Record: "Memories Are Made of This" - Capitol 3295
St. Position: Semi-closed position
Footwork: Opposite throughout. Directions given are for the M.

- Meas. (4 beats) Introduction
- 1-2 Wait
- 3-6 BAL FWD, TOUCH; BAL BACK, TOUCH; BAL FWD, TOUCH; BAL BACK, TOUCH;
Step fwd L, touch R toe beside L; Step back R, touch L toe beside R. Repeat.
- 1-4 FWD-CLOSE, BACK; BACK-CLOSE, FWD; FWD-CLOSE, BACK; BACK-CLOSE, FWD;
Step fwd in LOD on L, close R to L, step back in RLOD on L; Step back on R, close L to R and step fwd R. Repeat Meas 1-2 to end facing partner in loose-closed position.
- 5-6 SIDE-CLOSE, CROSS; SIDE-CLOSE, CROSS;
Step to side along LOD on L, close R to L, step through between partner to RLOD by crossing L over R; Step to side along RLOD on R, close L to R, cross R through to LOD
- 7-8 TWO-STEP TURN; TWO-STEP TURN;
Starting L foot do two CW turning two-steps to end in semi-open pos.
- 9-12 WALK, 2; ROLL ACROSS; WALK, 2; ROLL BACK;
Step fwd L, R; Then M takes 3 steps in place LRL as W makes one L-face turn in 3 steps in front of M to end facing LOD on L side of M and assume semi-open pos; Moving LOD walk fwd R,L; Then as M takes 3 steps in place, W makes one R-face turn in 3 steps crossing in front of M to end facing partner in loose-closed pos.
- 13-14 SIDE-CLOSE, CROSS; SIDE-CLOSE, CROSS;
Repeat Meas. 5-6.
- 15-16 TWO-STEP TURN; TWO-STEP TURN;
Repeat Meas. 7-8 to end in semi-closed pos. ready to repeat the dance.

ENTIRE DANCE IS DONE FOUR TIMES PLUS ENDING

ENDING: Repeat Meas. 1-3. On the 4th meas., face partner, step back slightly R, L, and take normal bow. (M's R hand, W's L, joined)

California "STYLE" —by Madeline Allen—

When you hear a dance described as 'California Style', what comes to your mind? Unfortunately, judging from letters and articles in magazines all over the country, most people think of a very fast tempo, intricate Hash calls, lots of grab-grab arm swings, jerky movements done without adequate time allowed, and a lot of new commands that old-time dancers don't understand. They deplore the loss of smoothness and grace, and they say we are 'killing square dancing'. As a California dancer who has also seen a lot of dancing in other parts of the country, may I rise in our defense?

Before anyone starts to complain, let me state that I am obviously not talking about all California dancing. California is a big State, and we dance all sorts of ways. But I am speaking specifically about the type of dancing labeled 'California Style' by its critics, and I am going to try to explain why we like it.

First, let's take the question of speed. I think we do go a little faster than the National average, but we do not go nearly as fast as people think, nor as fast as a lot of us did a few years ago. A 'fast' caller here probably uses a metronome speed of 132-134, and may occasionally hit 138. (Not 160, as had been charged!) This is as fast as we like our feet to go, and we do like to take a step for each beat of the music. The thing that fools people is that our thinking speed is so much faster than they are used to. The thing that leaves visitors breathless, and sometimes makes them give up in disgust, is the fact that our callers never call anything twice the same way. No matter how well you know the figure, you cannot count on doing it the way you know it. Even if the Heads got through all right, the Sides may have a switch pulled on them, and you have to listen to every word -- an exhausting business for people not used to it. Once, we were able to coast through any figure we knew and only listen really hard on the breaks, but nowadays about the only mental rest we can take is on a 'Grand Right and Left'. We do have a few 'Gentleman's Agreements' about interrupted calls -- if you say 'Grand right and left' you are supposed to let the dancers go as far as their partners before changing the call, and a 'do-paso' is supposed to be partner, corner, partner, every time, although what you do when you reach your partner again is anybody's guess.

The effect of jerkiness, criticized by many people who say we are not 'dancing', is not our ideal. We gave up a long time ago allowing the classic 8 or 16 counts for every figure, and have been trying instead to allow just as many beats as our dancers naturally seem to take. In the hands of a good caller, this system, we feel pays off in smoother progress from one movement to another. Unfortunately, all California callers are not good callers. A poor caller, trying to call like an expert, does pretty well in a singing call, or in a routine call where he can memorize and repeat. But it takes a high degree of skill to call a smooth mixture of figures, changing all the time, never the same, and timed so that each command comes exactly when it is needed. And it takes pretty slick dancers (although I think the Caller's part is more important), to execute these changes smoothly, moving at a steady pace, never stopping to figure anything out, keeping perfect balance so as to be able to turn either way, and making twirls when there is time, but skipping them if necessary. It also takes a smooth floor, for uninterrupted motion, and excellent acoustics, because you have to hear every word. As you can see, the combination necessary to produce perfect examples of 'California Style' dancing is hard to get, and a lack in one field or another produces something a little different. When you do finally achieve that ultimate combination, however, you have a totally new dance experience.

