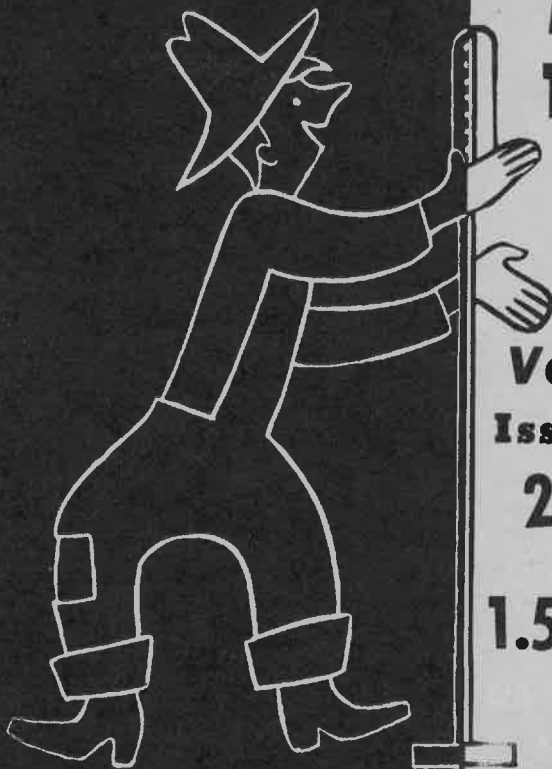

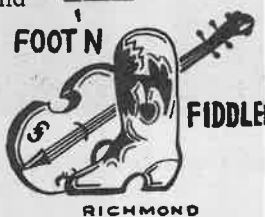

SQUARE DANCE ~ WHERE?

"Square your sets, let's dance!", is a chant that will be heard more and more as the time for the 8th National Square Dance Convention nears. There will be a huge migration to Denver in May as thousands of dancers are attracted to the World's Greatest Square Dance Event. Invitations have been sent out from the Executive Committee to all dancers, callers and leaders, to meet and participate in the 8th ANNUAL NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE CONVENTION, May 28th, 29th and 30th at the Denver City Auditorium.

This will be a truly colorful affair. The delegates are being offered the full days and nights of continuous dancing, clinics, panels, exhibitions, reunions, after-parties and "hot-hash" sessions, but they would like all of this to join them, especially for the beautiful SQUARE DANCE PAGEANT, Saturday afternoon and the official RODEO, Friday night.

The PAGEANT will be staged in the Auditorium Arena under the direction of Dorothy Shaw of Colorado Springs and will be narrated by the well-known "Bugs Bunny" Chuck Jones, of Hollywood. The Rodeo will be a "first class" event in that it will start at midnight. It will be put on at the Jefferson County Fairgrounds by the Inman Rodeo Company, with five main events, special events and a famous clown.

There is a great trend, to-day toward square dancing, as people desire the friendly, neighborly spirit involved. It is true that the square dance of today is an off-shoot of the early squares and quadrilles, but it is an activity geared for the men and women of the mid-twentieth century. The "frontier" atmosphere has disappeared in most of the modern square dance halls, but the western friendliness, flavor and color are still a part of the fun today.

RECORD: "Firefly" - Columbia 4-41237 (Tony Bennett)

POSITION: Open, facing LOD

FOOTWORK: Opposite. Directions given are for the M

INTRO: 5 Measures: Wait 6 counts (3 meas); Then, turn away with 4 steps (L,-,R,-; L,-,R,-;) M turning L and W turning R in a small circle, to end in OPEN POS, facing LOD.

