A SALUTE TO BOB PAGE

Going along with the theory that most men have to be dragged to their first square dance, BOB is unusual in that he went of his own accord and liked it from the beginning. This was in 1948 and the group was the HARMONY HOEDOWNERS. He was their first president. It wasn't too long before their caller, SANDY TEPPER, had BOB "under his wing" teaching him the whys and wherefores of calling. Those were the "toothpick and water" days of square dancing in this area and callers were needed by the carload!

In 1949 he started calling for the COUNTRY COUSINS of San Leandro and in 1951 for the SHINDIGGERS of Oakland. The COUSINS will celebrate their 7th Anniversary in October and the SHINDIGGERS toasted five years of happy dancing on Sept 21. Two years ago he started calling for the BARN OWLS of San Lorenzo who are well known for their wonderful first Saturday hoedowns. Just recently BOB signed up as caller with a new group, the VALLEY VAGABONDS of Napa, and is looking forward to a lot of fun with these enthusiastic people. Also, he is director of the BOB-O-LINKS Exhibition Group (teenagers) and they are his pride and joy.

Being on the teaching staff of the Hayward Area Recreation Dept. for the past seven years, BOB has taught many beginner and intermediate classes and is now interested in the development of new callers (CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE. BOB, THAT IS)

- having just "graduated" a class of 11. Many requests for another class promises a full session this fall.

Historically speaking, BOB helped to organize the Northern California Square Dancers' Association and is past chairman of the Dancers' Workshop; also, Sets in Order Caller of the Month in May, 1954. Being Program Chairman of the Golden State Roundup for two years, he was responsible for setting up their first program which has since been "copied" extensively in other parts of the United States.

Also, BOB and his taw, NITA, are the originators of the round dance, Rose Room, which has enjoyed popularity throughout the country. He composed the singing call, "Two Timin' Gal", released two months ago on the Sunnyhills label.

BOB hailed originally from the plains of Nebraska, and NITA was born in Texas. Her father was (of all things) a square dance caller and she grew up with the square dance Rhythm of the hoedown. They have three children - Kenny, 10; Craig, 6; and Bobbi Dee, 17 months. To the PAGES, square dancing is no fad or passing fancy - it is a way of life.

OF THE MONTH

By Jeri and Hunter Crosby, Three Rivers, California

RECORD: "Barbershop Rag" - RCA Victor 20-5565

POSITION: Varsouvienne

FOOTWORK: Same. Both Start L.

Meas.

1-4 TWO-STEP, TWO; THREE, FOUR; WALK, TWO, THREE, FOUR; TWIRL, -, 2, -;

Do 4 two-steps progressing down LOD; Then 4 "strutting" walking steps. As M walks 4 more steps, W does 2 RF twirls under their R hands. Resume Varsouvienne pos.

5-8 TWO-STEP, TWO; THREE, FOUR; WALK, TWO, THREE, FOUR; TWIRL, -, 2, -;

Repeat Meas 1-4 except as W comes out of second twirl, retaining R hand-hold, turn to face each other, M facing wall, and join L hands under R hands in a cross-hand hold.

9-12 TOGETHER, APART; CHANGE SIDES; TOGETHER, APART; CHANGE SIDES; Each stepping IRL partners two-step together making a window under their R hands, two-step apart RLR; Retaining handholds M raises R hand and pulling slightly with L hand in 2 two-steps partners change pos, W turning R-face under their raised hands. W passing in front of M (twd LOD). Repeat the two-steps together and apart and partners again exchange places, M raising L hand and pulling with R, W turning LF under their raised hands, W again passing in front of M (twd LOD). End M facing wall in RH star pos.

13-16 STAR AROUND; TURN AWAY; STAR AGAIN; TURN AWAY;

In a RH star in 2 two-steps partners exchange places; M now on outside of circle; Releasing hands partners circle away from each other in 4 strutting steps both turning L in a small circle; Partners come together again in a LH star and in 2 two-steps exchange places again, M now on inside; With 4 more strutting steps partners circle away from each other both turning R. Return to Varsouvienne pos.

