Record: "Montana Waltz" - Sets in Order, 3019
Position: Open, inside hands joined.
Footwork: Opposite throughout. Steps described for M.

Meas.

- 1-4 SOLO TURN, 2, CLOSE; AROUND, 2, CLOSE; DOSADO, 2, 3; 4, 5, 6;
Turning away from each other (M to L; W to R) and progress-
ing LOD, do one full waltz turn in six steps. End facing
partner for a 6-ct waltz dosado passing R shoulders. As-
sume closed pos, M's back to COH on ct 6.
- 5-8 DIP, -, -; FORWARD, TOUCH/TURN, -; WALTZ; WALTZ;
In closed pos, M dip back on L (W fwd on R). As M steps fwd
on R and touches L beside his R, partners turn so that M faces
diag RLOD ready for waltz turn. Two waltz steps in closed pos
starting bwd in LOD on L for M and making one CW turn, opening
on last ct to repeat from meas 1.
- 9-16 Repeat 1-8, ending in closed pos M's back to COH.
- 17-20 SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE; FRONT, FLARE, -; BEHIND, SIDE, FRONT; SIDE,

Grapevine in LOD, M stepping to side on L, behind on R, to
side on L; across in front on R, swing L fwd in LOD, flaring
with the L; behind on L, side on R, across in front on L; to
side on R, and touch L beside R -- moving RLOD after the flare
End in open pos, inside hands joined and facing LOD.
- 21-24 STEP, SWING, -; CHANGE SIDES, 2, 3; DIP, -, -; STEP, TOUCH, -;
Step to side on outside ft, swing inside ft across; dropping
hands, partners change sides in 3 steps (M walking across in
front with 3/4 R-face turn and W crossing in back with 3/4 L-
face turn) to face partner in closed pos, M's back to wall;
dip back twd wall on M's L; step slightly fwd on R, touch L
to R ending in open pos to repeat meas 21-24 in RLOD.
- 25-28 Repeat Meas 21-24 in RLOD, ending in closed pos with M facing
diag RLOD.

ing 1 1/2; W twirls on meas 32 to complete the second full turn

Your Styling is Showing

by MADELINE ALLEN

What comes to your mind when someone mentions "Styling"? Do you think of the gents elegantly placing their free hands on their pants' pockets, and the ladies swishing their skirts and twirling in a Ladies' Chain? Most people do--they seem to associate the idea of improving their Square Dance Styling with the attempts of Victorian ladies to get their pupils to stick out their little fingers while drinking tea. They figure that sort of stuff is for the Birds--and for Exhibition teams--and they will have none of it.

We have listened to BOB OSGOOD'S talks about Styling for many years, and we wish every dancer could have an opportunity to hear him. To BOB, and to us, Styling is made up of the small things, actually non-essentials, that make you a pleasanter person to dance with. Good Styling eliminates jerks and bumps, makes people meet smoothly and pass easily, and minimizes black-and-blue spots. The fact that it also looks better is merely coincidental.

Take the rule, for instance, that a gent's palm is held up, and a lady's down, when they take hands. If you think about it, you can see how much fumbling it saves, every time you form a circle. But just try to dance a simple mixer sometime with a bunch of Beginners who have not yet been taught that one bit of styling, and you'll be amazed at how awkward it seems, and how many ways there are of joining hands. This 'palm up' business was stressed a few years ago in connection with the Courtesy Turn, and a lot of people refused to go along with it at that time, because they felt that the 'Landing Field' technique did not give them enough control to turn a lady quickly. Our feeling about that is that if you are in the middle of a fast Allemande Break, or other Rat Race, and a Ladies' Chain is called, you don't want half measures. Leave out the Courtesy Turn entirely and do a left arm swing -- faster and surer. But if you really have time to do a Courtesy Turn correctly, as a courtesy, then do it in the most graceful way you know, which is with the lady's hand lying lightly on the man's.

We go along with FRANK HAMILTON on the question of the men's hands. We like them out of the way merely -- no elbows sticking out, no careful feeling for the pants' pocket every two seconds, but just an unused hand hanging close to the side. We like to see the ladies use their skirts gracefully when they have nothing else to do with the free hand, but the sight of about a dozen crinolines petticoats whirling in everyone's faces at all times is slightly ridiculous. Don't overdo the thing.

The question of extra whirls comes in here, too. If you are a natural-born spinning top, and can go around three or four times and still come out of it facing the right way, go right ahead, always remembering that there are seven other people in the Square who need space to operate, too. In at least two figures, the Docey-Do and the Wagon Wheel, a whirl makes the difference between smooth action and awkwardness, but even in those two, the addition of a couple more spins should be considered strictly optional, or even questionable.

On the other type of extra whirls -- where no whirls at all are called for--our advice is take a good look at yourself, and ask yourself if you are the 'Levis and Laces' type. Are you small, slender, quick on your feet, with perfect timing and plenty of petticoats? If so, you may whirl to a Left Allemande, whirl to a Ladies' Chain, and spin between each two men in a Grand Right and Left. If not, don't try. And men -- don't try to flatter the ladies by giving them an extra spin, as if they did look like that. We know better.

As for the men -- just remember that there are ladies present. Cut your steps down to where we can keep up with you, especially when you are on the inside of an Allemande Turn, and we are on the outside. ('Vienna Dreams' is the same situation -- someday I want to do that dance in a clockwise direction, and let the men try to get around on the outside track!) Pull smoothly on an arm swing, instead of jerking. Hold your hand above the lady's head for support for her twirl, but don't twirl her -- let her do it herself.

One of the most valuable tips on Style I ever heard was to keep your feet under you when you dance. You would not think anyone would have to be told that, but when you see some of the people in a set slipping and sliding on a slick floor, while others glide smoothly along, they are letting their feet get away from them. They are taking long steps, leaning forward as they go,

throwing their feet around corners, and counting on being able to catch themselves as they fall. On a slippery floor, this can't be done. If your center of gravity is in balance, you can dance on almost any floor. A good rule is, the Slicker the floor, the smaller the steps, and the more swings you can do. If you are stuck with a slow, gummy floor, on the other hand, pick up your feet, skip the twirls, and swing just once, and you won't get quite so exhausted.

One last word -- adapt! If you are in doubt, do what the others in the Square are doing, or rather, don't do what they are not doing. That way, you may be wrong, but you'll have company, and half the secret of smooth dancing is cooperation within the square.

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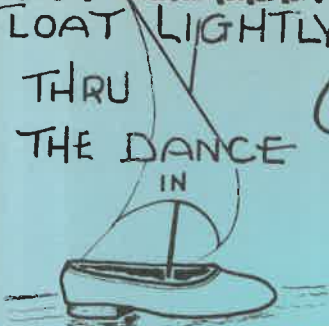

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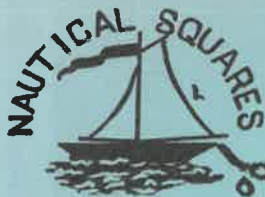
