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SQUARE DANCE ~ WHERE?

COUNCIL ASS'N MEETING

On February 21, 1959 the Council of Square Dance Associations of California met in regular session at Fresno, California and your proposal for a national square dance organization was discussed fully.

The Council voted unanimously that it became a matter of record that California is opposed to the proposal. Thirteen associations representing 614 clubs participated in the voting. We believe that the growth and development of square dancing can be attained better through loosely-knit state and local organizations than by means of over-organization on a national level with its host of complicated organizational problems. The growth and development of square dancing is best served by local organizations close to the scene; local problems can best be met by these local groups operating independently within their own areas.

WORD FROM RICKY HOLDEN

Rickey Holden, square dance caller from Wilmington, Delaware, begins a two and one-half month tour of European countries on June 1st, visiting Ireland, England, Belgium, Netherlands, Germany, Austria, Switzerland, France, Spain and Portugal.

The route of Rickey's tour will follow, in general, the itinerary worked out for the American Square and Folk Dance Troupe, whose visit to Europe has had to be postponed until 1960 due to failure to secure the necessary tax deductible status from the U.S. Treasury Dept. in time for all arrangements to be completed for 1959.

In addition to visiting the people in Europe to secure arrangements for the 1960 Troupe, Rickey will be calling at a number of places, particularly in England, Germany and Spain. He returns to the U. S. about August 12th.

RECORD: "Waltz Caress" Aqua No. 209

POSITION: CLOSED, FACING LOD

FOOTWORK: OPPOSITE, directions for M

INTRO: 4 Meas: Face partner diagonally, WAIT 2 Meas; BAL APART; BAL FWD TO CP

MEASURES

1 - 4 STEP, TOUCH, -; STEP, TOUCH, -; GRAPEVINE; CROSS, TOUCH -;

In closed POS M steps fwd LOD on L, touches R by L and hold ct 3; M steps fwd on R making 1/4 turn to face wall, touches L by R and holds ct 3; Facing wall, M does a 3-step grapevine a long LOD; M steps on R across in front of L maneuvering to face RLOD, touches L by R, and holds ct 3.

5 - 8 WALTZ; WALTZ; WALTZ; TWIRL (TO CLOSED POS);

In CLOSED POS, partners make 3RF turning waltzes and Wtwirls to end in CLOSED POS, M facing LOD.

9 - 12 STEP, TOUCH, -; STEP, TOUCH, -; GRAPEVINE; CROSS, TOUCH -;

Repeat action of Meas. 1-4

13 - 16 WALTZ; WALTZ; WALTZ; TWIRL (TO PROMPOS, BOTH FACE LO)
Repeat action of Meas 5-8, ending in PROMPOS facing LOD.

17 - 22 WALTZ FWD; LADY CROSSES; WALTZ FWD; MAN CROSSES; SC LO TURN, 2,3; 4,5,6;

In PROMENADE POS facing LOD, starting M's L, partners wa fwd; As M waltzes diag fwd twd wall, W crosses in front of M inside of circle (handhold is retained); Partners again waltz fwd LOD, M on outside; As W waltzes diag fwd twd wall, M crosses in front of W to inside of circle to end both facing LOD; Releasing hands, partners make one solo waltz turn away from each other in a small circle (slight progression) in 6 cts (M L-face, R-face) to end M facing partner and wall in BUTTERFLY POS.

23 - 26 BAL TOGETHER; BALAPART; CROSSOVER, 2,3;; WALTZ BWD, 2 FACE;

In BUTTERFLY POS partners balance together to BANJO; Still in butterfly pos, balance apart; With M's R & W's L hands joined, partners cross over in 3 steps, W under joined hands, to end facing RLOD, inside hands joined; Waltz slightly bwd in LOD, assuming BUTTERFLY POS on last step, M facing COH.

7 - 30 BALTOGETHER; BALAPART; CROSS-OVER, 2, 3; WALTZ BWD, 2, 3;
Repeat action of Meas 23-26, except to end in OPEN POS facing LOD.

1 - 32 WALTZOUT; WALTZ IN (TO CLOSED POS);
Partners facing LOD, inside hands joined, waltz fwd and slightly away from partner; Waltz fwd and in twd partner, as W turns L to assume CLOSED POS, Mfacing LOD to begin dance.

○ ENTIRE DANCE 3 TIMES. On Meas 32 last time thru end with LF twirl or spin for W. Bow & Curtsy, M's R & W's L hands joined.

NOTE: On Meas 3 (grapevine), it is necessary that the W shorten her "cross-over" step slightly to allow the M to accomplish a smooth "maneuver" into CP.

Madeline Allen Asks... To Twirl or not to Twirl?

Nobody asked me to write this article -- this is my own particular gripe. I think a lot of square dancers are Twirl-happy. Some women really like to twirl, and know how and wh to do it, but a lot more either think they have to twirl at certain times, or are forced to twirl by men who assume they have to, or else try to twirl on every possible occasion because they think it makes them look like High Level dancers. I don't think many of them ever really asked themselves whether or not they wanted to do as many twirls as they do -- they don't think they have any choice.