MEASURES

- 1 - 4 FWD, 2, 3, BRUSH; FWD, 2, 3, TOUCH; TURN AWAY TWO-STEP; TWO-STEP;
Starting M's L, move fwd in LOD 3 steps and a brush (L,R, L, brush R); Starting M's R, move fwd in LOD R,L,R, touch L; Releasing handholds and starting M's L, partners turn away from one another (M to L, W to R) describing a small circle with 2 two-steps. End in LOOSE-CLOSED POS, M's back to COH.
- 5 - 8 GRAPEVINE LEFT; GRAPEVINE RIGHT; TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP;
Grapevine along LOD: step L to side, step R behind L, step L to side, and touch R beside L; Starting M's R, repeat along RLOD; Assume CLOSED POS and do 2 R-face turning two-steps progressing in LOD. End in OPEN POS, facing LOD.
- 9 - 16 FWD, 2, 3, BRUSH; FWD, 2, 3, TOUCH; TURN AWAY TWO-STEP; TWO-STEP; -- GRAPEVINE LEFT; GRAPEVINE RIGHT; TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP;
Repeat action of Meas 1-8, ending in CLOSED POS, M's back to COH.
- 17 - 20 SIDE, CLOSE, SIDE, CLOSE; SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS, -; TWIRL L, 2, 3, TOUCH; TWIRL R, 2, 3, TOUCH;
Moving along LOD, M steps L to side, closes R to L, steps L to side, closes R to L; Steps L to side, closes R to L, closes R to L, crosses L in front of R (W, XIF also) twd RLOD, and holds 1 ct; While M does a grapevine and touch along RLOD (R,L,R, touch L), W makes a L-face or reverse twirl along RLOD (L,R,L, touch R) under joined M's L and W's R hands; While M does a grapevine and touch along LOD (L,R,L,touchR), W makes a R-face twirl along LOD (R,L,R, touch L) under the same joined hands (M's L and W's R).
- 21 - 24 SIDE, CLOSE, SIDE, CLOSE; SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS, -; TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP;
Moving along RLOD, M steps R to side, closes L to R, steps R to side, closes L to R; Steps R to side, closes L to R, crosses R in front of L (W, XIF also) twd LOD, and holds 1 ct; Assume CLOSED POS and do 2 turning two-steps progressing in LOD. End in OPEN POS, facing LOD.
- 25 - 32 FWD, 2, 3, BRUSH; FWD, 2, 3, TOUCH; TURN AWAY TWO-STEP; TWO-STEP; -- GRAPEVINE LEFT; GRAPEVINE RIGHT; TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP;
Repeat action of Meas 1-8, ending in CLOSED POS.
- 33-34 TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP;
Starting M's L, do 2 turning two-steps progressing in LOD. End in OPEN POS, facing LOD.
- 35 - 58 REPEAT MEAS 9-32, ending in OPEN POS, facing LOD.
- ENDING: REPEAT MEAS 1-6; Then, W does a quick R-face twirl under joined M's L and her R hands. B & C.

CELEBRATION COMMEMORATES 10 YEARS OF CALLING BY **BOB PAGE**



What is this strange bond all square dancers share toward their recreation and the love of their fellow man wherein such sentiment, love and tribute could be expressed with such heartfelt emotion? It is a rather startling thought that perhaps we who square dance know the answer and hold the key to world peace!

Sunday, March 8, 1959, was just another day on the calendar, but to Bob Page it became a date that will always remain the most important one in his life. For on that day, his three clubs, the Country Cousins, Barn Owls and Valley Vagabonds along with the Bob-O-Links Exhibition Group and other square dance friends, paid him the highest tribute any caller could ever receive. The hall at Vichy Springs in Napa was turned into a place of beauty with the rows of tables covered in white and sprays of camellias and lilies used as centerpieces. Every part of the hall was decorated but the main decoration was an orange and white parachute which was spread over the rafters in memory of Bob's days as a paratrooper in World War II. Over 200 people were sitting at these tables in total silence awaiting Bob's arrival. It took hours of planning and preparation, but he arrived on this scene in total surprise and the effect will long be remembered by every person present. As he walked to his table everyone sang some beautifully written words to Rose Room (Bob and Nita's first round dance) and then Bob was told what it was all about. It was his tenth anniversary as a caller and the many square dancers present wanted to pay him tribute.

The program and M.C.'ing was handled by Nonie Moglia and it can safely be said that before Nonie had finished his program, there wasn't a dry eye in the place. Letters and telegrams of congratulations had come in from all over the country and these were read by various members of Bob's clubs, and the effect was impressive and emotional. Letters from Joe Lewis and Frank Lane had the group in hysterics and some of them (especially from his mother who lives in Nebraska) had them in tears. There were letters from Sandy Tepfer of Eugene, Oregon, who taught Bob to call, and many other well-known personalities, too many to mention. Lee Helsel was present and represented Sets in Order in presenting Bob a handsome plaque of the Stamper that pressed his first record release; Kay and Forrest Richards danced a melody of all the rounds Bob and Nita had written; and the Bob-O-Links turned the tables on Bob and performed for him. Bob's first mike was gilded in gold and placed in a glass mahogany box with a touching inscription. All of the mementos of the day were put into a scrapbook and this was presented to Bob along with a tape recording of the program.

Along with all of this, the guests enjoyed a potluck dinner and after the program, square dancing. Everyone received a large photo of Bob and Nita so they too would have a memento of the occasion.

LESS 'TOGETHERNESS,' PLEASE!

My text today is a quotation from the late W. C. Fields - "Anyone who hates children and dogs can't be all bad!" So far, I have had no requests to write anything about dogs, so the present subject is limited to "Children in Adult Square Dancing," and what to do about

Actually, you don't have to hate children not to want to dance with them. Some people resent children at Square Dances because they have none of their own, and some for the opposite reason -- because they do have some of their own and have gone to a lot of trouble and expense to leave them at home. Either way, I think they have a point.

