SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT!

We note through our subscription files that many areas outside of the San Francisco Bay Area are noticeably weak or slipping in many cases dying altogether Square Dance wise. This is a sad condition, one that can and should be corrected.

We have seen isolated Callers alone in their own Towns after a few years become exhausted or lose their zest to keep the movement alive. Many of them will readily admit they would welcome help. Some still resent tho, through short sightedness or selfishness anyone moving into their domain, and the Square Dance picture gets dimmer and dimmer.

Feuds of long years standing between Callers go on hurting the scene. New Callers would perhaps be a diversion., create new perspectives. Lets get a program started that will develop new Caller talent in undeveloped Square Dance cities and towns. Let the Callers in stronger areas visit and help wherever possible by guest calling, teaching, offering their ideas. It is a mathematical equasion, the greater the number of qualified Callers in an area the greater the stimulation of our favorite activity.

In October 1949 BEV. & I attended our first Square Dance class, under the instruction of the LOUIS LEONS' of BAKERSFIELD. After a few swings around the floor I got so dizzy I decided the caller was having more fun. Through the encouragement of a fellow newspaper worker, I started learning to call by teaching our neighbors to dance in our garage.

Later I was given the opportunity to call regularly for one of Bakersfield's oldest and finest clubs the WAGON WHEELERS. To this group I feel I owe a great deal, for suffering through all the mistakes that's possible for a caller to make. This group was active in sponsoring beginners classes, so I was fortunate enough to experience teaching, along with calling. I found teaching to be one of the true rewards of a caller. This led to classes in Arvin and with the Delano Adult Education.

In 1952 we moved to Fresno where I went to work for the newspaper. Believe me, if you square dance you are never strangers in a town for long. Just goes to show -- Square Dancers are the friendliest people!

Our first dances in Fresno were Friday night open dances. Then in 1954 I started calling for the BAR NONE Club, also was asked to teach classes sponsored by the Valley Associated Square Dancers.

I am now calling for -- BAR NONE -- KRAZY 8'S and have a KRAZY 8'S sponsored beginners class, on Friday nights, and manage to take out of town dates about twice a month.

The three little STOTTS', MIKE, BECKY & TIM have adapted themselves to being of a Square Dance family and watch their T.V. shows thru strains of All-mande lefts from the other room.

Now is my chance to publicly thank my wife for all the help she gives me. I feel a caller has a tremendous responsibility to dancers...without them (Bless their dancing feet) where would we be?



Who SQUARE DANCES

If you ask people why they Square Dance, instead of playing Golf or Bridge, or going to Night Clubs, you'll get a lot of different answers, but the one you'll get most often has something to do with the kind of people they meet there. 'Square Dancers are such nice people, everywhere,' they'll say, 'It's a pleasure to associate with them.' Carrying that theory a step further, I've been trying to find out why such nice people Square Dance, and I think I know the answer - or at least, part of it.

Square Dancing is the only sport I can think of that is based on Co-operation instead of Competition. It is the only athletic activity where husband and wife are on an even basis - no handicap based on size or strength - and where you make progress, not by setting someone else back, but by pulling everyone else along with you. The result is that Square Dancing appeals to people who are naturally co-operative, and who would rather help others than show off their own accomplishments. It appeals to people who like to see things going smoothly, and who are willing to adapt their own actions to those of others, for the common good. It appeals to those who like to learn something new, and who like to help others learn. And for people like that, the greatest reward they can have is the sight of the most possible people, moving in unison and harmony, co-operating to increase each other's enjoyment.

Naturally, all the people who try Square Dancing are not like this. We get all types, for awhile, at least. We get people who cherish their individuality so much that they cannot bear to change their habits for anyone. We get those who won't even try to learn anything. We get people who want someone else to provide their entertainment for them, and who won't make any effort at all. Most of these non co-operators come a few times and then drift away, and are never heard of again. A few stay, and remain strictly Flies in the Ointment. But there are others who stay with it, and change, and these people are perhaps the greatest advertisement for Square Dancing. There is a very special sort of thrill in seeing a glum, shy introvert blossom out into a cheerful, friendly guy who likes everyone or in seeing a dowdy, middle aged, drab woman gradually learn how to dress, how to do her hair, how to talk to people, and, as she becomes an expert, how to be really popular in spite of being no Glamour Girl. Complainers change into boosters, people who have always been 'too tired' to do anything suddenly can't get enough dancing, and sloppy dressers learn how to look sharp. These people are all Converts, and they have become Square Dancers. And they are the people who are so nice to know - the reason the rest of us like to Square Dance.

Position: Skaters, facing LOD

Footwork: SAME throughout. Directions given are for the M

Intro: 4 measures. Wait

Meas.

Part "A"

- 1 2 SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE, BEHIND; STEP, BRUSH, STEP, BRUSH;
(SMALL STEPS) Starting L and moving twd COH, step to side on L, step behind L on R, again step to L side on L, step behind L on R; Step to L side on L, swing R ft fwd brushing floor, step to R side on R, swing L ft fwd brushing floor.
- 3 4 DIAGONAL-2-3-BRUSH; FORWARD-2-3-BRUSH;
(TRAVEL) Starting L and moving diag fwd twd wall, dance LRL-brush R; Travel in LOD stepping RLR-brush L.
- 5 8 Repeat Meas 1-4.
- 9 10 CROSS-2-3-BRUSH/SWING; Cross-2-3-BRUSH/SWING;
Moving diag fwd and to R of LOD, step on L across in front of R, step diag fwd and to R side on R, step again on L across in front of R, swing R fwd and around while pivoting slightly L on L ft; Repeat, starting on R and moving diag fwd and to L of LOD.
- 11 12 FORWARD-2-3-BRUSH; W/TWIRL-2-3-TOUCH;
Dance fwd 3 steps LRL and brush R ft fwd; Then, releasing hand holds, M continues to progress fwd RLR-touch L while W makes 1 complete individual R-face twirl, moving in LOD, and stepping RLR-touch L. End in skaters position.
- 13 16 Repeat Meas 9-12.

