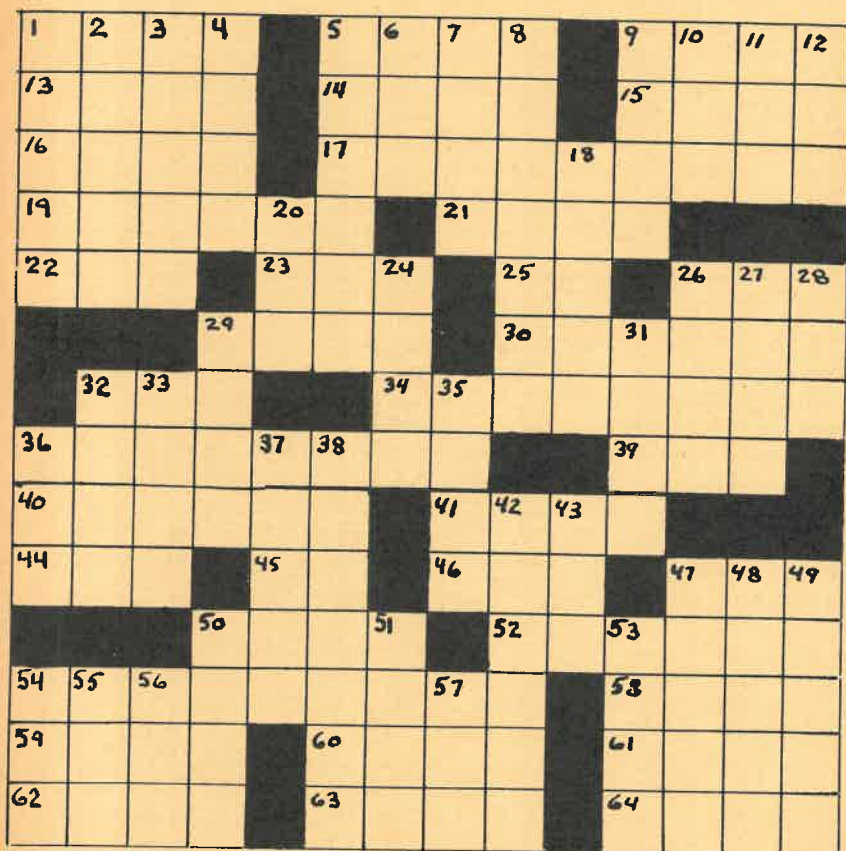

ROUND DANCE of the MONTH

YOU CAN'T GET LOVIN'

by Bill & Alice Johnson — Chicago, Ill.

RECORD: "You Can't Get Lovin'" Dot 15619

POSITION: Closed, M facing wall.

FOOTWORK: Opposite. Directions given for M

INTRO: 4 measures

MEASURES:

- 1 - 2 SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE, BEHIND; PIVOT, -, STEP, -;
In closed pos, M facing wall, M steps L to side along LOD, R behind L, L to side, R behind L; Both make $3/4$ L-face pivot in 2 steps M stepping L first with a small step changing sides with partner and taking a longer step bwd down LOD on second step. End M facing RLOD in banjo pos. (W takes longer first step on R down LOD changing sides with partner and a smaller step L to finish her pivot.)
- 3 - 4 BACK UP TWO-STEP; TWO-STEP;
Retaining banjo pos 2 two-steps down LOD (M backing up and leading back L on first two-step).
- 5 - 6 BANJO AROUND, -, 2, -; TWIRL, -, 2, -;
Retaining banjo pos as a couple walk around in 2 steps (M steps bwd L on first step, W steps fwd R on first step), end with M's back to COH; W twirls R-face under M's L hand with 2 steps as M walks beside. End in closed pos.
- 7 - 8 TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP;
2 R-face turning two-steps, ending in semi-closed pos facing LOD.
- 9 - 10 WALK, -, WALK, -; CUT, STEP, STEP FWD, -;
In semi-closed pos walk fwd in LOD 2 steps (M steps L, -, R, -); CUTL in front of R, walk back on R, step fwd on L.
- 11 - 12 REPEAT MEAS 9-10, starting M's R, W's L.
- 13 - 14 ROLL, -, 2, -; SIDE, CLOSE, STEP, -;
M turning L-face, W R-face and progressing in LOD, roll with 2 steps (M -, L, -, R, -) to end facing partner, both hands joined with M's back to COH; One swd two-step to M's L along LOD.
- 15 - 16 REPEAT MEAS 13-14 using opposite footwork and progressing down RLOD. End in closed pos, M facing wall.

DANCE IS DONE FOUR TIMES IN ALL

TAG: REPEAT MEAS 1; Then balance L, -, balance R, -; W turns R-face under M's L hand with 2 steps; Change hands with partner (to M's R, W's L); Honor partner.

From

National Square Dance Convention

Many, many congratulations are due Eddie Colin and his hard working committees for the outstanding way in which they presented the Seventh Annual National Square Dance Convention at Louisville, Kentucky, June 19 to 21, 1958.

All phases of the convention were excellently planned and executed, despite the tremendous handicap of having only nine months to prepare. The workshops and clinics were ably managed, and the panel direction and participation were excellent. The tremendous coliseum presented an inspiring sight to the many spectators who enjoyed the exhibitions and dance sessions. Although a good many of the visiting callers felt compelled to show their versatility by competing with each other with speed and intricate calls, the last hour of the program on the main floor will long be remembered as square dancing at its best. Program Chairman Floyd & Magdalene Bohart deserve a hearty "well done" for a well laid out program.

