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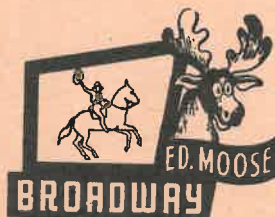

JUST CALL ME ABBY.... by Madeline Allen

The Golden State Round-up has come and gone again, and, as usual, this one was the best yet. Lots of us are getting smarter, and we danced during the day and watched at night, coming down out of the balcony once or twice for one square and then giving up our space to someone else. Sunday night things opened up a little, but the floor was still full 'til the bitter end. What a party!

It was lucky I didn't want to dance every dance -- (who could?) -- because all thru the weekend I kept getting cornered. Every time I sat down, someone with a problem would drop down beside me, or they would buttonhole me in the halls, or on the stairs. I got a real earful of highly classified material, but I also got a lot of really interesting and thoughtful questions. I tried to answer them off the cuff, as much as possible, but I am sure other people are thinking about the same things in their own Clubs. So here are a few examples of those questions that are "fit to print".

Question: In our area the Clubs are knocking themselves out trying to serve the best refreshments, and catering dinners are not only breaking the Clubs' treasuries, but are losing members too. Should we have to compete that way?

Answer: No! You are losing sight of what people come to Square Dances for. If you get the best callers you can get, and see that the other requirements, like good floors and sound, are met, you should attract the right kind of dancers. Some Clubs have stopped serving even coffee and doughnuts, if it is too much trouble, although most Saturday night dances still do have a coffee break. But keep it simple.

Question: Our Club is for married couples only, but now we are faced with the question of whether or not to admit two singles, who would come as a couple. Should we allow this?

Answer: That's a tough one, but I'd be inclined to say, stick to your rule. Or at least, have it clearly understood that if one of the singles leaves, the other does too -- or sure as Fate, you'll be left with someone with no partner, for the members to worry about. My advice would be to welcome them cordially as guests, but not as members.

Question: We are beginning to be concerned about the trend toward going out after Square Dances and drinking beer -- at first it seemed simple and pleasant, but lately some of our members have been getting a little noisy. We wonder if the Club has a right to object. The people say it is not our business what they do after the dance is over.

Answer: Anything that reflects on the Club, or on the Square Dance movement as a whole, is the business of the Club. If those dancers would go home and change out of square dance clothes before starting to whoop it up, it would be different. But people in square dance outfits represent all square dancers, and it would be a sad state of affairs if it got so that square dancers were not welcome everywhere. The same thing applies to loud parties in Motels at an affair such as this, when square dancers travel in bunches. Usually no direct action is needed in a Club -- it should be enough to let these people know that the rest of the members do not approve. A trend like this certainly ought to be discouraged.

Question: We are always told that when in Rome we should do as the Romans do, even if they do a pigeon-wing Allemande. But we danced at a Bay Area Club the other night -- we are from out of the State -- and everyone took high kicks on the Allemandes, and even on a Grand Right and Left. We did not know how to do it, so we left out the kicks, and the members acted as if we were wet-blankets. What should we have done?

Answer: Leaving out entirely the question of whether I like or dislike that style of dancing (ugh!), the real question is, what should the Club have done? One of the basic, original rules of behavior, in Square Dancing as well as in everything else, is COURTESY -- and in this case the Club seems to have been guilty of discourtesy to guests. Sure, the guests ought to try to conform, and not make a point of insisting on their own style of dancing. But

many Clubs have special things they do within the Club that they don't do outside, and some of them are very confusing and even painful to guests. It should be the Club members' responsibility to see that guests are made comfortable, and members dancing in squares with guests should modify their extreme styling to suit them. What an opinion some guests in our State must have of our dancing!

Question: How did you like the Style Show?

