UKELELE LADY

By Marge and Vince Belgarbo, Skokie, Ill.

Record: Wing W-90021
Position: Open, facing LOD
Footwork: Opposite throughout, Directions for M

Measure

- 1-2 WALK, 2/FACE; SIDE CLOSE, SIDE CLOSE;
Inside hands joined, step fwd L R, face partner and join hands; Step to side on L, close R to L, step to side on L close R to L.
- 3-4 TWIRL 2, 3 TOUCH; TWIRL 2, 3 TOUCH;
While the M steps to the side in LOD, L R L touch R, change hands to M's L & W's R, W twirls R under her R arm in 3 steps RLR touch L; Repeat in RLOD, with W making L-face swirl under Same Joined Hands.
- 5-8 SIDE/CLOSE, CROSS; SIDE/CLOSE, CROSS; SLIDE/CLOSE, CROSS; SIDE/CLOSE, CROSS;
Facing partner, M's L & W's R hands joined, step to L side on L, close R to L, cross L over R; Change hands to M's R & W's L, Step to R on R close L to R then cross R over L. Repeat above action.
- 9-16 REPEAT MEAS. 1-8, AND AFTER LAST CLOSE, CROSS CHANGE HANDS TO SKATERS POSITION FACING LOD.
- 17-18 LADY OUT; SIDE CLOSE, STEP TOUCH;
M's R hand around W's waist. (Skaters pos. keep R hands joined throughout meas. 17-24) M walks L R making $\frac{1}{4}$ R-face turn to face wall (while W makes $\frac{3}{4}$ R-face turn in 2 steps R L to face partner), then step L R L touch R in LOD
- 19-20 LADY IN; BACK CLOSE, BACK TOUCH;
M walks R L, turns $\frac{1}{4}$ R-face to face RLOD as he winds lady back $\frac{1}{4}$ L-face into skaters pos (W is now on inside of circle); M steps back R L R touch L.
- 21-22 LADY OUT; SIDE CLOSE, SIDE TOUCH;
Repeat Meas. 17-18 in RLOD.
- 23-24 LADY IN; BACK CLOSE, SIDE TOUCH; (Skaters Pos)
Repeat Meas 19-20. End facing LOD.
- 25-28 WALK, 2; TURN, 2; SIDE CLOSE, SIDE TOUCH; SIDE CLOSE, SIDE TOUCH;
Both wlk fwd 2 steps, drop hands, turn in twd partner and all the way around to face partner; Join hands, Step to L in LOD L R L touch R; Then to R in RLOD R L R touch L.

29-32 WALK, 2; TURN, 2; SIDE CLOSE, SIDE TOUCH; SIDE CLOSE, SIDE TOUCH;

Repeat action of Meas. 25-28 progressing in LOD

Break--DO-SA-DO (Passing right shoulders) with 4 slow two-steps ending facing Partner,

Tag --Walk, 2; TURN 2, BOW;

Walk 2 in LOD, turn in twd partner all the way around in 2 quick steps and bow.

SEQUENCE: ENTIRE DANCE, BREAK, ENTIRE DANCE, BREAK, TAG.

THE CALLER SPEAKS UP

This month, I have a message from the 'California Style' callers to the dancers. Please, they say, no matter how hard we try, we can't do it all! If you want to dance all this tricky, challenge stuff, and hear something new every time we call, you will have to learn to do the little, simple, basic things right. If you don't end a figure facing the right way, you won't be in the right position for the gimmick, and the square will fall apart with a dull thud. Modern square dance figures call for accuracy as well as fast reaction time, and it takes only one individualist to defeat the efforts of seven other people -- eight, counting the caller.

First, before we start arguing, I am not talking about the casual manoeuvres we do while the caller is just playing around, before he really starts the call. 'All around your left hand lady, seesaw your pretty little taw' is a break in itself, and can be done with a lot more freedom of action than the 'seesaw' that appears in the middle of 'Riptide'. A whirlaway may go substituted for a half sashay when you are circling eight, but when four people are working in the center of the set, there just isn't room. The figures I have in mind are the simple basics that serve to change people around from one place to another in the call itself.

First, here are a few things two people do with each other, and where they start and where they end. (I am assuming that you really know how to do them, and just need a little reminding.)

