ON SQUARE DANCE ETIQUETTE

Square dancing has always been a free-and-easy activity, where almost anything goes in the way of costumes, hoots-and-holloers, and gags of all kinds. Anything we think would be fun to do, we do--or at least, we try it, to see if it really is fun. At the same time, we find that somethings that are accepted in some places are simply 'not done' in others, and the question is, how can you avoid making mistakes?

Take Cutting In, for instance. Some Clubs do it all the time, and think nothing of it. Others act very chilly about it, and make you feel as if you were eating peas with a knife. If you are away from home, how can you tell? And asking strange ladies for dances is it done or isn't it? (How about ladies asking strange gents?) We won't even mention the question of joining any square on the floor, invited or not--you know what I think about Setting Up Squares.

I have some pretty strong ideas about Cutting In, too. If you are in any doubt, don't. If you do, be sure you are slick enough to know who you are cutting out, and be sure that that person is one you know will not mind. And after you have accomplished your aim, and are dancing, relax! Don't worry about the person you cut out, and don't keep looking to see if he is cutting in somewhere else, or waving to him to take your place again. To me, the supreme insult is to have the person who cut me out not give me credit for being able to get back in again if I want to. Perhaps I'd rather watch for awhile or, more likely, I am waiting for a really smooth place to get back in, and I don't want to be rushed. If you keep worrying about me, the chances are you'll goof, yourself, and ruin the square anyhow. And that reminds me, if you can't cut into a square without messing it up, stay away. Practice in your own Club until you know just how to do it before you try it out in public. Cutting in is an art, and you have to know how.

I had always assumed that a lone man at a square dance was in luck, because if he wanted to dance, all he had to do was to ask any lady. That is certainly true around here--the lady may refuse, if she is tired, or is waiting for her husband, but she will not object to being invited. But a man from another State recently told me that where he came from, if he asked another man's wife to dance, there'd be a fight, right there! So I guess you'd better be careful if you get outside of California--but around here, I think any lady is flattered to be asked for a dance. And it has been my experience that ladies temporarily deserted by their husbands (usually Callers who are yakking outside) can often find an unemployed man whose wife's feet hurt, and who doesn't object to being asked, either. (He can always say no--that is allowed, too.) You notice I said (temporarily deserted), though. This does not apply to women whose husbands won't dance, or who haven't any--in other words, to permanently deserted ladies. You don't have to dance with your own husband all the time, but you are supposed to get him to the dance, to keep the numbers even--or else you belong in a Singles group. After all, square dancing is fundamentally a couple activity.

This brings up another point--that perennially deserted lady the Caller's wife. I am not talking about your Club Caller--his wife can stay home if she wants, or come if she wants, or come if she likes to help, and in any case she knows the members and can dance if she likes. But when you invite a Caller from a distance to take over for one night, and his wife comes with him, it seems to me that it is up to someone to see that she has a chance to dance if she wants. (Sometimes she doesn't - but she still ought to have the chance.) Too often, one or two Club leaders ask her for a dance apiece, and the rest of the time she just sits there. I would like to see something like an old-fashioned dance program filled out for the Caller's wife, whereby someone would be responsible for each tip--at least to offer himself for the dance, or just to sit and talk. Here is a case where a Club may give an impression of rudeness, just because the committee does not realize that any action is necessary.

Another problem that seems to me to come under the heading of 'etiquette' is the case of the couple who, perhaps for really good reasons, has decided to sit this one out, and then sticks to it, to the bitter end, no matter how long the crowd calls for 'just one more couple' to fill out a square. I would be the last one to forbid anyone to sit out a dance, for any reason at all, but I do think it should be done less offensively. If you just don't care much about dancing the next one, sit still and see whether or not you are needed. But if nothing is going to budge you, then hide. Go outside and stay there until the Caller actually starts calling. If only one of you feels that way, then you go outside, and leave your partner to dance with someone else, if necessary. There is something very superior and insulting about a couple simply refusing to put themselves out for the sake of six other people. Square dancing depends for its very life on cooperation, so if you aren't prepared to cooperate, at least don't boast about it.

ROUND OF THE MONTH

Mr. Guitar



Original dance by Manning and Nita Smith, College Station, Texas

Record: "Hey, Mr. Guitar" - RCA Victor 20-6108 by Chet Atkins

Footwork: Opposite; steps described for men

Position: Face to face, M's back to center of hall, both hands joined.

Meas.

1-4 SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE, BRUSH; BACKUP, 2, 3, TOUCH;

Moving in LOD step to left side on L, step R behind L; step side on L, face LOD as you brush R; step on R in LOD, pivot away from your partner to face RLOD releasing hands as you turn away from your partner, step back on L as you rejoin inside hands (M's L and W's R); step back on R touch L toe beside R foot.

5-8 TWO-STEP; 2; 3; TURN;

Beginning on inside feet (M's L and W's R), inside hands joined, do three two-steps in RLOD; on fourth measure face partner, step to R side on R, close L to R, step in place on R as you complete turn to face LOD.

9-12 FORWARD, 2, 3, SWING; BACKUP, 2, 3, TOUCH;

Dance forward in LOD L, R, L, swing R fwd. Still facing LOD back-up on R L R and touch L toe beside R as you face partner and take closed position.

13-16 TWO-STEP TURN; 2, 3, 4 TO SIDE CAR;

In closed position do four turning two-steps as you progress in LOD. End in sidecar pos. (L hips adjacent) with M facing slightly R of LOD.

17-24 FWD, 2, 3, STEP-STEP; FWD, 2, 3, STEP-STEP; FWD, 2, 3, STEP-STEP; FWD, 2, 3, FACE CENTER;

In sidecar position and moving in LOD man steps fwd L R L and does two quick steps in place R L as he crosses to banjo pos with R hips adjacent and man facing slightly left of LOD, do this four times progressing LOD in a zig-zag pattern, and on the last two quick steps the W turns and both face center in semi-closed position.

25-28 IN, 2, TURN, POINT, REVERSE TWIRL, 2, 3, TOUCH;

In semi-closed position dance twd COH with man stepping L R L with weight on both feet pivot individually twd wall and point R toe (still in closed pos), joined hands held high. With hands still joined W turns left face as she moves twd wall stepping L R L touch R. Man follows W with R L R, touch L as he turns W with his L hand and her R hand to end face to face with M's back to COH.

29-32 APART TWO-STEP; 2, TOGETHER TWO-STEP; 2;

Starting M's L and W's R do two two-steps backing away from each other M backing twd COH; then two two-steps moving twd each other to take original position.

Repeat entire dance twice more; then repeat measures 1 thru 12 ending with bow to partner on last count of measure 12.
