Dance of the Month

EXACTLY LIKE YOU
by VIRGINIA & AL JOHNSON, SAN LORENZO, CALIFORNIA

RECORD: "Exactly Like You", Decca #30064 (Play above 78 RPM)

POSITION: Loose closed, M's back to COH

FOOTWORK: OPPOSITE, Directions are for M

INTRO: 4 meas. (Wait 2 meas. acknowledge on meas. 3-4)

Meas:

- 1 - 4 SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE, BRUSH; FWD TWO-STEP; SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE, BRUSH; FWD TWO-STEP;
Starting M's L, grapevine along LOD: step L to side, step R behind L, step L to side, then facing LOD in semi-closed pos. brush inside foot fwd; starting M's R, still in semi-closed pos do one fwd two-step; maneuver to loose closed pos and repeat these two measures;
- 5 - 8 TWIRL, 2, 3, TCH; REV/TWIRL, 2, 3, TCH; TURN TWO-STEP, 2; 3, 4;
Moving along LOD and starting M's L, M does a swd two-step and touch; repeat action in RLOD starting M's R (W makes one RF twirl under joined leading hands moving LOD; and one LF twirl moving RL OD); assume closed pos and do four quick turning two-steps making two full turns progressing LOD;
- 9 - 16 REPEAT MEAS 1-8 ENDING IN OPEN POS FACING LOD;
- 17 - 20 BAL APART, BAL TOG (TO BUTTERFLY); STEP, TAP, STEP, TAP, SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE, BEHIND: STEP, BRUSH, STEP, TOUCH;
With inside hands joined and starting M's L, do a two-step bal. a-part and a two-step bal tog. to face partner, arms extended in butterfly pos M's back to COH; step L to side along LOD, tap R behind L, step R to side along RLOD, tap L behind R; then, moving along LOD M steps L to side, step R behind L, step L to side, step R behind L (limp step); in open pos step L fwd brush R fwd, step back on R, touch L;
- 21 - 24 REPEAT MEAS 17-20 EXCEPT ON LAST STEP TCH, W MAKES 1/2 LF TURN TO END IN BUTTERFLY BANJO POS (RHIPS ADJACENT) M FACING LOD;
- 25 - 28 FWD, CLOSE, STEP, SWING: FWD, CLOSE, STEP, SWING: TO SIDECAR, 2, 3, BRUSH: HALF/AROUND, 2, 3, touch;
Starting M's L, progressing LOD, do one fwd two-step, swing R fwd; repeat fwd two-step starting M's R, swing L fwd, (W is backing up); then M steps L behind R, step R to side, close L to R, brush R fwd to end in butterfly sidecar pos (L hips adjacent) (W does a swd two-step, brush); then M steps -RLR- TCH L making 1/2 CCW turn to end M facing RLOD still in butterfly sidecar pos;
- 29 - 32 FWD, CLOSE, STEP, SWING: FWD, CLOSE, STEP, SWING: TO BANJO, 2, 3, BRUSH: TURN, 2, 3, TOUCH;
Starting M's L, progressing RLOD, repeat foot action of Meas. 25-26; then starting M's L do a swd two-step, brush to end in butterfly banjo pos facing RLOD (W steps R behind L, step L to side, close R to L, brush L fwd); as M steps -RLR- tch L making 1/2 CW turn, W turns LF under joined M's R & W's L hands. End in loose closed pos M's back to COH.

ENTIRE DANCE IS DONE TWICE, THEN:

ENDING: REPEAT MEAS 1 - 8; IN SEMI-CLOSED POS, WALK, -, 2, -;
TWIRL, BOW.

KAY and FORREST RICHARDS

We are very proud of KAY & FORREST RICHARDS. All of NORTHERN CALIF. should be. While most of us looked on Round Dancing only as incidental the Square Dance Picture, along came those two specialists who promoted Round Dancing as an integral part of the movement.

It all began in 1951 when the RICHARDS' enrolled in a square dance class. For over two years, friends had been trying to interest them in square dancing, but they were just "too busy" --with FORREST'S neon sign work and KAY'S school teaching plus their mutual hobby, private flying. Finally, early in 1951, after seeing a square dance demonstration at a P.T.A. party, FORREST said "Where do we learn to do that?" So -- they managed to squeeze in one night a week for square dance instruction -- and they loved it!

They don't know quite how it happened, but their phone would ring and some-one would ask, "Could a group of us come over tonight, and would you help us with the rounds?" And --there they were, down in the rumpus room, clarifying spots and having a wonderful time.

We guess it was a "natural" in a way; for KAY holds a credential for teaching dance and also holds a Masters degree from Mills College; -- so it was an easy "modulation" from "Dance Forms in Education" to Round dance Forms with Squares." And -- KAY had previously worked extensively with Elementary, Junior High, and High School Students in the various forms of the dance -- from Tap. Folk, through Creative, Modern, and Dance Pantomime, with some original operettas sprinkled in.

When they were asked to start their first Round Dance Class, KAY said, "NO" -- but FORREST said, "YES." It is quite evident whose decision carried -- and, both are truly happy in the activity; they work with such wonderful people!

Both FORREST and KAY are avid square dancers and have been since they had their first lessons in basic instruction -- for they believe that nothing can equal the lift and stimulation received from square participation; however, since they feel that "rounds can be fun, too", they have attempted to pass on to others the enthusiasm which they feel for the "in-betweens" in a square dancing evening.

