EASY PICKINS
by FLOYD CRIGER

Head two gents and your corner girl
Forward up and back to the world
Forward again and box the gnat
Right and left thru the other way back

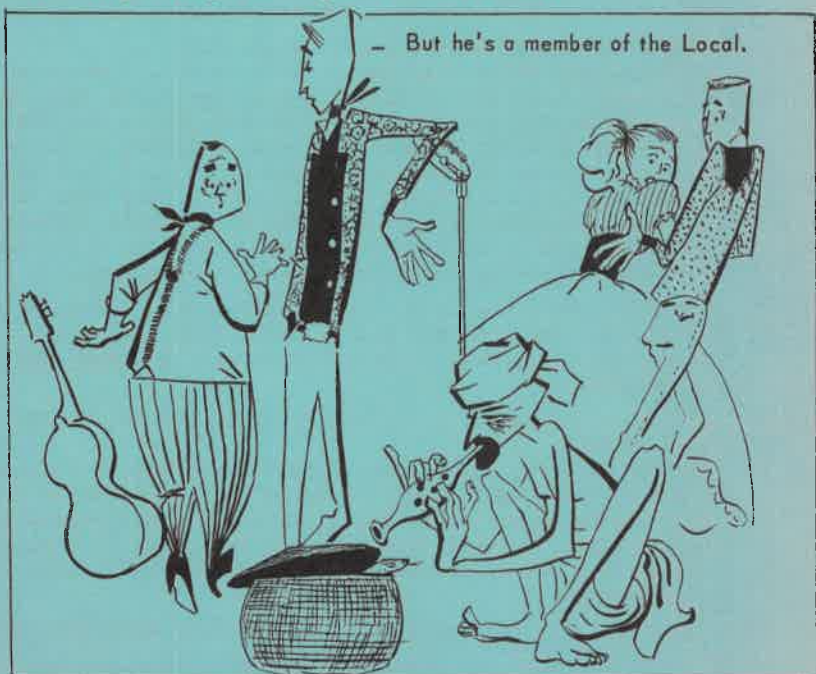
Turn 'em boys and pass thru
Turn alone and don't be late
All join hands and circle eight
Head two couples forward and back you go

Forward again with a right and left thru
Turn 'em round and the four ladies star
Four ladies star three quarters round
To a do-paso when you come down

Her by the left, corners right
Partner left, left hand round
Promenade the corner as you come down.

JACK Philosophizes Square Dancing in this way:

RECORD: Windsor #7636 -- "If You Ever Fall in Love Again"

POSITION: Open dance position, both facing LOD

FOOTWORK: Opposite; steps described are for the M

MEASURES

- 1-4 WALTZ AWAY; WALTZ TOGETHER; SPOT TURN AWAY; SIDE, DRAW, -;
Start L ft, do one waltz step diag fwd and away from partner;
Start R ft and do one waltz step diag fwd and twd partner;
Release hands, start L ft and with three steps, L-R-L, make a spot $3/4$ L-face turn away from partner (W turns R-face) without progressing in LOD, to end facing M's R and W's L hands joined, M facing wall; Step to R side in RLOD on R ft, draw L heel to R ft, hold 1 ct while pivoting $1/4$ L to face in LOD in open pos.
- 5-8 WALTZ AWAY; WALTZ TOGETHER; SPOT TURN AWAY; SIDE, DRAW, -;
Repeat action of Meas 1-4, ending in open pos facing LOD.
- 9-12 WALTZ AWAY; WRAP; BAL FWD, TOUCH, -; BAL BWD, TOUCH, -;
Start L ft, take one waltz step diag fwd and away from partner;
As M crosses in front of W in a half-circle R-face turn with 3 steps, R-L-R, to end facing RLOD, W makes a $1/2$ L-face turn with hands still joined, L-R-L, to end with both facing RLOD, M on outside, W on his R side, M's R arm around W's waist holding her L hand crossed over her chest, other hands joined in front; Bal fwd in RLOD on L ft, touch R toe beside L ft, hold 1 ct; Bal bwd in LOD on R ft, touch L toe beside R ft, hold 1 ct.
- 13-16 UNWRAP; WALTZ FWD; CHANGE SIDES; SIDE, DRAW, -;
As M does one waltz step fwd in RLOD, L-R-L, W makes a full R-face turn with 3 steps, R-L-R, ending in open pos, M on outside, both facing RLOD; Start R and do one fwd waltz step in RLOD; Change sides with M making a $3/4$ R-face turn across in front of W, L-R-L, to face wall while W makes a $3/4$ L-face turn, R-L-R, under joined arms, ending with partners facing, M's R and W's L hands joined; Step to R side in RLOD on R ft, draw L heel to R ft, hold 1 ct while pivoting $1/4$ L to face LOD in open pos.
- 17-24 WALTZ AWAY; WRAP; BAL FWD, TOUCH, -; BAL BWD, TOUCH, -;
UNWRAP; WALTZ FWD; CHANGE SIDES; SIDE, DRAW, -;
Repeat action of Meas 9-16 except to end in closed pos. M facing wall.
- 25-32 BAL BWD, -, -, MANUV, 2, 3; WALTZ; WALTZ; WALTZ; WALTZ;
WALTZ; TWIRL;
Bal bwd on L ft, hold 2 cts; Then M Maneuvers in 3 steps, R-L-R, to face RLOD, ready to start back on L ft for 5 R-face turning waltz steps making $2\frac{1}{2}$ turns and progressing in LOD; Then, W twirls under joined fwd hands as M walks along-side, R-L-R. End in open pos, facing LOD, ready to repeat dance.

