SUMMER SAUNTER

Summer is here, and the question is, what are we going to do about it? Elsewhere in the country, Summer is the time when Square Dance Clubs finish their season and quit, and most people stop dancing entirely except on open-air slabs and in a few air-conditioned Halls. So far, we in the Bay Area have gone right along all year, making no change for the Summer season, and being proud of it. Lately, I have been wondering if we might be making a mistake.

Goodness knows I don't want to stop dancing in Summer. With the climate we have here, there is no need for that. But if you talk to the Clubs and Callers, you will find that everyone complains that in Summer the crowds are smaller, attendance is irregular, some people drop out entirely, and even those who do come seem to come later and later. Vacations account for some of it, as well as longer hours of light for gardening, things you want to do with the children, and often just a sort of general disinclination to get dressed again after loafing in the patio. I don't see anything wrong with any of these reasons -- the fact is, simply, that Square Dancing has more competition in Summer than in Winter, and therefore a smaller number of people will be dancing on any given night.

My point is, this situation is perfectly natural and ought not to be allowed to be discouraging. The trouble is not primarily financial -- most Clubs have monthly dues and can weather a few lean nights, and people will turn out for the big special events anyhow. The problem seems to be the effect of a half-empty Hall on both Callers and dancers. Even worse for morale is the feeling of guilt you have when you don't go -- you know the crowd will be small, and you hate to make your Caller feel badly, and you know your excuse is no good -- you just don't feel like it. But did it ever occur to you that maybe your Caller doesn't feel like going either? Maybe once a week, all year, is beginning to weigh on him too. So why not face facts and make a virtue of necessity?

My idea would be, cut your dances in half. If you dance once a week, dance only every other week in Summer. And if you want to please everyone, don't just drop any two dances. Look for another Club, not too far away, that dances on the same night, and agree to drop alternate nights and visit each other. That would mean that there would still be a dance every week for those who wanted it, but each Caller could take time off, and between the two Clubs there would be a good crowd each night. And think of the fringe benefits, like getting to know a new bunch of dancers, and being able to dance to a Caller you had had to skip before, because your Club nights conflicted. I can see nothing but advantages in the idea.

Summer is full of nice Square Dance things to do, if you are not tied down to your own Club. Of course the most exciting thing to do is to go to a Square Dance Institute, like Asilomar, of which there are so many now that you can't even keep track of them. Someone figured out that if you had the time, you could go from one Square Dance Camp to another all Summer, making a complete tour of the country and dancing somewhere every night, and it would cost you no more than the average family resort. You can get ranch-type Camps, with rough accommodations and horses to ride, or Summer Hotels with pools and golf courses, or anything in between, and they are all fun. Some need reservations months in advance, but others may still have vacancies. Ask your Caller how to find out about them.

Even if you can't make one of the week-long Camps, you can find dances on Sunday afternoon, out-of-doors, that are a real change from regular dancing. There is our own Marin County dance on June 7th, in the fabulous Larkspur Rose Bowl, where you dance on a smooth wood floor under the redwoods -- this time to Jack Jackson from Ohio, who is here for this week-end only, between the National Convention in Denver and a date at Sunny Hills in Los Angeles. This is his first visit to California, and a real event. (Plug.) And there are the various Clubs that have week-end outings and dance in Resort areas out of doors -- watch the Magazine for invitations to join them, at places like the Russian River or the Santa Cruz mountains. Or you might just check the listings for places you never heard of -- do you know where "Paradise" is, or "Field's Landing"? Why not find one of them on the map and make a

week-end of it? The local Club will be thrilled to see you and you'll make a lot of new friends, beside learning a little geography.

Summer is the time for County Fairs and Rodeos, with Square Dancing as an added attraction. Take the family and spend the day and then join in when the dancing begins, and do your part toward selling Square Dancing to people who may never have seen it done the way we do it. You may have to dance in the street, or on a cement slab, or even on grass, but at least you will be helping to counteract the effect of all the Ozark stuff on T.V., and showing people what sort of dancing they would be doing themselves if they were to come out for the classes that will be offered in the Fall.

Summer is the time for Travelling Callers, too. Watch for announcements of special dances called by the real Big Names in Square Dancing, and try to hear as many as you can. Maybe you will still think that your own Caller is the best in the world, and that the Bay Area has more good Callers than anywhere, and it is just possible that you may be right. But how can you be sure unless you hear the others? And even if they are no better, they are different -- notice with what pleasure our own Callers dance to these visitors and listen for ideas. Sometimes they even get so fascinated they forget what they are supposed to be doing, and we all know that no one can goof more thoroughly than a Caller!

One way or another, let's have a 'change of pace' for Summer. Let's do different things, and dance with different people and in different places. Because if there is one thing I do believe in absolutely it is this--that the more groups of people you dance with, and the more Square Dance friends you have all over the country, the more you enjoy your Square Dancing.