The activity and interest shown at the Convention Bid Committee meeting called by Chairman Howard Thornton was most encouraging. Excellent bids were submitted by Albuquerque, Dallas, Des Moines, and Miami Beach; and Des Moines was selected as the site of the 1960 convention by a narrow margin. The unsuccessful bidders were urged by Chairman Thornton not to be discouraged, but to plan on rebidding at a future date. Interest in future conventions was also demonstrated by representatives from Detroit, Los Angeles, Omaha, Seattle, and Washington, D.C. The meeting was also attended by Art & Hermina Slack, co-chairman of next year's convention at Denver, Colorado.

The National Convention Committee in executive session elected Bud Dixon, San Diego, as chairman for the coming year and Art Lowell of St. Louis as Secretary-Treasurer. Inquiries about future conventions should be addressed to Chairman Dixon at 5 North 2nd Avenue, Chula Vista, California. The members of the executive committee present also voted unanimously to go on record as opposing over-organization of the square dance movement. They strongly feel that the present method of organization on a local level will best serve the future of our wonderful hobby.

BIGGER OR BETTER -- WHICH?

Square Dancing as a whole may be getting both bigger and better, but I am afraid that some of our big gatherings of Square Dancers are going to have to make a choice pretty soon, between the two. As long as there were not enough square dancers available at any given time to fill our largest spaces, we could go all out for the biggest crowd in history, and knock ourselves out trying to top the last event. But square dances are held in halls, which are not elastic, and the limit was bound to be reached some time. Anyone who tried seriously to dance Saturday night at the Golden State Round-Up, or last year at the State Convention at Long Beach, or at the last few National Conventions, knows that Square Dancing was not what they were doing. The stubborn ones went on wrestling, and the smart ones sat out, and danced in the daytime sessions. This situation may give the committees some impressive figures to boast about, but is it fun? We think not.

You notice, I am talking about the Saturday night dance at each of these big affairs. The daytime sessions are well attended, but not too much so - you can dance easily. The people there are the people who come for the whole package deal -- the three days, or the weekend, or whatever has been planned. They are the ones who made their plans ahead, who came probably from some distance, and who came on that particular weekend because they could get in several days of dancing on one trip. So what happens? On Saturday night, the headline callers are on, so all the local dancers, who live so close they don't need to make plans, decide to drop in, and for the cost of any local dance, fill up the place so that no one can dance. Of course, plenty of local dancers attend the whole thing too, but they are victimized in the same way. It does not seem right.

If there were larger facilities available, the answer would be easy. The solution of letting in only as many people as can dance, and then shutting the doors, is impractical. Giving people tickets of different colors, and dancing in shifts, has been tried, but no one was happy about it. The present system, of milling around on the floor until you are black and blue, and then withdrawing to the balcony to lick your wounds, is certainly not ideal. Some of us, however, have thought up one idea that might work, and we would like to put it up for discussion.

The idea is simply this -- to sell the whole affair as a package. Whether it is for two days, three days, or more, figure the cost per couple of the whole party, and then charge that amount, no matter what part of the program you attend. This would not add anything to the cost for the guests from a distance, as they pay the whole thing anyhow. It would certainly cut down the number who would come for one dance. It might also encourage people to come for some of the daytime programs, if they had to pay for them to get the night tickets. And there would be no objection to sharing tickets -- if you can come only on Saturday, find another couple who can come only on Sunday, and split with them. That would balance up the crowd, and you could set a limit on the total number of tickets sold, according to what the hall would hold. If there were no sale of individual tickets at the door, people would have to make their plans ahead, and I think it is about time square dancers were forced to do that anyhow. (Ask any committee who has to sign up callers a year ahead, what they think of people who can't decide until that night!)

One of the questions sure to be brought up is, what is the real purpose of a big affair like the Round-Up? Is it for the benefit of visitors, or is it for the local dancers? The answer, to me, is that the Golden State Round-Up is the Bay Area's party given for square dancers all over, as our way of repaying the hospitality of San Diego, Tucson, Fresno, and all the other areas that entertain us. Here, we are the hosts, and we are responsible for the good time our guests have. The Association Stampedes, on the other hand, are parties we give for ourselves, to give us a chance to hear callers from a distance, and attendance is limited to our own members. The Stampedes are for dancers who want only a Saturday night dance, and are not interested in meeting people from a distance, or learning new things at Workshops, or discussing Callers' or Dancers' problems with experts. For this reason, I do not think these same people ought to object if they are not encouraged to pour in for one dance during a weekend, and prevent those who are attending the whole thing from enjoying the big night.

At the National Conventions, the problem is even more serious. Because of having to allow for that huge Saturday night crowd, the committee is having a harder and harder time finding any place that can take the National. San Diego had the largest crowd of all, because it drew from such a huge area of dancers who just came for the day. The figures from Louisville are not in yet, but it seemed to those that went, that the situation there was a little better. There seemed to be a more even distribution of dancers over the whole three days, probably due to the fact that there are not nearly as many dancers in the immediate area, and the great number came for the whole time. But a package deal might help the National, too, the next time it is held in a great center of square dancing.

Even in our small Club Hoedowns, we are finding more and more dissatisfaction with the situation where you are crowded to the wall one night, and next month the hall is almost empty. Part of the success of the "Flyin' Heels" dances is due to the fact that in order to come you must not only make up your mind a month ahead but must pay that far ahead as well, and you know that only as many tickets will be sold as the hall holds comfortably. Other areas are now planning dances along similar lines, and there may come a day when those who really care about their dancing enough to plan for it, can be assured of actually getting the thing they paid for -- a good dance with good callers in a good hall, and room to dance!
