---NOTICE TO ALL CALIFORNIA SQUARE DANCERS---

Regarding the next Annual Calif. Square Dance Convention
It will be remembered that at the 2nd Annual Calif. Square Dance Convention in Fresno-Feb 1955--Six main things evolved from the Brunch Business Meeting.

#1- Sacramento came prepared to bid for the 1956 or '57 Convention.

#2- One Delegate (From the South) questioned (a) if the dancers wanted the State Convention idea continued (b) if it would hurt the National in San Diego in '56.

#3- Of the nine Delegates present over a majority wanted it continued and likewise over a majority felt it would stimulate, rather than detract from it.

#4- The suggestion was made to go ahead with Annual Convention in 1956 and since Fresno was centrally located and had, had the experience of handling two Conventions, she go ahead and host the 1956 Convention.

#5- The final decision was to send Dancer questionnaires to all Associations to get individual dancer votes from all clubs to determine, briefly, if the dancers wanted the Annual Convention continued, and if one in '56 would harm the National.

#6- These returns were to be tabulated by Fresno and Sacramento and a decision made from these returns as to the course to follow.

The questionnaires were tabulated and the results, with a summary, were returned to all Associations in May, with the notation that Fresno and Sacramento would let you know as soon as possible, their decision.

At the Oakland Round-Up, Sacramento and Fresno met and came to this decision: that altho the questionnaires returns did not give a complete, conclusive picture, they did very definitely point a trend; namely that there was more and more individual dancer votes turned in and correspondingly more "Yes" votes for a Convention as you progress Northward.

The decision was then made to accept the suggestion, that was made at the "Brunch" Business Meeting, of the Convention in Feb. and have Fresno Host the 3rd Annual Calif. Square Dance Convention in Fresno for 1956.

We find we can get the Auditorium for Feb. 17, 18, and 19th, 1956 so the date is officially announced for them. Final details later but hold the date open.

All about Freeloaders

Have you ever heard Square Dancers say, 'We don't belong to any Club. We don't care about that sort of thing. We just like to pay our money and dance.'? The trouble is, if all of us felt that way, there wouldn't be any Square Dances for those Freeloaders to attend by paying at the door.

In recreation, as well as in other parts of daily living, there seem to be three main ways of going about getting what you want. You can agitate to have the Government give it to you, you can pay for it in cash, or you can 'do-it-yourself'. In Square Dancing we have tried all three.

There was a time, not so long ago, when the Government gave us quite a lot. We had free classes at schools, and free use of halls, on some sort of theory of Recreation for the masses. We got into the habit of shrugging off responsibility, both for organizing places to dance, and for interesting new dancers--that was all done for us. Now that stage is over, and we are faced with the necessity of either paying for everything or doing some of it ourselves.

In a few places they have tried letting commercial interests handle the whole thing, and we have not liked the result. It seems that as soon as the money-makers take over, not only do we have to pay too much for what we get, but a lot of other things begin to creep in. Bars are opened, non-dancers are encouraged to come in and try-'It's easy!' and the very atmosphere we are trying to get away from, in modern dancing, takes over. It seems we can't get the sort of thing we want by simply paying for it in cash alone.

So, in the end, we come to the 'do-it-yourself' approach. Even the firmest 'do-it-yourself' addicts in other fields, however, admit that a few parts of their work are better done by experts, and just as a man building a playroom for himself finds out that he had better hire an electrician and a plumber, but can do his own painting, so we are beginning to find out how we stand. We are no longer satisfied with putting on a called record, in our own living room, and working eight people through it. We know we need a Caller, and we have also found out that we need a Caller who is willing to put a little more time and effort into calling than most of us can or will do. A lot of people who started calling 'for fun' found out that, between the cost of equipment and the time required for practice, a real job of work was called for, and they either demanded pay or quit calling. The Caller, then, became our first essential expert.

Live music is more in the luxury class. Naturally, anyone who can afford live music and can get it, would rather have it. But if the cost of live music, divided among the dancers, would raise the price per couple above a reasonable point, we have found that we can easily skip it, and do very well with records. In this area, musicians have practically priced themselves out of the market.

A place to dance has also become a necessary expense, with the decline of free halls, and the growth of Clubs beyond the bounds of playrooms. Rent may not be much, but it has to be paid.

A Caller and a Hall - the Caller bringing the equipment and records - are those the only essentials for an evening of Square Danc-

ing? If your answer to that question is 'Yes', and you really think so, then you had better wake up.