Let's Look at Grips

Madeline Allen

I have just been counting on my fingers, and I can think of about twenty different ways of taking hold of a girl, in Square Dancing, all correct somewhere. (Of course, there are others that no one would approve of, anywhere.) There are dozens of different combinations of hands, arms, elbows, waist swings, pigeon wings, arches, and so on, and the wonder is that we agree as often as we do, on what sort of grip the Caller means when he says simply, 'Left to your partner.'

I am going to leave out all the other areas in the country, where they do pigeon wings or Varsouvienne promenades, and note down a few preferred grips used right here in the Bay Area. When I say preferred, I mean preferred by ME - and usually by Dan - no matter what some Callers teach. The management welcomes argument.

Starting with that perennial bone of contention, the Allemande Left, we prefer a plain left Forearm Swing. In this, I am afraid we are in the minority, but we have a lot of good company there. The Float-out, no matter how little Float is used, still takes up time and space, and people will insist on doing it in the wrong places, like in the turn-backs on a Daisy Chain. And when I say "Forearm", I mean that part of the arm between the wrist and the elbow - no higher.

We all seem to do the Right and Left Grand the same way, and on the Promenade, the only question is the 'Landing Field' - whether the man should hold his hands palms up, and let the lady lay hers in them, or really 'hold' her hands. While agreeing in principle with the 'Landing Field', and preferring it for a real Promenade, we feel that there are lots of promenades in modern Square Dancing that are too short to bother taking that position. We tend to hold our hands vertical instead of horizontal - as if we had faced each other, shaken hands with the hands crossed, and then swung back to promenade position. This hold is especially valuable in this era of 'Wheel-Arounds' and 'Back-Tracks' - you are more prepared for a quick change of position.

A Ladies' Chain Three-Quarters Round? A hand hold will not get you around fast enough, and you are faced with the choice of a Forearm Grip or a Pigeon Wing Star. Either one seems all right to me, but it would be nice to know which one your opposite lady was aiming for. Personally, I like the Forearm Swing, as it fits in a little better with our styling out here.

The 'Landing Field' comes in again on the Courtesy Turn, after a Right and Left Thru or a Ladies' Chain. Here again, in a singing call, where you have lots of time and want to look graceful, I think the more Courtesy you can show the better. But a lot of our Chains these days are pretty quick maneuvers, often in crowded situations, and in that case we prefer a sort of modified left arm swing, helped out by the man's right hand in her back, and fudging at the end to face the set, if necessary. (This is the turn BOB OSGOOD uses as a Horrible Example, but we don't have to agree with everything he says.)

On Stars, the rule says that a man in a Thar Star grips the wrist of the man in front of him - or rather, behind him - or anyhow, the man whose back he is facing - but girls in the same figure make a simple star. I prefer to have the girls use the wrist grip too, and get into the habit of doing it, so that when an Arky Thar comes along, with two men and two women in the center, they can all do the same thing.

A Star Promenade is another choice of holds. I have been told many times, in a patronizing sort of way, that the proper hold is the lady's hand on the man's shoulder, the man's arm around her waist. But I am on the short side, and when the man is tall, that position is very awkward for me. I would rather see each pair take whatever hold is comfortable for them, and for me it is usually my arm around the man's waist. I can see no difference in convenience of either position, for a Rollaway or a Turnback.

One call I would like to see outlawed is the change from an Alamo Style to an Allemande Thar - a hand grip to a forearm grip. But if Callers insist on using it, I would rather drop hands entirely, and then take a forearm grip, rather than try to slide up each others' arms - it can't be done gracefully.

