

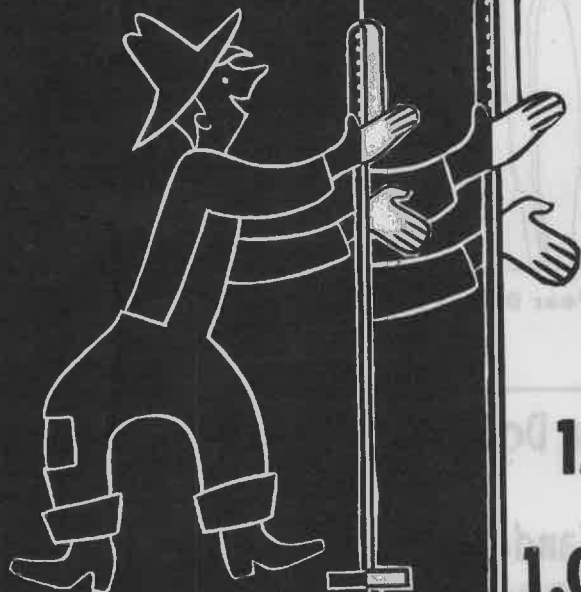

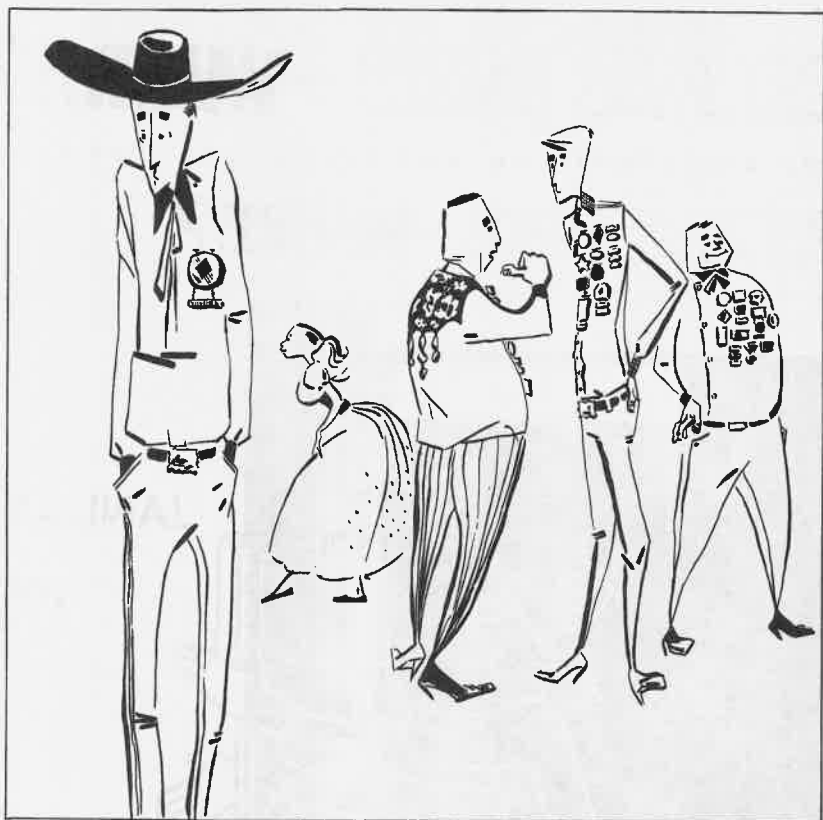

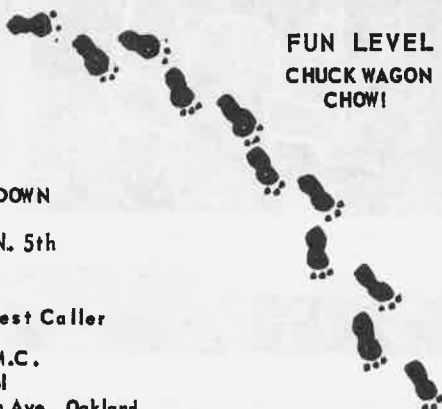

4th Annual California Square Dance Convention
Municipal Auditorium, Long Beach
March 22, 23, 24, 1957

While bearing in mind that square dancing will be the main attraction at the 4th Annual California Square Dance Convention on March 22-24, a great deal of thought is being devoted to the many "side events" that will be going on during the 3-day celebration, according to General Chairman, BILL TICKELL.