I can imagine people, reading this, wondering why we bother. If our ideal dance situation is so hard to achieve, and may result in such a mess at any time, why not settle for the type of dancing that anyone can do, anywhere, with almost any caller, and relax? I guess the answer is, we don't dance to 'relax'. We enjoy square dancing as a dynamic sport, with something doing all the time, and plenty to talk about between dances. We like to 'live dangerously', and never know for sure whether we are going to get through the next tip alive. The fact that conditions are not always ideal on any given evening does not matter -- we figure we are learning something anyhow, and are preparing ourselves for that perfect dance, at some future time, when caller, dancers, floor, acoustics, and everything else will get together, and we'll really 'live it up'. Actually, this happy combination occurs oftener than you would

think -- in California that is. (What happens to 'California Style' in some other parts of the country, may be something else again.)

If you think you could not stand such a mental pace all evening, you're right. We don't, either. Most callers use a singing call as a second tip, to let their dancers down easy, and most Clubs take a five minute break after each pair of tips, besides. Then we do a Round, to give those who are still full of pep a chance to work some of it off, while the others continue to pant. Contrary to what you might think, California dancers are not all young and athletic -- a majority of them are 'mature' dancers, old enough not to need baby-sitters for their children any more, and they know what they can take, in the way of exercise. They may not like to swing quite as long as they used to, and they may skip a few twirls, and out a few corners, but there is nothing the matter with their heads, and the more puzzling a dance is, the more they like it -- at least, while it's new.

This brings up one more main difference between California-type calls and others. California Workshops have been accused of putting out a lot of dances that are not worth printing -- just a bunch of Hash, all more or less alike, not well-balanced, with no lasting value. I think the answer is, we are not actually trying to write anything of lasting value - our output is more like a series of television scripts than a serious literary effort, and is definitely expendable. Most of the calls are really only suggestions -- a new figure, or a variation on an old one, is introduced and described, and a few lines are written around it, to show how it could be used. None of us expect our calls to be used exactly as written -- every caller will take out the part he likes, weave it into some other pattern, and go on from there. We are satisfied if we have contributed a new twist to an old movement.

Another complaint of those who say we are 'ruining square dancing', is that we are making things so complicated that it takes too long to learn to dance. We agree that it takes longer than it used to, and we compensate for this by arranging classes for beginners and intermediates, and by providing 'Beginners' Hoedowns' as parties for those who have not yet finished the course. We think, however, that the sort of dancing that will be open to those beginners when they finally graduate serves as a shining goal for them, and that they are glad to keep at it through the learning period, in order to qualify eventually for the 'real' Hoedowns. How many of them fall by the wayside? Well, we lose a few, but think of the number of people who buy a set of golf clubs and then never learn to play! There will always be those who start and never finish, in any activity. But judging by the number of new Clubs starting up all the time, and the attendance at each of the big gatherings lately, we are more than holding our own, and square dancing in California is still growing.

Finally, we believe in 'live and let live' -- you dance your way and we'll dance ours. No one else has to go along with us, although we notice more and more isolated Clubs around the country who are going our way. We're glad to see it, and we enjoy sending them our Workshop Notes and getting their reactions to our inventions. But we're not trying to change anyone. Square dancing would be in a sorry state if everyone danced exactly the same!

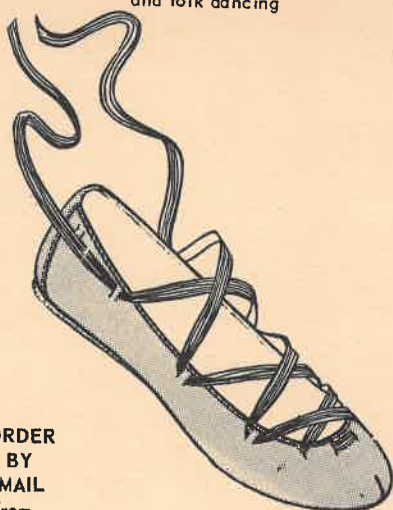

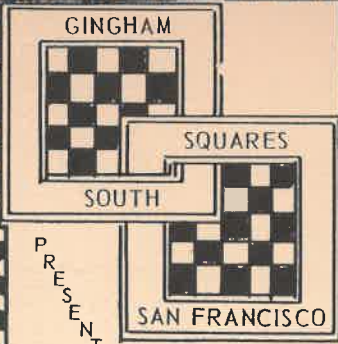

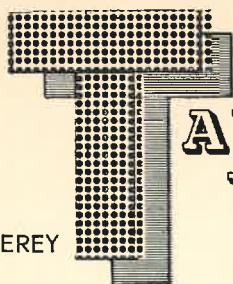
