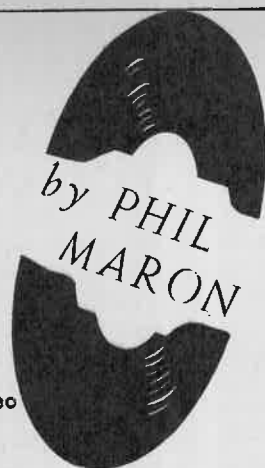

Square Dancing is so colorful

---OR Is It?

Speaking of Trends--and who isn't? '--- here is one I personally am concerned about, even if no one else is. How come Square Dancers are getting so conservative about color all of a sudden? And I mean real color, not Western-type trimmings or authentic styles. I mean red and blue and green and yellow -- the colors that show up on the dance floor and make a gay spectacle of it. Dancers are better dressed than ever as far as style goes, but more and more men are wearing white or neutral shirts and more and more women are turning to muted colors and quiet elegance instead of gaiety. If it weren't for the Squaw dresses, a Stampede would be a drab sight indeed. At this rate a big Square Dance will soon look no more exciting than a Bankers' Convention.

I am certain this trend toward dullness is not intentional. No one is deliberately sabotaging our traditionally 'Colorful Spectacle.' But how many of you, when you plan outfits for yourselves, consider not only how you will look to your friends in your own square but also how you will fit into and improve the whole picture? At the next Stampede, climb up into the balcony and look down, and you will see what I mean.

On the subject of white shirts for men, I am ready to admit that there are arguments on the other side. White shirts are easy to find, they don't fade, and they blend with whatever dress the woman wears. Really bright shirts for men are pretty rare, and making shirts is not for most women. On the other hand, I think it does a man good to strut out in a shirt that knocks everyone's eye out, and I think it is worth a little extra trouble to have a few on hand for big occasions, especially where the Public will be watching. On Club nights, you have my permission to keep it simple.

But ladies' clothes are another matter. In our area, at least, I am sure that the great majority of women either make their own clothes or have them made -- very few of them find what they want ready-made. That means that they have a choice of all the rainbow of color available in the greatest collection of yard goods ever offered -- so why do they choose what they do? When it isn't a mistaken attempt to be subtle, it is probably partly ignorance of how to look at colors and partly, I hope, the fact that they never gave it a thought until now. After all, as I have been told often enough, not everyone is as hipped on the subject of color as I am.

Let's assume to begin with that you really agree with me, and would like to contribute your share to the effectiveness of the mass of dancers at the next Golden State Round-Up. You have already decided what type of dress to make, and you are standing in front of a rack of the right weight of materials, trying to choose one. Let's eliminate white -- a certain amount of white is good on a floor, but you know there will be plenty without you. Looking over the crowd at the last Stampede, I saw more turquoise Squaw dresses than any other single color, with red a close second. (Most of the dresses I did not even see.) Both of those are good colors when they are solid, without too much trim. But if you really want to help, don't take either of those, but try for something that is more unusual -- only be sure that it is a color, not a neutral. If you want a print, don't buy one without looking at it from all the way across the Yardage department -- if you turn back at the end of the aisle and can't spot the one you were looking at, it is no good. A print that has equal amounts of two or more colors will blend together at a distance and disappear. The best print is one with a lot of clear background color and the figures widely-spaced, so that the background is definitely dominant. Stripes are all right if you remember that the color you see will be the mixture of both stripes -- thus narrow red and white stripes will look pink and bright blue and white will turn to pale blue. Wide stripes are better, or narrow stripes spaced far apart on a bright background. Any material that shows up clearly from the other end of the store will show up on the dance floor.

Of course, there is the other side of this blending business too. If you find a color that seems too heavy -- like a Royal purple or a Billiard-table green -- you can always cut it down with white trimming or silver braid, or maybe a wide band of another, lighter shade in the skirt. Nothing is more effective seen from above than skirts with wide bands near the hem --

when you twirl, they look like pinwheels. I would certainly like to look out over the crowd at the next Round-Up and see highlights of orange and emerald green and brilliant yellow and magenta, as well as turquoise and scarlet and blue.

One last suggestion -- have you ever thought of dyeing? Most people don't realize how easy it is to dip a dress or shirt, if it is dull or faded, or if you are just tired of it. Naturally, the dye should be darker than the original color, preferably a related shade, like orange over pink or green over light blue. Nylon dyes beautifully, and prints can be dyed with very interesting results-- some of the colors change, some stay, and the pattern still shows up. Of course the dye washes out to some extent, but for one special occasion you can make a real effect with an old outfit, considerably easier than making a new one. And while you are at it, pick a bright color, for me!

The first organized club in the Sacramento area, The Circle Eighters held their momentous 10th Anniversary.

"HAVE RECORDS, WILL TRAVEL"

Rickey Holden, square dance caller from Wilmington, Delaware, leaves in mid-January for a second world tour of countries in Asia, Africa and Europe. He'll be teaching square and other dances to people of the countries involved.

The tentative itinerary includes Japan, Korea, Taiwan, Hong Kong, Philippines, Viet-Nam, Singapore, Malaya, Borneo, Thailand, Burma, Ceylon, India, Pakistan, Jordan, Iran and Egypt. This will probably be followed by visits to other countries in the Middle East and in Europe. He is due back in the U.S.A. about October, 1961.

Holden is reported to be the most widely travelled professional square and folk dance leader in the world. In August, 1958, he completed his first tour around the world, having travelled over 46,000 miles in ten months and taught over 18,000 people in 30 countries in Asia, Africa and Europe. This past summer he spent two and one-half months in Europe, and this fall he was in Cuba and Mexico. So far he has visited a total of 53 different nations.

He plans to call at least one square dance in every country program on this trip, although there will likely be many times when simple round dances and mixers may be more successful because of language or general dancing problems.

Rickey says the language problem is not so formidable as you might think because he now speaks fifteen languages--twenty words in each language. He can say, "Go, Stop, Left, Right, Turn around and You're wonderful." Just a few things like this are all he finds necessary.

The official mailing address is Box 8882, Crenshaw Station, Los Angeles 8, California; the official mailing address for registrations only is P.O. Box 11, Van Nuys, California.

There is an official convention badge for all Chairman and Committeemen.

A guest list of dignitaries and the press is partially prepared.

All Chairmen are to submit their photograph with their round dance and square dance history for publication.

There are seven Committees:

- (1) Publicity has charge of mailings, publications, advertisements and general publicity.
- (2) Facilities has charge of displays of club banners, and badges, decoration of Arena, panels space, sound, housing, parking, transportation, and maps.
- (3) Hospitality has charge of a room for callers and the Committee, First Aid Room, Lost and Found, Information Booths, Advisory Committee Luncheon on Sunday, and fill in squares pom poms.
- (4) Registration has charge of preregistration (for which the card is printed and available), day by day registration, confirmations, dancer badges and decals. The decals are ready
- (5) Program has charge of programming the complete convention, all square dancing, all round dancing, workshops and panels. A souvenir program is still in the discussion stage. There will be a Pre-teen Panorama consisting of over one hundred squares of children between the age of eight and twelve years on Saturday.
- (6) Commercial has charge of the exhibit booths.
- (7) Special Events has charge of the Special Luncheon on Saturday at the Town and Gown Hall at USC, and the After Party at midnight on Saturday at the Police Academy.

Good progress has been made by all Committees.
