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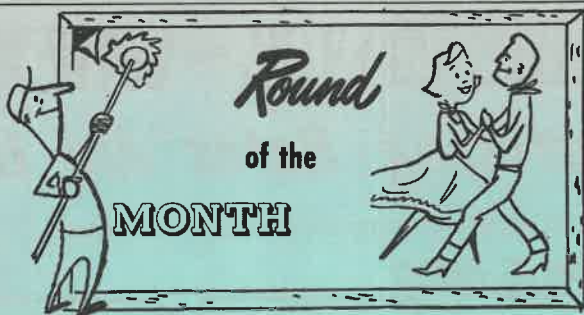

BONITA TWO-STEP

By Bob and Nita Page, San Leandro, California

Record: Gimme A Little Kiss, Sunny Hills AC 125-So

Position: Loose-closed pos, M facing LOD

Footwork: Opposite, directions for M

1-4 Side, Behind, Side, Touch; Side, Behind, Side, Touch; Step Fwd, —, Turn (R), —; Step, Close, Step, —;

Starting M's L, grapevine in twd COH; step L to side, step R behind L, step L to side, touch R beside L; Repeat the grapevine, starting M's R and moving twd wall; Step L fwd in LOD, hold 1 ct, step R turning R to face wall, hold 1 ct; continuing to turn R, do a 2-step to end FACING RLOD.

5-8 Side, Behind, Side, Touch; Side, Behind, Side, Touch; Step Fwd, —, Turn (L), —; Step, Close, Step, —;

Still in loose-closed pos, M facing RLOD, starting M's R and moving twd COH, repeat action of Meas 1-2; then, step R fwd in RLOD, hold 1 ct, step L turning L to face wall, hold 1 ct. Do a swd 2-step (R, close, R) along RLOD, to end in OPEN POSITION, inside hands joined, FACING LOD.

9-12 Away, 2, 3, Brush; Together, 2, 3, Brush; Banjo Around, 2, 3, Brush; Around 2, 3, Brush;

Progressing in LOD, move diagonally twd COH (W twd wall) stepping LRL—brush R (keep inside hands joined); Repeat moving diagonally twd partner (RLR—brush L) to end in BANJO POSITION, R hips adjacent, M facing wall; stepping LRL—brush R; RLR—brush L; make $\frac{3}{4}$ CW turn to end in OPEN POS, inside hands joined, FACING LOD.

13-16 Fwd Two-Step; Point Fwd, —, Point Back, —; Fwd Two-Step; Point Fwd, —, Point Back, —;

Starting M's L and progressing in LOD, do 1 two-step fwd; then, point R ft fwd, hold 1 ct, Point R bwd, hold 1 ct; Repeat action of Meas 13-14, STARTING M's R. End in OPEN POS facing LOD.

17-20 Side, Behind, Side, Touch; Side, Behind, Side, Touch; Balance Fwd, Touch, Balance Bwd, Touch; W/Turn, —2 —;

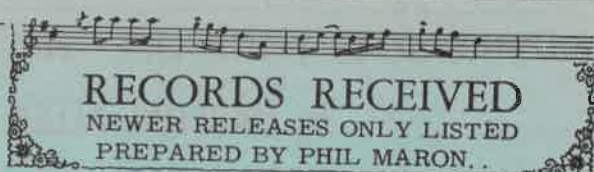
Release handholds and grapevine away from partner (M twd COH, W twd wall). Step L to side, step R behind L, step L to side, touch R beside L; Starting M's R, grapevine back (M twd wall, W twd COH) to assume semi-closed pos, facing LOD; Balance fwd and back; step L fwd, touch R beside L, step R bwd, touch L beside R; then, keeping fwd hands joined (M's L and W's R) and releasing others, M steps L, —, R, —, in place while W does $\frac{1}{2}$ RF turn (R-L) under M's L and her R arm to end in LOOSE-CLOSED POS, M facing LOD, ready to repeat dance from beginning.

Repeat entire dance for a total of four times, ending with bow and curtsy.

THIS IS YOUR LIFE, JIM YORK!

Leadership in Square Dancing is sort of like an iceberg - ninety percent of it is under the surface, out of sight. We see the top part - the Big Name Callers, the M.C.s, the Club and Association Presidents, and, nearer home, our own callers and teachers. We tend to thank these people for our enjoyment of modern square dancing, and to forget that square dancing was not always what it is today. How many of us would be dancing now, if square dancing still consisted of "Birdie in the Cage", called four times thru, with an occasional 'Sally Gooden'? What influence was it that picked square dancing up out of the small country towns, where little groups of people did the same half dozen squares night after night, and built it up into a nation-wide activity that attracts alert and sophisticated people from all sorts of environments, and keeps them interested and happy?

