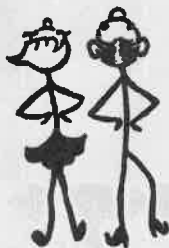

TWILIGHT TWO-STEP

By Kay and Forrest Richards, San Leandro, California

RECORD: "Don't Take Your Love from Me" - Decca 29691 (Grady
 POSITION: Butterfly banjo, M facing LOD Martin)
 FOOTWORK: Opposite throughout. Directions given for M
 MEAS:

1-2 (FWD) TWO-STEP, SWING; (TO SIDECAR) TWO-STEP, TOUCH;

In butterfly banjo pos (R hips adjacent), M facing LOD, starting M's L and progressing in LOD: do 1 fwd two-step and swing R ft slightly fwd; Starting M's R, M repeats the fwd two-step progressing diagonally to his R and touches L beside R, while W, still moving bwd in LOD, crosses L behind R, steps R diagonally bwd to her R, steps L slightly in front of R, and touches R beside L -- to end in butterfly sidecar pos (L hips adjacent).

3-4 (FACE CENTER) TWO-STEP; (TO SIDECAR) TWO-STEP;

Releasing M's R and W's L hands and starting M's L ft, partners change sides (Calif whirl) with 2 two-steps, M turning L and W turning R ($\frac{1}{2}$) to face COH on first two-step; continuing the turn, the second two-step brings partners into butterfly sidecar pos, M facing RLOD, W facing LOD.

5-6 (BWD) TWO-STEP, SWING; (TO BANJO) BEHIND, SIDE, FWD, TOUCH;

In butterfly sidecar pos, starting M's L, do 1 two-step in LOD (M backing up this time) and swing R ft slightly fwd; Then, still moving in LOD, M crosses R behind L, steps L diagonally bwd to his L, steps R slightly in front of L and touches L beside R -- while W does a fwd two-step progressing diagonally to her L and touches R beside L, to end in butterfly banjo pos, M still facing RLOD.

7-8 (FACE CENTER) TWO-STEP; (TO CLOSED) TWO-STEP;

Releasing M's L and W's R hands and starting M's L ft, partners change sides (Calif twirl) with 2 two-steps, M turning R and W turning L ($\frac{1}{2}$) to face COH on the first two-step; Continuing the turn, the second two-step brings partners into closed dance pos, M facing LOD.

9-12 WALK, -, TURN, -; PIVOT, -, TWO, -; TWO-STEP; TWO-STEP;

In closed dance pos, step L fwd in LOD, step R fwd turning to face wall (M's bk to COH); Still in closed pos, pivot $\frac{3}{4}$ CW turn in 2 steps L,R, to end facing LOD; Starting M's L, do 2 fwd two-steps in closed pos progressing in LOD.

13-16 WALK, -, TURN, -; PIVOT, -, TWO, -; TWO-STEP; TWO-STEP;

Repeat action of Meas 9-12 to end in butterfly banjo pos, M fac. LOD.

CALLER OF THE MONTH



NEVA JOHANNES

Lady callers add spice to the square dance scene, and when they call well, it is particularly pleasant - one of our favorites is NEVA JOHANNES who has contributed with husband JACK, so very much to the entire picture. Here is the picture in NEVAS' own words.

"We were married in San Francisco nineteen years ago. We have one daughter, KATHY, 13, born on her father's birthday, and out from the same pattern.

We moved to Los Gatos, in 1950 and started folk and square dancing in 1951. Loved square dancing from the start. Attended CASTNER'S Callers Class in 1953 but didn't have the courage to start teaching until Sept. 1954. We now have two clubs - The RAFTER ROCKERS, organized in 1955, and the STAR SWINGERS, which is now five years old. We're about to start our sixth beginner's class, and have a group of 6th, 7th, and 8th graders for the Los Gatos Recreation Dept. I also work in my uncle's record and appliance shop in Los Gatos, six hours a day, five days a week.

I love music and people of all kinds. A combination of happy, laughing, dancing people and lots of rhythmic music, makes a very enjoyable evening.

Call it what you will, sport or recreation, there's nothing better to rid people of their shyness and inhibitions, than square dancing. We have never met so many fine and interesting people, or had so much fun, before we started square dancing.

I couldn't conduct any of my groups without the help of my "better half" - JACK. He's the one who shoves records in my hand, shuts me in the den, and says, "Practice!" He assists in the teaching of squares and rounds, sees that we get to places on time, is friendly and co-operative with everyone, and is always good natured. Besides he does all the "muscle work" of loading, unloading, setting up, etc. of equipment at least four times a week, without complaining.

Serving a year as Secretary-Treasurer of the Northern California Square Dancers Association, Caller's Workshop, made me feel that I was contributing just a little bit toward square dancing. It also gave me a sense of belonging in this "man's world" of calling and teaching.

I have no gripes, I just like to see happy, laughing people. I guess that's why I enjoy, so much, what I'm doing."

