"SQUARE DANCE~WHERE?" CALLER OF THE MONTH

GREETINGS TO LEE HELSEL

LEE has always been one of our favorites in the Square Dance Field. His contributions are many, his followers Legion. LEE tells his story thusly:

My first introduction to square dancing was in 1946, when Mary and I joined the DO-C-DO Square Dance Club in North Hollywood. The caller for this club was FENTON "JONSEY" JONES. At that time I was working with the Los Angeles Recreation and Park Department as a Recreation Director. I started calling several months later because of the tremendous demand for square dance classes in the area. From 1946 to February 1951, I taught classes and called in the Southern California Area, usually busy six to seven nights a week. One of the most interesting groups I had during this time was a group composed of movie and radio personalities--such people as PRESTON FOSTER, DANNY KAYE, LES PAUL, GEORGIA GIBBS, and RALPH EDWARDS were among the people in the club.

In 1951 I moved to Sacramento to assume the position as Coordinator of Rehabilitation Therapies with the Calif. State Department of Mental Hygiene, and continued teaching and calling. Presently I am calling regularly for clubs in Sacramento, Vallejo, Chico, Lodi, and Stockton, in addition to doing considerable calling in the whole Northern California Area. Occasionally I call for clubs in Southern California, as my work with the Department of Mental Hygiene takes me throughout the State. While in Southern California I began to assist new callers in techniques of calling and held callers classes for calling aspirants. I have continued this practice in Northern California, holding two classes per year for the last five years.

I have served as a staff member of the Northwest Square Dance Camp, Cosur de 'Alene, Idaho, and the Lake Quinalt Square Dance Institute, Lake Quinalt, Washington. I am a regular member of the Winter Asilomar Institute staff, as well as having served as staff member at the August Session of the summer institute. I served as first chairman of the Callers Workshop of the Associated Square Dancers of Superior California, and assisted in the organization of the dancers association. I travelled over 13,000 miles last year calling square dances. I have composed a number of dances, such as "Little Red Wagon", "Hey Ma!", "Dog Face Soldier", "Chesapeake Bay", and my two latest dances, which will be released in September under Sets In Order label are "Them Ther Eyes", and "Square Dance Melody". I am currently recording for Sets In Order label. My next release is due in the later part of September.

My wife, Mary, ably assists me in my busy square dance activities, and has proven to be a tremendous help to me in my work in square dancing.

I will make a calling tour to the East Coast in the latter part of Sept. and the first half of October. I plan to leave the day after the Guerneville Session. I will call in Chicago, Akron, Philadelphia, Boston, Washington, D.C. Cincinnati, and Denver.

My position with the Department of Mental Hygiene involves the direction of the state-wide program of rehabilitation therapy, which includes occupational, recreational, and music therapy, together with volunteer services. The Department operates thirteen mental hospitals, and square dancing is an integral part of the rehabilitation program of each hospital. It can be safely said that square dancing helps many patients on the road to recovery.

GETTING TO KNOW YOU

By Jeff and Dottee Peters, Seattle, Wash.



Record: "Getting to Know You" - Decca 27613
Position: Open, facing LOD, inside hands joined.
Footwork: Opposite
Intro: 4 measures. Wait 2 meas.; then balance apart on meas. 3 and together on Meas. 4

Meas.

PART A

- 1-2 STEP, TOUCH, CHANGE SIDES, 2; STEP, TOUCH, CHANGE SIDES, 2;
(Same fig as Blue Pacific) Swinging joined hands fwd and turning slightly away from partner step L touch R beside L, swing joined hands back and releasing, change places pivoting full R-face turn R,L (W pivots L-face across in front of M); Repeat with W on M's L still facing LOD with opp. hand & footwork.
- 3-4 WALK, -, 2, -; 3, -, 4, -;
Four slow walking steps LOD, inside hands joined. Bend the knee slightly just after each step is taken while the other foot glides fwd to the next step.
- 5-8 Repeat meas. 1-4, turning to face partner on Meas. 8
- 9-10 CHANGE SIDES, -, 2, -; SIDE, CLOSE, SIDE, -;
In 2 slow steps change sides, M crossing in front of partner L, R, (W turning L-face under M's R) pivot on 2nd step to face partner and COH. Join both hands shoulder high (Butterfly pos), side, close, side (LRL), in RLOD.
- 11-12 CHANGE SIDES, -, 2, -: SIDE, CLOSE, SIDE, -;
Retaining W R-hand in M L, partners cross back in 2 slow steps with W crossing R-face under joined hands (M twd LOD as they pass each other) to end in Butterfly pos; swd two-step in RLOD.
- 13-14 TWIRL TWO-STEP; REVERSE TWIRL TWO-STEP;
Twirl W R-face under M L-hand as M does swd two-step in LOD; Reverse or L-face twirl under same hands in RLOD (many prefer this 2nd twirl under M R and W L hands). End in closed pos., M back to COH.
- 15-16 TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP;
Two R-face turning two-steps progressing in LOD.

