A SALUTE TO MADELINE



MADLINE ALLEN

The Square Dance Panorema takes many cogs to make the wheels go around. The Caller and the Dancer are only a segment of the whole. MADELINE ALLEN and her provocative pen (which sometimes resembles a sword of justice) has been a strong and dominant force of good for the entire Square Dance scene. We join in a salute to a great lady who is unselfishly and sincerely devoted to the art of Square Dancing.

MADLINE vignettes a part of her story as follows:

"I graduated from Stanford (Phi Beta Kappa, in case anyone cares), majoring in Psychology and English, both of which are useful in writing my columns. I got an 'A' in Geometry, and the only 'C' I ever got was in Public Speaking--which explains why I can write Squares, but never tried to Call. We started Square Dancing during the War, in Marin City, as a recreation project. We had a young Caller from Colorado, who used the Grange Do-Si-Do. He taught us that there was no 'right' way to do any figure--you did it the way the Caller told you to. This was a very rare point of view in those days. We danced for a couple of years with CHARLIE REINDOLLAR, when he was the only Live Caller in Marin County. We started talking about Square Dancing (which is quite a different thing) when DAN joined the Callers' Association, soon after it was formed. I have always loved to argue, and I felt right at home immediately with such outstanding hair-splitters as SANDY TEPFER, BILL CASTNER, and JACK MCKAY. JACK put me on his Standardization Committee, where we really had a Ball, analyzing Square Dance figures. We learned an awful lot, though I doubt if anyone ever read our report. Our first Square was 'Between the Ladies', based on a gimmick by our son TOBY, then thirteen and learning to call. He suggested the opening, where

ROSE ROOM

Record: "Rose Room" - Tempo #520
Position: Semi-closed dance position, M's back to COH.
Footwork: Opposite. Directions described are for the M.

Part A

Meas.

- 1-2 STEP FORWARD, THRU; SIDE/BEHIND, SIDE/DRAW;
Moving in LOD, step fwd on L, step fwd and thru on R; Then, turning to face partner, do a quick 3-step grapevine progressing in LOD: step to the side on L, step behind L on R, step to the side on L and draw R to L (keep wt on L), turning to face RLOD.
- 3-4 STEP FORWARD, THRU; SIDE/BEHIND, SIDE/DRAW;
Still in semi-closed pos, starting on M's R and moving in RL OD, repeat action of Meas 1-2. End in OPEN pos, inside hands joined, facing LOD.
- 5-6 WALK, TWO; TURN AWAY/TWO, THREE/-;
Starting on M's L and moving in LOD, progress fwd two steps, LR; Then turn away from partner (M, L-face; W, R-face) with 3 quick steps, LRL, still progressing in LOD. End facing RLOD, M's L and W's R hands joined.
- 7-8 BACK-UP, TWO; TURN AWAY/TWO, THREE/-;
Starting M's R and moving in LOD, progress bwd two steps, RL; Then, turn away from partner (M, R-face; W, L-face) with 3 quick steps, RLR, still progressing in LOD. End in semi-closed pos, M's back to COH.
- 9-16 Repeat Meas 1-8, except end in OPEN pos, inside hands joined, facing LOD.

Part B

- 17-18 WALK, TWO; SIDE/CLOSE, CROSS/PIVOT;
Starting M's L, open pos, progress fwd two steps, LR; Then, step to side on L, close R to L, cross L over R, pivoting to face RLOD, join M's L and W's R hands.
- 19-20 WALK, TWO; SIDE/CLOSE, CROSS/PIVOT;
Starting M's R and moving in RLOD, repeat action of Meas 17-18, pivoting on the last ct to assume CLOSED dance pos, M facing LOD
- 21-22 WALK, TWO; ROCK/ROCK, ROCK/-;
Progress fwd two steps, LR; Then, rock fwd on L, rock bwd on R, rock fwd on L.
- 23-24 WALK, TWO; ROCK/ROCK, ROCK/-;
Repeat action of Meas 21-22, starting on M's R. End in OPEN pos.
- 25-32 Repeat Meas 17-24. End semi-closed pos, M's back to COH, to repeat dance.
- DANCE IS DONE 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ TIMES THROUGH -- PART "A", "B", "A", "B", "A"
- ENDING: Both bow.