Children seem to get into adult Square Dancing in three ways - In Exhibition groups, as a Baby-sitting problem, and in the squares themselves. The first two are easy. Everyone likes to watch cute little imitations of themselves trying to copy their antics, or unbelievably expert teen-agers doing things we couldn't do in a thousand years. And most people will do their best to dispose of their children while they are dancing, and if things do sometimes get out of hand and they have to bring the little problems with them, their friends will be tolerant -- just so it doesn't happen too often, and providing control is exercised at all times. No one likes a bunch of yelling children sliding across the floor between dances or coming out during a dance to pull on mother's skirt, but then, no one is supposed to like it. The parents are apologetic, and the other dancers are usually good sports about it.

But in the squares - there's another question. Answering the last letter I received on the subject, I would like to say emphatically that I do not like to see a couple get out on the floor and join a square and then, after it is ready, have the lady step out (or the man either) and a small child step in. In the first place, it is an obvious deception -- the parents must now from experience that other couples are reluctant to join a square with a child in it. They probably feel that their child is such a good dancer that the others will change their minds after one tip, and they also know that real square dancers are too well trained to step out of any square once it is formed. Even if their faith were justified, they would still be guilty of imposing on people's good manners.

The trouble is, fond parents who reason that way do not realize that knowing how to square dance is not the same thing as being a good Square Dancer. If square dancing consisted entirely of doing the right thing at the right time, ending each figure facing the right way, and moving in time to the music, then it might very well be that a ten-year-old out of an Exhibition Group could run circles around any of us. But Square Dancing is a social activity too, done by men and women, and to me, each man is entitled to dance with a woman and each woman with a man. Long ago we stopped allowing two women to join a group as a couple, and dancing as a man, for the same reason. And dancing with a small child is not the same thing as dancing with a grown-up or even a large teen-ager. Even if you can remember to reach down to take a hand a foot below normal level, what about making an arch? You can't even do an ordinary arm swing, to say nothing about a real swing, but have to modify all your normal motions to adapt to a half-pint in the square. You may be willing to forgive the imposition, but why should you? Has that child any right to be there? (That claim as been made, by one fond mother.)

First, let's attack the subject of rights in general. I think the confusion arises because people forget that Square Dancing is a social function rather than an economic one. When we advertise a dance, and invite people to come, we don't mean everybody -- we mean people who know how to square dance. Some invitations are even more specific -- they ask or people who know how to square dance well. We don't ask them to prove it -- this is a friendly activity, and a trustful one, and we expect people to grade themselves. If inexperienced dancers guess wrong, and find themselves out of their depth, we assume that they didn't mean to, and try and help them get thru somehow. But the point is, we trust people to know whether or not they will fit into a given dance, and if they don't know, to try and find out. We assume that Square Dancers want to cooperate, and will not knowingly spoil a dance or other dancers. There is no question of rights here -- anyone has a right to eat garlic be-

fore a dance, but Square Dancers just don't. All the little niceties that make people fun to dance with are like that-- Square Dancers find out what makes them acceptable as associates and then take care to be that way. That's why we love them.

Now - as to children dancing with adults. It seems to me the whole question is, are they Welcome? If you were invited to a formal dinner, would you take the children? Even if they knew how to eat properly? Of course not. Or if you were invited to a barbecue and honestly did not know whether or not the children would be welcome, what would you do? Wouldn't you ask? There are some Square Dance Clubs that make a point of being for Families, or have occasional Family Nights, or encourage children's groups to join them for special events. This is fine, and should be encouraged. But the great majority of Clubs are for adults only, and some are for married couples only. These Clubs might make an exception in favor of a teen-ager, provided he or she were fully grown and a good dancer, but would never welcome a small child, no matter how expert. The same is true of the large Saturday Night Hoedowns, and the Round-Ups and Conventions. If you are considering letting a child dance at one of these, be sure you have a whole square of children, or else fill in yourself, but don't expect them to be welcomed by everyone. You don't have any right to spoil other people's pleasure, even to give your little darlings a treat.

At the risk of being disowned by my own offspring, I am going to tell you my own experience. When Toby was thirteen, we went to the first Asilomar session. At that time, he was a dancer and was interested in Calling, and had just written a square that is still being danced, and he was full of enthusiasm. Of course I wanted to register him as a participant there, and I must say he was almost as tall as Dan, even then. But Bob Osgood had more sense than I had, and told me regretfully that they had decided not to accept any dancer under eighteen. Toby and I were disappointed, but he went anyhow, and watched, and took part in everything else there, and loved it. Since then, I have realized how right Bob was. Toby knew everything about Square Dancing then (and how!), but he was certainly no dancer -- he was awkward and rough and sloppy, a typical thirteen-year-old. I'm glad Bob realized even then that adult Square Dancing is for Adults.