Just for a starter, you will need at least three other couples. If you do not want to share the cost of the Caller and the Hall between the eight of you, you will want a lot more than that. Where do they come from? How did you know there would be a Square Dance that night? Did you get a card? Who sent it? Or did you read about it in 'Square Dance-Where'? Who do you think put in the notices? If it was a regular Club dance, who organized the Club, and hired the Caller, and rented the Hall?

Maybe you think the Caller does all that, for the amount he is paid. Maybe you think he sweeps the floor before the dance, too, and his wife brings the cake and makes the coffee. Maybe in some parts of the country they really do run things that way--or maybe, if the Caller is desperate enough for dancers who will put up with his first feeble efforts, he really will try to do everything. But not for long. Either he will get good enough so that he does not have to scratch for dancers and can refuse to call unless all the leg work is done for him, or he realizes that he never will be that good, and goes back to being a dancer. So it is up to somebody else.

Here is where the Square Dance Club comes in. Essentially, our Clubs are groups of people banded together for the purpose of doing all the little jobs that go with putting on a Square Dance. The Club now hires the Caller, rents the Hall, sends out notices and advertisements, and serves any refreshments that are provided. But more than that the Club also worries about providing more dancers all the time, by promoting classes for beginners, and bringing beginners to the classes. All these things are done for the Club by the members--who else?

Even among the members, the question is always arising, 'Why not pay to have all that done?' The answer is simple--we can't. Depending on the solvency of the Club, we can hire a janitor or a dishwasher, but no amount of money could buy a Club secretary or the sort of press agent a Square Dance Club needs. Only dancers can do jobs of that sort, and only the labor of love of a lot of Club members can keep our kind of Square Dancing going.

Sure, other parts of the country have other systems, but here in California the price we pay for an evening of Square Dancing consists of the money we pay at the door, plus a certain number of hours a year put in on work for our Club. And the person who does not belong to any Club, or who pays his dues but does no work, is not carrying his fair load, no matter what he pays. Under our system, he is a Square Dancing Freeloader.

Record: "Bumpty-Bump" - Mercury 70444

Starting Position: Open, facing LOD

Footwork: Opposite throughout. Steps described for M.

Meas.

Dance

- 1-2 STEP, TOUCH, STEP, TOUCH; SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE, SWING;
Step on L to side, touch R beside L, step on R to side,
touch L beside R (or may pas-de-basque). Drop hands
and do a grapevine step moving away from partner. Last
count is swing of free foot across supporting foot.
- 3-4 STEP, TOUCH, STEP, TOUCH; SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE SWING;
Repeat Meas. 1-2, starting on R and moving twd partner.
- 5-6 TWO-STEP FORWARD; TWO-STEP FORWARD; TURN AWAY, 2, 3, 4;;
Open position, moving LOD, 2 quick two-steps fwd start-
ing on L; turn away from partner but progress in LOD
and make one complete circle in four steps; end facing
LOD (L face turn for M; R for W).
- 7-8 Repeat Meas. 5-6.
- 9-16 Repeat Meas. 1-8, ending in closed dance position, M's
back to COH.
- 17-18 STEP, CLOSE, STEP, TOUCH; STEP, CLOSE, STEP, TOUCH;
(Slow) Step sideways L in LOD, close R, Step L, touch
R beside L; step sideways R in RLOD, close L, step R,
touch L beside R.
- 19-20 BACK AWAY, TWO; TOGETHER, TWO;
M's back still twd COH, back away from partner with
two walk steps (L-R); then, walk fwd to place with two
walk steps (L-R).
- 21-24 Repeat Meas. 17-20, ending in closed dance position, M
facing LOD.
- 25-26 TWO-STEP AHEAD; TWO-STEP AHEAD;
Two slow fwd two-steps in closed pos. moving LOD and
starting with M's L.
- 27-28 DO-SA-DO, 2; 3, 4;
Four-step do-sa-do, passing right shoulders (back to
back).
- 29-32 Repeat Meas. 25-28, ending in open dance position, M
facing LOD.

Modulation

- 33-34 TWO-STEP AWAY, TWO; 3, 4;
2 two-steps away from partner starting on L to make 3/4
turn; end facing partner M's back to COH (L face turn for
M; R for W).
- 35-36 ROCK, 2, 3, SWING: ROCK, 2, 3, TOUCH;
Cross L in front of R, rock back on R, rock fwd on L, swing
R fwd; cross R in front of L, rock back on L, rock fwd on R,
touch L beside R.
- 37-40 Repeat Meas. 33-36; end open pos., ready to repeat dance thr-
ough Meas. 32.
- END WITH ACKNOWLEDGEMENT (M FACING LOD AND PARTNER) ON LAST COUNT OF
MEAS. 32
- SEQUENCE: DANCE, MODULATION, DANCE.