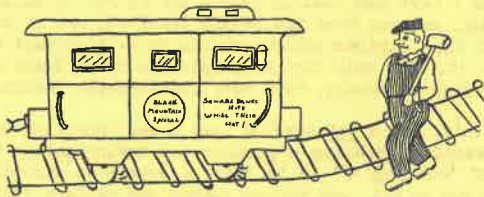
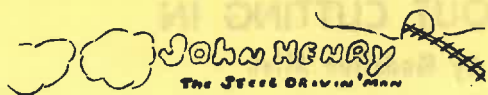

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the heads do a half sashay, lead to the right, and the ladies break to a line. At the time, this had never been done. He also suggested the 'right hand over, left hand under,' from a line of four --also new --and then threw it into my lap to finish. I worked the figure out, and then gave it to DAN to word in Caller's language. Since then, I have thought up my own gimmicks, but the process has been the same -- first the new figure, or new twist to an old one, then the arrangement that makes it come out right, then the words. Some of our favorite Calls, beside that one, which we still like, are 'Birds or a Feather', 'One More Duck', 'Around the One Who Isn't There', and my favorite of all, 'Who's On First?' 'I love that one, because it makes people laugh, and I think that is a valuable part of Square Dancing."



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ABOUT CUTTING IN

Remember the story about the woman who told her children not to put beans up their noses? Well, it seems I have been telling people not to cut in unless you are sure what you are doing, and you know the people involved, and so on. and all I have done is to get them curious about cutting in -- they want to know what it is, and how to do it. Not only that -- people who never heard of cutting in before have been trying it lately, with very questionable results. So here goes.

First, what is 'cutting in'? It is not barging into a set, knocking one or more people out of their stride, grabbing a partner and daring anyone to throw you out. The essence of 'cutting in' is to enter a square so smoothly that seven people don't notice you at all, and the one person you replace finds himself outside and can't figure out why. Your arrival must cause no confusion at all, and no interruption of the figure.

In order to do this, you must know several things. You must know what figures are possible to cut in on, and you must be able to tell when one of them is coming. Your timing must be perfect, so that you don't run into anyone, or cause anyone to run into you. You must also be able to execute your maneuver neatly, and immediately begin to listen, so that you will not miss the next call. In other words, in order to cut into a square, you must be able to do everything they are doing and more too.

Maybe I had better say a word here about why cut in. One good reason is because you have no partner at the moment or there are not enough couples for another square, and you want to dance. In effect, you are borrowing someone else's partner and place in the square, without so much as asking. In this case, think first, is your credit that good? Will he grin and go off and cut in somewhere else, or maybe be glad to sit down for a moment, or will he stand and glower at you? Will he know enough to get out gracefully, or will he be confused and embarrassed, and maybe mess things up instead? Unless you can answer these questions satisfactorily, better give up the idea.

Another good reason for cutting in is to liven things up a little. At a large open dance, where the level is being held down for the majority of dancers, there may be a few sets who are getting along just a little too well. Maybe they are getting bored and careless, and you think they need waking up. Having people cutting in and out of such sets gets the dancers interested again and a real effort to do it smoothly and ingeniously supplies the challenge that they may have been missing. There again, just pushing in does no good -- sloppy cutting-in is just as bad as any other kind of horsing around.

The simplest and surest method of cutting in to almost any square is on an allemande left. You spot your victim, and take your place unobtrusively near his home base. You wait for the end of a figure, and as soon as an allemande left is called, you move. As he turns his back on his partner to go to his corner, you step into his spot, facing his partner's position. When she comes back to him, she finds you instead, and he sees nothing but your back. Seeing a strange man's back instead of his partner's face should be a pretty strong hint to him to get out -- he is no longer needed. (Of course, he can simply follow along behind, giving his erstwhile partner his left hand, and so on around, and at the promenade everyone will have his corner as a new partner, and the interloper will find himself left out. This puts the shoe on the other foot, but is not considered really 'cricket'.

Another good way to cut in, but a trickier one, is on an 'around just one' figure. This method involves knowing the pattern of the figure, so that when your victim comes out of one side of the square, you can anticipate where he will go next, and get there first. This is even better when done by a couple, who simply step into the home base of a couple who are coming around the outside, and do the next figure in their place. This has occasionally resulted in a constant procession of different couples coming in and out of a square, and was a lot easier to accomplish before the present rash of Cross Trails and such. Once upon a time, you could predict what the figure was going to be, but not any more.

There is one other rule I usually make for myself, when I am plotting to borrow someone's partner for a dance. I wait until she has had at least a part of a dance before I cut in. If it is a long square, I wait until half way through, or maybe until the second tip. Stepping in one the first allemande left would be much easier, but it would be straining your credit pretty far.

Cutting in on Star figures is easy but rough -- you can step in anywhere, but the result is almost sure to be a scramble for partners, and general confusion. This method is not recommended.

I would like to see Clubs do more cutting in on their own class nights, for practice. Having all members know how to cut in without disrupting things is a great help on nights when an uneven number of people are present. By keeping the extra people circulating, no one needs to stay out more than a few moments, waiting for a good opening. In some Clubs, there is a rule that you may not cut back into the same square, but must move one, mixing things up even if that means cutting right back into the same square.
