LOVE ME

By Sam and Betty Evans, Pottstown, Pennsylvania

RECORD: "Love Me a Little Bit" - Mercury #71072 (Eddy Howard)

POSITION: Semi-Closed, facing LOD

FOOTWORK: Opposite with M starting on L. Directions for M

INTRODUCTION: Wait 3 notes, then:

MEASURES:

- 1 - 4 TWO-STEP BAL FWD, TWO-STEP BAL BACK; TWIRL, 2, 3, TOUCH; TWO-STEP BAL FWD, TWO-STEP BAL BACK; REVERSE TWIRL, 2, 3, TOUCH;
In semi-closed pos starting M's L, do a two-step bal fwd (LRL), a two-step bal back (RLR); Starting M's L do a 3 step grapevine and touch (LRL tch R) along LOD as W twirls R-face (RLR tch L) under leading hands (M's L, W's R) end in OPEN POS facing RLOD M's L, W's R hands joined; Starting M's R do a two-step bal fwd, two-step bal back; Grapevine and touch (RLR tch L) along RLOD as W does a L-face twirl (LRL tch R) ending in SEMI-CLOSED POS facing LOD:

DANCE

- 1 - 4 TWO-STEP, TWO-STEP: STEP, BRUSH, STEP, BRUSH; SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE, TOUCH; REVERSE TWIRL, 2, 3, TOUCH; Starting M's L, do 2 two-steps (LRL, RLR) in LOD; Step L, brush R, step R, brush L; With leading hands joined (M's L, W's R) do a 3-step grapevine and touch (LRL tch R) along LOD; M repeats grapevine and touch (RLR tch L) along RLOD as W does a L-face twirl (LRL tch R) ending in SEMI-CLOSED POS facing LOD;
- 5 - 8 REPEAT MEAS 1-4, ending in OPEN POS facing LOD, M's R, W's L hands joined;
- 9 - 10 TWO-STEP BAL AWAY, TWO-STEP BAL TOGETHER; TWO-STEP BAL AWAY, CROSS OVER, 2;
Starting M's L, do a two-step bal away (LRL) swinging joined hands fwd, two-step bal together (RLR) swinging joined hands back; Two-step bal away (LRL) swinging joined hands fwd again, change places pivoting full R-face turn R, L (W pivots L-face across in front of M);
- 11 - 12 TWO-STEP BAL AWAY, TWO-STEP BAL TOGETHER; TWO-STEP BAL AWAY, CROSS BACK, 2;
Repeat Meas 9-10 with W on M's L still facing LOD, with opposite hands and footwork; end facing, M's back to COH, both hands joined;
- 13 - 14 TWO-STEP BAL LOD; TWO-STEP BAL RLOD; ROLL AWAY, 2, 3, TOUCH;
Starting M's L do a two-step bal (LRL) to side along LOD, two-step bal (RLR) to side along RLOD; Partners do a full turn roll away (M to L, W to R) from each other (LRL tch R); progressing along LOD.
- 15 - 16 TWO-STEP BAL RLOD, TWO-STEP BAL LOD; ROLL AWAY, 2, 3, TOUCH;
Repeat Meas 13-14 with opp footwork and direction ending in SEMI-CLOSED POS and repeat dance from beginning.
DANCE IS DONE THREE TIMES PLUS ENDING

ENDING:

- 1 - 4 TWO-STEP, TWO-STEP; TWIRL, 2, 3, 4; TWO-STEP; TWIRL, 2, 3, 4;
In SEMI-CLOSED POS facing LOD, starting M's L, do 2 two-steps (LRL RLR); M walks 4 steps (LRLR) as W twirls twice (RLR); Repeat Meas 1 - 2;
- 5 - 6 TWO-STEP, TWO-STEP; TWIRL, 2, BOW.
Repeat Meas 1; Then M walks (LR) as W twirls once (RL), BOW.

-AND I REPEAT!

If you ever begin to wonder whether or not the Square Dance movement is growing, just make a point of attending one of the Stampedes at the Oakland Auditorium. Not only do you see practically all your own friends there, but you are continually amazed at the number of people you never saw before -- and not beginners, either. Maybe individuals do not dance as many nights a week as they used to, but the number of different people who dance is certainly growing all the time.

The reason I bring this up is that I am always being asked to write something about some subject that I considered I had already covered. At first I thought these people were pretty forgetful, but then I began to realize that as far as these editorials were concerned, they just came in late. So for their benefit I am going to repeat a few things I have said before.