Part "B"

- 17 24 Repeat Meas 1-8, Part "A".
- 25 26 TWO-STEP AWAY, 2; STEP, TOUCH, STEP, TOUCH;
Starting on L and releasing L hands, both do 2 quick two-steps, M turning to face wall while W turns 3/4 R-face to face partner; Step to side on L, touch R beside L, step to side on R, touch L beside R.
- 27 28 BOX THE GNAT-2; STEP, TOUCH, STEP, TOUCH;
Starting on L, exchange places with partner with 2 quick two-steps (box the gnat), crossing under joined R arms (W makes 1/2 L-face turn); Step to side on L, touch R beside L, step to side on R, touch L beside R.
- 29 30 TO SKATERS, 2; STEP, TOUCH, STEP, TOUCH;
Starting on L, R hands still joined, progress to original position, facing LOD, with 2 quick two-steps; Resuming skaters position, step fwd L, touch R beside L, step back on R, touch L beside R.
- 31 32 FORWARD-2-3-BRUSH; W/TWIRL-2-3-TOUCH;
Repeat Meas 11-12, Part "A"

Bridge

- 1 2 STEP, -, TOUCH, -; BACK, -, TOUCH, -;
Step diag fwd on L, hold 1 ct, touch R toe beside L ft, hold 1 ct; Step back on R, hold 1 ct, touch L toe beside R ft, hold 1 ct. (CONTINUED ON PAGE 5)

The mentioning of new delegates to the Northern California Square Dancers Assn brings up the old question of what is a delegate and what are their duties. Whether you know it or not you are very important people to your club, to us and to the square dance movement. You put the personal touch into the relationship of your club and the Association.

You are the only ones that can bring the wishes of your clubs and problems to the attention of the association. Your Executive Board would rather function by knowledge than by blindly making decisions because nothing has been said. To often the thought that your opinion or question is trivial hampers the functioning of the Association to serve the best interest of all members.

You have been chosen by your clubs to interpret the feelings of your club to us and to bring back answers to the club of actions taken by the Association. Only by you actively participating at delegate meetings can you give the strength to the Association and discover that many others have similar ideas and problems. The Association can become as strong and prominent in representation of Square Dancers as you want it.

Just a word to the Clubs. If you do not instruct your delegates and listen to their reports, then you are the losers. Your delegates give time and energy to represent you. Lets all weld a firm and happy foundation for the future, for while square dancing is a wonderful activity, only the best can be obtained by supporting those people who are willing to take on the working end. This is not an easy job I assure you.

The WASHINGTON KNOTHEADS have recently been originated in the State of Washington by a Square of Seattle WESTERNERS and a Square of DO'C'DOS, to promote FELLOWSHIP among Square Dancers, and is an Honorary Group recognizing fun and FELLOWSHIP, that can, and is being spread in Square Dancing.

To become a WASHINGTON KNOTHEAD you and your partner gather up three other couples who are NON-KNOTHEADS, and travel in this pre-arranged Square 100 miles or more one way, (the recognized map mileage to govern between cities or towns) to attend a CLUB or OPEN DANCE, given by other Square Dancers. Festivals, Conventions, Institutes or Dancing Classes do not count. Odd couples do not count.

When your Square has been arranged, you should take a prepared letter with you, stating thereon the names of the dancers, showing from where you came and the name of the town or city you traveled to. This letter should be certified by the President, Secretary, Caller or M. C. of the dance attended and MAILED FROM the town or city visited to: WASHINGTON KNOTHEADS, % RAY LANG, 3051 West 56th Street, Apt. #2, Seattle 7, Washington.

After making the trip your Square should make a request to the WASHINGTON KNOTHEADS, for a BADGE which will constitute recognition of the fact you are now a KNOTHEAD. Anyone that will travel with a square to a Dance 100 miles away is a KNOTHEAD. A small fee of 75¢ per person should be enclosed with your request for the BADGE to cover the cost and mailing. There are no other fees or dues in connection, as once a KNOTHEAD always a KNOTHEAD.

If you care to have your BADGE publicly presented to you and your Square (this is not a requirement) make arrangements with the chairman of the next big dance or one of your local Festivals (Not the State Festival as there would be too many and take too much time) and ask the M. C. to present the BADGE to you, which you have given him.

As we are not a Club the CHARTER MEMBERS of the WASHINGTON KNOTHEADS are the governing body. It is the wish of the WASHINGTON KNOTHEADS that others will form their Squares and join with us in the promotion of FELLOWSHIP AMONG SQUARE DANCERS.

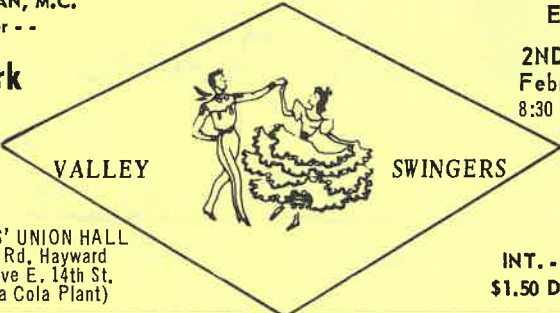

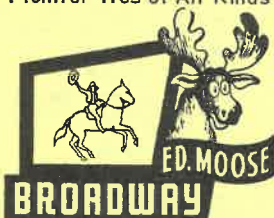

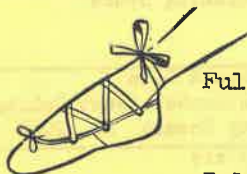
