If it is true that 'Square Dancing is Fun', then it ought to be true that 'Going to Square Dances is Fun', too. But no matter how much you enjoy the dancing itself, it can certainly sour your whole evening to spend the time between tips listening to one person after another telling you how so-and-so has been cutting his throat, by stealing his dancers, or talking about him behind his back, or doing him dirt in some way or other. Sometimes everyone is against him, and no one appreciates his efforts, or maybe his Club is going to the dogs because they won't take his advice. Whatever it is, it is never his fault—he is an innocent victim, and you have to sit and listen to it until the music starts again.

I have two different objections to these chronic complainers. The first is very personal—they bore me. I love to talk about Square Dancing and all its fascinating angles, but I believe in that old song—you should 'accentuate the positive, eliminate the negative'. I am always ready to listen to a real request for help on a problem, but the ones I am talking about—and my list includes both Callers and dancers as well as their respective wives and husbands—don't really want advice, no matter what they say. What they want is attention and sympathy, including the assurance that you know they are really tops as Callers or dancers or Club officials, and are being unfairly thwarted in their aspirations for leadership. If you actually told them what you think they ought to do, they would never speak to you again. (That's Bad?)

My other objection is that this chronic complaining tends to take every small disagreement or misunderstanding and work it up into a real battle, with the original parties and all their friends lined up on both sides. The fact is that people of the type I am discussing go around with a permanent chip on their shoulders, and if it is accidentally knocked off, they immediately assume that it was intentional on the part of someone. They will never believe that someone might have forgotten to call them about a party—no, 'of course, they meant to leave us out.'! Everyone who does not see them on the street, cuts them dead. If another Caller comes to their dance, it is to steal dancers. If he never comes, he is too high-hat. Whatever happens, these people insist on taking every incident and making a personal insult out of it.

Another point—does it ever occur to these Callers who complain so bitterly about dancers deserting to another Club, that the other Caller might just possibly be giving people what they want? Maybe dancers don't like to be scolded and berated over the Mike, or told that they ought to be doing better than they are, or warned not to go to other Callers' dances. Maybe they like a happy atmosphere with their dances.

In the same way, a few complainers, with chronic hurt feelings, can easily sour everyone else on Club or Association meetings. Meetings can be as much fun as dances (they can?) or they can be one long pain-in-the-neck. Those few people can make all the difference.

Maybe the trouble is that these people are not asking themselves 'Are we all having fun together?', but 'Am I getting ahead in the Square Dance picture?' They have not yet discovered that the important thing is the Square Dance movement itself—not who is in the driver's seat.

CALLER OF THE MONTH



JIM YORK

JIM remembers 1941 as a fighting year. World War II began and he was dragged, fighting and screaming, to his first Square Dance by his "ever lovin'", JEANNE and two of her female accomplices. This weekly kidnapping by a determined woman continued for six months before JIM admitted defeat and went to the dance on his own steam. Then followed about five years of happy dancing, mainly to records ("live" callers were a rarity in those bygone days). With the big boom in Square Dancing in Southern California, RAY SHAW encouraged JIM to start calling and the "tail has been wagging the dog" since then.

A traveling job as Assistant Chief of Paroles for the California Youth Authority complicates JEANNE'S job as Director of YORK'S Appointments, but JIM still manages to work with the "MILL WHEELERS" and the "AXLE DRAGGERS" in Marin County, to call Saturday dances anywhere between the CANADIAN Border and MEXICO and to parlay an annual vacation into a calling junket. For the past two years he has also served on the staff of Square Dance camps at LAKE COEUR d'ALENE, and at JACKSON, MONTANA.

At a time when "Take a Little Peek" was a top figure, JIM began composing new patterns. His first, the "SUZIE Q", is probably still most widely known and used. Since then most of us have danced "LET 'ER GO", "TRAILIN' STAR", "EWE TURN", "RED DOG", "TOO MANY TIMES" and other YORK brainstorms. JIM says, "I'm afraid that we have never really formalized our philosophy about Square Dancing. We dance simply because it's fun to dance and to enjoy the friendship of the swell people who are Square Dancers. We call and teach in the hope that it will help other people to the same enjoyment and because we find that calling and teaching is fun!"

ROUND OF THE MONTH



DRIFTING WALTZ

By Bill Shymkus, Chicago, Illinois

Record: "Curse of an Aching Heart" - Windsor 7628

Starting Position: Open dance position, inside hands joined, both facing in LOD.

Footwork: Opposite footwork throughout for M and W: steps described are for the M.

Meas.

1-4 STEP, TOUCH, -; STEP, TOUCH, -; WALK, 2, FACE; BEHIND, FACE, FORWARD;

Step fwd in LOD on L ft, touch R toe beside L ft, hold one count; step fwd on R ft, touch L toe beside R ft, hold one count; with quick steps moving in LOD, step fwd on L, step fwd on R, step fwd on L ft turning $\frac{1}{4}$ R to face partner; step on R ft across in back of L turning slightly R to face almost in RLOD and dipping slightly by flexing R knee, step to L side in LOD on L ft turning slightly L to face partner step in LOD on R ft, turning to face LOD.

5-8 Repeat action of Meas. 1-4.

9-12 BALANCE FORWARD; BALANCE BACK; WALTZ AWAY; WALTZ TOGETHER; Bal fwd on L ft, touch R toe beside L ft, hold one count; bal bwd on R ft, touch L toe beside R ft, hold one count; start L ft and take one waltz step fwd and diag to L of LOD away from partner, L-R-close on L; start R ft and take one waltz step fwd and diag to R of LOD twd partner, R-L-close on R, to end with partners facing and taking closed dance position, M's back twd center.

13-16 BALANCE BACK; WALTZ; WALTZ; TWIRL; Bal bwd on L ft and hold two counts; starting fwd on R ft, toeing out, take two waltz steps making one full R face turn while progressing slightly in LOD, R-L-close on R, L-R-close on L; W then makes one complete R face twirl under her own R and M's arm with three steps, L-R-L, as M takes three steps in place, R-L-R, ending with partners taking open dance position, inside hands joined, both facing in LOD, ready to repeat the dance.

REPEAT ENTIRE DANCE FOR A TOTAL OF SIX TIMES, ENDING WITH PARTNERS BOWING DEEPLY TO EACH OTHER.

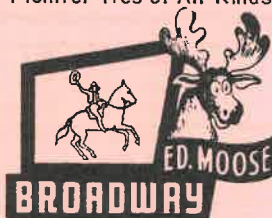
