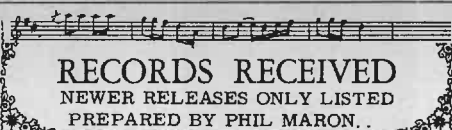

HAPPY WALTZ

DANCE BY: Jerry & Charlie Tuffield - Denver, Colorado
 RECORD: "The Happy Waltz" - Shaw 217-18
 POSITION: Intro: Partners facing, M's back twd COH, M's R & W's L hands joined.
 Dance: OPEN POS, facing LOD
 FOOTWORK: Opposite throughout - Steps given for the M

MEASURES: INTRODUCTION

1 - 4 WAIT; WAIT; BALANCE APART; BALANCE TOGETHER (to BUTTERFLY)
 Partners facing, M's back twd COH, M's R & W's L hands joined, wait 2 meas; Then step L bwd twd COH (W bwd twd wall), touch R to L, hold; Step R assuming BUTTERFLY POS, M facing wall, tch L to R, hold;

5 - 8 WALTZ BAL LEFT; WALTZ BAL RIGHT; TWIRL, 2,3; STEP, TOUCH, -; (to OPEN POS)
 In butterfly pos step L to side along LOD, step R behind L, step L in place; Repeat waltz bal to R; M takes 3 steps in place LRL while W twirls R-face under her R & M's L hands; Step R, touch L, hold, ending in OPEN POS face LOD;

DANCE

1 - 4 WALTZ BACK-TO-BACK; WALTZ FACE-TO-FACE; STEP, SWING, -; FACE, TOUCH, -;

In open pos waltz fwd LOD turning slightly back-to-back; Waltz fwd turning face-to-face; Step L, swing R fwd LOD, hold; Face partner and step R to side along RLOD, touch L, hold;

5 - 8 WALTZ BACK-TO-BACK; WALTZ FACE-TO-FACE, STEP, SWING, -; STEP (BACK-TO-BACK), TOUCH, -;

Repeat action of meas 1-2; On meas 7 step L, swing R fwd turning to back-to-back pos, step R, touch L, releasing joined M's R & W's L & joining M's L & W's R hands (M is now facing diag COH & RLOD, W facing diag wall & RL OD).

9 - 12 WALTZ BAL LEFT; WALTZ BAL RIGHT; STEP, FLARE, -; FACE (to closed), tch, -;

Step L to side along RLOD, step R behind L, step L in place; Repeat waltz bal to R; Step L in place, swing R around in a Flare to face partner & assuming CLOSED POS; Step R, tch L, hold;

13 - 16 DIP; MANEUVER WALTZ; WALTZ; WALTZ;

In closed pos M's bk twd COH dip bwd on M's L & hold 2 cts; Do 1 waltz, maneuvering to end with M's back twd LOD; Do 2 RF turning waltzes making a 3/4 turn to end facing partner, M's back twd COH;

17 - 20 SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE; FRONT, SIDE, BEHIND; TWIRL, 2,3; STEP, TOUCH, -;

In loose-closed pos M's back twd COH, do a 6-step grapevine along LOD starting M's L; While M walks fwd 3 steps LRL in LOD, W twirls R-face under her R & M's L hands RLR; Face partner and step R, touch L, -; (assume CP)

21 - 24 SIDE, BEHIND, SIDE; FRONT, SIDE, BEHIND; TWIRL, 2,3; STEP (to open), TOUCH

Repeat action of meas 17-19; On meas 24, step R, tch L to end in OPEN POS, facing LOD;

25 - 28 STEP, SWING, -; REV TWIRL (SPIN MANEUVER); WALTZ; WALTZ;

In open pos facing LOD step L, swing R, -; Release handholds & while W turns one full free turn L, M walks 3 steps turning 1/2 R-face to end in CLOSED POS with M's back twd LOD; Do 2 R-face turning waltzes, starting bwd in LOD End in OPEN POS facing LOD;

29 - 32 STEP, SWING, -; REV TWIRL (SPIN MANEUVER); WALTZ; WALTZ;

Repeat action of meas 25-28

ENDING: On third time through, in Meas 32, W twirls R-face under her R & M's L hands. Bow to partner.

IS YOUR CLUB NECESSARY?