PART B

- 17-32 Repeat all of Part A ending meas 32 in banjo pos, M facing LOD.
- 33-34 FWD TWO-STEP; FWD TWO-STEP;
In banjo pos R hips adjacent, M facing and moving LOD step, close, step (LRL) step, close, step (RLR).
- 35-36 ROCK FWD, -, ROCK BWD, -; TWIRL, 2, 3, 4;
Still in banjo pos rock fwd LOD ct 1, 2, rock bwd RLOD 3, 4; twirl W under M's L in 4 quick steps changing hands and ending in open pos, inside hands joined to start from top.

SEQUENCE: A, B, A, B, B, ENDING WITH BOW AND CURTSY.

SOLVED - - THE VISITING CALLERS WIFE

Square Dance Callers' wives have a lot of problems, but to me the biggest one is how to remain a real part of Square Dancing after your husband takes up calling. Some wives just give up, and let their husbands go out alone. But Square Dancing is fundamentally a couple activity, and most wives do their best to keep it so. They dress up and go along, and greet people, and remember names, and act like hostesses, until the dancing starts. Then they sit.

Here is where I think they need and deserve help. It isn't that the men don't want to dance with a Caller's wife. On the contrary, they can see that most Caller's wives are prettier and better dancers and more glamorous than their own, and would be a welcome change. But, as I said, Square Dancing is a couple activity. In most Clubs the normal procedure is for a couple to start the dance together or to exchange partners with another couple, but not for a man to abandon his wife and ask another lady to dance. This is even more true at the special dances with Visiting Callers, where it is a treat to dance every dance. For this reason, it takes some concrete plan, on the part of the Club, to provide a continuous procession of partners for the Caller's wife, to make her glad she came.

Of course, if the Club has single members, one solution would be to assign a man to the Caller's wife for the evening. This would work a hardship on the single girls, though, who were probably counting on dancing with him. An even worse solution is for the Club President to take her on, and try to get other men to dance with her. His wife has lost him, and other wives never seem to cooperate. And the machinery is all too apt to show. An attempt to make out a program for the Caller's wife bogged down on the simple fact that Square Dances are not programmed any more, and no one ever knew whether it was the third tip or the fifth. Then came Robin Hood.

This was my own idea, and I am proud of it. I used to be a Caller's Wife occasionally myself, before we decided to be plain Dancers, and it always makes me feel guilty to see a guest of the Club sitting alone. I did not mind lending her my husband for an occasional dance, but not for the whole evening. So one night I took along a silver badge, a product of a children's television show ('send to your Station for our Membership Card and Badge'), with a pretty red stone on it, and the words 'Robin Hood'. My husband pinned it on, told the other Club members it meant 'Robin Hood to the Rescue!', and asked the caller's wife for a dance. In the next break, he pinned it on the chest of another member, and told him it was his turn. All evening that badge travelled around among the members, and the Caller's wife was danced right off her feet. At the end of the evening, we asked her how she liked the new idea, and she had not caught on at all. She had noticed the badge, but thought all the men were wearing them, and thought she had never seen such a hospitable Club!

Ever since then, we have used that idea. At San Diego, where BILL MARON had his engravers making badges to order, I got one that says 'Available for Dancing', and we use that to indicate that that particular man has been officially released by his wife, and has her permission to ask the Caller's wife for a dance. (What a ball the ladies had the night we had a lady Caller! We really gave her husband a rush.) We have found that no wife minds releasing her husband for one dance, if she is sure of getting him back. And we have even found an interesting side effect of the plan. We are getting a lot more cutting-in than we used to have, because the wife who is left out feels perfectly free to cut in anywhere she wants to, and she knows who to cut out. The Visiting Callers' wife may like to cut in too, and may be an expert, but if she does not know the members very well, she hesitates to start. A member's wife has no such inhibitions, and there has been a noticeable rise in mixing on the floor.

Incidentally, since that first surprise trial run, we have found that it works better to explain the system to the visiting lady, and to tell her that if she really does not want to dance every dance, she still has the privilege of saying, 'No, thank you', and no one will be insulted. After all, some of those ladies haven't danced much lately, and we don't want the change to be too much of a shock.
