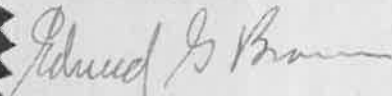

GET FIDDLE TWO-STEP

By Hunter and Jeri Crosby, Three Rivers, California

RECORD: "Get Fiddle Two-Step" - MacGregor 8435

POSITION: INTRO: Open

DANCE: Semi-closed, facing LOD

FOOTWORK: Opposite. Firections for M

INTRO: WAIT 2 meas; STEP SIDE, TOUCH, TOGETHER (TO SEMI-CLOSED)

MEASURES

TOUCH;

- 1 - 4 WALK, 2(FACE); SIDE, BEHIND; SIDE, IN FRONT; PIVOT, 2;
In semi-closed pos walk fwd LOD 2 steps to assume LOOSE-CLOSED POS, M's back twd COH; Grapevine along LOD stepping side L, XIB on R (both XIB); Side L, XIF on R (both XIF), as partners assume tight CLOSED POS and start pivot; Pivot 1/2 R-face stepping L, R, ending in LOOSE CLOSED POS M facing COH.
- 5 - 8 BALANCE LEFT; BALANCE RIGHT; ROLL, 2; 3, 4;
In loose-closed pos do quick two-step balance to L along RLOD; Repeat to R along LOD; Roll in 4 steps (M turning L and W/R) progressing RLOD, ending in SEMI-CLOSED POS facing RLOD.
- 9 - 12 WALK, 2(FACE); SIDE, BEHIND; SIDE, IN FRONT; PIVOT, 2;
Repeat action of Meas 1-4 starting RLOD and ending M's back to COH.
- 13 - 16 BALANCE LEFT; BALANCE RIGHT; TWIRL, 2; TWIRL, 2;
Repeat balances of Meas 5-6 starting along LOD; W makes 2 regular R-face twirls with 4 steps progressing LOD as M walks 4 steps beside her, to end in BUTTERFLY POS M's back to COH.
- 17 - 20 BALANCE LEFT; BALANCE RIGHT; ROLL, 2; STEP/STEP, STEP/BRUSH;
In butterfly pos do a two-step balance along LOD; then along RL OD; Roll 1 complete L-face turn (W, R-face) in 2 steps L, R; Assume BUTTERFLY POS and quickly step L/R, L/brush R;
- 21 - 24 BALANCE RIGHT; BALANCE LEFT; ROLL, 2; STEP/STEP, STEP/BRUSH;
Starting M's R repeat action of Meas 17-20 along RLOD and along LOD, M rolling R-face and W rolling L-face, to end in BUTTERFLY POS briefly.
- 25 - 28 LADY UNDER TWO-STEP; TWO-STEP (TO FACE); LADY UNDER TWO-STEP; TWO-STEP (TO CLOSED);
("Arches" figure) Drop M's R and W's L hands and as M two-steps diag twd wall, W changes sides in two-steps in front of him under his L and her R, diag twd COH; As partners turn to face, they join new leading hands (M's R & W's L) and W again changes sides under joined hands as M two-steps back twd COH behind her, ending in CLOSED POS M's back to COH.
- 29 - 32 TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP; TWIRL, 2; TWIRL, 2;
Do two turning two-steps progressing LOD followed by 2 R-face twirls by W in 4 steps as M walks beside her with 4 steps. End in SEMI-CLOSED POS facing LOD.

DANCE IS DONE A TOTAL OF THREE TIMES PLUS ENDING

ENDING: BALANCE LEFT; BALANCE RIGHT; TURNAWAY, 2; 3, BOW;

In BUTTERFLY POS, M's back twd COH, do a two-step balance L; two-step balance R; Turnaway (M to L, W to R) and BOW.

THOSE NEW BASICS-- WHO'S PUSHING WHO? BY MADELINE ALLEN

Suppose you visit a strange Club one of these days and the Caller tells you to "Shake the Line". You never heard the term before (you couldn't have -- I just made it up) so you ask about it, after fouling up the square. 'Oh, that's a New Basic,' you are told. 'Hasn't your Caller taught it to you yet?' So on your next Club night you ask your own Caller about it, and he says he never heard of it either. What do you do then?

Well, if you're smart you say 'Thank Goodness!' and forget it. If your Caller has never heard of it, you can be pretty sure it is not one of the very few really useful New Basics that have been approved by the Callers' Association and the Workshop group. In the face of the recent flood of newly-invented terms for new or old figures which have been coming in from all parts of the country, our two Northern California organizations, in cooperation with the Sacramento group, have been making a valiant effort to screen and evaluate all these new ideas, with the intention of protecting the poor dancer from complete confusion. Most of our Callers have agreed not to use terms until they have been approved for use in our area -- except, of course, for trying them out in their own small workshop groups. This way a lot of awkward, impractical or simply unnecessary terms fall by the wayside, whereas the few really interesting and useful ones are taught everywhere at the same time.

If you, the dancer, think I am exaggerating the danger to your peace of mind, just cast an eye over this small segment of the list of New Basics proposed in the last year or so. These are only the ones using the word 'Line' -- we have plenty of other types too. We have Bend the Line, Divide the Line, Break the Line, Retreat the Line, Reverse the Line, Pair the Line, Weave the Line, Slide the Line, Roll the Line -- see how it goes? Imagine yourself standing in a line of four and hearing a string of these commands -- even if your Caller has carefully walked you thru all of them, do you think you would be able to react correctly to any one that was called?

I suppose there are 'Red Hot' Clubs somewhere in the country that know and use all these terms and more. It is more usual, however, for each area to accept and use only a few of them, and our effort should be to see that all the Callers and Clubs in the Bay Area choose the same few New Basics to learn, so that we can all continue to dance together. Many times we will receive the same words from two different parts of the country but with different meanings. Or, alternately, we get two terms for the same thing and have to choose. Speaking as a member of the Workshop, let me tell you that the decisions aren't easy.

If you are one of those dancers with a memory like an elephant and an eager appetite for everything new, and you don't see why you should be limited to a few New Basics instead of learning all of them, forget yourself for a moment and think of the poor Beginner. How are you ever going to sell your friends on the idea of joining a class and learning to square dance so that they can join your Club, if you have to tell them that they won't be ready to dance with you until they have studied hard for two years? Of course, by that time you will have learned so many new things that they'll still be behind, and maybe they'll never catch up. Where will your Club be then, with all those with poor memories dropping out and no replacements coming in?

It isn't as if Square Dancing were being held down by lack of variety. Any good Caller can keep any good dancer as confused as he wants, using nothing less than five year old. But it takes more skill on the part of the Caller, and more real ingenuity on the part of dance originators, to invent new figures and patterns using the same old terms, than it does to invent a pattern and just give it a new name. That's the easy way to get novelty into you calling. There will always be Callers who are willing to sacrifice the general good of the whole area in order to get a little personal applause. If your Caller is not that type, however, and is abiding by the agreement made by the majority, don't penalize him by demanding that he use all the new stuff you hear elsewhere from wildcat Callers. Trust him to give you all the New Basics you really need to know, and just be grateful that you don't need to struggle with the rest.