Dos-a-do--- you start facing each other, go around each other passing right shoulders, and end up exactly where you started, still face to face.

Seesaw -- same thing, passing left shoulders.

Box the gnat -- you start facing each other, join right hands, exchange places, and end up still face to face, but in each others' places.

Box the flea -- same thing, with left hands.

California Twirl, or Frontier Twirl -- you start side by side, lady on the gent's right, with inside hands joined. You exchange places and reverse direction, and you end up with the lady still on the gent's right, but both facing the other way.

California Whirl -- same thing, with the lady on the gent's left. (Yes, I know these two names sound too much alike. Here in Northern California, we always mean 'twirl' (with your partner) unless we cue it with 'with your corner girl, California Whirl', or something like that. If all that you heard was, 'California---', do it with the lady on your right.)

Half sashay -- start side by side. The lady slides in front of the gent, who slides behind her. You end still facing the same way, with the lady on the gent's other side.

Resashay -- slide right back to place. Not necessarily followed by -

Go all the way around -- gent goes in front of lady, then around behind her.

Whirlaway -- half sashay with a full turn for the lady.

Rollaway -- same as whirlaway, from a star promenade.

Half sashay, put the girls in the middle -- called from a Thar position. The lady and the gent slide by each other, face to face, and end up with the lady in the middle, still going forward, while the man is still backing up.

Eight Rollaway with a half sashay -- Starts and finishes like the above, but with each person doing a full turn -- first a half turn together, then a half turn separately.

On the subject of how far to go on an arm swing, we can't be quite so specific. The usual arm swing is once around and back to the same place, like a left allemande. Anything else the caller says, like 'go once and a half

around' or 'go all the way around' or 'a full turn, Joe', means that he wants you to go farther than that, and the next call will tell you how far -- as 'on you go', or 'new corner by the right', or some such thing.

When you get four people milling around in the middle of the square, you have a lot of other things they can do, and a lot of other ways they can go wrong. Here are some two-couple figures that are often done pretty sloppily;

Pass thru -- you pass right shoulders with the opposite person, but you don't do anything else until you are told.

Right and left thru -- always turn your partner with a courtesy turn and face back the way you came, no matter what the next call is.

Ladies chain -- always turn the lady around and face back.

Four ladies star across -- don't use a courtesy turn. The caller said 'star' instead of 'chain' just so that you would use an arm swing.

Cross trail thru -- pass right shoulders first, then cross, when two couples are working together. If you are told to 'cross trail thru' an inactive couple, split them first, then cross.

Trail thru, or trail on thru -- in Northern California, same as above.

Circle once around -- that means exactly once. Even if you came into the center with a lady on your left, circle far enough so that she will still be on your left.

Star once around -- same thing.

Head gents break and form a line -- first, always know whether or not you are a head gent. If you are, let go with your left hand and hang onto your partner -- meaning the lady on your right at the time. This will put the active gents on the left end of the line, every time.

This brings up another little point -- who's your partner? In Australia, you could almost say that she was the lady you brought to the dance. But here, you sometimes change partners so fast that you don't even have time to say 'hello'. To name a few, your partner is:

The girl on your right in a circle

The girl you swing

The girl with whom you start a right and left grand

The girl with whom you start a do-pas-o

The girl with whom you do a right and left thru

The girl you receive in a ladies chain

The girl on your arm in an allemande thar.

The girl you promenade

By the same token, your corner is the girl on your left at any given time. In an eight hand star, figure out who would be on your left if you spread out into a circle -- the girl behind you in a left hand star, the girl ahead of you in a right hand star. Any time you don't know which way is 'left', face the set and see -- or try wearing a glove with a big 'L' on it.

One last request -- whenever you find yourself in a square formation again for a moment, take a good look at your corner. You may have acquired a new one in the last break, and your best anchor to windward, these days, is to be sure who your 'original' corner is. This may not help you do the figure the caller is trying to call, but it has one great advantage -- when he finally comes out with 'corners all -- left allemande!' you can make a dive across the set, grab your corner, and finish in style, with your own partner, just as if you had been right all along. There is nothing like a good strong finish to leave everybody happy.