Answer: As Style Shows go, I thought it was fine, and apparently a lot of people like Style Shows. But I think it is about time someone spoke up for the captive minority, who are sitting there watching because it is the "only game in town." (Some of them are catching a nap.) When I think of the agony of having to choose between going over and working with the Manning Smiths, earlier that same afternoon, or staying to hear Bob Van Antwerp on Callers' Problems, it makes me mad to think that if I don't want to see the Style Show, there is nothing else to do. Why can't the Style Show and the Callers' Discussion come at the same time? I'll bet that would cause very little conflict, except maybe with the lady callers -- and they could always send their husbands! I am assuming that all those people who put in so many hours on the Show did it because they wanted to, and were satisfied with the result. Certainly the dresses were beautiful, and the dances they did were very effective. But we can see the dresses all weekend, on the floor, and we already have exhibitions. Let's have the Style Show for those who want to see it, but if we have to double up somewhere on the weekend's events, please, let's do it then -- and let those of us who just don't care for Style Shows have some choice in the matter.

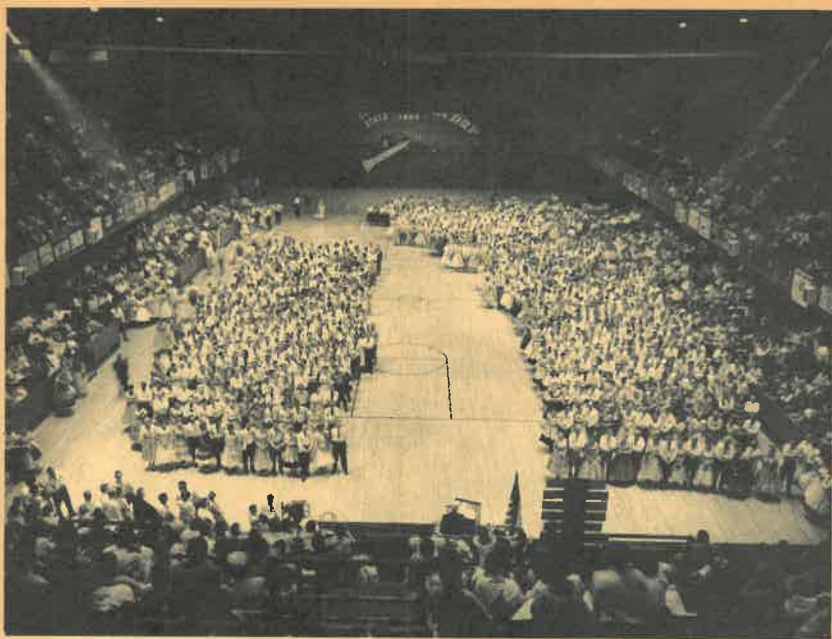

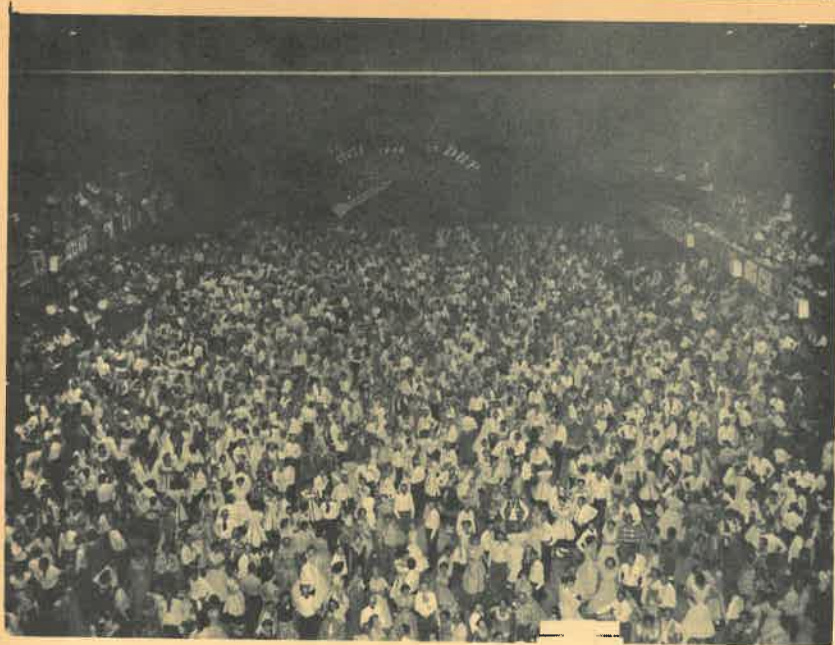