I think the complaint I get most often is about Roughness. I think the trouble must be that a lot of new dancers still associate Square Dancing with Hillbillies and Barn dances and a lot of cavorting and skipping and bouncing, and have not had it pointed out to them that modern Square Dancing is a smooth, easy, relaxed movement, and not a wrestling match. Maybe they have watched some of the really slick Teen Age Exhibition teams, who are part acrobat, and are trying to copy them. Maybe they think that because they are now square dancing, they can forget all the rules of gentleness and consideration toward ladies that they learned before. Maybe they don't even know they are rough. Anyhow, I said before and I still say -- take it easy. Don't force a lady to do any twirl or spin she does not want to do -- just give her a hand and let her decide. Don't jerk on a turn-back, and don't pull her by like cracking the whip. After a swing, let her go, gently, in the right direction -- don't give her a spin and cast her loose, without even looking to see where she is going. And if you feel, as some new dancers tell me they do, that your caller is not giving you enough instruction in how to dance, tell him so. He's probably afraid to include too much 'styling' in the course for fear he might lose a few rugged individualists. If they are the kind that are going to wind me up like a top, willy-nilly, I say good riddance. The ones who are going to make good square dancers anyhow will welcome some pointers on how to make other good dancers like dancing with them.

The problem of short sleeved shirts on men seems to be licked. At least, no one asks me to write about it any more, so I assume that the men I don't see are as well dressed now as those I do dance with.

Another recurrent gripe concerns people who don't do their share. I wrote one good blast against people who don't join a Club because they don't want to be bothered, and I said that just paying your fee at the door is not enough to ensure the continuance of our kind of square dancing. It seems, though, that there are also a lot of people who do join a Club, but who stop right there, and do nothing to help the Club. Here I think the Club itself has the obligation to draw a line between duties and leadership. All Club members should be required to pay their dues, and to take their turn at such routine chores as kitchen and door committees. But square dancers are also people, and not all people are good, or even possible, leaders. I think the real complaint comes when those people who refuse office in a Club still insist on criticizing the way the Club is run. The only possible answer to members like that is a simple 'Put up or shut up!' Most successful Clubs that I know just assume that some are leaders and some are not, and let the rest coast along in the background, as long as they are happy there. After all, a Club needs dancers too, as well as officers.

One thing I have never written about is drinking. I just assumed that all square dancers knew that drinking and square dancing do not mix. But I guess new dancers have to be told by someone, and if their caller does not do it, they may never really know what the score is. There are two main reasons why we say no liquor at all -- not even beer. The practical one is that we do most of our dancing in schools, and they forbid it. Having the use of school halls is very important economically to square dancing, and for that reason alone we would rule out all drinking. But it is also true that even a small amount of liquor can affect both calling and dancing, much more than casual drinkers think. Some people go so far as to say that a drink within six hours of a dance can affect you, but we personally don't go that far.

Most of the dancers I know draw the line at dinner -- a drink before dinner, and I mean a drink, is allowable, but a drink after dinner is not. And of course any drinking during or around a dance is unthinkable. Those few individuals who consider that they are too big to be bound by the rules in a case like this, or who think they can take a drink without being detected, or who don't care what people think, will find out that they are wrong. Square dancers are not necessarily people who do not drink -- they are just people who do not drink when they are going to dance.

How to dress for dancing is another subject people seem to want to hear about. I've written a lot about that, too, but mostly it all boils down to -- dress up! Let what you wear add to the color and gayety and comfort of dancing, and let it also express your suppressed desires -- wear the things you ordinarily consider too bright for you. Keep an eye on other dancers and see who looks attractive to you, and ask yourself why. Right now, ballerina length dresses with lots of petticoats are the thing, or else squaw dresses, but with a little less braid than those overloaded numbers they wore for awhile. Men's clothes look best fairly fitted, which is why Western shirts are so popular. Slippers or boots ought to be specially made for dancing, no matter how much you'd like to wear out your old flats -- your feet will know the difference. But do wear special clothes, and add something to the occasion for everybody.

And here is one last request -- this time from me, personally. Please, wear your Club badge at all times, preferably the kind with your name in great big letters that even I can read from across the square. There are so many square dancers I know so well, and have danced with so often, but still can't identify, just because they never wear badges. And I really do want to know you!

In case you didn't know, you can have the collection of MADELINE'S first two years of editorials, called "Squaredancemanship", just by sending 50¢ to "Square Dance-Where?" And a second series, to bring you up to date, will soon be available.

FRESNO'S ANNUAL

KROSSROADS SQUAR-RAMA

Fresno's Second Annual "Kross Roads Squar-Rama" is now history, with it comes a request for an overall review. Lets' give this by a sort of running set of answers to most oft asked questions. The birth of the Squar-Rama ushered in an annual event, sponsored by the Valley Associated Square Dancers to take the place of the first three State Square Dance Conventions, which Fresno hosted. The machinery of this one, if you prefer to call it that, was a meshing of the following clubs -- committies -- individuals and most of all you, the dancers and guests, whether you realize it or not. Participating clubs: BAR NONE, COUNTRY COUSINS, GRAPE STOMPERS, HICKS & CHICKS, KNOTHEADS, KRAZY 8'S, PAIRS OF FOUR, STEPPERS & STOMPERS, SQUARE WHEELERS and FRESNO ROUNDERS, CHUCK GRIFFIN (Assn. Pres.) COMMS: Steering (BETHEL THOMASON, Chairman), Gen. Prog. (Steering Comm.), Publicity (Chr. MAURICE WHIT), Posters (BURT GARNER), Printing (BETHEL & ANDY LATONA), Mailing (Chr. DICK FRANCIS), Decorations (Chr. "MAC" McDONALD with KNOTHEADS), Floor & Meeting Rooms (Chr. BILL DODDS & JESS LANE with HICKS & CHICKS), Sound (Chr. LUTHER BROOKS), Music (Steering Comm.), Callers & MG (ANDY LATONA), Exhibitions (BURT GARNER), Registrations (WINNIE COLLINS, FRED SMITH, KAY MORGAN, FENTON GRENNEN with KRAZY 8'S and GRAPE STOMPERS), Displays-Transportation and Insurance (ROY SCHIDT), Finance & Budget (DEE BREWER), Hospitality (JACK WIGGETT & HERB DICKENSON with BAR NONE and STEPPERS & STOMPERS).