The convention Banquet, under the chairmanship of JESSIE PUTNEY, is scheduled for Saturday, March 23 at 6:00 p.m. and should prove to be very enjoyable. It will be held in the Lafayette Hotel Banquet Room, which is now under construction. The room will be large enough to seat 1,200 persons, and a "soup-to-nuts" meal will be served to those attending.

Many celebrities are being invited to attend the banquet, and according to latest reports, Governor and Mrs. GOODWIN KNIGHT will be present.

Entertainment during and after the meal will include, among other things, a barber-shop quartet of four well-known callers, a style show, and community singing. Tickets to the banquet will be \$3.00 per person, and reservations must be in by Monday, March 18. Although arrangements have been made to utilize all available space, there is a possibility that some who want tickets at the last minute will be disappointed. Please make your reservations early!

The Lafayette Hotel banquet room will also be the setting for the convention After-party on Saturday night, March 23. The party will get under way at the close of the evening's activities in Municipal Auditorium. ROY McDONALD is chairman of the committee which is planning the details for this event. At previous state and national conventions, the After-Parties have been very popular, and this one should certainly prove to be no less so.

Step L to side along LOD, close R to L, step L to side again,

Release hands and turn away from partner (M to L, W to R): LRL

MORE About KNOTHEADS

The KNOTHEADS were originated by a Square of SEATTLE WESTERNERS and a Square of JO-C-DOS, to promote FELLOWSHIP among Square Dancers, and is an Honorary Group recognizing the FUN & FELLOWSHIP that can and is being spread in Square Dancing.

To become a KNOTHEAD gather up a complete square who are NON-KNOT-HEADS, and travel in this prearranged Square 100 miles or more one way, (recognized map mileage to govern between cities or towns) to attend a CLUB or OPEN DANCE, given by other Square Dancers. Festivals Conventions, Institutes or Dancing Classes do not count. There must be a minimum of One Square (four couples) or more. All additional couples are eligible.

When your Square has been arranged, you should take a prepared letter with you, stating thereon the names of the dancers, showing from where you came and the name of the city or town traveled to. This letter should be certified by the Caller, President, Secretary or M.C. of the dance attended and mailed to:

After making the trip your Square should make a request to the KNOT-HEADS, for a BADGE which will constitute recognition of the face you are a KNOTHEAD. Anyone that will travel with a Square to dance 100 miles away is a KNOTHEAD. A small fee of \$1.00 per person should be enclosed with your request for the BADGE to cover the cost of making and mailing. There are no other fees or dues in connection, as once a KNOTHEAD, always a KNOTHEAD.

If you care to have your BADGE publicly presented to you and your Square (this is not a requirement) make arrangements with the Chairman of the next big dance or one of your local Festivals (Not a State Festival as there would be too many and take too much time) and ask M.C. to present the BADGE to you, which you have already given him. As we are not a CLUB the CHARTER MEMBERS of the WASHINGTON KNOTHEADS are the governing body. It is the wish of the WASHINGTON KNOTHEADS that others will form their squares and join with us in the promotion of FELLOWSHIP AMONG SQUARE DANCERS.

The OREGON KNOTHEADS and CALIFORNIA KNOTHEADS operate under the rules of the governing body of the WASHINGTON KNOTHEADS. You may join either or all.

NOTES ON THE TEACUP CHAIN

In a recent issue of 'Sets in Order', the styling section was devoted to the 'Teacup Chain', complete with 'How To' pictures. Since that time, we have been asked by various people if we understood the call, and what was it, anyhow. I have read the description, and it is very clear, as far as it goes. The only thing is, it does not go far enough.