After sitting in on years of Panels on "Club Problems" at Camps and Conventions, I have come to the conclusion that most of the discussion could be boiled down into one short question - "How can our small Club afford to rent a hall and pay the Caller?" Here the operative word is "small", and of course it may mean anything from six squares in some areas to less than three in others. The usual answer given is to try to increase the membership by starting a Beginner Class, but this only leads into another familiar question - "How can we attract more Beginners?" My answer would be different -- maybe your Club is not really necessary and ought not to be maintained.

Naturally, I am not talking about areas where dancers live so many miles apart that they have to drive an hour to get together. There, even one square may represent a triumph of organization, and may be well worth while. I am talking about our own Bay Area, where on any night of the week the average dancer has a bewildering choice of places to dance, within easy reach. Each of these Clubs has roughly the same overhead regardless of whether there are three squares or twelve. Most of our halls are much too big for the average Club anyhow, especially the school halls with the low rent, and most of our Callers charge either the same fees for all Clubs, or else are reluctantly helping to subsidize the marginal Clubs by agreeing to "wait" for a good fee until the Club is on its feet (until when?) So why not solve all our problems at once by simply combining two or more of these small, uneconomic Clubs into one strong one, as large as your best hall will hold, and not start another one in the same area until the pressure of too many dancers has made it desirable?

The first squawk I hear comes from the Callers who are not chosen to call for the large Club. What about them? Well, I don't think all Callers are necessary either -- maybe some of them would actually be happier going back to being dancers again, especially if they were really good dancers before they became Callers. (If they became Callers before they learned to dance, maybe that is why they aren't in great demand as Callers.) I agree that anyone who thinks he wants to be a Caller should be given a chance to try, and deserves our encouragement and our tolerance while he is learning. Sooner or later, however, it becomes apparent -- usually to everyone but him -- into which category he is eventually going to fall. Maybe he is on the way to becoming a top Caller, needing only a little more experience to be in demand everywhere. That's fine, even if he is never going to be that good but is developing into a competent teacher and Club Caller, there is plenty of room for him in the Square Dance picture and he should be given every encouragement. But if he just does not have what it takes -- if he can't stay on pitch or in rhythm, or loses his temper because he can't make people do what he wants them to do, then his best friend ought to tell him, and he should give it up. I don't think the Square Dance movement owes every would-be Caller a Club to call to.

Sometimes Charter Members are just as bad as Callers when it comes to trying to keep a moribund Club alive. Maybe they really feel like Somebody in their own Club, and they may have their doubts about being welcomed in other Clubs. Maybe they really are a special group, and would not mix well with a larger Club. Their only answer, then, is to be willing to pay more per person to cover their overhead -- if they value their individuality enough to pay for it, let them keep it. But don't come crying to me that other Callers are stealing your dancers, or that your Beginners are disloyal because they will not stay with you. I am convinced that every dancer should feel free to choose the group with which he wants to dance, and if it turns out that nobody wants to join your group, it might just be that your Club has outlived its usefulness. Just because a Club is one of the oldest in the area is no sign that it should necessarily be preserved -- maybe it is time to write it off and start something new. Or maybe your members would be happier disbanding and joining other Clubs of their choice, with fewer problems.

The point is, just because a Club has a name and a Caller and a few members, don't take it for granted that the Club deserves to survive. Whether it was once successful and is now going downhill, or just never got off the ground -- if there is something obviously wrong with it now, why keep it alive? Maybe Euthanasia is the answer.

The group meets once each month (1st Sunday) at Lincoln School in Redwood City, where an attempt is made to workshop ALL the Round Dances that come along in both the "Round Of The Month" category, as well as dances written primarily for the Round Dance enthusiast. 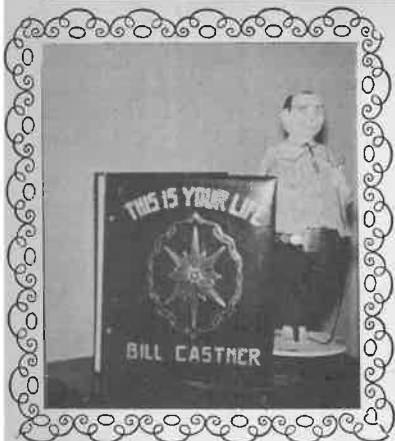
