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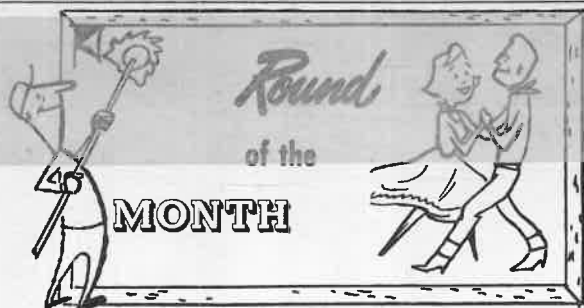

By Mamie and Lowell Lawson, Waterloo, Iowa

Record: Mercury 70247 "Gadabout."

Position: Semi-closed.

Footwork: Opposite—directions for M.

Introduction: Wait four beats—Step, Touch, Forward and Back.

Part A

- 1-4 Fwd, 2, 3, Brush; Fwd 2, 3, Brush; Two-Step; Two-Step:**
Moving in LOD, step L, R, L, brush R; R, L, R, brush L; (Basic Shottische).
Face partner and in closed pos do two turning two-steps progressing LOD.
End in semi-closed pos.
- 5-8 Fwd 2, 3, Brush; Fwd 2, 3, Brush; Two-Step; Two-Step;**
Repeat meas. 1-4. End facing partner both hands joined M back to COH.

Part B

- 1-4 Step, Close, Step, Swing; Step, Close, Step, Swing; Cross, 2, 3, Touch; Cross, 2, 3, Touch;**
In LOD step L, close R, step L, swing R in front of L releasing lead hands while turning to face LOD; in RLOD step R, close L, step R, swing L in front of R releasing trailing hands while turning to face RLOD. Retaining M left and W R hand, M crosses in back of W with L, R, L, touch R, ending facing COH. (Lady crosses with R face turn under M arm) M crosses back with R, L, R, touch L in back of lady; end facing wall. (Lady crosses back with L face turn)
- 5-8 Step, Close, Step, Swing; Step, Close, Step, Swing; Cross 2, 3, Touch; Cross 2, 3, Touch;**
Repeat meas 1-4 (Part B) end in semi-closed pos facing LOD to repeat dance.

Break

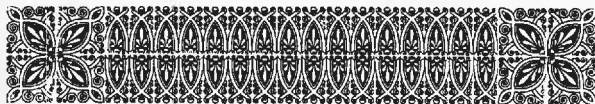
- 1-4 Walk, —, 2, —; Turn, —, Point, —; Walk, —, 2, —; Turn, —, Point, —;**
In semi-closed pos walk in LOD L, R, step L turning to face RLOD and point R to RLOD. In RLOD walk R, L, step R turning to face LOD and point L. (These steps are slow).

Tag

Repeat Measures 5-8, Part B, ending with usual bow.

Sequence

A, B, A, B, Break, A, B, Break, A, B, A, B, Tag

" WE HAVE A PROBLEM " DEPARTMENT....

To all Square-dancers in the Vallejo area:

You have been, or are about to be, solicited to attend, on a permanent basis, the meetings of another square-dance club in Vallejo, and to forsake your present club. It will be done in "friendly" and flattering fashion.

For years, four major clubs in Vallejo have existed amicably together, promoting the Square-dance movement in a friendly way, realizing they needed each other's thriving activity to fully enjoy square-dancing in their own group. Members have wandered from club to club, occasionally but in the main, as far as new members go, the four clubs have stayed in their own back-yard. Self-perpetuating as square-dance clubs must be, new members have been obtained from non-dancers. Each club proudly has undertaken the work of teaching and training its own members, secure in the fact that such work would pay off in eventual group enjoyment of a clean and unsullied sport.

Ethically, each club has shrunk from even the appearance of solicitation of another club's members, holding it as some-thing that just wasn't done. Each has realized, on a long range basis, that each club prospers and remains healthy as long as the others enjoy the same kind of a life. Attendance of each other's functions has been on a visit-basis returning to own clubs after pleasant parties and hoodowns. The major clubs have felt that as one club failed, they would now have fewer aides to help them in a mutual enjoyment.

You have been, or are about to be, approached with honeyed phrases, usually by telephone, such as "we want YOU at our club", "we know YOU will enjoy our much more friendly atmosphere", "come over to dance with us, "WE NEED YOU, "we have no this-or-that in OUR club", or "we have, this-or-that in our club"...you lovely person, you! You, who will help us build up, on short-cut fashion, with no work, to the prestige (if such exists) of a large club, to the glorification and self-satisfaction of the present "operators"!

Such short-sighted and unethical practices eventually have their own reward, as all unhealthy actions eventually work their own destruction, ingrowing in cancerous fashion.

In the meantime, however, one sits by, with feeling of unjust hurt and frustration.....for a while.

Eventually, aware of the general harm such leprous activity brings to the square dance movement as a whole, (far greater than any temporary effect on an individual club).....one takes action.