Official opening was Friday nite with some 20 local & out of town guest club callers. Four things stood out: (1) Larger crowd than was anticipated (2) fun everyone had (3) the poor sound (not your fault Luther!) (4) the surprising number of Sound Experts who all knew (by different methods) how to kill the "Sound Bugs".

Saturday a.m. found the So. Caller-Dancer-Publications Relations group having breakfast at the Hotel Fresno. Hosted by the South Coast Assn. (JOHN WHISENANT) and Combo. Hosts, the A.S.Q.D.'s (LAMBERTS) Cow Counties (COCKRELLS) Western Assn. (MUCKEL-RAYS) So. Callers (HARLEY SMITH) Square Dance-Where? Publication (FERRARIOS) & C.C.C. Publication (CLEO HARDEN). Sixty attended.

At the Auditorium - Round Dancers in session with CROSBYS & MAXHIMERS leading the group. Before 1:30 the Square Dancers were clamoring to get going. Some excellent club callers on program. Sound? Still n.g! Saturday evening opened with both halls filled with gay dancers, beautiful gowns, crowded spectator galleries and thousands of anxious ears waiting for the first peep from the Sound Boxes. When it came, the Pleased smiles were the answer. Some "Fairly" had waved a wand over the sound for sure. BUB ABLES, "BROWNIE", JIM MORK and BILL RICHARDSON all did a superb-calling job and CAL GOLDEN at the M.C. spot kept things rolling. At half time shuttle busses were busy between halls while BOB & NITA'S BOB-O-LINKS put on a splendid set of exhibitions. Dancers won't quit at midnight, in Fresno, so they scattered to the various after party club halls. KNOT HEADS hosted 240 odd -- 450 were fed and danced at the "New Barn" and they danced until 5 a.m. 350 ate with the BAR NONE and reluctantly stopped dancing at 3 a.m. For many that was over 9 hours of Saturday dancing (yours truly lost 8 lbs over the week end). Sunday a.m. the EAGER BEAVERS were at it again and Sunday p.m. wound it up at 5 p.m. with GLEN STORY and BRUCE STOTTS calling an excellent program to a full floor.

The only clinic was on Caller-Dancer relationships, handled by BRUCE STOTTS and attended by sixty attentive participants.

Answers to final questions and comments: "Was the SquarRama a success?"

That must be judged by the yard stick used, and who used it. For instance the second State Convention ended with \$50 left in the budget and one bill yet outstanding of \$49. This, the Convention Bureau (of the Chamber of Commerce) said was a most outstanding example of

a "Perfect" convention. (Breaking even by the hosting group). The financial figures are not all in on this one, but from dancer reactions and comments this was successful. "What was the spread of attendance? Ans: From North of San Rafael (Bay Area) North of Paradise (inland) Bishop (East) Santa Cruz (West) San Diego (South) Oregon 4, Idaho 4 (out of State) Central Valley and Fresno proper.

May I comment on "Monthly Mail Bag letter of Edith Blew?"

Her inference of ROUND DANCING being "monotony of ballroom dancing"

shows several things I suspect is wrong with Edith Blew.

- (1) One of those couples that never can learn to round dance. (or dance.)
- (2) Hasn't tried too hard to round dance. (3) Doubt if she realizes that very few "ballroom" dancers are or can round dance. (4) Most GOOD square dancers I've met country wise are either round dancers or would like to be.
- (5) Square Dancers that do not like at least some rounds (rounds for squares)

are generally the rough dancers that think it smart to be rough and ignore the music. (I'll bet Edith is from Texas.)

I have found clubs that do not round dance for several reasons, none very good ones. (1) Caller doesn't like rounds (can't dance squares either)

(2) Rounds have been poorly presented (In this case the squares are not either.)

Of course through this area N. Mexico, Texas, they do not do rounds, too much, (nor good square dancing either) they have very few callers, and no teachers.

We have been round dancing for sometime (left Calif. about a year ago, holes in our head I think) and enjoy it every bit as much as squares. We learned our rounds under the HAMILTONS, Leons, with a little bit of M & N SMITH, and the RICHARDS thrown in, I think we've had the best.

The day rounds are not on a square dance program we may not be there, let us not fall into texas style 3 squares about 8-9 min. long single visitation dance.
