BLACK AND WHITE RAG

By Julie & Bert Passerello, Long Beach, California

Record: Sunny Hills AC 103SO

Position: Varsouviana

Footwork: Identical throughout (start L foot for both)

PART A

Meas.

- 1-4 POINT FRONT, -, SIDE, -; BEHIND, STEP, STEP, -; POINT FRONT, -, SIDE, -; BEHIND, STEP, STEP, -;

Pt L ft fwd slightly across R, pt L ft to side; Step on L in bk of R, step to side on R, step fwd on L (Calif. Schottische step); Repeat starting with R ft.

- 5-8 WALK, -, 2, -; TURN (R), 2, 3, -; BACKUP, -, 2, -; TURN (L), 2, 3, -;

Walk fwd in LOD L, R; Then turn $\frac{1}{2}$ R-face as individuals in 3 quick steps L,R,L, (Still in Vars. pos) so W stays on outside of circle throughout meas. 5-8; Walk back in LOD R, L; Turn $\frac{1}{2}$ L-face in 3 steps R,L,R.

- 9-16 REPEAT PART A (MEAS 1-8). Finish in Skaters pos.

PART B

- 17-20 CROSS, STEP, STEP, -; CROSS, STEP, STEP, -; CROSS, STEP, STEP, -; CROSS, STEP, STEP, -;

In skaters pos, cross L over R (in front) pivoting R slightly to face diag. fwd out, step bk quickly on R (on ball of ft only), step fwd again on L, at same time lifting R ft up in bk with slight kick and bring around to cross R over L (in front) pivoting L slightly to face diag fwd in twd center, step bk on L, fwd again on R (progress slightly only on cross step; the step, step is done in place); Repeat to L; Repeat to R; On last step remain facing diag fwd into center.

- 21-24 BUZZ L, -, 2, -; 3, -, 4, -; BUZZ R, -, 2, -; 3, -, 4, -;

In skaters pos partners step to side on L and take 4 buzz steps to L one full turn keeping wt on L ft and pushing with R; Release handholds and take 4 solo buzz steps to R one full turn changing wt to R ft, pushing with L. Resume skaters pos at end.

- 25-32 REPEAT PART B (MEAS 17-24); After solo buzz step resume vars pos to start A.

DANCE ENTIRE DANCE THROUGH 4 TIMES

TAG

- 1-4 POINT FRONT, -, SIDE, -; BEHIND, STEP, STEP, -; POINT FRONT, -, SIDE, -; GIRL TURN AND BOW.

In vars pos repeat meas 1-4 of Part A but on last 3 steps release hands - M makes $\frac{1}{2}$ R-face turn in 2 steps, R,L; step bk on R for bow. W turns $\frac{3}{4}$ R-face turn in 2 steps to face partner, R,L, step bk on R, joining M's R, W's L hands for bow.

-Callers Workshop Speaking-

After last month's list of simple basics often loused up, I got a lot of 'Thank You's' from the Callers, and a lot from the dancers, too. They all agreed that those figures, at least, ought to be done right, without any argument, because everybody really does know how to do them, if they will only think. But the Workshop-type Callers, who are trying out the new stuff, pointed out that there are also quite a few new calls, supposed to be directional, which are still too new to be taught in classes, and which are still open to argument. They sometimes wonder if even the Callers really know what they mean.

A good example of this type of direction is 'Face in the Middle'. Sure-- if you are swinging a girl, and the Caller says 'Face in the Middle', you put her down on your right in such a position that you both face the center of the square from wherever you were swinging. But then along comes the 'Little Red Hen', and when the call comes, you are already facing the center, from one point of view. After you have been walked thru the square enough times, you finally realize that there are two ways to 'face the middle' - with your back to the head position, or with your back to the sides. If you are already facing it one way, the call must mean to turn and face it the other way, otherwise, why give any command at all? So the rule has come to be, when you are told to 'Face in the Middle', make a quarter turn, individually, and face the other axis of the square.

Then we get something like 'First and third pass thru, separate, go around two, and form lines of four'. We are often asked which way the lines are supposed to be formed. If you go all the way around the two people, you would line up at the head of the set, but if you just go past them, you would line up at the sides, beside the side people. For your information, there is now a rule about that, and it is this; if the call just says 'form lines', you line up with the couples already standing there, and face the same way. If the call says 'form new lines', it means to line up the other way, and the people standing there will have to turn and face the way you are facing. (Some Callers don't know this rule, either.)

Do you know the difference between 'Wheel around' and 'Back-track' from a promenade? In a 'Wheel around', you turn as a unit, and the girl stays on the man's right, and promenades back on the inside. In a 'Back-track', you turn individually toward each other, but keeping promenade hold, and the girl is now on the man's left, with the man still on the inside.

A little word that always throws people because it is hard to understand in a hurry is 'Rim'. It simply means the people on the outside of a star promenade, especially an Arky Star, when some of them are men and some are ladies. 'The Rim turn back' ought to be clear enough, if you actually hear it.

'Hinge', also, ought to be clear, if you stop to think. What does a hinge do? It doesn't go anywhere - it stands still, and something attached to it moves. So, 'the Ends Hinge' means for the ends of the line to stand still and turn, while the centers hang onto them and move around them, as far as directed. You can also have 'the Centers Hinge, the Ends turn in', in which case the line closes like an open book. Or you can have 'the ladies hinge', wherever they are, and the men will walk around them. If you are told you are a 'hinge' just stand pat and turn.

Of course, you all know 'Rip and Snort', where one couple goes down the center of the square, pulling the rest with them, dives thru the opposite couple, and separates. When they get back together, the square is just the way it started. But do you know 'Rip and Tear'? This is a relatively new call, in which the couple does not separate, but just keeps going, until they have turned the square inside out, leaving it sunny side out.

There are probably a lot more of these, and I will hear about all of them in good time, but it is still pretty soon after the National Convention to be thinking at all. There is one other figure, though, that is not new at all, nor even obscure, but that is still harder to get people to do without warning than any other thing I know. I mean the call, from a Grand Right and Left, 'First couple only, turn right back, the rest keep going' and so on. I think there are two 'areas of difficulty' in that call, of which the first is, re-

membering which couple you are. But I also think there is one thing a lot of people don't know, or never heard. That is, that you have to meet your own partner before you turn back, no matter where you were when you heard the call. Think a moment -- at what point can the 'First couple only' turn back? Obviously, when they are together -- otherwise someone else would have to turn back with each of them. The same is true of each successive call -- meet your own partner before you turn back. If you dancers would learn to do such simple turn-backs, we could go on and call other figures depending on multiple turn-backs. (Anything you can learn to do, we can think up ways to complicate! You can't win.)