Sane action consists of advice and warning. Such advice and action must be tendered, - or unthinking and flattered innocents, at last coming against the abrupt brick wall of disillusionment at the end of an unhappy pathway led by a phony "charm", - will turn from the square-dance movement as a whole. In disgust, they will have the gnawing, uneasy feeling that they have been used.

"BEWARE OF GREEKS BEARING GIFTS!"

Carefully scrutinize overtures of "friendliness" and flattering remarks as to how important you (YOU!) are. (And I, too, like to have a fuss made over me')

With little exception, your own club, which you are presently attending, is where you belong, individually enjoying square-dancing, and as a whole, promoting the splendid hobby as a healthy way of life, with malice toward none, and with charity toward all.

So enter into the life of your own club, in active participation, and genuine friendliness, encouraging healthy interclub activity, avoid cliques, be regularly present, and encourage your fellow dancers and members in all ways. In quite another way than was originally meant, "Help keep our city clean!"

ROSY GLOW DEPARTMENT

June 3rd -- The Morning After The Golden State Round-Up

I am sorry to have to disappoint my regular readers, but this morning I am not mad at anyone. Right now, I can't see that anything at all is the matter with Square Dancing - not after this week-end. I only wish that everyone who has ever sneered at the idea of grown-up people spending their time and energy on such a silly activity, could have been up in the balcony Saturday Night, and watched that whole floor full of people, all gaily dressed and happy, and all moving together with perfect cooperation and harmony. It was worth watching.

I was particularly pleased about one thing. I have often written about tough dancing, and how important it was to be especially careful not to indulge in extra twirls and kicks on a crowded floor, but up until this Round-up I have always found a number of show-offs who were ignoring other people completely and pleasing themselves. But at the last meeting of the Dancers' Association Workshop, the callers were asked please to spend a little time impressing on their dancers the necessity for a special type of dancing under the very conditions that were present Saturday and Sunday nights, and I guess they must have done it. I have never seen, anywhere, such a large number of dancers dancing so smoothly!

Of course, there were other factors that made this event even better than usual. For one thing, the sound was improved to the point where everyone on the floor could actually understand what the caller was saying. That meant that even the squares in the far reaches, where the stage used to be, were moving too. Of course, it would be even nicer if we could improve the quality of the sound, as well as the clarity, so that the total volume could be cut down to a roar -- but the main problem has been licked. And the removal of the stage did make a lot more room -- guesses as to the number of squares on the floor went all the way up to 200, and there was still room to box the gnat without boxing the person in the next square. Of course, courteous dancing helped there, too -- squares were kept smaller and neater than usual, and there was less thoughtless horsing around. And never once during the evening programs did I feel like counting up beats on the callers. Real experts that they were, they all gave us time to dance what they were calling!

Another outstanding feature of this year's Round-Up was the size of the afternoon crowds. The main floor was almost full, and beside that, the Round dance sessions were simply jammed. Apparently, everyone came to everything -- which is very encouraging.

Just to keep up my record, though, let's sound at least one warning note. I had more compliments on my article on fast dancing than I had ever had before, and the vast majority of people asked me to go on and say something, again, about Rough Dancing, and especially about callers not teaching their dancers how to behave. Everyone agreed that people were behaving fine, right here, but, they complained, not at the regular dances. I heard criticisms that covered everything from short-sleeved shirts and back-lashing (both of which I thought were dead) to not keeping time to the music, and high kicks on a Left Allemande. Dancers want the callers to teach their beginners better, and callers say that they can tell the dancers what to do, but the dancers won't do it. One caller told me that he has always gone along with me on avoiding set-up squares, but that unless something was done about pure painful roughness, he was going to have to start picking and choosing just to protect his wife.

Of course, there are always those who defend the right of the dancers to dance any way they like, in their own Clubs. All right - I'll go along with that. But I have yet to see a really rowdy Club whose dancers don't carry that style to other dances. Club members who boast - and I do mean boast - that their Club has more 'fun' than other clubs because they whoop it up and really cut loose, seem to feel the necessity of advertising their presence at a Hoedown by

indulging in exactly the same sort of thing they do at home -- to the dismay of anyone else who happens to get into a square with them. And to me, one of the most important things about an open dance is that everyone should be able to dance with everyone else and have a good time doing it. Backlash only in your own Club? Baloney!

Can the Callers really control behavior by teaching? Maybe not in every case - I don't know - but they certainly can fail to teach proper behaviour. And how are new dancers to learn what is accepted, if no one tells them? Somewhere along the line there has been a serious lag between the teaching of dancing and the teaching of manners, when you see (as I actually did) a Knothead badge pinned to a short-sleeved shirt! That poor man knew how to do a Dixie Chain and a Square Thru, but he did not know how to dress so as to make people want to dance with him.

Anyhow, the Round-Up proved that square dancers can do anything they want to do. Now if they will just agree to carry their 'company manners' over into their regular Hoedowns, the Millenium will really be here.