Well, I think they do. If you are doing an Exhibition Square Dance, and the choreographer indicates a twirl at a certain point, then you had better do it. It looks better to see all the skirts swing out at once and looking good is what you are trying to do. But most of square dance only for our own entertainment (at least most of the time) and not for the effect on the spectators, if any. Our only obligation is to the other dancers in the square, and the most important thing we can do for them is to keep together. If you can't keep up with the Caller and the other dancers and still do all the twirls you usually do, then don't do them. Twirls are strictly optional.

First, let's look at how you twirl. The man's part is easy -- all he has to do is to raise his arm over the lady's head and let her hand turn in his, loosely, as she turns. But a lot of men don't even know that this is what they should do. Some of them grab a girl's hand and wind her up, as if they were cranking an old car. Some don't lift their arm high enough, but reach over head and make a circle around her, forcing her to dodge her own arm and knocking her hair-do to pieces. Many of them hang onto her hand too long and too tight, threatening her with a broken arm. In short, a lot of men just don't seem to know how, or to care.

Ideally, a lady should be able to twirl smoothly without ducking at all, and the man's hand ought to be exactly above the top of her head as she turns. Their hands should make contact but only just -- either palm to palm, as in the June 'Sets in Order' Styling picture or with one hand turning loosely in the other. He should offer to raise her arm for a twirl, but if she resists he should be quick to release her hand and allow her to skip that one. Ladies may not want to twirl for various reasons -- no time, no strength left, plain laziness, but mostly, I think, because of sticky floors. In order to twirl comfortably your slipper should really slip on the floor, and if it sticks you just can't do it. But let her be the judge.

Are there any points in a square where you really ought to twirl? There are certain places where it is the regular custom, as for instance when you meet your partner in a Gra Right and Left, and when you reach home after a Promenade. Those two twirls are usual, and if you did just those and no more you would be safe. (You still don't have to do even those. The twirl when you pick up your corner to promenade is pretty general, but it is also pretty awkward, and would never be missed. And as for the twirl between each man in a Gra Right and Left -- well, words fail me!

I have been happy to notice in the write-ups of some Rounds lately that you are given a choice of doing one twirl or two. This trend is realistic, recognizing that many different kinds of dancers are now doing Rounds, and that a lot of us really love to do them if we don't have to twirl ourselves dizzy. Here is the place, though, for the Whirling Dervishes to express themselves without bothering anyone -- if two twirls are good, they can usually get three or more.

If I could have my choice, though, of one particular twirl that I would like to kill dead, it would be this one -- the extra twirl the men try to give you after you have promenaded home, done one twirl, and a single swing. You are all through, ready to stand a moment and wait for the next call -- or sometimes the next call has already been given -- and you are off guard and relaxed, and what does he do? Up goes that arm, you are jerked off balance, wound around your own feet, and then, as a finish, he jerks you over toward him before you have quite come around, in order to be in position for the next call. Of all the u

necessary, uncomfortable, ill-timed maneuvers, this is my choice for first prize. (Dan has just pointed out to me that the reason this twirl is especially awkward is that it is done out of swing and therefore with the man's left hand, so that he is actually reaching across himself to do it. No wonder it is so hard to do gracefully! I hadn't thought of that.)

I think most callers hate as much as I do those extra twirls that louse up the timing. If I were a caller, I hope I'd have the courage to stand up and tell my dancers, 'Quit that! It is it, I think that most of them have accepted it as inevitable and try to meet the challenge by adding something like "First and Third go forward and back", a call that is expendable and gives the twirling couples time to get into place before the real call comes. I know one caller, though, who feels the way I do about it, and who occasionally leaves out all that extra stuff just on purpose to trap one square of twirl-happy dancers and show them how far behind they are getting. He gets a fiendish pleasure out of it, too.

One of the worst features of this super-spinning by fast dancers is the effect it has on slower or slower dancers. They want to progress as rapidly as possible, naturally, and they are eager to do everything the better dancers do, but they make the mistake of trying to copy his particular bit of 'styling', and the net result is that instead of being a little behind the call, just because of slow reaction time, they are now a lot behind. I would certainly advise all dancers who have any trouble at all in keeping up, to skip all extra movements, even wings, for a while, and concentrate on the basic movements necessary to the figure they are doing. It would help them to overcome that jerky, rushed effect that makes them look like beginners. Instead, they would look like old, beat-up, square dancers like us, who are always looking for the easy way to do things.

Going back to that extra twirl after a swing, for a moment, I have found my own defense against it, and I will release the secret for the benefit of other ladies who feel as I do. About halfway thru the swing, before you get all the way around, just quietly withdraw your right hand from his left. When his left hand goes up for that twirl, it is empty - where'd you go? You are standing calmly beside him, ready for the next call. Do it enough times and he may even take the hint and drop the whole thing. It really works.