17-20 TWO-STEP, TWO; WHEEL, 2, 3, 4; TWO-STEP, TWO; WALK, 2, 3, 4; Do 2 two-steps progressing down LOD then both turn individually RF $\frac{1}{2}$ then M backing up partners wheel around RF to finish a complete revolution ending facing LOD with W on M's L side; Do 2 more two-steps down LOD and 4 strutting steps (W still on M's L side).

21-24 TWO-STEP, TWO; WHEEL, 2, 3, 4; TWO-STEP, TWO; TWIRL, -, 2, -; Repeat the two-steps and wheel again (turn L this time), W coming back to M's R side, ending facing LOD, do 2 more two-steps down LOD; And, as M walks 4 steps, W does 2RF twirls under their R hands. Resume Varsouvienne pos.

ARE YOU "A SQUARE DANCER?"

Asks

Madeline Allen



When you try to find out, from new acquaintances, whether or not they share your enthusiasm for your favorite activity, did you ever notice the difference it makes if they say, "Oh yes, we've been to square dances", or "Oh yes, we're Square Dancers! ". Those who answer the first way may be good prospects, and should be encouraged to join a Beginners' Class, but you'd better not invite them to your Club. Chances are they have danced one evening at a Resort, or at a Benefit Party or other One Night Stand, and think they have seen it all. But if anyone says he is "a Square Dancer", he probably is. If he puts it that way, it means that he has progressed to the point where he differentiates between Square Dancers and non-Square Dancers, and has no doubts as to where he belongs.

This year, so far, we have been to four Institutes and two Conventions, including the National. We have seen an awful lot of Square Dancers, and our opinion is still the same as ever -- they are wonderful. We know of no other group or fraternity to which you can belong that carries as many privileges, and as instant acceptance by as many people. You don't have to be a Caller, or a Club president, or any other celebrity -- you can go into a strange town, call a number listed in your Guide, and tell someone you never met that you are a Square Dancer, and the chances are that they will not only give you a list of Clubs where you can dance, but will offer to pick you up and take you where they are going, maybe invite you to dinner, or even offer you a place to stay. Boys at Army or Navy posts have found that being Square Dancers, or even sons of Square Dancers, gave them a ready-made set of friends in nearby towns, even where the civilian population is generally unfriendly. Square Dancers who have travelled to Hawaii or Australia have really had the Red Carpet laid down, and have had special dances planned for them, parties given, and have generally been made to feel like V.I.P.S. - All this, because you introduced yourself as "a Square Dancer."

I have never been able to figure out exactly when a beginner becomes a Square Dancer. It happens to different people at different times. It seems to be a little like learning to swim, or to ride a bicycle. Suddenly you are with it, and you know you really belong. It has nothing to do with levels, or ability, or how long you have danced. You just know that this is for you, and you are hooked.

I have been asked several times to comment on wearing special clothes for Square Dancing, and to explain why we think this is important. Of course, there are obvious reasons -- Square Dance styles are fundamentally beautiful styles. They are gay and colorful and becoming, and make women look graceful and men tall and handsome. They are also uninhibited- women can wear all the ruffles and bows they want, and men all the bright colors. But there is another side to it, as well. We feel that as long as a person chooses clothes with mental reservation that they can also be worn for other things than Square Dancing, he or she is not really with it. As long as you keep one foot on the bottom of the pool, you are not really swimming -- you always seem just about to back out. Women who do not care enough about Square Dancing to make or buy at least one real Square Dance dress haven't really yielded yet -- they are not sold on the whole idea. Once you have made a real investment in Square Dancing -- not only lessons, but dresses and shoes and shirts and boots -- the chances of your dropping out are much lower. So we say -- let yourself go! Let yourself have a good time, and be a real "Square Dancer".