The RICHARDS' have conducted many Round Dance Workshops, Clinics for Callers, have participated in State and National Conventions, and have assisted FRANK & CAROLYN HAMILTON as Round Dance Instructors for the Asilomar SETS IN ORDER INSTITUTES during the past two years, and their dances include: "JOY RIDE", "CUDDLE UP", "PAPER MOON", "TWILIGHT TWO-STEP", and "THREE O'CLOCK WALTZ."

We salute you! The movement has been enriched with your knowledge, graciousness, and your devotion to the ideal that Round Dancing belongs to all Square Dancers.

Several worthwhile publications have had to fold because of lack of subscribers, the latest being one here in Texas. This publication survived for ten-and-a-half years, but now is no more. It was a wonderful little magazine, too, and published by two people who always have had square and round dancing at heart. We have always known what a rough road we have to travel, but when a magazine that old has to give up, no one but the dancers are to blame.

Balance and Swing is now the ONLY Square and and Round Dance magazine published in Texas, and is in its fifth year. Would YOU like to see the same fate hit YOUR magazine?

ODDS and ENDS

by MADELINE ALLEN

Hidden in the side seam of each of my square dance dresses is a small pocket, and into that pocket goes everything I accumulate at a square dance. Along with stray dollar bills, given me for subscriptions to SQUARE DANCE-WHERE? (Pug), I find notes with suggestions for future articles, from all sorts of people I meet. As a grand clean-up at the end of summer, I have decided to toss all of those notes into one heap and try to cover them briefly. Actually, almost every subject has been covered already, one way or another, so I have added the date of the previous article. If you don't save your magazines, you should be ashamed. But don't despair - any day now we may decide to bring out another collection, and you can buy that.

BACKLASHING: Most people complain about it, but a few say, "Why not?" I still say no, except within your own Club, if the majority of the members do it and like it. See March and April, 1956.

RIGHT AND LEFT THRU: Why can't people remember to turn the girl every time? More tricky squares are ruined in the middle by one sloppy Right and Left Thru than by all the Square Thrus and Cross Trails put together. For exact rules on when to turn, and how much, see July, 1956.

DRESSING FOR SQUARE DANCES: Is it on the decline? I hope not. I think the special type of costume we wear is a very important part of our enjoyment of square dancing. I do think that clothes are very much more practical than they were, require less upkeep, and cost less to make. But they are also getting much prettier than they used to be, as we get away from small prints and calicoes, and into bright colors and many petticoats. The fact is, styles have caught up with us, and square dance clothes no longer look as different as they did. But they are still costumes and should be just a little gayer and less conservative than other clothes. See October, 1956.

ROUGHNESS: Can't we do anything about the sort of dancing that leaves you black and blue and forces you to defend yourself in the clinches? Personally, we know Clubs that dance that way by choice, and we have stopped going there. This seems to be a problem all over, and we would certainly like to hear any ideas as to how to control it. A lot of us aren't getting any younger, and we'd like to dance a few more years all in one piece. For concrete suggestions to improve your own smoothness, if you suspect I am talking about you, see Nov. 1956.

DUES PAYING MEMBERS: How can you get people to join a Club and do their share? I agree - they should - and I covered that subject pretty thoroughly in an article on "Freeloaders", which was reprinted in SQUAREDANCEMANSHIP, available from "SQUARE DANCE-WHERE?"

WEARING A HAT WHILE DANCING: Should it be allowed? Generally speaking, I am against it. No gentleman would wear a hat while dancing with a lady, under other circumstances. But I realize that to some men, a cowboy hat is a sort of symbol - it may mean that at last he is a real Caller, or even a real Dancer. Maybe he bought that hat in the first flush of enthusiasm and wants to get his money's worth out of it. Just wearing it to the dance isn't enough - no one sees it. Some callers wear it as a gag - their own trademark. So don't be too hard on men who are still little boys - let them have their fun. It may do worlds of good to their egos.

BICKERING: Why so much in Clubs? Well, square dance clubs, like other clubs, are made up of people, and people bicker. I have heard this complaint so often that I realize I am becoming unsympathetic. I have a feeling that bickering, to the people who complain about it, means arguing about something that they think should be done their way. You might read "The Crying Room is Outside", in SQUAREDANCEMANSHIP.

COURTESY TURN: Should it always be used in a Ladies' Chain? My own answer to this question is, no. In singing calls, and in the Grand Square, where you have plenty of time to be courteous, and in places where the ladies chain and then face the set, you should do it. But in the middle of a fast hash call, where you go on to a do-paso or some other figure right away, I am in favor of a simple fore-arm turn. Of course, a courtesy turn is always required in a right

and Left Thru, but I notice that we are cutting it down more and more, even though we still insist on ending facing the way we came. See December, 1956 for a discussion of Grips.

SQUARE THRU: How do you do it? Well, this is too new a figure for me to be able to tell you how to do all the variations that may develop, but I can give you one good rule. In a full Square Thru you end in your own place, where you started at home, you are now facing your corner, which is easy. But if you started in two lines of four, the chances are fifty-fifty that you are now facing out - so stay that way. Another call will be along soon. And when all the various forms of Square Thrus become pretty well established, I'll write a whole article on it. Right now, it's every man for himself.

ALL THESE NEW FIGURES ARE RUINING SQUARE DANCING: Who said that? Plenty of people - but I don't agree. The callers don't have to call them all right now, but the very fact that they keep on appearing is a sign that square dancing is still a Living Art. Don't be an old fogey.