'No calls are needed', they say. What they mean is, you can't call it, because eight people are doing four different things at the same time. (Four callers working together might try, I suppose.) Anyhow, the idea is that each person learns his or her own part, and then they all work together, like a Barbershop Quartette. (Then you rotate, naturally.)

Anyhow, I have learned (?) the Teacup Chain at least once a year since it came out eight years ago, and two or three times in some years. One advantage of the call is that any visiting caller giving a Workshop can always fall back on it - it will be new to half the people, and the rest still can't do it. Actually, it is very simple if you have a mind like a white rat.

In teaching the Teacup Chain, you generally begin with the head ladies. (See diagrams) they go into the center with a right hand star, go three quarters round to their corners, are turned with a courtesy turn, and then cut across the corner of the square to their original opposite man. He puts out a left hand for a courtesy turn, but they have to ignore that, and reach for his right hand instead, and push him around backwards. They then go into the center for a left hand star, which must be not three quarters but five quarters, or once and a quarter. This is a long way, and the best way to tell when to stop is to look for a gent you have not met before. The first lady who can decide which man to go to gives the other lady a final push to decide her, and then dodges that man's left hand and pushes him around with the right. From here she cuts across the corner to her own partner, who is not expecting her from that direction, and has to be pushed around too, this time by the left.

The side ladies are now put thru the mill. The gents have the idea by now, and only have to be told to turn those ladies once around from a standing start before they send them on to the right (see extra turn on diagrams.) The head gents are braced for that wrong-way courtesy turn, and actually help. But now the side gents are in trouble. The first lady they received last time wanted a left hand turn, but this one comes out of the center with a right hand out. At this point, he has to decide who to trust, and if he is smart he will go along with the lady - after all, he figures, all she has to do is to use alternating hands all the way thru, and what is hard about that? Generally speaking, he is right, the only catch being that the ladies do make mistakes. Dan, who is very charitable, says that a courtesy turn is really a two-hand figure, and that might explain why the ladies sometimes do not seem to know which hand to use next. My own secret formula is to put whichever hand I am not using, behind my back. This is natural in a courtesy turn, but if you do it in a star too, then all you have to remember is to use the hand behind you, next. It may make you look like a mechanical doll, but it works.

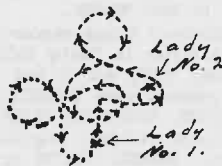
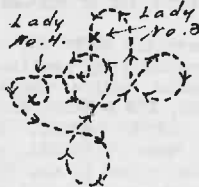
Contrariwise, it would seem to the ladies that when each man has nothing to do but to send all the ladies in the same direction, he could be counted on to start her out right. Unfortunately, out of a wrong-way courtesy turn - a contradiction in terms if ever I saw one - no direction looks 'right'. So he tends to turn her loose to find her own way, and we sometimes get three or four ladies heading for the center at the same time, or else, as one bewildered lady wailed, 'I did go into the center, but there was no one there!'

About now comes a little analysis. The men will start telling each other to remember -- two lefts and two rights. The ladies will note that all the right hand stars are three quarters, while all the left hand stars are once and a quarter. Then someone will discover that while the head ladies are doing two

stars and four courtesy turns, the side ladies do two stars and five courtesy turns. How come? This is a good question.

Well, finally we are ready to try. But there is one more hurdle in our path. While it is true that no directions are needed for the figure itself, it seems that the original call started out with the four ladies chaining across the square and back, and then 'All four ladies Teacup Chain.' But every caller seems to take a fiendish pleasure in not telling us this. So here we are, on our toes - the head ladies leaning forward, the side couples in courtesy turn position. The caller starts the music, and on the words 'All four ladies chain-' we are off! But the caller goes on '-across the set,' and confusion reigns. Very funny! Well, you pick yourself up and start off again. From there on, all you have to do is to practice until you know your own part perfectly, and you are all right - until next time, that is. And that's the Teacup Chain. I wonder how many times I'll learn it in 1957? Happy New Year!

(P.S. Personally, I really like to do the Teacup Chain, but I don't think it will ever replace the Arkansaw Traveller.)