NOTES ON THE DIXIE CHAIN

Did you ever wonder how new square dance 'basics' came about, and how they were adopted? Here is an example of how one of the latest new ones got started, and how far it has gone, to date.

Generally speaking, we like our calls these days to be directional, and anyone trying to introduce a new term like 'Dive for the Oyster' or 'Wash the Clothes' would be laughed off the floor. But we are still using a lot of non-directional calls that are so old they are respectable, like 'Allemande Left' and 'Docey-Do', and when BILL OWEN brought a square into the Northern Calif. Workshop with a figure in it called a 'Dixie Chain', our first thought was that it must be an old one that we had just happened to miss. It was so simple and logical that we were really surprised when he said that he had just made it up. But when we had danced it, we began to feel a little like the mother whose son brings home a cute puppy with unknown antecedents and big feet -- we felt sure this one was going to grow by leaps and bounds, but we could not tell exactly what the end result would be. The question was, how should we define it?

In the original square in which the Dixie Chain appeared, two couples came down the center in single file, the ladies in the lead, met and passed thru each other, and the ladies went left and the gents went right. The ladies took right hands, as in a ladies' chain, and gave left hands to their opposite men, but instead of being turned around, they went on by, and the men took right hands with each other and passed by, right shoulders, following the ladies. So we wrote up the definition that way, and sent out the square. We knew there would be repercussions, and there were.

Right away, the callers began using the Dixie Chain, and changing it. The first thing that happened to it was a square in which the men were in the lead. Well, this was fairly simple, and we decided that a Dixie Chain could mean any two people meeting two others in single file, regardless of sex, the first two taking right hands. Then someone inserted a Dixie Chain into the 'Little Red Wagon', and had both people turn left at the end, instead of separating. This made sense, too, as there was plenty of time for the command to be given, so we (meaning the Workshop) agreed that the Dixie Chain was finished when the two sets of people had passed each other, and the next call would tell them what to do next. This left nothing of the original definition but two people meeting two other people single file, the first two taking right hands.

The next square that appeared had another angle. In fact, two squares appeared about the same time, with the same calls, but wanting the dancers to do two different things. In this case, we had a ring of eight, two men, then two women, moving in single file, and the call came, "Ladies turn back to a Dixie Chain", which was logical, as two people were meeting another two, in single file. But one call wanted them to pass two people only, then turn and face the center, while the other calls wanted them to continue, as in a grand right and left, until they met their original partners. Thinking it over, we came to the conclusion that the first was a real Dixie Chain, but the second was something else again, and we called it a Dixie Grand -- it started like a Dixie Chain and ended like a Grand Right and Left. So there we had the first - figure to grow out of the Dixie Chain.

Now we had people Dixie Chaining across the square, around the outside, two men and two women, all four men, and various other ways. Our next problem square, however, concerned a double Dixie Chain, or two Dixie Chains side by side. This came out of a regular double pass-thru position, with the head couples standing behind the side couples. That is, we got into it that way. But if you look at that position from another point of view, you find that you also have two people in single file, facing two others in single file, and with a similar line standing beside them. So, you would do two parallel Dixie Chains, but then what? The call said, "Face the middle" - (that is another story) - and if everyone did a quarter turn to face the person beside him, we had two lines

of four, facing each other. This whole arrangement was surprising, but it followed logically from our definition.

The last variation to confront the Workshop was a situation where two lines of three people each, met in single file. There was considerable discussion over this one, but again, we decided that we could not consider it a real Dixie Chain -- too many people. We compromised by telling the two lines to "go down the center in Dixie Style", and defined that to mean that the first two would meet with the right hand, continuing with alternate hands, and listen for the next call. "Dixie Style" might take care of a lot of other variations, too, as they came up, as it would simply mean "like a Dixie Chain".

As you can see, we now know about what size the puppy will eventually be, and about what shape. We also know what use it is. Before the Dixie Chain was invented, we had several squares in which two lines met in single file, but the squares were dropped because there was no good way to say what we wanted done. You could not say, "meet with a right and left grand", because the second person started with the left, and felt frustrated. The Dixie Chain not only took care of that problem, but it filled another, more subtle, need.

As a lot of dancers have pointed out, when two couples go down the center with a Dixie Chain, and the lady goes left and the gent goes right, they end up exactly the same as if they had done a Cross Trail Thru. This is perfectly true, but in the process they have also done a pretty figure. Lately, there has been an awful lot of plain marching done in squares -- two couples going "down the center, pass thru, around one, into the center, cross trail, around one, right and left thru, turn back, pass thru --", etc., etc., while the other couples stand and watch. The ones who are moving may march or they may scurry, depending on the speed of the caller, but they don't dance. But throw in a Dixie Chain, and the skirts swish and the dancers weave from side to side, and things begin to pick up again. After all, no figure in all square dancing is more used or better loved than the 'Grand Right and Left', and the Dixie Chain is just a little piece of it, thrown in where it is needed. Judging from the number of new squares in which it appears, the Dixie Chain is here to stay.