Finally, there is the Elbow Swing. In the old days, an Elbow Swing was really something - you hooked elbows, leaned back, and really took a swing. Some of you may even remember 'Meet your partner with an Elbow Swing, It's a Grand Allemande all around the Ring.' That was before we ever did a Forearm Swing - it was all hands or pigeon wings. I remember when the Caller's Association decided to standardize the Forearm Swing for use in the Bay Area, and what a shock it was to a lot of us. Then, when we had finally got used to it, we agreed that it did make for smoother dancing. But somewhere, when we weren't looking, someone broadened the definition to include the Elbow Swing as well - 'When the caller Says 'Elbow Swing' in modern square dancing, we do a Forearm Swing.' We never agreed with the change, but as no one ever called it anyhow, it was not worth a struggle. But now -- here comes a new singing call with a real old 'Grand Allemande' in it, where you swing each girl all around the ring, and the callers are telling us to do a Forearm Swing on that! It is not the same thing, and I am sure the one who wrote the call meant a real Elbow Swing, done with spirit and abandon. This seems like a good time to take a stand on the subject, so I am calling on all you other Elbow Swingers to rise and declare yourselves, and help save a fine old call before it is too late. Let's just insist on hooking elbows and letting ourselves go, and if the callers don't like it they can change the words and say what they do want. To me, an Elbow Swing means just that, and that is what I intend to do.

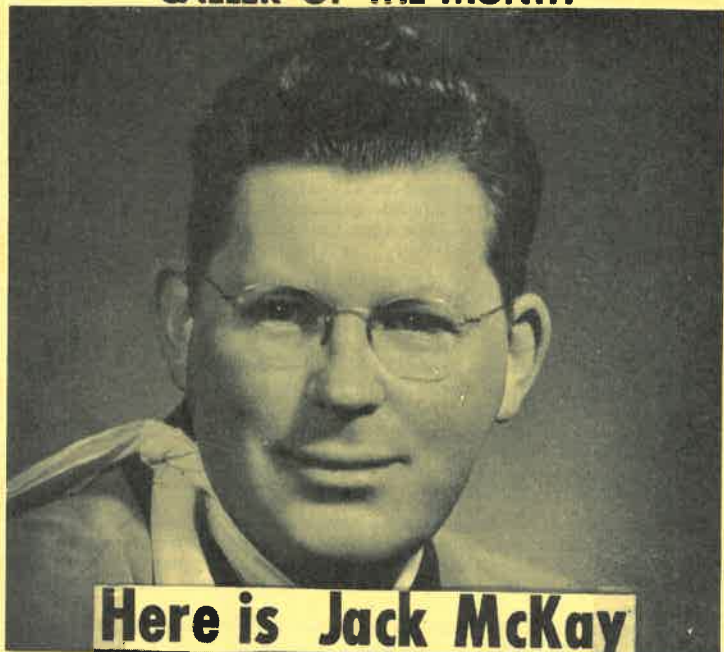

CALLER OF THE MONTH



Born in CANADA and spent the first 18 years of his life traveling up and down the Pacific Coast with his family. In 1939, while attending S.F. City College became interested in a Consumer Co-operative group which undertook as its first project, an International Folk Dance Program. In short order found that needed was some one to call squares and JACK was elected.

After a four year time out for Army duty in the Pacific, he started dancing again and resumed teaching both Folk and Square Dance. In 1948 there was sufficient interest to cause the formation of the first all Square Dance Class in S. F. This class became the SQUARE CUTTERS Square Dance Club; shortly after this time, a second club was needed and the CAPER CUTTERS were born.

Since 1948 more and more of JACK'S time has been spent on Square Dance including Calling or teaching six nights a week, conducting a monthly Callers Clinic, writing a book on teaching techniques, and producing a teaching album called "Squares for Everyone". In addition, institutes, camps, and teacher training programs at the University of B. C., University of Calif., San Francisco State, Mills College, University of Oregon, and Chairman of the Square Dance Section of College of the Pacific Dance Program each summer.

Jack states: "I started early enough in the area to help found the Callers Ass'n. and have served that organization in the capacity of Program Chairman, Research Chairman, and President.

At the 1955 National Convention, I MC'D the Quadrille Program, and assisted CHARLIE BALDWIN of NEW ENGLAND in presenting the Contra Dance Program. In the 1956 National Convention I served on the Summer Camp Program Discussion panel, the panel on Square Dance teaching, presented one half of the Contra Program with BOB BRUNDAGE of CONN., and assisted in the Callers Swap Shop.

Just to keep out of mischief I spend my mornings as a Trouble Shooter for the Controllars office at the University of Calif. Medical Center, and my Tuesday evenings as a Major in the active Reserve Program, teaching an officers class in Civil Affairs and Military Government.

Future plans - continue the activities at MCKAY'S SQUARE DANCE CENTER in SAN FRANCISCO, and eventually complete work on a Ph. D. in Sociology at the University of California." All of us gratefully acknowledge JACK'S many contributions to Square Dancing, fortunate indeed to have men of his calibre, and know-how.
