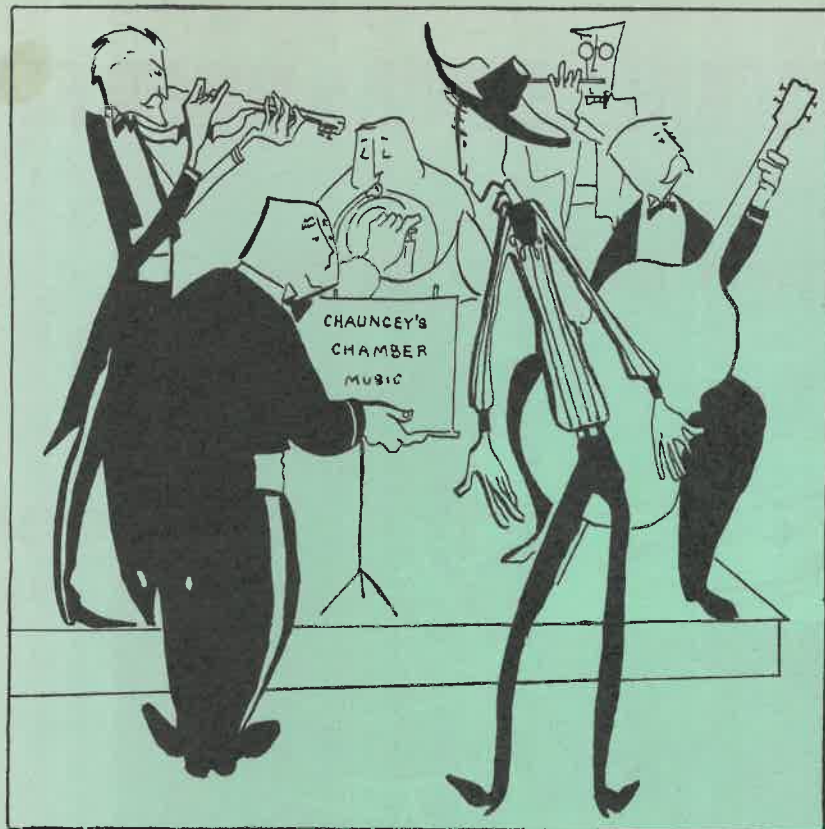

A Square Is Four Couples - Or Is It?

by MADELINE ALLEN

Did you ever wake up with a start, while dancing a normal square, and notice that something had changed? Maybe there were five, six, or even seven couples dancing, and no one seemed to care. Did you suddenly realize that the others in the square were dancing by a set of local ground rules that you didn't know? Did you wonder how to star 'across' a five-couple set? Here are a few simple rules to get you out of a tight spot, and make you 'one of the gang'.

The two basic rules most of us understand pretty well are that in a right and left grand you promenade the fifth girl -- the one you meet with your right hand -- and that when you star across you pass one and take the next. These are reasonable rules, because they follow what you would do in a regular square, if you figure it out. (The only difference is that you don't get the same girl every time.) They work equally well with only three couples or with seventeen. They make most breaks feasible, and a lot of figures too.

Then you star all the way around, however, you had better not try to count, but just speed up a little and meet the same girl. (It applies only in squares of five or six couples, though. By the time you get sixteen or seventeen, try to count to the fourth girl, but be grateful for whatever you get.)

When told to go 'twice around', as in 'throw in the clutch', try to speed up and make it, or pay attention if someone in your square yells 'Make it once!', here the main thing is cooperation, and any system works if the dancers are quick-witted enough to agree on it.

The real problem, and the challenge too, comes in the figures. Some people just let the odd couples drop out at that point, but we like to try anything. Here are a few spur-of-the-moment solutions to frequent situations, taking a set of five couples as an example.

'First and third lead to the right, circle to a line-' any couple leads to the right and circles four, the next couple leads out and circles six.

'Right and left thru across the set-' the two couples in one line do a right and left thru with two of the couples in the other line, and the odd couple simply promenades across.

'pass thru and the ends turn in-' all pass thru, ends turn in, and four people in one line do a dishrag (fun!).

'Heads to the center with a right hand star, turn your corners-' Two or three couples star, those with standing corners turn them, the others turn each other.

You can see that it is a matter of ingenuity for the dancers to preserve the form of the figure by doing lines, stars, or circles, as called, but by forgetting entirely who is where, and taking any girl for a partner. Singing calls work especially well, because the figure is predictable, and gives you time to plan ahead. Crosstrail Hash is the worst, unless you simply throw everything to the winds, and about half of you keep going in and out and around each other as if you knew what you were doing. Sooner or later you'll hear (Corners all with a left allemande', and from there on you're in. Happy Dancing!

Round Dance

OF THE MONTH

VIENNA DREAMS

by Jack and LaVerne Riley, Seattle, Washington

Music: "Vienna Dreams" -- Aqua #203

Position: Open, inside hands joined, traveling LOD. W does counter-part.

Intro: 4 measures

Meas.

1-4 WALTZ OUT; WALTZ IN; BACK TO BACK; FACE TO FACE;

Starting on L traveling fwd use running waltz stepping L,R, L, slightly away from partner; waltz in to face partner R, L,R; Change hands to M's L and W's R. Using the running waltz traveling LOD turn back to back (M-R face) with partner L,R,L; Waltz to a face to face pos (M-L face) R,L,R;

5-8 WALTZ; 2; 3; 4;

In closed dance pos do 4 natural turning waltz steps (Viennese style) turning CW traveling LOD.

9-16 Repeat Meas. 1-8 ending in open pos., inside hands joined.

17-20 STEP, SWING, -; AND ROLL; STEP, SWING, -; STEP, FACE, -;

Swinging joined hands fwd step diagonally on L, swing R in front of L; Exchange places with partner by M crossing behind W in a R face roll stepping R,L, hold while W crosses in front of M with a L face roll in two steps; End facing LOD, W on M's left side, M's L hand joined with W's R.

Swinging joined hands fwd step diagonally on R, swing L in front of R; Step on L facing partner and touching leading hands, M's back to wall;

21-24 STEP, SWING, -; AND ROLL; STEP, SWING, -; STEP, FACE, -;

Repeat meas. 17-20 starting on M's R. End facing partner, M's back to center, both hands joined in butterfly pos.

25-28 LEFT, -, CLOSE; LEFT, -, -; RIGHT, -, CLOSE; RIGHT, -, -;

Step L along LOD, hold, close R to L; Step L along LOD, touch R by L; Step R along RLOD, hold, close L to R; Step R along RLOD, touch L by R;

29-32 WALTZ; 2; 3; 4;

Four natural waltz steps as in Meas. 5-8

BREAK: Dance pattern completely a total of 4 times.

At the end of the 1st and 2nd times through the dance ONLY, you balance fwd LOD and back, in open pos. Turn the W under R arm at the end of the 4th time through, in place of the 4th waltz.

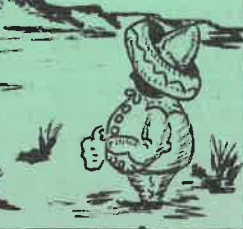

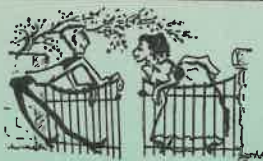