Exhibitions by BOB PAGE'S teen-age group, the BOB-O-LINKS, and BILL CASTNER SQUARENADERS will be given each evening, and EMERY PETERS' sub-teen group the SPINNERS 8, will perform each afternoon.

— WITH 'DE' DELAND

International Friendship and good will is the goal which the Prime Ministers and statesmen of many nations are striving to reach. This fact is attested by the numerous conferences held in the various parts of the world today as reported by almost any daily paper which may come to hand.

At the U. S. Naval Air Station, Iwakuni, Japan, three Chief Petty Officers of the United States Navy, currently serving with Patrol Squadron NINE, are adding a chapter of their own to the book of friendship among the peoples of the world.

These three, ROYAL B. DELAND, of the GARDEN SWINGERS, JOHN M. CHANCE, BOOTS & SLIPPERS, and TED DAVIS, PLEASANT HILLBILLIES have arrived at a unique way to become better acquainted with our Japanese friends and allies. The "Honcho" or guiding spirit behind this dancing is ROY DELAND. His unending enthusiasm and patience has enabled him to achieve the veritable insurmountable task of organizing an aimless group into the smooth flowing unit of dancers now performing.

While De does the calling, TED and JOHN assist the various squares should any difficulty in executing the maneuvers arise. As the group continues, this assistance has been needed less and less, and has come to the point that they join in the squares simply as a participating member.

In addition to the square dancing, many of the currently popular round dances are also being introduced. The incredible part of this dancing is the fact that once shown the basic step, the Japanese participants assimilate it so quickly that if a mis-step is made by one of the instructors, the pupil will immediately pick up the mistake.

The three will be returning to their homes and loved ones in March, but their thoughts will ever return to the many friends they have made and the happiness they were able to bring to this little spot in far off Japan.

DELAND is teaching two Japanese fellows to call so they may continue to enjoy the wonderful pastime they have learned to enjoy so much.

No "Squares" in Square Dancing; Must Stay on Toes, Says Fordman

Reproduced from the FORD MOTOR Monthly Bulletin in Milpitas

Since the end of World War II, the number of square dancers has quadrupled. Weekly, scores of new dance groups are formed. And, significantly, square dancing has moved from abandoned barns to schoolrooms.

Typical of the modern day hoe-downers are Russell F. and Anna Robinson, a Ford family for more than 23 years. Robinson is Cashier at the San Jose Assembly Plant.

Encouraged by Neighbors

"We're just newcomers to square dancing," says Russ. "We got interested because one of our neighbors was always talking about dancing. We decided to try it."

"Our group is composed mostly of young married couples with a few single girls and fellows," says Mrs. Robinson. "We enjoy them."

As the Highland Hillbillies swing through a dance to such unlikely directions as: "box the gnat," "four ladies star across," and "eight roll-away with a half sashay," they present a gaudy spectacle.

Bright Colors Favored

The men are dressed in brightly colored western shirts and string ties. Many wear levis or breeches and boots. Their partners spin through dances in flashes of calico or squaw dresses and ballet slippers.

These styles are explained by the official publication of the Northern California Square Dance Callers' Association as serving a two-fold purpose.

"They are gay and colorful and becoming," says the magazine, **SQUARE DANCE — WHERE?** "They are also uninhibited," it continues. "Women can wear all the ruffles and bows they want and men all the bright colors."

Focal point of all square-dance groups is the caller. The groups take on a little of his personality. Calling for the Highland Hillbillies is Ken Oburn, an enthusiastic hoe-downer who has been calling for four years.

Ruffles, Bows and Bright Colors Are Encouraged

The Robinsons are members of the Highland Hillbillies, a West San Jose group which meets Thursday nights at the Monroe School.

Prerequisite to square dancing are beginners' classes which are being formed throughout the year. In these classes, the neophyte square dancers walk through the steps and learn the fundamental calls.

Three Months to Learn

"It takes about three months to get the basic steps straightened out," says Mrs. Robinson. "Then it takes a lot of practice to keep learning the more advanced dances."

But plenty of opportunities to practice are provided for the post-beginners. In San Jose alone, there are nine different groups meeting throughout the week. Their picturesque names—Shooting Stars, Hicks & Chicks, Korn Krackers, Flyin' Squares and Dudes & Dolls—indicate the uninhibited character of square dancing.

In addition to the regular meetings, the square-dance groups sponsor exchange dances and a variety of parties.

The callers, like the dancers, are largely recruited from the people who turn to square dancing as an after-work recreation.

"It's good, clean fun," says Robinson, father of a 20-year-old son. "You can't afford to drink before going to a dance or," he says with double meaning, "you'll fall down on the job."

Inexpensive Fun

Few activities are cheaper. The Robinsons each pay \$1.50 monthly for their membership in the Highland Hillbillies.

Like scores of other Ford couples, Russ and Anna Robinson have discovered that square dancing—a happy marriage between the French minuet, the English quadrille and the New England round dance—is a stepping stone to many pleasant evenings.