Well, of course it wasn't any one person. Perhaps Dr. LLOYD 'Pappy' SHAW was the first to set things going, and to introduce a few new maneuvers, like the 'Allemande Thar'. To live things up. But from then on, square dancing has been built up, developed, shaped to suit modern dancers, and kept moving forward, by the efforts of many ingenious callers and square dance composers, and high up on anyone's list of these leaders stands our own JIM YORK.

It is too bad that the average dancer of today does not know what he is dancing. He may know the names of a few singing calls - he can recognize the tunes, or the tag lines - but he does not know who wrote them, and of the hundreds of patter calls he dances all the time, he can hardly recognize one. Ask any dancer if he knows 'Trailin' Star' or 'Let 'Er Go', let alone who wrote them (naturally, JIM YORK), and you'll get a blank stare. But just call them, and they're off. It is ironic that a part of JIM YORK'S great influence on Square Dancing should be to keep people from knowing what he did do - because JIM was among the first to call so directionally that he no longer needed to tell people what they were about to do, so that they could do it. It was JIM'S use of what has become known as 'cross trail hash' and 'surprise allemandes' that started the trend away from named squares, because even the named ones never came out the same, with him. Just when you thought you had the pattern memorized - (that used to be possible) - he would throw in another whole series of pass-thrus and cross-trails, and you'd be off again. We're used to surprises now - but JIM had a lot to do with making them popular.

According to those who knew him 'when', JIM was one of the first to insist that callers ought to share their knowledge and experiences. It is hard now, to imagine a caller jealously guarding his one call, and refusing to call it if there was a rival caller present. We shudder to think of each caller using his own terms, so that dancers would have to learn all over again in order to dance to someone else. But that was the situation when JIM and a few of his friends started having callers' meetings, and passing around material, and encouraging new callers to come to them for advice. It took vision to do that, and real interest in the activity as a whole. Today, exchange of ideas is the accepted thing, but someone had to start the ball rolling.

A list of JIM YORK'S original calls would be more impressive if people nowadays knew calls by name. How many of you can recognize 'Susie Q', 'Two Turn', 'Too Many Times', 'Summer Knot', 'Twirl Out', 'Let 'Er Go', or 'Trail-in' Star'? Most of you do know 'Don't Blame It All On Me', but did you know he wrote it? And the list of movements he denies writing, but certainly made popular, is even more familiar - Cross Trail Thru, Ends Hinge, Ends Turn Out, Strip the Gears, and so on. And then there are the combination calls that he first put together, creating new and exciting movements - whirldaw to a Right and Left Grand; Box the Flea and Throw Out The Clutch (from an allemande thar); Reverse The A; Cross Trail And U Turn Back; and all the combinations of Pass Thrus and Cross Trails that keep you jumping. JIM may not have invented all these things, but he was out there in front, showing the other callers how they could be used, and getting dancers used to them.

Perhaps JIM'S unique contribution is really a combination of several factors - his imagination and ability to visualize what he wants the dancers to do, combined with his superb sense of timing, which enables him to give the command just at the right moment. Add to this a memory like a card-index system, and a lightning comprehension that enables him to see what is developing in the square as he calls it, and compose new twists as needed, and you can see why JIM YORK is going to be hard to follow.

Thousands of dancers, all over the country, have seen the ten percent of the iceberg, when they have danced to JIM'S contagious calling, and responded to his warm and friendly personality - and have encountered his most strikingly attractive asset, JEANNIE. But is the hope of those of us who know about the other ninety percent, that some of it may become better known. When we get together in September, both here and in Southern California, to show our appreciation of JIM YORK as a leader of square dancing, we hope that the number and enthusiasm of the dancers present will show that our message has gotten across, and that all of you really do appreciate JIM YORK.

Reports from many well qualified persons attending the convention indicate that the majority of activities ran very smoothly and that the many clinics, panels and forums were well-attended and that those attending were well pleased with the results of these activities.

Final figures show that total registration was 8,457, with a composite attendance of 18,452 for the 3-day session. Unusual weather conditions were a factor in holding down attendance on the final two days. The heaviest rainfall in St. Louis history for a 12 hour period began early Friday evening, the city getting 9-inches and one of the suburbs 13-inches. Many delegates were caught downtown and were delayed in getting back to the auditorium but they carried on by dancing in the hotels until a break in the downpour.
