ROUND OF THE MONTH



COCOANUT GROVE

An original dance by Murle and Ariel Marquis, Glendale, Calif.

Music: Sets in Order Record No. 3004.

Starting Position: Partners in skaters position. W's R hand works skirt, both facing in LOD.

Footwork: Same footwork for M and W throughout the dance.

Measure **Introduction**

1-2 Wait

3-4 Walk fwd in LOD four steps starting L ft.

Part I

1-2 **Cross, side; in back, step/step;**

Touch L toe to floor across in front of R, touch L toe to floor diag. to L side and fwd; step on L ft across in back of R, step diag to R and fwd on R ft/ close L ft to R taking weight on L.

3-4 **Cross, side; in back, step/step;**

Repeat action of Meas. 1-2 starting R ft.

5-6 **Walk, pivot; grapevine, pivot;**

Step fwd in LOD on L ft, step fwd in LOD on R ft pivoting $\frac{1}{4}$ R face turn to face wall on R ft; step to L side in LOD on L ft/step on R ft across in back of R, step to L side in LOD on L ft pivoting $\frac{1}{4}$ L face turn to face in LOD.

7-8 **Walk, pivot; grapevine, pivot;**

Repeat action of Meas. 5-6 starting R ft and pivoting first to L and then to R

9-16 **Repeat Part I (Meas. 1-8 above)**

Part II

17-18 **Cross/side, cross/swing; cross/side, cross/swing;**

Moving diag. fwd and to R of LOD, step on L ft across in front of R/step diag. fwd and to R side on R ft, step again on L ft across in front of R/ swing R ft fwd and around while pivoting slightly on L ft; moving diag fwd and L of LOD, step on R ft across in front of L/step diag fwd and to L on L ft, step again on R ft across in front of L/swing fwd and around while pivoting slightly on R ft;

19-20 **Cross/side, cross/swing; cross/side, cross/touch;**

Repeat action of Meas. 1-2 except to end by touching toe to floor beside R

21-22 **Canter, canter; twirl;**

Partners make one complete L face turn with M wheeling and W dancing fwd CCW, with M taking four canter steps by stepping fwd on L and rocking back on R on each canter step. W takes two canter steps with M during one Meas. then makes one complete R face twirl under her own and the M's L arms during second Meas. End by partners resuming skaters position and facing in LOD.

23-24 **Grapevine left; grapevine right;**

Step to L side twd COH* on L ft/step on R ft across in back of L, step again to L side on L ft/touch R toe to floor across in front of L; repeat this action starting R ft and moving to R side twd wall.

25-32 **Repeat Meas. 1-8**

Tag

Walk, two; three, four;

Walk fwd in LOD four steps starting L ft as in Introduction.

Repeat entire dance for a total of three times

Your Styling is Showing

PART II

The subject this month is Crowded Floors -- suggested by the Fresno Convention just passed and the Golden State Round-Up coming up, and written after one of JIM YORK'S Saturday nights. We'd all love it if we had a "Sunny Hills" up here, with lots of room for all of our big dances, with good floors and good acoustics, but we don't. We all love big dances, and we certainly don't want to close the door on a popular dance when the floor is just comfortably filled, even if the ones already in would have a better dance. So, until bigger and better Halls are built, we'll just have to get along occasionally on a ten-foot Square, and like it. (Ten feet? Eight at most!)

What we can all do to help, though, is to dance a little differently in those crushes. We can be even more careful about extra twirls and swings, and keep our feet even more under us, and take even shorter steps. We can emphasize precision rather than freedom of action, and work for economy of movement. (Don't worry -- you'll get plenty of exercise on a crowded floor, anyhow, just dodging.)

For instance, take the half-sashay and the whirlaway. Some people think they are the same thing, or at least interchangeable. But try measuring the space needed for both, some time, and you'll see where the difference lies. Actually, a Whirlaway should never be done unless called, as it takes more time as well as more space, and the Caller may have a following Call in mind for which you won't be ready. But especially in the center of a crowded set, as where two couples face each other in the middle, do remember to slide neatly across to your partner's position, and save all that bumping.

Then there are the regular twirls in a promenade -- when you meet your partner across the set, when you get home, and when you pick up your Corner to promenade. All these twirls are legitimate and look nice, and are usually done, but why not leave them out, if you bump into someone every time you do them? This is part of Adaptability -- what is the value if insisting on a purely decorative piece of styling under circumstances where it is no longer pretty or fun or even very safe? Just forget it, and pick her up in promenade position.

Someone pointed out to me, after my last article, that I had not mentioned the Backlash as a bad habit. Frankly, I thought that was a dead issue -- that only Non-Conformists and Die-Hards were still doing it. But for the record, it has been denounced by every group of Dancers or Callers that I know, and is definitely on the scrap heap. So there.

One little traffic rule that turns out to be more important on crowded floors than usual, is the question of how two people pass on the outside of the Square. The general rule is that the lady passes on the inside, thus letting the gentleman run the risk of bumping into the next set. But when there are two men or two women passing each other, I would think that the usual rule of passing Right Shoulders would apply -- as in any Pass-Through figure. (Any arguments? Let's hear them.)

Another rule perhaps not generally understood applies to Cross Trails. We have been doing a regular Cross Trail for years, with the lady on the right, and everyone knows that the lady crosses in front. But lately we have been using all forms of mixed-up Cross Trails, with ladies on the left, and with two ladies or two men. It seems to be generally agreed that when a man has a lady on either side of him, he remains a gentleman and lets her go first, but when both are men or women, the one on the right, in the lady's usual place, goes first. Here again, on a crowded floor you have less space to maneuver, and it is more important to know exactly what to do.

For the rest, use common sense. Ladies, don't hold out your skirts in an Allemande Thar if you keep tangling with other ladies' skirts. Gents, promenade in close, shoulder to shoulder, and pull into the center when two couples promenade the outside. And when the Caller forgets where he is, and comes out with something like 'Spread that Star Away out wide!', don't take him too literally. Probably the sight of such a large crowd has gone to his head. But don't hold it against him, either -- it is pretty exciting to all of us to see our favorite activity bursting out at the seams.
